ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-3 since the All-Star Break, 7-7 over the last 14 games and 10-12 over the last 22 contests...are 30-23 (.566) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are tied for the third best record in the American League and tied for fifth best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 44-53 (.454) overall, which is the second worst record in the AL (Boston, 42-54)...are in sole possession of last place in the AL West for the 69th time in the last 73 days...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 69 days in fifth...the 69 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 414-369 for a run differential of +45...that is fifth best in the American League and eighth best in the majors...are 28-20 (.583) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the eighth best record in the majors...however, are 16-33 (.327) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is second worst in the majors (Toronto, 13-31, .295).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-22 (.313) in one run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...are 3-6 (.333) in extra inning, which is the fourth worst in the American League...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their first post-break road trip tonight, a five-game trip to San Francisco (three games) and Los Angeles-NL (two games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (1-2)...are 23-24 (.489) on the road compared to 21-29 (.420) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 7-18 (.280) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-35 (.514) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-16)...are batting .244 (218-for-892) against lefties compared to .259 (636-for-2454) off righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's will play each of their first 22 games after the All-Star Break in California, including 20 in the Bay Area...the first six were in Oakland and, after this three-game series at San Francisco, the A's travel to Los Angeles (NL) for two games before returning home for an 11-game homestand...Dan Otero tossed 3.0 innings yesterday and Arnold Leon 3.1 marking the first time the A's had two relievers pitch at least 3.0 innings in a game since June 16, 2000 at Kansas City (Service and Tam)...Josh Reddick hit the A's fifth grand slam of the season Sunday, which is second most in the majors (San Francisco, 6)...the A's lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (79)...are one of two teams that has not had an opponents starting pitcher toss a complete game (Cubs)...have a streak of 139 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...had two players named to the American League All-Star team (Sonny Gray and Stephen Vogt)...have seven players on the disabled list and have used the DL a total of 18 times.

A's vs. GIANTS: This is the first of six meetings between the A's and Giants this year...the A's won the season series last year, 3-1...swept a two-game series in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...have won each of the last two season series and seven of the last nine games...have lost 13 of the last 16 games in San Francisco but have won 11 of the last 13 contests in Oakland...in the previous 18 years of interleague play, the A's have won six season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 53-47 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 31-19 in Oakland and 22-28 in San Francisco...including 18-25 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in hits (92), stolen bases (20) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in runs (42) and total bases (120)... Brett Lawrie has hit safely in all six of his interleague games, going 9-for-21 (.429) with five RBI...is a .340 (51-for-150) career hitter against the National League... Eric Sogard has a 43-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage... Ben Zobrist has not committed an error in 31 games at second base and has a 60-game errorless streak as a second baseman dating back to June 19, 2014.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1990 Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in 1999 Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-2 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado), which is the second best record in the majors (Houston, 8-1)...the seven interleague games are tied with Arizona for the fewest in the majors...have a 2.00 ERA (14 er in 63.0 ip), which is the lowest mark in the majors, and a .296 (71-for-240) batting average, which is the highest mark...are averaging 6.29 runs per game (44 runs in seven games), which is second best to Houston (7.22)...in addition to this three-game series with the Giants, the A's also travel to Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and will host Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fourth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 185-146 (.559)...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-5 (.200) with a run, RBI and three strikeouts...the hit was by Scott Kazmir on June 16 at San Diego and it snapped a 0-for-38 streak by A's pitchers dating back to June 3, 2013...A's pitchers now have a .081 (27-for-335) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 154 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .090)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 23-17 with a 2.67 ERA (99 er in 334.1 ip) over the last 53 games dating back to May 23...have allowed one run or fewer in 25 of those games...have a 3.08 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...rank second in the majors in innings pitched (592.2) and fewest home runs (44)...have allowed seven home runs in six games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break.

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League in ERA (3.39), shutouts (12), opponents slugging percentage (.359) and fewest extra base hits (228) and rank second in opponents batting average (.237) and fewest home runs (80) and third in opponents on-base percentage (.299).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored two runs or fewer in 11 of the last 22 games and are batting .233 (170-for-729) with 73 runs scored over that span (3.3 runs per game)...for the season, rank third in the American League in triples (24) and fewest strikeouts (640) and fourth in batting average (.255)...have been successful in 56-of-70 (80.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors...lead the AL in infield hits (101).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four consecutive games without an error, which matches their longest errorless streak of the season (April 13-17)...have 85 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors and one more than the season total from 2006 when the A's set the club record for fewest errors in a season...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 49).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (5-9, 3.21 ERA)

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed 6.0 shutout innings in his last start to snap his three-game losing streak...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .306 opponents average during the streak, which spanned three starts from June 28 to July 9.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-4 with a 4.60 ERA (24 er in 47.0 ip) and .282 (53-for-188) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 2-5 with a 2.38 ERA and .221 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 5-9 with a 3.42 ERA (38 er in 100.0 ip) in his 16 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 13-17 with a 3.73 ERA (97 er in 234.1 ip) in 39 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

LOSSES: Has nine losses, which are tied for fourth in the American League...they are also a career-high (had eight last year)...all nine came before the break, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Was the winning pitcher in his only interleague start this year June 17 against San Diego (1 er in 7.0 ip, 1.29 ERA)...is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) over his last four interleague games and is 2-2 with a 3.88 ERA (23 er in 53.1 ip) in 21 career interleague appearances...that includes 2-1 with a 5.06 ERA (15 er in 26.2 ip) in five starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0-for-3 with three strikeouts last year...is now 0-for-8 with eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career...went 1 for 10 with eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit as a minor leaguer.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-6 with a 2.36 ERA (16 er in 61.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-3 with a 5.08.00 ERA (22 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more...has the fourth lowest ERA in the American League when starting on four days rest.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-3 with a 2.76 ERA (18 er in 58.2 ip) in 11 games at night compared to 2-6 with a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip) in nine games during the day...is tied for the Major League lead in day losses...the day losses match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last A's pitcher to lose more than six games during the day is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (8).

RUN SUPPORT: Received 11 runs of support in his last start after getting just 36 runs over his first 15 starts...also has one start with nine runs of support, leaving him with 27 runs of support in his other 14 starts (87.0 ip, 2.79 RSA)...has support of two runs or fewer in 10 of his 16 starts as his season RSA.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-4 with a 2.33 ERA (14 er in 54.0 ip) in 10 games at home compared to 2-5 with a 4.10 ERA (24 er in 52.2 ip) in 10 games on the road...over the last two seasons, he is 8-6 with a 2.52 ERA (34 er in 121.1 ip) in 25 games at home compared to 5-11 with a 4.11 ERA (60 er in 131.1 ip) in 27 contests on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.41 ERA (5 er in 32.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 4.62 ERA (31 er in 60.1 ip) in the third through sixth innings and a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .204 (31-for-152) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .275 after that (69-for-251)...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .043 (2-for-46), which is the lowest mark in the majors...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 16 starts...has yielded seven of his eight home runs to lefties...five have come with runners on base...has allowed five home runs in his last seven starts and 42.0 innings after surrendering three over his first 13 games and 64.2 innings.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 15-21 with a 3.45 ERA (119 er in 310.0 ip) in 87 games, including 37 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded the save in his final relief appearance **April 18** at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit...took the loss in his first start, a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) **April 23**...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit, a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Sa-

las, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, in April...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota **May 5**...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay **May 21**...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit **May 26** in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on **May 31**...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston **June 6**...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 12**...left with a 4-3 lead...was relieved by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego **June 17** in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 14-1 win over Minnesota last Sunday in Oakland...tossed 6.0 shutout innings and allowed just three hits and a walk while striking out nine...allowed two base runners to advance into scoring position and that was in the fourth inning when the Twins loaded the bases with two outs.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 21 of its past 26 games and has a 2.72 ERA (23 er in 76.1 ip) over that span.
- Has a 3.36 ERA (51 er in 136.2 ip) over its past 50 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.08 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (Texas, 4.47).
- Has 10 wins and 18 losses...the wins are tied for third fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fifth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (40) and is tied for the second most first batter home runs (12).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (14) and the second lowest save percentage (57.6%).
- Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (36).
- The A's are 5-32 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 37-20 when it allows one run or fewer (three complete games).

- Has not allowed a run in 12 of his past 14 games (2 er in 13.1 ip, 1.35 ERA)...has a 2.70 ERA (5 er in 16.2 ip) over his past 23 games after posting a 7.04 ERA in his first 11 contests.
- Has allowed a .162 (6-for-37) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .278 (15-for-54) with 10 extra base hits (.667 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has allowed 21 hits, 12 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, six home runs)...has the fifth highest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.505).
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (4) and is second in first batter RBI (12).
- Has faced the Giants five times in his career (4.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 so, 4.15 ERA).
