OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-56) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (56-44)

TUESDAY, JULY 28, 2015 – DODGER STADIUM – 7:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a four-game losing streak, which matches their second longest losing streak of the season...the season high is six from May 6-11...are 3-6 since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 10-15 (.400) since then...are 44-56 (.440) overall, which is tied with Boston for the worst record in the AL...have spent 73 of the last 77 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 73 days in fifth...the 73 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Have lost three straight and four of their last five interleague games...are 5-5 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-3 vs. San Francisco)...have a 2.90 ERA (28 er in 87.0 ip), which is fifth lowest in the majors, and are batting .276 (94-for-340), which is fifth highest...are averaging 5.10 runs per game (51 runs in 10 games), which is fourth best...in addition to this two-game series with the Dodgers, the A's also travel to Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and will host Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 185-149 (.554)...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-7 (.143) with a run, RBI, four strikeouts and a sacrifice hit...the hit was by Scott Kazmir on June 16 at San Diego and it snapped a 0-for-38 streak by A's pitchers dating back to June 3, 2013...A's pitchers now have a .080 (27-for-337) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 155 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .090)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last two losses have been by one run and the A's are 10-24 (.294) in one-run games for the season, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (16-35, .314)...are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are the fewest in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in four of the previous seven games and are scheduled to face a lefty in each of the two games of this series...are 7-19 (.269) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-37 (.500) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-16)...are batting .242 (224-for-924) against lefties compared to .259 (653-for-2522) off righties.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed three innings or fewer in three of the last four games (12 er in 12.0 ip, 9.00 ERA) and are 1-5 with a 5.24 ERA (26 er in 44.2 ip) and .287 (50-for-174) opponents batting average in nine games since the All-Star Break...have a 3.18 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have allowed nine home runs in nine games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 46 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 42).

PITCHING: The A's have a 4.16 ERA (37 er in 70.0 ip) in nine games since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.37 ERA before the break...have a 3.44 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League (Kansas City,

3.43)...lead the AL in shutouts (12), opponents slugging percentage (.362) and fewest extra base hits (236), are tied for second in fewest home runs (82), rank third in opponents batting average (.240) and fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.301).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .206 (27-for-131) with nine runs scored over the last four games and .232 (192-for-829) with 80 runs scored over the last 25 contests (3.2 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer in 12 of the last 25 games...for the season, rank third in the American League in fewest strikeouts (659), tied for third in triples (25) and fourth in fewest home runs (81)...have been successful in 56-of-72 (77.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors...rank second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (79) and grand slams (5)...have 104 infield hits, which ranks second in the majors (Pittsburgh, 106).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 1-for-8 with two walks in the three-game series at San Francisco and are batting .192 (14-for-73) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have 14 pinch walks, which are twice as many as any other AL team...are third in plate appearances (89).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors in their last seven games but have 87 for the season, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 49).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (two games) and have now lost six of the last eight road games...are 24-27 (.471) on the road compared to 21-29 (.420) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...return home following the game tomorrow for a season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (four games), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (1-2).

INCOMPLETE: The A's are the only team in the majors that has not had an opponent toss a complete game...the last pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's was Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City...have a streak of 142 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history.

THE SCHEDULE: This two-game series marks the A's only two games outside Northern California in the first 22 games after the All-Star Break...the first six were in Oakland, the next three were in at San Francisco and the A's return home following the game tomorrow for an 11-game homestand...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston).

A's vs. DODGERS: This is the first of four meetings between the A's and Dodgers...also meet in Oakland Aug. 18-19 for another two-game series...the two clubs last met in 2012 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland...last squared off in Los Angeles in 2009 when the A's lost two of three...the A's have won five of the eight season series and lead the all-time series 16-9...are 12-2 in Oakland and 4-7 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (20) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in hits (93) and total bases (121)...**Billy Butler** is 16-for-31 (.516) in interleague play, which is the best mark in the majors (min. 25 plate appearances).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1989**, after both teams score a run in the 10th inning, Carney Lansford's 11th inning single scores Stan Javier with the winning run in the A's 8-7 victory over Seattle...in **2002** Miguel Tejada has six RBI and the A's score 11 times in their final two at bats to win at Texas, 12-2...in **2009** Adam Kennedy goes 5 for 7 in the A's 9-8 win at Boston...it is the first of two five-hit games for Kennedy in 2009.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (10-4, 2.30 ERA)

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 2-1 with a 3.95 ERA (18 er in 41.0 ip) and .232 (36-for-155) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 5-3 with a 1.37 ERA and .190 opponents average over his previous nine starts from May 3 to June 14.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest opponents batting average (.206) and slugging percentage (.280) in the American League, ranks second in ERA (2.30), third in opponents on-base percentage (.260), tied for fourth in winning percentage (.714) and tied for fifth in wins (10) and innings pitched (136.2)...has allowed eight home runs in 136.2 innings and his average of 0.53 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...also ranks fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.7), tied for fourth in shutouts (1) and wild pitches (9), tied for sixth in complete games (1) and opponents reaching base on an error (6) and tied for seventh in games started (20).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 0-1 with a 4.85 ERA (7 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 18 starts before the break...went 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 19 starts before the break last year...his 2.04 ERA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchscherer's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 9-11 with a 3.31 ERA (62 er in 168.1 ip) in 27 games after the break.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-1 with a 1.84 ERA (15 er in 73.1 ip) in 11 starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 2.84 ERA (20 er in 63.1 ip) in nine starts at home...is tied for the Major League lead in road wins and ranks second in the American League in road ERA...has allowed two home runs in 73.1 innings on the road, six in 63.1 innings at home...has a five-game winning streak on the road and has a 1.27 ERA (6 er in 42.2 ip) over that six-start stretch, which began May 24...posted a 2.51 ERA on the road last year, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez logged a 2.50 ERA in 1976.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season...went 1-1 with a 4.81 ERA in four starts against the National League last year and is 1-1 with a 4.44 ERA (13 er in 26.1 ip) in five career interleague appearances, including four starts.

WITH THE BAT: Is 0-for-2 with a strikeout and two sacrifice hits in four career plate appearances...never batted as a minor leaguer.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Recorded his 28th putout of the season in his last start, which ties the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...leads Major League pitchers in putouts...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances (47) and tied for fifth in assists (19).

IN JULY: Is 1-1 with a 3.10 ERA (10 er in 29.0 ip) in four starts in July and 6-1 with a 1.85 ERA (14 er in 68.0 ip) in 11 career appearances in the month.

29 CAREER WINS: Has 29 wins in 65 career games...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 30th game in fewer than 68 career games are Tim Hudson (52nd game), Barry Zito (61st), Mark Mulder (61st) and Trevor Cahill (66th).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 7-2 with a 1.79 ERA (18 er in 90.2 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 3.33 ERA (17 er in 46.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more...has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 0.79).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.92 ERA (5 er in 48.2 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 5-3 with a 3.07 ERA (30 er in 88.0 ip) in 13 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League and is tied for the lead in day wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 17 of his 20 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .222 (39-for-176) with one double and two home runs (.261 slugging percentage) with runners on base...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the batting average is 10th lowest...has yielded a .130 (33-for-253) batting average with two strikes, which is third lowest among AL qualifiers...opponents are batting .208 (27-for-130) with a .259 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are fourth lowest in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in four of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22)...is 4-1 in 10 starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in 11 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times, one earned run or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times...the A's are 12-8 (.600) in his starting assignments and are 36-27 (.571) when he starts in his career...is 26-1 in 37 career starts with three runs of support or more... went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 (also 1.03 in July, 2014)...finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...started the A's final game before the All-Star Break and the first game after the break to become the seventh pitcher in Oakland history to start consecutive team games...is the first to do it since Dave Stewart in 1991.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Toronto last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Donaldson in the third but the A's scored once in the fourth and twice in the fifth to take a 3-1 lead...allowed a lead-off home run to Valencia in the seventh and left after seven innings with a 3-2 lead...Clippard allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

RHP Jesse Chavez (5-10, 3.45 ERA): Is 3-5 with a 5.04 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 2-5 with a 2.38 ERA and .221 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 5-10 with a 3.67 ERA in his 17 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...has 10 losses, which are tied for second in the American League...the losses are an on-going career high and match Sonny Gray's team-leading total from a year ago...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 3-7 with a 2.81 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest...the ERA is eighth lowest in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-3 A's loss at San Francisco last Friday (3.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...is 0-1 with a 2.16 ERA in eight career appearances against Los Angeles, all in relief...is 2-3 with a 4.31 ERA in 22 career interleague appearances

- Has the third highest ERA in the American League (4.01) and has yielded the fourth most home runs (36)...is tied for the second fewest wins (10) and has the fourth most losses (18).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (14) and the second lowest save percentage (57.6%).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (41) and is tied for the second most first batter home runs (12).
- The A's are 5-33 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 37-22 when it allows one run or fewer (three complete games).

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed nine runs in six appearances for a 12.00 ERA before he was optioned to Nashville on April 22...allowed five runs in 3.0 innings (15.00 ERA) during his second stint from May 2 to 7.
- Has faced the Dodgers once in his career on Sept. 8, 2014 at Los Angeles (1.0 ip, 1 bb).
- Had a .244 opponents batting average with Nashville, including .170 against right-handers compared to .364 against left-handers...did not allow a home run in 24.0 innings...his complete 2015 stats:
