### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-58) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (47-54)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost six of the last seven games and are 4-8 (.333) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are 45-58 (.442) overall, which is tied with Boston for the worst record in the AL...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is ½ game short of the season high (last: May 27)...have spent 76 of the last 80 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 76 days in fifth...the 76 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 11-17 (.393) since then.

**IN JULY:** The A's are 10-13 in the month of July entering the final game today...it is the first time they finished with a losing record in July since 2009 (12-14)...the offense has walked just 42 times, which matches the 1999 Montreal Expos for the fewest walks in the month of July since at least 1914...the fewest by an American League team is 49 by the 1982 Toronto Blue Jays...the fewest by an Oakland team in any month of 15 or more games is 52 in April, 1968...in addition to walks, the A's also rank last in the AL in July in runs (75), home runs (15), extra base hits (54), on-base percentage (.274) and slugging percentage (.347), second to last in doubles (34) and have the third lowest batting average (.231)...the on-base percentage is currently tied for the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (April 1968 and August 1972)...the fewest runs scored in July in Oakland history is 86 in 2008, the fewest home runs is 16 in 1977 and the lowest on-base percentage is .293 in 1972

**HOME AND AWAY:** The are 0-1 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (0-1), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 21-30 (.412) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.25 ERA (50 er in 106.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.37 ERA before the break...have a 3.47 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...lead the AL in shutouts (13) and opponents slugging percentage (.363), are tied for the lead in fewest home runs (84), rank second in fewest extra base hits (245) and third in opponents batting average (.240) and on-base percentage (.301)...the 13 shutouts match the A's team total from each of the previous three seasons...four of the shutouts have come in July.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-6 with a 4.39 ERA (32 er in 65.2 ip) in 12 games since the All-Star Break...have a 3.16 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 11 home runs in 12 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 48 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 43)...are tied for third in the AL in complete games (4) and innings pitched (624.0).

**OFFENSE:** The A's were held to a season-low tying two hits last night (also June 13 at Los Angeles-AL) and are now batting .230 (213-for-928) with 90 runs scored over the last 28 games (3.21 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer in 14 of those games...are 4-for-4 in stolen base attempts over the last two games and are 60-for-77 (77.9%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...have the third fewest strikeouts in the American League (678), are tied for the third fewest home runs (83) and rank fourth in triples (25)...are batting .337 (30-for-89) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded and are tied for second in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .197 (15-for-76) but have 14 walks, which are twice as many as any AL team and seventh most in the majors...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (92)...have 108 infield hits, which ranks second in the

majors (Pittsburgh, 110)...have nine sacrifice hits, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest sacrifice hits in Athletics history is 18 in 2007.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 89 errors, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 51)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied for the fewest in the American League.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 10-24 (.294) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (17-36, .321)...are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are the fewest in the majors...have two walk-off wins in their last six home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 37-39 (.493) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-17)...are batting .242 (231-for-954) against lefties compared to .257 (666-for-2591) off righties...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League.

**COMPLETE:** Last night, Carlos Carrasco became the first pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's since Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City...had a streak of 144 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history.

**THE SCHEDULE:** This 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Crisp, Thompson and Venditte are on rehab assignments...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The season series is even at two games each...lost the first game in Oakland last night after taking two of three in Cleveland in the final series before the All-Star Break...are batting .179 (22-for-123) with nine runs scored in the four game...have won five of their last seven games from the Indians...have won two season series and lost two season series over the previous four years and are 18-16 against Cleveland dating back to 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 266-231 against the Indians...that breaks down to 139-102 in Oakland and 127-129 in Cleveland...including 42-60 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 901-1024 against the Indians.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and is tied for the lead in hits (96)...has hit safely in each of his last 10 home games (16-for-43, .372) and is batting .362 (54-for-149) in Oakland, which is the second best home batting average in the American League (Kipnis, CLE .376)...**Josh Reddick** is 13-for-33 (.394) with five doubles, two home runs and seven RBI over his last 10 games and is batting .311 (23-for-74) in July...**Eric Sogard** has a 47-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972** Vida Blue tosses a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat Texas 2-0 in 1:52...Joe Rudi drives in both of the A's runs with sacrifice flies as the A's are also limited to two hits...in **1973** Ken Holtzman pitches all 11 innings of the A's 4-3 win over Minnesota...Ray Fosse drives in the winning run with a sacrifice fly.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-7, 4.13 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 0-3 with a 10.22 ERA (14 er in 12.1 ip), .357 (20-for-56) opponents batting average, four home runs and nine walks in 12.1 innings over his last three starts after going 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA, .236 opponents average, four home runs and nine walks in 43.0 innings over his previous six starts from June 7 to July 4...the three-game losing streak is the first of his career...went 3-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first seven starts.

**SECOND STINT:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-5 with a 3.21 ERA (26 er in 73.0 ip) and .266 (75-for-282) opponents batting average in 12 starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...walked nine batters in 16.1 innings during his first stint (4.96 per nine innings) and has 23 in 73.0 innings during his current stint (2.84 per nine innings).

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (6), ranks second in games started (16), third in innings pitched (89.1) and fifth in strikeouts (57)...has one of six complete games by an AL rookie.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-3 with a 3.35 ERA (19 er in 51.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA (22 er in 38.1 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has surrendered nine of his 12 home runs to right-handed hitters...opponents are 6-for-32 (.188) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has yielded a .439 (18-for-41) batting average to the opponents number three hitter and a .400 (16-for-40) mark to the five hitter.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-3 with a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) in nine starts on the road compared to 2-4 with a 5.40 ERA (24 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts at home...has surrendered three home runs in 49.1 innings on the road compared to nine in 40.0 innings in Oakland.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 1-3 with a 6.52 ERA (14 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in the month of June...ranked fifth in the American League in June ERA...was 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts in May...compiled a 1-2 record and an 8.27 ERA in four starts in April.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 8-8 (.500) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 16 starts and walked two batters or fewer 11 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 16 starts and is 1-7 in those games...is 5-0 in seven starts with support of three or more runs.

**STREAKS SNAPPED:** Allowed four runs in 5.2 innings for the loss July 10 at Cleveland...the loss snapped the first three-game winning streak of his career (2 er in 21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA)...yielded a RBI double to Gomes in the fourth to snap his scoreless streak at a career and A's season high 19.0 innings...the game ended a six-game streak where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts (June 7-18) without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963).

**2015 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 10-1 A's loss to Texas **April 9** in Oakland...allowed the first two home runs of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career **April 14** at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...took the loss **April 25** against Houston to fall to 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts...was optioned to Nashville the next day...was recalled **May 23** and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay **May 23**...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston **June 7**...left the game with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed six runs in the eighth inning, with Clippard getting the blown save and loss...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth ML start, an eight-hitter

in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 13**...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches...allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks...became the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to lose a 1-0 complete game, the third in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle)...also took the loss in his next start **June 18** against San Diego for the first losing streak of his career...tossed a career-high tying 111 pitches in 7.0 shutout innings for the win **June 29** against Colorado...combined with Pomeranz and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 4** in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed five of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Cleveland **July 10**...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 19.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Toronto **July 21** in Oakland...allowed a career-high three home runs.

**LAST START:** He extended his losing streak to a career-high three games in the A's 4-3 loss at San Francisco last Sunday...tossed just 1.1 innings, which is the shortest outing of his career as a starter...faced nine batters in the first inning and allowed three runs on a two-run home run by Duffy and a RBI single by Belt...allowed a RBI single to Duffy in the second and was relieved by Otero with one out in the second inning and runners on first and second...Otero got a double play and the pen blanked the Giants on five hits in 6.2 innings of work.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Aaron Brooks (0-0, 6.23 ERA):** Was acquired from the Kansas City Royals with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on Tuesday for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch and will be recalled by Oakland tomorrow...was 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...struck out 92 batters and ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts at the time of the trade on July 28...was also tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...walked just 21 batters for an average of 1.77 per nine innings...was the losing pitcher in his only Major League start, a 12-1 Kansas City loss at Toronto on May 31, 2014 (0.2 ip, 5 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...has never faced the Indians in his career.

- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and is tied for the third most first batter home runs (12).
