OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-57) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (46-54)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games and are 4-7 (.364) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 11-16 (.407) since then...are 45-57 (.442) overall, which is the second worst record in the AL (Boston, 44-58)...have spent 75 of the last 79 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 75 days in fifth...the 75 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a season-long 11 game homestand tonight against Cleveland (four games), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (1-2) and are 21-29 (.420) at home for the season, which is the fourth worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road.

IN JULY: The A's are 10-12 in the month of July with two games remaining...have not finished with a losing record in July since 2009 (12-14)...have scored 74 runs this month, which is the fewest in the American League...the fewest runs in July in Oakland history is 86 in 2008...have drawn just 41 walks, which is last in the majors...the fewest walks in any month of more than 12 games in Oakland history is 52 in April, 1968...have hit 15 home runs, which is also the fewest in the AL...the fewest home runs in July in Oakland history is 16 in 1977...also rank last in the AL in extra base hits (53) and slugging percentage (.357) in July, second to last in on-base percentage (.280) and doubles (33) and have the third lowest batting average (.237)...the on-base percentage is currently third lowest in Oakland history in any month (.274 in April, 1968 and August, 1972).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.36 ERA (47 er in 97.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.37 ERA before the break...have a 3.48 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...lead the AL in shutouts (13), opponents slugging percentage (.363) and fewest home runs (83), are tied for the lead in fewest extra base hits (243) and rank third in opponents batting average (.240) and on-base percentage (.301)...the 13 shutouts match the A's team total from each of the previous three seasons...four of the shutouts have come in July.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 4.45 ERA (29 er in 58.2 ip) in 11 games since the All-Star Break...have a 3.15 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 10 home runs in 11 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 47 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 42)...are tied for third in the AL in complete games (4) and innings pitched (617.0).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .235 (211-for-899) with 89 runs scored over the last 27 games (3.3 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer in 13 of those games...stole three bases last night and are 59-for-76 (77.6%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...have the third fewest strikeouts in the American League (671) and rank fourth in triples (25) and fewest home runs (83)...are batting .337 (30-for-89) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded and are tied for second in grand slams...have 107 infield hits, which ranks second in the majors (Pittsburgh, 109).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 2-for-11 (.182) with two walks on the five-game road trip at National League ballparks and are batting .197 (15-for-76) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have 14 pinch walks, which are twice as many as any other AL team...rank third in plate appearances (92).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors in their last nine games but have 87 for the season, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 49).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-24 (.294) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (17-35, .327)...are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are the fewest in the majors...have two walk-off wins in their last five home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-38 (.493) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-17)...are batting .242 (231-for-954) against lefties compared to .259 (664-for-2562) off righties.

INCOMPLETE: The A's are the only team in the majors that has not had an opponent toss a complete game...the last pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's was Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City...have a streak of 144 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history.

THE SCHEDULE: This 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Crisp, Thompson and Venditte are on rehab assignments...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lead the season 2-1 after taking two of three in Cleveland in the final series before the All-Star Break...have now won five of their last six games from the Indians...have won two season series and lost two season series over the previous four years and are 18-15 against Cleveland dating back to 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 266-230 against the Indians...that breaks down to 139-101 in Oakland and 127-129 in Cleveland...including 42-60 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 901-1023 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (20) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in hits (95) and total bases (123)...**Brett Lawrie** had four hits, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, three runs scored and one stolen base last night at Los Angeles (NL)...is the third player in Oakland history with at least all of those numbers in one game along with Rajai Davis (July 10, 2010 vs. LAA) and Tony Armas (Sept. 20, 1980)...**Josh Reddick** has back-to-back three-hit games (6-for-9) for the third time in his career (last: April 18-19, 2014)...**Eric Sogard** has a 46-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Napoleon Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier...in **2000** Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-3, 2.94 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and started and lost that day at San Francisco (2 er in 6.0 ip, 3.00 ERA)...was called up for the first time April 23 and logged a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in five relief appearances before being optioned May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...returned July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and had a no decision that day at Cleveland (2 er in 6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA)...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 0-3 with a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) and .256 (22-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked two batters in 23.0 innings as a starter (0.78 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...all five of his relief appearances came during his first stint.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received a total of four runs of support in his four starting assignments (23.0 ip, 1.57 ERA)...that includes no runs once, one run twice and two runs once...has 14 runs of support in nine career starting assignments (51.2 ip, 2.44 RSA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .220 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .181 (13-for-72) against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (14-for-51) against right-handers...however, has issued 10 of his 11 walks to lefties...opponents are 9-for-47 (.191) with runners on base...both of the two home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .127 (8-for-63) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .238 (10-for-42) the second time and .500 (9-for-18) the third time...the opponents clean-up hitter is 1-for-11 (.091).

IN RELIEF: Yielded at least one run in three of his five outings and walked two batters or more four times...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch...tossed 4.1 innings in his first outing April 25 against Houston, which is the longest outing by an A's reliever this year.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Colorado June 30 in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing back-to-back singles to Tulowitzki and Arenado in the fourth inning...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Blackmon...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 1-0.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive 2-1 game July 5 against Seattle...the A's scored a run in the third inning and he blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...retired the first two batters in the sixth before hitting Cano and allowing a double to Cruz...Smith then followed with a two-run single.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Cleveland July 11...the A's scored a run in the first and he shutout the Indians on three hits and a hit batter over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth but the A's scored once in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the bottom of the seventh and left after 6.1 innings with the score tied 2-2.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at San Francisco last Saturday...allowed a solo home run to Bumgarner in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...allowed a RBI single to Duffy in the sixth inning for the loss.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters in 69.0 innings and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68...went 1-5 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games following his May 11 option...did not pitch for the Sounds following his July 5 option...had a loss in his only start following his only July 12 option despite allowing just two runs in 6.0 innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on.

THIS AND THAT: Went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA and .245 opponents average in five games on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-6 with a 3.79 ERA in nine starts...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...the Sounds were 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just two of his starts.

2015 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed a season-high five runs for the loss in his first start April 9 at Colorado Springs...his first win came in his third appearance of the season, a relief outing against Colorado Springs when he tossed 4.2 scoreless innings...that ran his record to 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA before his April 23 promotion to Oakland...return to Nashville May 11 and pitched in relief in each of his first two outings...including May 19 against New Orleans when he tossed 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...returned to the starting rotation for good May 24...picked up his second and final win of the season May 29 against Las Vegas, allowing a run on four hits in 5.2 innings...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.0 innings June 3 against Salt Lake...allowed just one unearned run in that game but had a no decision in the Sounds 5-1 win...then walked a season-high four batters in his next start June 8 at New Orleans, a six-inning complete game...allowed three runs and took the loss in a 3-1 decision...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 20 against Omaha but took the loss in a 5-3 decision...logged 5.0 scoreless innings in a no decision against Oklahoma City June 26, a 3-2 Sounds win.

RHP Kendall Graveman (6-7, 4.13 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 10.22 ERA, .357 opponents batting average, four home runs and nine walks in 12.1 innings over his last three starts after going 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA, .236 opponents average, four home runs and nine walks in 43.0 innings over his previous six starts from June 7 to July 4...the three-game losing streak is the first of his career...is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (6)...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 4-3 with a 3.35 ERA in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA in seven starts on five days rest or more...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at San Francisco on Sunday (1.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Indians, a start and loss in a 5-1 decision at Cleveland earlier this year on July 10 (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed nine runs in six games (12.00 ERA) before he was optioned to Nashville April 22...allowed five runs in 3.0 innings (15.00 ERA) during his second stint from May 2 to 7.
- Had a .244 opponents batting average with Nashville, including .170 against right-handers compared to .364 against left-handers...did not allow a homer in 24.0 innings...his complete 2015 stats with the Sounds:
