OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-56) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (56-45)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 29, 2015 – DODGER STADIUM – 7:10 P.M. PDT RHP JESSE CHAVEZ (5-10, 3.45) VS. LHP CLAYTON KERSHAW (8-6, 2.51) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their losing streak at four games last night and are now 4-6 since the All-Star Break...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 11-15 (.423) since then...are 45-56 (.46) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League (Boston, 44-57)...have spent 74 of the last 78 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 74 days in fifth...the 74 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Are 2-4 over their last six interleague games after going 4-1 over their first five...are 6-5 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-0 vs. Los Angeles)...have a 2.63 ERA (28 er in 96.0 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (San Francisco, 2.21)... are averaging 4.82 runs per game (53 runs in 11 games), which is fifth best...in addition to

this two-game series with the Dodgers, the A's also travel to Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and will host Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 186-149 (.555)...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2-for-10 (.200) with a run, RBI, six strikeouts and a sacrifice hit...now have a .082 (28-for-340) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 157 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .090)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the sixth time in the last nine games tonight...are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-37 (.500) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-16)...are batting .240 (228-for-949) against lefties compared to .259 (654-for-2529) off righties.

PITCHING: Sonny Gray tossed the A's 13th shutout of the season last night, which is tied with the Giants for second most in the majors behind the Dodgers (15)...it matches the A's team total from each of the previous three seasons...it is the A's fourth shutout in the month of July...for the season, the A's lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.360) and fewest extra base hits (237), rank second in ERA (3.41), fewest home runs (82) and opponents on-base percentage (.300) and third in opponents batting average (.239).

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray tossed the A's fourth complete game of the season last night, which is tied for second in the American League...A's starters had tossed just 12.0 innings total over the previous four games...starters are now 2-5 with a 4.36 ERA (26 er in 53.2 ip) and .261 (53-for-203) opponents batting average in 10 games since the All-Star Break...have a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.80)...have allowed nine home runs in 10 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 46 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 42)...rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (612.0).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .202 (33-for-163) with 11 runs scored over the last five games and .230 (198-for-861) with 82 runs scored over the last 26 contests (3.2 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer in 13 of the last 26 games...for the season, rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (56-of-73, 76.7%), third in fewest strikeouts (664) and fourth in triples (25) and fewest home runs (82)...are tied for second in the majors in grand slams (5) and rank third in RBI with the bases loaded (79)...have 104 infield hits, which ranks second in the majors (Pittsburgh, 106).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 1-for-8 with two walks in the threegame series at San Francisco and are batting .192 (14-for-73) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have 14 pinch walks, which are twice as many as any other AL team...are third in plate appearances (89).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors in their last eight games but have 87 for the season, which is the most in the majors... the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 49).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last two losses have been by one run and the A's are 10-24 (.294) in one-run games for the season, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (17-35, .327)... are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-0) and have lost six of the last nine road games...are 24-27 (.471) on the road compared to 21-29 (.420) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...return home following the game tonight for a season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (four games), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (1-2).

INCOMPLETE: The A's are the only team in the majors that has not had an opponent toss a complete game...the last pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's was Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City... have a streak of 143 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history.

THE SCHEDULE: This two-game series marks the A's only two games outside Northern California in the first 22 games after the All-Star Break... the first six were in Oakland, the next three were in at San Francisco and the A's return home following the game tonight for an 11-game homestand...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston).

A's vs. DODGERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2015 last night and now have a four-game winning streak against Los Angeles...that matches the longest in Oakland history against the Dodgers (June 11, 1999-June 9, 2000)...the two clubs last met in 2012 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland...last squared off in Los Angeles in 2009 when the A's lost two of three...the A's have won five of the eight season series and lead the all-time series 17-9 (.654)...the only team with a better winning percentage against the Dodgers is the White Sox (14-7, .667)...are 12-2 in Oakland and 5-7 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (20) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in hits (94) and total bases (122)...**Josh Reddick** had three hits off a left-handed pitcher for the first time in his career last night and is now 10-for-33 (.303) off lefties dating back to June 10.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to hit 40 home runs when he hits a solo shot in the first inning of the A's 6-5 win against the New York Yankees...a young rookie named Vida Blue recorded his first Major League win in that game...in **1989** Rickey Henderson steals five bases but the A's lose 14-6 to Seattle...in **1992** Dennis Eckersley saves his 33rd consecutive game to set what was then a ML record with 36 consecutive saves dating back to 1991...he would save 36 straight to start the season for a total of 40 consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (5-10, 3.45 ERA)

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-5 with a 5.04 ERA (28 er in 50.0 ip) and .302 (61-for-202) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 2-5 with a 2.38 ERA and .221 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 5-10 with a 3.67 ERA (42 er in 103.0 ip) in his 17 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 13-18 with a 3.83 ERA (101 er in 237.1 ip) in 40 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

LOSSES: Has 10 losses, which are tied for second in the American League...his .333 winning percentage is tied for fourth lowest...the losses are an on-going career high and match Sonny Gray's team-leading total from a year ago...nine came before the break, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (5 er in 10.0 ip) in two interleague starts...is 2-3 with a 4.31 ERA (27 er in 56.1 ip) in 22 career interleague appearances...that includes 2-2 with a 5.76 ERA (19 er in 29.2 ip) in six starts.

WITH THE BAT: Has a sacrifice hit in his only plate appearance this year... is now 0-for-8 with eight strikeouts and two sacrifice hits in his career... went 1 for 10 with eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit as a minor leaguer.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-7 with a 2.81 ERA (20 er in 64.0 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 2-3 with a 5.08 ERA (22 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more...has the seventh lowest ERA in the American League when starting on four days rest.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .226 (43-for-190) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (65-for-227) with seven of his eight home runs against left-handers...five of his eight home runs have come with runners on base...has allowed five home runs in his last eight starts and 45.0 innings after surrendering three over his first 13 games and 64.2 innings...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .063 (3-for-48), which is the lowest mark in the majors...opponents are 7-for-36 (.194) with runners in scoring position and two outs....has walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 17 starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-4 with a 3.21 ERA (22 er in 61.2 ip) in 12 games at night compared to 2-6 with a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip) in nine games during the day...is tied for the Major League lead in day losses...the day losses match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last A's pitcher to lose more than six games during the day is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (8).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-4 with a 2.33 ERA (14 er in 54.0 ip) in 10 games at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.53 ERA (28 er in 55.2 ip) in 11 games on the road...over the last two seasons, he is 8-6 with a 2.52 ERA (34 er in 121.1 ip) in 25 games at home compared to 5-12 with a 4.29 ERA (64 er in 134.1 ip) in 28 contests on the road.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 17 starts...has one start with 11 runs of support and another with nine...has 28 runs of support in his other 15 starts (90.0 ip, 2.80 RSA).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.38 ERA (9 er in 34.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 4.55 ERA (31 er in 61.1 ip) in the third through sixth innings and a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 15-22 with a 3.54 ERA (123 er in 313.0 ip) in 88 games, including 38 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded the save in his final relief appearance *April* **18** at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit...took the loss in his first start, a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) *April 23...* tossed six innings and allowed just one hit, a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, in April...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota *May 5...* was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay *May 21...*Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the start.

out the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit May 26 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits ... Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on May 31...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston June 6...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 12...left with a 4-3 lead... was relieved by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego June 17 in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Phila-delphia)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 14-1 win over Minnesota *July* 19 in Oakland...the win snapped a three-game losing streak...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .306 opponents average during the streak, which spanned three starts from June 28 to July 9.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss at San Francisco last Friday...tossed just 3.0 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter since June 19, 2012 at Milwaukee (2.2 ip)...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Posey sacrifice fly and a Pence RBI double, and two more in the second on a Pagan RBI single and a Panik sacrifice fly... loaded the bases with no outs in the fourth as was relieved by Rodriguez who escaped the jam with a strikeout and double play.

CHAVEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-1 with a 2.16 ERA (8.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in eight career appearances, all in relief...has a loss and a 3.38 ERA (1 er in 2.2 ip) in four games at Dodger Stadium and a 1.59 ERA (1 er in 5.2 ip) in four games in his home ballparks...has not faced Los Angeles since June 6, 2010 at Dodger Stadium (0.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)... entered the game to start the bottom of the 11th inning and allowed a walk to Martin, a sacrifice by DeWitt and a walk-off single to Ellis for the loss.

RHP Chris Bassitt (0-3, 2.94 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and started and lost that day in a 2-1 decision at San Francisco (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 so)...is 0-3 with a 2.74 ERA and .256 (22-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked two batters in 23.0 innings as a starter (0.78 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...all five of his relief appearances came during his first stint...has received a total of four runs of support in his four starting assignments (23.0 ip, 1.57 ERA)... that includes no runs once, one run twice and two runs once...has 14 runs of support in his only career start against the Indians, a 5-4 A's win at Cleveland earlier this year on July 11 (6.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 so, 1 hr).

- The A's bullpen tossed 6.2 scoreless innings Sunday, which was its longest scoreless outing since June 13, 2013 vs. New York-AL (10.0)...now has a 2.80 ERA (11 er in 35.1 ip) since the All-Star Break.
- Has the fourth highest ERA in the American League (4.01) and has yielded the fourth most home runs (36)...is tied for the second fewest wins (10) and has the fourth most losses (18).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (14) and the second lowest save percentage (57.6%).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (41) and is tied for the second most first batter home runs (12).
- The A's are 5-33 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 37-22 when it allows one run or fewer (three complete games).
