### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-54) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (52-44)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three of the last four games but are 9-9 over the last 18 contests...are 30-24 (.556) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are tied for the third best record in the American League and tied for fifth best in the majors dating back to May 23... however, are 44-54 (.449) overall, which is the second worst record in the AL (Boston, 43-54)... are in sole possession of last place in the AL West for the 70th time in the last 74 days (dating

back to May 8)...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 70 days in fifth...the 70 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 5-3 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-1 vs. San Francisco), which is tied for the fifth best record in the majors... the eight interleague games are tied for second fewest in the majors...have a .289 (79-for-273) batting average, which is second highest in the majors, and a 2.79 ERA (22 er in 71.0 ip), which is third lowest...are averag-

ing 5.88 runs per game (47 runs in eight games), which is second best to Houston (7.22)...in addition to this three-game series with the Giants, the A's also travel to Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and will host Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 185-147 (.557)...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers are 1-for-5 (.200) with a run, RBI, three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit...the hit was by Scott Kazmir on June 16 at San Diego and it snapped a 0-for-38 streak by A's pitchers dating back to June 3, 2013...A's pitchers now have a .081 (27-for-335) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 154 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .090)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 7-18 (.280) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-36 (.507) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-16)...are batting .244 (218-for-893) against lefties compared to .259 (644-for-2486) off righties.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in back-to-back games for the second time this year (May 17-18)... starters are 1-3 with a 4.82 ERA (20 er in 37.1 ip) in seven games since the All-Star Break...have a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the majors in fewest home runs (44) and tied for second in innings pitched (595.2)...have allowed seven home runs in seven games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break.

**PITCHING:** The A's lead the American League in ERA (3.44), shutouts (12), opponents slugging percentage (.361) and fewest extra base hits (231) and rank second in fewest home runs (80) and third in opponents batting average (.239) and on-base percentage (.301).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored two runs or fewer in 11 of the last 23 games and are batting .234 (178-for-762) with 76 runs scored over that span (3.3 runs per game)...for the season, rank third in the American League in triples (24) and fewest strikeouts (645) and fourth in batting average (.255)...have been successful in 56-of-70 (80.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors...have 102 infield hits, which ranks second in the majors (Pittsburgh, 106).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's had their season-high tying four-game errorless streak snapped last night and now have 86 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 49).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 10-22 (.313) in one run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...have the second worst record in games decided by two runs or fewer (16-33, .327)...are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this five-game trip to San Francisco (0-1) and Los Angeles-NL (two games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (1-2)...are 23-25 (.479) on the road compared to 21-29 (.420) at home...have the third worst home record in the AL...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383).

THIS AND THAT: The A's will play each of their first 22 games after the All-Star Break in California, including 20 in the Bay Area...the first six were in Oakland and, after this three-game series at San Francisco, the A's travel to Los Angeles (NL) for two games before returning home for an 11-game homestand...Josh Reddick hit the A's fifth grand slam of the season Sunday, which is second most in the majors (San Francisco, 6)...the A's lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (79)...are one of two teams that has not had an opponents starting pitcher toss a complete game (Cubs)... have a streak of 140 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...had two players named to the American League All-Star team (Sonny Gray and Stephen Vogt).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Thompson and Venditte are on rehab assignments...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. GIANTS:** The A's lost the first meeting of 2015 last night after winning the season series last year, 3-1...swept a two-game series in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...have won each of the last two season series and seven of the last 10 games...have lost 14 of the last 17 games in San Francisco but have won 11 of the last 13 contests in Oakland...in the previous 18 years of interleague play, the A's have won six season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 53-48 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 31-19 in Oakland and 22-29 in San Francisco...including 18-26 at AT&T Park.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in hits (92), stolen bases (20) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in runs (42) and total bases (120)...**Brett Lawrie** has hit safely in all seven of his interleague games, going 10-for-25 (.400) with five RBI...is a .338 (52-for-154) career hitter against the National League...**Eric Sogard** has a 43-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage...**Ben Zobrist** has not committed an error in 32 games at second base and has a 61-game errorless streak as a second base and has a 61-game errorless streak as a second base man dating back to June 19, 2014.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** the A's have two triple steals in the same game...Al Simmons, Bing Miller and Dib Williams turn the trick in the first inning and Mickey Cochrane, Simmons and Jimmie Foxx steal together in the fourth inning...in **1936** Frankie Hayes ties a major league record with four doubles in a game against Cleveland...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome...at the time it was the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-2, 2.93 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his fourth stint with the A's this year...was called up for the first time April 23 and logged a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in five relief appearances before being optioned May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...returned July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and had a no decision that day at Cleveland (2 er in 6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA)...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching...made one start with the Sounds following his July 12 option and was the losing pitcher in a 3-0 loss to Omaha last Sunday (6.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 0-2 with a 2.65 ERA (5 er in 17.0 ip) and .266 (17-for-64) opponents batting average in three starts compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked two batters in 17.0 innings as a starter (1.06 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...all five of his relief appearances came during his first stint.

**INTERLEAGUE:** Has made one career interleague appearance and it came earlier this year in a start and loss against Colorado June 30 (1 er in 5.0 ip, 1.80 ERA).

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .218 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .167 (10-for-60) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (12-for-41) against right-handers...however, has issued 10 of his 11 walks to lefties...opponents are 5-for-25 (.200) with runners in scoring position...has a .111 (6-for-54) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .273 (9-for-33) the second time and .500 (7-for-14) the third time.

**IN RELIEF:** Yielded at least one run in three of his five outings and walked two batters or more four times...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch... tossed 4.1 innings in his first outing April 25 against Houston, which is the longest outing by an A's reliever this year.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Colorado June 30 in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing back-to-back singles to Tulowitzki and Arenado in the fourth inning...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Blackmon... was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 1-0.

**SECOND START:** He lost his second consecutive 2-1 game July 5 against Seattle...the A's scored a run in the third inning and he blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...retired the first two batters in the sixth before hitting Cano and allowing a double to Cruz... Smith then followed with a two-run single.

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Cleveland July 11...the A's scored a run in the first and he shutout the Indians on three hits and a hit batter over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth but the A's scored once in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the bottom of the seventh and left after 6.1 innings with the scored tied 2-2.

sued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68... went 1-5 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games following his May 11 option...did not pitch for the Sounds following his July 5 option...had a loss in his only start following his only July 12 option despite allowing just two runs in 6.0 innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on.

THIS AND THAT: Went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA and .245 opponents average in five games on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-6 with a 3.79 ERA in nine starts...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...the Sounds were 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just two of his starts.

2015 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed a season-high five runs for the loss in his first start April 9 at Colorado Springs...his first win came in his third appearance of the season, a relief outing against Colorado Springs when he tossed 4.2 scoreless innings...that ran his record to 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA before his April 23 promotion to Oakland ... return to Nashville May 11 and pitched in relief in each of his first two outings...including May 19 against New Orleans when he tossed 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...returned to the starting rotation for good May 24...picked up his second and final win of the season May 29 against Las Vegas, allowing a run on four hits in 5.2 innings...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.0 innings June 3 against Salt Lake...allowed just one unearned run in that game but had a no decision in the Sounds 5-1 win...then walked a season-high four batters in his next start June 8 at New Orleans, a six-inning complete game...allowed three runs and took the loss in a 3-1 decision... tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 20 against Omaha but took the loss in a 5-3 decision...logged 5.0 scoreless innings in a no decision against Oklahoma City June 26, a 3-2 Sounds win.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the Sounds 3-0 loss to Omaha last Sunday in Nashville...blanked the Storm Chasers on three hits and a hit batter over the first four innings...allowed a run in the fifth inning on a sacrifice fly and yielded another run in the sixth inning on a Brett Eibner RBI single...three Omaha pitchers combined to shutout the sounds on six hits and three walks

**CAREER:** Was originally drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 16th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft...made his Major League debut last year, going 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA in six games, including five starts... was traded to the A's with Josh Phegley, Rangel Ravelo and Marcus Semien for Jeff Samardzija and Michael Ynoa, December 9.

**MINOR LEAGUE CAREER:** Compiled a 22-10 record, five saves and a 2.97 ERA in 96 games, including 44 starts, in four seasons in the White Sox farm system...did not pitch above Double-A with Chicago...is now 24-17 with five saves and a 3.09 ERA (133 er in 387.0 ip) in 109 career minor league appearances, including 54 starts...has allowed just 21 home runs, an average of 0.49 per nine innings.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (6-6, 3.78 ERA): Is 0-2 with an 8.18 ERA, .289 opponents batting average and three home runs allowed over his last two starts after going 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA, .236 opponents average and four home runs over his previous six starts...was recalled from Triple-A Nash-ville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-4 with a 2.76 ERA and .251 opponents batting average in 11 starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26... is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (6)... was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-1 A's loss to Toronto on Tuesday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Giants in his career...is 1-1 with a 1.29 ERA in two career interleague appearances, both starts this year...has never batted as a professional.

- Has the second highest ERA in the American League (4.13) and has yielded the fourth most home runs (36)...has the third fewest wins (10) and is tied for the third most losses (18).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (14) and the second lowest save percentage (57.6%)
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (41) and is tied for the second most first batter home runs (12).
- Has allowed 50-of-154 (32.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.
- The A's are 5-33 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 37-20 when it allows one run or fewer (three complete games).
