#### **OAKLAND NOTES**

- The Oakland Athletics are now 6-18 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...fell to 28-19 (.609) in games decided by three runs or more...are 24-26 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2009...are 2-2 on this six-game homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (0-1).
- Kendall Graveman allowed more than four runs for the first time since April 25 against Houston (6 er) and for just the third time this year...has allowed 10 runs on 13 hits over his last two starts (11.0 ip).
- Billy Burns (2-for-4) recorded his team-best 27th multiple hit game of the year...is batting .358 (49-for-137) at home compared to .257 (39-for-152) on the road.
- Brett Lawrie (2-for-4) had his 26th multiple hit game of the year...is 5-for-17 (.294) on the current homestand.
- Jake Smolinski (1-for-4, 3b, rbi, so) is 6-for-13 (.462) with four runs, one triple, two home runs and six RBI in five games with the A's since being recalled from Triple-A Nashville on July 7.

#### **TORONTO NOTES**

- The Toronto Blue Jays snapped a four-game losing streak against the A's...have scored 35 runs over the last six games and have hit multiple home runs in four of those contests...have now hit three or more home runs 12 times this season...became the quickest team in the Majors to reach 500 runs since the 2011 Red Sox (94 games)...have a Major League leading 505 runs...are 1-0 on this six-game road trip to Oakland (1-0) and Seattle (three games).
- Mark Buehrle set a Blue Jays club record with his ninth consecutive start of six or more innings and two or fewer earned runs allowed (previous: Dave Stieb and Roger Clemens, 8)...has a 1.52 ERA (11 er in 65.0 ip) since June 1...has won 6 of his last 7 decisions...has tossed at least seven innings in seven consecutive outings and in 11 of his last 12 starts.
- Edwin Encarnacion (1-for-3, 2 r, hr, rbi, 2 bb) has hit eight of his 19 home runs against AL West opponents this year (17 games)...20 of his last 37 hits have been for extra bases (10 2b, 10 hr).
- Jose Bautista (1-for-5, r, hr, rbi) hit his 223rd home run as a Blue Jay, tying him with Vernon Wells for second all-time (Carlos Delgado, 336)...became the third player in Blue Jays history to hit 20 or more home runs in at least six consecutive seasons (Carlos Delgado, 9; Joe Carter, 7).
- Kevin Pillar (2-for-4, r, 2b) recorded his 30th multiple hit game of the season...is batting .337 (57-for-169) over his last 45 games...has hit safely in 25 of his last 33 contests
- Jose Reyes (2-for-5, rbi, so) has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games and is batting .358 (19-for-53) over that span...is batting .297 (62-for-209) since returning from the disabled list on May 25.
