OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-55) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (53-44)

SUNDAY, JULY 26, 2015 – AT&T PARK – 1:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (6-6, 3.78) VS. RHP TIM HUDSON (5-8, 4.76) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and four of the last five games... went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 10-14 (.417) since then...are 44-55 (.444) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League (Boston, 43-55)...are in sole possession of last place in the AL West for the 71st time in the last 75 days (dating back to May 8)... for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 71 days in fifth...the 71 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-4 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-2 vs. San Francisco)...the nine interleague games are tied for third fewest in the majors...have a 2.73 ERA (24 er in 79.0 ip), which is third lowest in the majors, and are batting .278 (85-for-306), which is fifth highest...are averaging 5.33 runs per game (48 runs in nine games), which is fourth

best...in addition to this three-game series with the Giants, the A's also travel to Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and will host Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 185-147 (.557)...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-7 (.143) with a run, RBI, four strikeouts and a sacrifice hit...the hit was by Scott Kazmir on June 16 at San Diego and it snapped a 0-for-38 streak by A's pitchers dating back to June 3, 2013...A's pitchers now have a .080 (27-for-337) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 155 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .090)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 10-23 (.303) in one run games with the loss yesterday, which is the worst record in the majors...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...have the second worst record in games decided by two runs or fewer (16-34, .320)...are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 4.57 ERA (22 er in 43.1 ip) in eight games since the All-Star Break...have a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.79)...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...rank second in the majors in fewest home runs (45) and most innings pitched (601.2)...have allowed eight home runs in eight games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break.

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League in ERA (3.43), shutouts (12), opponents slugging percentage (.361) and fewest extra base hits (233), are tied for second in fewest home runs (81) and third in opponents batting average (.239) and on-base percentage (.301).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored two runs or fewer in 12 of the last 24 games and are batting .231 (184-for-795) with 77 runs scored over that span (3.2 runs per game)...for the season, rank third in the American League in triples (25) and fewest strikeouts (654)...have been successful in 56-of-70 (80.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors...have 104 infield hits, which ranks second in the majors (Pittsburgh, 106).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in their last six games but have 86 for the season, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 49).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (0-2) and Los Angeles-NL (two games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (1-2)...are 23-26 (.469) on the road compared to 21-29 (.420) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 7-19 (.269) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-36 (.507) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-16)...are batting .243 (223-for-919) against lefties compared to .259 (645-for-2493) off righties.

INCOMPLETE: The A's are now the only team in the majors that has not had their opponents starting pitcher toss a complete game following Cole Hammels no-hitter at Chicago (NL)...the last pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's was Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City... have a streak of 141 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's will play each of their first 22 games after the All-Star Break in California, including 20 in the Bay Area...the first six were in Oakland and, after this three-game series at San Francisco, the A's travel to Los Angeles (NL) for two games before returning home for an 11-game homestand...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston)...Josh Reddick hit the A's fifth grand slam of the season a week ago today, which is second most in the majors (San Francisco, 6)...the A's lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (79)... are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...had two players named to the American League All-Star team (Sonny Gray and Stephen Vogt).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Thompson and Venditte are on rehab assignments...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2015 after winning the season series last year, 3-1...swept a two-game series in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...have won each of the last two season series and seven of the last 11 games...have lost 15 of the last 18 games in San Francisco but have won 11 of the last 13 contests in Oakland...in the previous 18 years of interleague play, the A's have won six season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 53-49 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 31-19 in Oakland and 22-30 in San Francisco...including 18-27 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run in 14 of his past 16 games (2 er in 15.1 ip, 1.17 ERA) after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances...**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in hits (93), stolen bases (20) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in runs (42) and total bases (120)...**Billy Butler** is 15-for-30 (.500) in interleague play, which is the best mark in the majors (min. 25 plate appearances) ahead of Ben Zobrist (.481)...**Eric Sogard** has a 43-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage...**Ben Zobrist** has not committed an error in 33 games at second base and has a 62-game errorless streak as a second baseman dating back to June 19, 2014.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1977** Vida Blue tosses a complete game four hitter in the A's 2-1 win over California...it is the 100th complete game of his career as he becomes the first and only Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...in **1994** Stan Javier ties an Oakland record by collecting three doubles in the A's 6-0 win at California...Steve Ontiveros, Bob Welch and Bill Taylor combine on the three-hit shutout.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-6, 3.78 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-2 with an 8.18 ERA (10 er in 11.0 ip), .289 (13-for-45) opponents batting average and three home runs allowed over his last two starts after going 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA, .236 opponents average and four home runs over his previous six starts.

SECOND STINT: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-4 with a 2.76 ERA (22 er in 71.2 ip) and .251 (68-for-271) opponents batting average in 11 starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...walked nine batters in 16.1 innings during his first stint (4.96 per nine innings) and has 21 in 71.2 innings during his current stint (2.64 per nine innings).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (6), tied for second in starts (15), ranks third in innings pitched (88.0) and fifth in strikeouts (55)...has one of six complete games by an AL rookie.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.44 ERA (13 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts on the road compared to 2-4 with a 5.40 ERA (24 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts at home...has surrendered just two home runs in 48.0 innings on the road compared to nine in 40.0 innings in Oakland.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-2 with a 2.72 ERA (15 er in 49.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA (22 er in 38.1 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

INTERLEAGUE: Is 1-1 with a 1.29 ERA (14.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 9 so) in two career interleague appearances, both starts this year.

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .203 (14-for-69) with runners in scoring position...has a .223 (27-for-121) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .295 (65-for-220) after that...has surrendered eight of his 11 home runs to right-handed hitters...has yielded a .410 (16-for-39) batting average to the opponents number three hitter and a .400 (16-for-40) mark to the five hitter.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.80 ERA (14 er in 45.0 ip) and .233 (38-for-163) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game, a 5.50 ERA (22 er in 36.0 ip) and .309 (46-for-149) opponents average in innings four through six and a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) and .276 (8-for-29) mark from the seventh inning on.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-7 (.533) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 15 starts and walked two batters or fewer 10 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 15 starts and is 1-6 in those games...is 5-0 in seven starts with support of three or more runs.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-2 with a 5.00 ERA (10 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in the month of June...ranked fifth in the American League in June ERA...was 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts in May...compiled a 1-2 record and an 8.27 ERA in four starts in April.

STREAKS SNAPPED: Allowed four runs in 5.2 innings for the loss July 10 at Cleveland...the loss snapped the first three-game winning streak of his career (2 er in 21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA)...yielded a RBI double to Gomes in the fourth to snap his scoreless streak at a career and A's season high 19.0 innings...the game ended a six-game streak where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts (June 7-18) without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963).

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 10-1 A's loss to Texas *April 9* in Oakland...allowed the first two home runs of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career *April 14* at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed

four of the hits...took the loss April 25 against Houston to fall to 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts...was optioned to Nashville the next day...was recalled May 23 and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay **May 23**...tossed six in-nings and allowed three of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston June 7...left the game with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed six runs in the eighth inning, with Clippard getting the blown save and loss... tossed his first career complete game in his ninth ML start, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches. allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks...became the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to lose a 1-0 complete game, the third in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle)...also took the loss in his next start June 18 against San Diego for the first losing streak of his career...tossed a career-high tying 111 pitches in 7.0 shutout innings for the win *June 29* against Colorado...combined with Pomeranz and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle *July 4* in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed five of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Cleveland July 10 ... did not allow a run over the first three innings to extended his scoreless streak to a careerhigh 19.0 innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Toronto last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high three home runs, including solo shots by Encarnacion in the second and Bautista in the sixth and a three-run home run by Martin in the sixth...also allowed a RBI single to Reyes in the third and left after 5.1 innings trailing 6-0.

RHP Sonny Gray (10-4, 2.30 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 3.95 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 5-3 with a 1.37 ERA and .190 opponents average over his previous nine starts from May 3 to June 14...is 7-1 with a 1.84 ERA in 11 starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in road wins and ranks second in the AL in road ERA...has a five-game winning streak on the road and has a 1.27 ERA over that six-start stretch, which began May 24...recorded his 28th putout of the season in his last start, which ties the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 10 innings last Wednesday in Oakland against Toronto (7.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Dodgers in his career...is 1-1 with a 4.44 ERA in five career interleague appearances, including four starts.

- Has blown the save in his past two appearances (2 er in 1.2 ip) after going a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities over his previous 11 games (12.2 ip, 0.71 ERA)...is tied for third in the American League in blown saves (4) and has the third lowest save percentage (81.0%).
- Has a .175 opponents batting average, which is eighth lowest among AL relievers, but has issued 21 walks, which is tied for second most.
- His opponents batting average breaks down to .100 (7-for-70) against lefties and .247 (18-for-73) against righties.
- Has a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) in 18 games at night compared to a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) in 19 games during the day.
- Is 2-2 with a save, blown save and 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) in 10 games, including one start, in his career against San Francisco.
