HAVE YOU SEEN ME LATELY

» The Indians beat the Athletics by a score of 2-1 on Friday night to extend their winning streak to 3 games, Cleveland's first of that length since reeling off 4 straight victories from July 7-10.
 » Cleveland's starting rotation continued its recent stretch of dominance, as **DANNY SALAZAR** came within 3 outs of recording the club's fourth consecutive complete game (8.0IP, 1H, 1R-0ER, 1BB, 4SO)...he retired 24 of the 27 batters he faced on the evening, including 18 straight to finish his outing...Salazar retired the side in order in 7.0 of his 8.0 innings.
 » **CODY ALLEN** relieved Salazar in the 9th and locked down his 21st save of the season, T10th-most in the A.L...was Tribe bullpen's first game action since Tuesday vs. Kansas City...**Allen has converted all but one of his 19 save opportunities since April 29, posting a 1.78 ERA, .197 avg. and 53 K's against 10 walks across 36 games in that span.**
 » Last night's win marked the Tribe's 20th come-from-behind victory of the season, as Oakland plated one unearned run in the 3rd inning to take a 1-0 lead...Cleveland also capitalized on a miscue and tied the game on an A's miscue to cap a two-out rally in the 7th...**MICHAEL BOURN** delivered the game-winning run with a one-out RBI-double in the 9th inning to score **LONNIE CHISENHALL**, whose third hit of the night led off that frame.

WINS & LOSSES

» At 48-54 (.471) and 6 games below the .500 mark, Cleveland is 7 wins shy of the club's high-water mark for 2015 (+1G, 2-1 on April 9) & sits 3 losses ahead of the club's low-water mark for 2015 (-9G, 5x, last 45-54, July 28)...the Indians .471 winning pct. is 4th-lowest in the A.L. just ahead of Oakland (.433, 45-59), Boston (.442, 46-58) & Seattle (.452, 47-57)...just 7 of 15 A.L. teams have records of .500-or-better...**the Indians have not been at the .500 mark since being 2-2 on April 10**...club pulled to within one game of .500 mark 3 times in June, but lost the subsequent game in all 3 instances.
 » The Indians have won 3 straight, but have also dropped 6 of 9, 7 of 11 and 10 of their last 16...the club has lost 26 of its last 47 games since June 7 after going 20-14 from May 1-June 6...that said, **Cleveland has played above the .500-mark since May 1 (41-40).**
 » The Indians capped July at 13-13 after finishing June with an 11-15 record...Tribe went 7-14 in April and 17-12 in May (3rd-best in A.L., 6th-best in MLB)...second time in 3 years with 17+ wins in May (18-12 in May 2013)...**CLE has not experienced consecutive losing months since 2012 when club had sub-.500 records from June-October.**
 » **Cleveland has allowed just 106 runs in the club's 48 wins (2.2RPG)** - pitching staff has posted a **2.02 ERA (436.1IP, 291H, 106R-98ER, 103BB, 473SO, 35HR)** in those 48 wins, but a 5.58 ERA (468.0IP, 548H, 326R-290ER, 167BB, 440SO, 67HR) in club's 54 losses (**6.0RPG**).
 » The Indians longest winning streak is 6 G (May 19-24), while the club's longest losing streak is 6 G (July 23-28)...**club is 20-27 following a win; 28-26 bouncing back from a loss**...the Indians are 32-8 when scoring first; 16-46 when opponent scores first.

A.L. CENTRAL STANDINGS

» Cleveland holds 5th place in the A.L. Central standings, 13.0G behind 1st-place Kansas City (61-41)...Minnesota (-8.0G, 53-49) is in 2nd place, Chicago-AL (-11.5G, 49-51) & Detroit (-11.5G, 50-53) are tied for 3rd place...Tribe's largest deficit of the season is 16.0G (July 28) - largest since finishing the 2012 campaign 20.0G back...the Indians have spent 13 days of the season in 3rd place, 58 days in 4th place and 42 days in 5th place.
 » **The Indians are 15-28 within the division** this season after going 44-32 in 2013 and 39-37 in 2014...Tribe played 17 consecutive games within the division from April 10-29, going just 5-12 during that stretch...are 9-15 since...**Indians have a 33-25 record outside the division.**

SERIES STUFF

» **Cleveland has gone 10-19-4 thru 33 series played in 2015 (2-12-3 at home; 8-7-1 on the road)**...the Indians have dropped 7 of 11 and 10 of last 16 series (4-10-2 in that span)...**8 of club's 10 series wins have come on the road** (April 6-8 at HOU, May 15-17 at TEX, May 18-21 at CWS, May 28-31 at SEA, June 2-4 at KC, June 16 at ChC, July 17-19 at CIN)...the 2 series wins at home came May 22-24 vs. CIN (3G sweep) & July 6-9 vs. HOU (won 3 of 4).
 » Cleveland has gone 10-24 in series openers (8 of those wins on the road)...in 3-game series, Cleveland owns a 10-13 record in the middle contest...the Indians have gone 20-13 in series finales and 4-9 in rubber matches...**the Indians are playing their 7th four-game series of 2015 against Oakland, going 4-1-1 with a 17-9 record in those contests.**

FOUR DAYS

» The Indians are 2-0 to begin a 7-day, 7-game West Coast swing through Oakland (2-0, two-to-play) & Los Angeles (3 games).
 » **Cleveland is 15-9 against the A.L. West this season, while the Indians .626 (57-34) winning pct. vs. that division since the start of 2013 is best in the A.L. and 2nd in Majors behind only Pittsburgh (.750, 12-4).**
 » Cleveland now holds a 3-2 edge in the 2015 season series...Indians & Athletics are meeting for second time, as Oakland took 2 of 3 decisions at Progressive Field, July 10-12...Oakland also won 4 of 6 meetings in 2014 after Cleveland held a 5-2 edge in 2013...the Indians are 7-7 at The Coliseum since the start of 2012, dropping 7 of last 12.
 » The Indians & Angels will be meeting for the first time in 2015 after Los Angeles-AL held a 5-2 advantage in the 2014 season series.

FILMS ABOUT GHOSTS

» **DANNY SALAZAR's** effort last night marked the third time this season for an Indians starter to work 8.0+ innings while allowing no more than one hit, as **COREY KLUBER** (May 13 vs. St. Louis) and **CARLOS CARRASCO** (July 1 at Tampa Bay) also pulled the trick earlier this season...*according to Elias*, it signals the first time for the Indians to see 3 such games in the same campaign since 1968 when the club got a trio of complete game one-hitters from Steve Hargan, Sonny Siebert and Luis Tiant.
 » Cleveland's pitching staff has held Oakland to 2-or-fewer hits in both games of this series so far (3 combined hits)...impressively, this is actually the second time in 2015 for the Tribe to hold an opponent to 2-or-fewer hits in consecutive games, as Cleveland also accomplished the feat on June 30 & July 1 at Tampa Bay (also 3 combined hits)...dating back to at least 1914, this appears to be the first time that Cleveland has pulled the trick twice in the same season...*thanks to John Krepp* for research assistance.

RECOVERING THE SATELLITES

» Salazar's outing last night followed 3 consecutive complete games in as many days from **TREVOR BAUER, COREY KLUBER** and **CARLOS CARRASCO** - the first time Cleveland has seen such a feat since 1994 when **Mark Clark, Jack Morris** and **Charles Nagy** pulled the trick on June 30 vs. Baltimore and July 1 & 2 vs. Minnesota, respectively...**over these last 4 games, the Indians rotation has combined to hold opponents to 5 R-4 ER on 13 hits over 35.0 frames (1.03 ERA) with 23 K's against 4 walks (.111 avg. against, 13-for-117)**...Tribe rotation had hit a brief rough patch over previous 6 games, posting an 8.72 ERA - this after carrying a 2.76 figure across 18 starts from June 29-July 21.
 » Cleveland became the first MLB team with individual CG's in 3 straight team games, ironically, since Oakland's rotation rattled off 3 straight CG's, July 31-Aug. 2, 2010 (**Dallas Braden** @ CWS, **Gio Gonzalez** @ CWS, **Trevor Cahill** vs. KC).

» **Cleveland's current starting rotation of Kluber/Carrasco/Bauer/Salazar/Anderson owns a combined 3.72 ERA for the season, which would rank as the 4th-lowest figure in the A.L. and 10th-lowest in the Majors entering today**...actual starters ERA with all outings included sits at 4.19, 8th-best in the A.L.

BRING THE NOISE

» **The Indians have gone 28-22 (.560) away from Progressive Field, good for the 2nd-best road record in the A.L. and Majors behind only Texas (.564, 31-24)**...conversely, the Tribe's 20-32 (.385) home record is lowest in the Majors.

» **The Indians have won 5 of 6, 10 of 14, 20 of 31 and 23 of their last 37 road games since May 6**...Cleveland's 3.34 road ERA is 2nd-best in the Majors behind St. Louis (3.10)...**Indians starters have allowed 3-or-fewer earned runs in 26 of the club's last 32 road games, posting a 2.97 ERA in that span since May 18** (team is 20-12).

» Coming out of the All-Star break, **the Indians were scheduled to play 23 of their next 36 games on the road through Aug. 24** at Chicago-NL (rescheduled game at Wrigley Field).

» **Cleveland has not finished a full season with a higher win pct. on the road than at home since 2005** (.531, 43-38 at home; .617, 50-31 on road)...over previous 7 seasons (2008-14), the Tribe's only winning season on the road came in 2013 when club went 41-40 away from Progressive Field.

» **CODY ANDERSON** has allowed 11R-ER across 8.1IP (11.88ERA) over his last 2 starts after posting an 0.89ERA (30.1IP, 3R-ER) over his first 4 career starts.
 » **MICHAEL BOURN** is batting .389 (14-36) w/ 4 SB's since ASB (11G).

TONIGHT'S START

» The 24-year-old right-hander is making his seventh career start/appearance today in the third contest of this 4-game series against Oakland.
 » Will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest after suffering his second loss of the year in a 9-4 defeat on July 27 against Kansas City...the right-hander allowed a career-high 7 runs in 5.2 innings of work (5.2IP, 8H, 7R/ER, 2HR, 2BB, 2SO, 81 pitches/54 strikes).
 » Will be making his first career start against the Athletics and his second start against an A.L. West team...earned the win on July 9 against Houston in a 3-1 victory at Progressive Field (6.2IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 1HR, 2BB, 1SO).
 » Is 1-1 with a 2.89 ERA (6ER/18.2IP) in 3 career road starts...has yet to walk a batter away from Progressive Field (more below).

LAST START

» Anderson was charged with his first loss at Progressive Field in a 9-4 defeat on July 27 against Kansas City...the right-hander worked 5.2 innings, allowing a career-high 7 runs (5.2IP, 8H, 7R/ER, 2HR, 2BB, 2SO, 81 pitches/54 strikes)...also allowed a career-high 2 home runs - a 2-run HR to Eric Hosmer and a 3-run HR to Omar Infante...has now allowed 3 home runs in his last 2 starts after allowing just one longball in his first 3 starts.

VS. OAKLAND | A.L. WEST

» Anderson will be making his first career start against Oakland and second appearance against an A.L. West club...the rookie earned the win in his lone start against another A.L. West club, a 3-1 victory over Houston on July 9 at Progressive Field, logging 6.2 innings of one-run ball (6.2IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 1SO, 79 pitches/49 strikes).

ON THE ROAD

» Anderson will be making his fourth career road start for the Tribe, as he is 1-1 with a 2.89 ERA (6ER/18.2IP) over 3 road contests...the right-hander has not yielded a walk in his three road outings this season, making him the first Indians hurler (since 1914) to not issue a free pass in his first 18.2 innings of work on the road.
 » The California native did not record a decision in his last road start on July 22 at Milwaukee, working just 2.2 innings in the Indians 7-5 win (2.2IP, 4R/ER, 1HR, 0BB, 1SO, 66 pitches/48 strikes)...allowed a career-high 10 hits.
 » Between AA Akron and AAA Columbus this season, the right-hander went 3-2 with a 2.41 ERA (10ER/37.1IP) over 7 starts on the road...had even better numbers at home this year, as he was 1-1 with a 1.08 ERA (5ER/41.2IP), holding opposing hitters to a .205 clip (31-for-151).

2015 HIGHLIGHTS | HISTORY BOOK

» According to *Elias*, Anderson became just the 7th pitcher in Cleveland franchise history to log more than 7.0 scoreless innings in a Major League debut - first since 2008 (Scott Lewis)...Anderson was the only one of those 7 hurlers who was not awarded a win.
 » The right-hander became the fourth pitcher in 2015 to toss 7.0 shutout frames in his MLB debut, joining Baltimore's Mike Wright (7.1IP, May 17 vs. LAA), Boston's Eduardo Rodriguez (7.2IP, May 28 at TEX) and Miami's Justin Nicolino (7.0IP, June 20 at CIN)...marks the highest number of pitchers to accomplish the feat in any MLB season dating back to 1914 (*MLB.com Stat of the Day*).
 » Anderson's 13.2 scoreless innings streak to begin his career was snapped by a Grady Sizemore HR in the 7th inning on June 29...according to *Elias*, Anderson becomes just the third Indians pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow one-or-zero runs over 7.0+ innings in each of his first two MLB starts, joining Luis Tiant (1964) and Dennis Eckersley (1975).
 » Teammates Danny Salazar and Carlos Carrasco followed up Anderson's effort on June 29 by carrying perfect games of their own through 5.0+ innings...this marks the only time during at least the Expansion Era (since 1961) for any Major League team to have starters remain perfect through 5.0 frames in three consecutive games (*Elias*)...prior to Anderson/Salazar on the 29 and 30, the trick had not been pulled in back-to-back games since 1969 by Jim McAndrew and Nolan Ryan for the New York Mets on June 24 and 25.
 » Anderson registered a career-high 8.0 innings on June 29, earning his first career win as the Tribe recorded a 7-1 victory over the Tampa Bay Rays (2H, 1R/ER, 1HR, 2SO, 100 pitches/68 strikes)...carried a perfect game through 6.1 innings before surrendering a solo HR to Grady Sizemore...marked the second time this season that an Indians starter went 8.0+ innings and allowed 2 hits-or-fewer, joining Corey Kluber's 18 strikeout game on May 13 vs. STL.
 » The California native became the first pitcher to carry a perfect game into the 7th inning within his first two career starts since RHP Juan Marichal in his MLB debut on July 19, 1960 vs. Philadelphia (*ELIAS*)...Marichal also lost his perfect game with one out in the 7th.
 » Combined with the 7.2 shutout innings the right-hander worked in his MLB debut on June 21 vs. TB, his effort at Tropicana Field made him just the third pitcher in the last 40 seasons (1976-2015) to face the same opponent in his first two career starts, while holding that opponent to one-or-zero runs over 7.0+ innings in both outings...first since Pittsburgh's Josh Fogg in 2002 against Chicago-NL (*Elias*).
 » Anderson logged a career-high (2x) 8.0 innings of work, suffering the loss despite tossing his first complete game (8.0IP, 6H, 1R/ER, 0BB, 4SO, 92 pitches/67 strikes) in a 1-0 Tribe defeat at Pittsburgh on July 4...became the first complete game thrown by an Indians rookie since Oct. 2, 2010 at Chicago-AL when Carlos Carrasco took a 6-2 loss to the White Sox in a rain-shortened 6.0-inning affair...first complete game of at least 8.0 innings by a Tribe rookie since Sept. 24, 2010 when Josh Tomlin (9.0IP) went the distance in a 7-3 win over the Royals.
 » Through his first 3 MLB starts, the right-hander had surrendered just 2R/ER over 23.2 innings to boast a 0.76 ERA...worked at least 7.2 innings with one-or-zero runs and one-or-zero walks in all 3 outings.
 » Anderson was the first pitcher in the Majors to log 7.2+ innings in each of his first 3 career starts since Pittsburgh's Tim Wakefield (4 straight) in 1992 - first in the A.L. since 1988 when 7 different pitchers accomplished the feat...is the first Indians pitcher dating back to 1914 to log 7.0+ innings while allowing one-or-zero runs in each of his first 3 career starts - first in A.L. and Majors to do so since Oakland's Rich Harden pulled the trick in 3 straight after making his MLB debut in July of 2003.
 » Is just the ninth pitcher since 1914 to toss at least 7.0-or-more innings while allowing one earned run-or-less in his first 3 MLB games.
 » The California native became the first MLB pitcher dating back to at least 1914 to toss at least 6.2 innings while allowing one-run-or-fewer in his first 4 career appearances...is just the second Tribe pitcher to go at least 6.2+ innings in his first 4 career appearances, joining RHP Mudcat Grant who accomplished the feat in 1958, going 9.0 innings in 3 of those 4 starts (went 7.0 innings in his other start).

MINOR LEAGUE NUMBERS

» Anderson began the season with the Akron RubberDucks, going 3-2 with a 1.73 ERA (10ER/52.0IP) over 10 starts/appearances in the Eastern League...Anderson was named the Indians Minor League Pitcher of the Month for April, going 2-1 with a 1.13 ERA (3ER/24.0IP) in four April starts...he finished April with 18 K's and the 2nd-lowest ERA in the organization.
 » Went 1-1 with a 2.33 ERA (5ER/19.1IP) in three starts at Columbus...won his Triple-A debut at Toledo on June 6 in a matchup against Detroit's Justin Verlander (4H, 1R-ER, 1BB, 9SO).
 » Combined, Anderson went 4-3 with a 1.89 ERA (15ER/71.1IP) and 54 strikeouts this season over 13 starts...the right-hander boasted the 2nd-lowest ERA in the Indians organization upon promotion to the Majors.
