THE LATEST:

Last night, TOR won the series opener at OAK, 7-1 to improve to 48-47 (2nd in AL East)... It is their highest per in the series opener at OAK, 7-1 to improve to 48in AL East)...It is their highest position in the standings since April 23 (9-7)...Have won back-to-back games for the 1st time since June 24-26...Have not won three straight contests since June 17-19...Are also trying to win back-to-back series for the 1st time since June 22-28 (2-1 at TB, 2-1 vs. TEX)...Are above .500 for the 15 since July 8 (44-43)...Have not been two games above .500 since July 7 (44-42)...Despite dropping 11 of their last 18 games, have won four of their last six contests... Have outscored the opposition, 35-19 over that span – out-homering them 10-5 in the process...Are now 14-17 since their 11-game win streak & are outscoring the opposition 149-125 (+24), despite the losing record over that span...The pitching staff has allowed three runs or less in eight of their last 10 contests (5-5 team record, 2.97 ERA, 29ER/88.0).

ABOUT THE OTHER DAY

- Mark Buehrle (7.0, 8H, ER, 3K) improved to 11-5 after last night's victory...The 11 wins are T-2nd in the AL (Keuchel-12)...Has won six of his last seven decisions (10-GS) since May 29, posting a 1.82 ERA (15ER/74.0)...Became 1st pitcher in club history to record nine straight starts of 2-ER or less & 6.0 IP or more (previous record was 8 held by Dave Stieb-2x & Roger Clemens)...Has now gone 114 straight batters without issuing a walk.
- Jose Reyes went 2-for-5 with a RBI & is now batting .352 (25-71) with a .821 OPS over his last 16 contests...Russell Martin went 2-for-4 with a HR & a game-high 3-RBI...It was his 13th HR of the season & ranks 5th among all catchers in the ML in HR (Brian McCann & Salvador Perez are tied with 15 for most).

PILLAR OF STRENGTH:

Since May 27, Kevin Pillar is batting .337 (57-169) with 10-2B, 1-3B, 6-HR, 21-RBI & a .880 OPS...Among the AL since then, ranks 2nd in AVG, T7th in hits, 8th in OPS (.880)...Among all OF, ranks 2nd in defensive runs saved with 14 (K. Kiermaier leads with 24).

- After 3-HR last night, TOR currently ranks 3rd in the ML with 24-HR (DET-27, LAA-27) in July...No team has hit more HR in the month of July since 2010 than the Blue Jays with 182 (BAL 2nd 169).

 Edwin Encarnacion launched his 19th HR last night & is now tied
- with Chris Davis for the most HR in the ML since 2012 (131-HR).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN:

TOR continues a 6-game road trip with the 2nd of a 3-game set at **OAK**...Following this series, conclude the trip with a **3**-game set at **SEA** (**43-51**)...Are **20-28** on the road, having lost **10** of their last 16 games...Despite the 6-10 record, TOR has pitched to a 3.67 ERA (57ER/139.2)...Have lost their last **three** completed series (**4-7** record over span) on the road, **2**nd time this year (last: **May 11-31**, **1-**2 at BAL, 0-4 at HOU, 1-2 at MIN)...In fact, have dropped four of their last five completed series since June 15, posting record of 14-17 over that stretch...Of their 20 victories, all but two have been with TOR scoring five runs or more.

BLUE JAYS vs. ATHLETICS:

- All-Time:183-211...All-Time, O.CO Coliseum: 94-104...2015: 1-0 The Jays snapped 4-game losing skid with last night's victory...It was their longest losing skid since 2007-2008 (5-games)...Overall, TOR has dropped eight of their last 15 meetings since 2013...Prior to last night's win, had lost four straight in OAK (4G sweep in last series-2014), most consecutive losses in that park since 1997-1998...TOR have lost 12 of their last 20 games at OAK since 2010.
- Jose Reyes has now hit safely in 12 of his 13 games, batting .315 (17-54) with 6-SB over that span.

RUNNING AWAY WITH IT:

- Have scored a ML leading 505 runs, 83 more runs than DET/HOU who are 2nd (422)...Are averaging 5.32 runs/game while NYY are the next closest at 4.58...That is 0.74 R/G more than NYY who rank 2nd...Have the 2nd best run differential in the ML at +95 (STL+103)...Have recorded 37, 4+ run innings, 19, 5+ run innings & 10, 6+ run innings this year...TOR has had 16, 10+ run games this year...That is the most by TOR since the 2003 campaign (19).

 Became the quickest team in the ML to 500 runs (95th game) since
- BOS did it in 94 games in 2011...It's the 4th time that the Jays are the 1st MLB team to 500 runs in a season (1986, 2003, 2012)...It was the fastest by TOR to **500** runs since the **2006** campaign (**94**th game).

KING OF THE YARD:

Last night, **Jose Bautista** homered for the 3rd consecutive game, his **20**th HR of the season...It was the 1st time he has done that since Aug. 26-31, 2014 (5-straight)...In fact, that HR was his 223rd HR as a Blue Jay which places him in a tie with **Vernon Wells** for 2^{nd} on the all-time club list...Has hit 13 of his 20-HR since **June 1** which ranks 4^{th} in the AL...Became just the 3^{rd} Blue Jay in club history to hit 20+ HR in at least six straight seasons, joining Carlos Delgado-9 & Joe Carter-7 on that list.

TONIGHT'S START & HIGHLIGHTS:

- Making his 3rd start of 2015 and 4th appearance.
- In his last start on July 12 (10 days ago) received a no-decision in an 11-10 loss...Allowed six 1st inning runs, however managed to complete five innings, leaving with an 8-7 lead...The seven runs allowed matched a career high (4th time).
- In his first Blue Jays start picked up the win, going 6.2 innings in a 2-1 victory at Chicago (White Sox) on July 7...Allowed just one walk and six hits...93 pitches was most in a MLB game since recording 104 on May 14, 2014 at MIN.
- Made his Blue Jays debut in relief on July 3 at DET, tossing 2.1 innings following Jays starter Drew Hutchison in an 8-6 loss. (2.1IP, 3H, 1ER, 1K).
- Went to camp with the Cubs making four appearances in the spring (0-0, 11.57)(7.0 IP, 17 H, 4 SO)...Was released by Chicago on March 28.
- Signed with Toronto on April 2 and was activated by the Buffalo Bisons (AAA) on May 13.
- Retired the first 14 batters he faced in Bisons debut and gave up just one hit in 5.0 innings, May 13 vs. DUR (ND, BB, 3 SO)... Did not allow an earned run through his first three starts (15.0 IP, 8 H).
- Struck out a season-high 8 batters twice, 6/5 @ LOU & 6/20 @ SYR.
- Allowed three runs or less in eight of nine starts with the Bisons...AAA

- 27 starts for the World Champion Boston Red Sox... Pitched out of the bullpen in the postseason, earning his first career postseason victory in Game 4 of the 2013 World Series.
- Has posted a career mark of 17-9 with a 4.35 ERA on the road and has been far more effective as a starter posting a 4.45 ERA compared to 8.29 in 30 relief appearances.
