OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-59) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (48-55)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three game losing streak last night and have lost seven of the last nine games...are 5-9 (.357) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are 46-59 (.438) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is ½ game short of the season high (last: May 27)...have spent 78 of the last 82 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...the 78 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 12-18 (.400) since then.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in three of the last five games and are 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (7 er in 35.0 ip) and .194 (24-for-124) opponents batting average over that span...have a 3.10 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 12 home runs in 14 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 49 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 44)...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (638.0).

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League and rank fifth in the majors with a 3.43 ERA...also lead the AL in shutouts (13), opponents slugging percentage (.361), fewest home runs (85) and fewest extra base hits (248), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and third in opponents batting average (.239).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .225 (222-for-987) with 96 runs scored over the last 30 games (3.20 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 15 of those contests...for the season, the A's lead the majors in stolen base percentage (61-for-78, 78.2%)...have 108 infield hits, which is second most to Pittsburgh (113)...rank last with nine sacrifice hits...the fewest sacrifice hits in Athletics history is 18 in 2007...have the second fewest strikeouts in the American League (686), are tied for third in fewest home runs (84) and rank fourth in triples (25).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last three games and have a Major League leading 91 errors for the season...the errors have led to 46 unearned runs, which is second most (San Diego, 51)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 1-2 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (1-2), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 22-31 (.415) at home for the season, which is tied for the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road...have a 2.93 ERA (158 er in 486.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-25 (.286) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (17-37, .315)...are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL...have two walk-off wins in their last eight home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 38-40 (.487) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-17)...are batting .242 (231-for-954) against lefties compared to .255 (675-for-2650) off righties.

IN JULY: The A's went 10-14 in July, the third time in four months this year they finished with a losing record...it was their first losing July since 2009 (12-14)...had a .267 on-base percentage, which was second lowest by an American League team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)...they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)...scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July...the runs were second fewest by an A's team in any month of 12 or more games over the last 36 years (68 in April, 2012).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .337 (30-for-89) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (NYY, 87) and tied for third in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .197 (15-for-76) but have 14 walks, which are the most in the American League and seventh most in the majors...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (92)...on Thursday night, Carlos Carrasco became the first pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's since Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City...it snapped a streak of 144 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Crisp, Thompson and Venditte are on rehab assignments...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's season series is even at three games each entering the final game today...have lost two of the first three games in Oakland after taking two of three in Cleveland in the final series before the All-Star Break...are batting .170 (31-for-182) with 15 runs scored in the six games (2.50 runs per game)...the lowest single season batting average in Oakland history against any team with more than three games played is .171 against Kansas City in 2012...since 1914, the A's lowest batting average against the Indians is .206 by the 1954 Philadelphia A's and the fewest runs per game is 2.43 by the 1995 Oakland A's...have won two season series and lost two season series over the previous four years and are 19-17 against Cleveland dating back to 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 267-232 against the Indians...that breaks down to 140-103 in Oakland and 127-129 in Cleveland...including 42-60 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 902-1025 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run in his past nine games and 9.1 innings (3 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and leads American League rookies in hits (96)...is batting .353 (54-for-153) in Oakland, which is the third best home batting average in the American League...**Fernando Rodriguez** has allowed just 2-of-20 (10.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the lowest percentage in the AL...**Eric Sogard** has a 49-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1924** Joe Hauser becomes the second American Leaguer to hit three home runs in a game...he also adds a double for a then-record 14 total bases...in **1933** Mickey Cochrane hits for the cycle for the second time in his career but the A's lose to New York, 16-3...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a five-hit shutout as the A's defeat Kansas City 5-0...it follows a three-hit shutout by Ken Holtzman, which followed a two-hit shutout by Vida Blue.

Saves/Opportunities: 19-for-34 (55.9%)

- The A's bullpen is 2-3 with three blown saves and a 3.86 ERA (19 er in 44.1 ip) in 13 games since the All-Star Break.
- Has the third highest ERA in the American League (4.13) and is tied for the fourth most home runs (36)...is tied for the second fewest wins (10) and tied for the third most losses (20).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (15) and the second lowest save percentage (55.9%).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and the fifth most first batter home runs (12).
- Has allowed 54-of-168 (32.1%) of inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL.
- The A's are 5-34 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 38-24 when it allows one run or fewer (four complete games).

56 LHP FERNANDO ABAD

- Has not allowed a run in his past nine games and 9.1 innings (3 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...has not yielded a run in 17 of his past 19 games (2 er in 18.1 ip, 0.98 ERA) after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Has allowed a .143 (6-for-42) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .254 (16-for-63) with 10 of his 12 extra base hits (.587 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (4) and is second in first batter RBI (12).
- Has allowed 22 hits, 12 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, six home runs).
- Has a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in 21 games at home compared to 5.40 (8 er in 13.1 ip) in 18 contests on the road.
- Is 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (2 er in 8.0 ip) in nine games in his career against the Indians.

- Was acquired from Toronto on Friday for cash considerations and reported to Oakland today.
- Began the year with Triple-A Buffalo and posted a 1-3 record and 2.44 ERA in nine starts...was selected from Buffalo July 3 and went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, including four starts, with Toronto...was designated for assignment Wednesday.
- Is 28-24 with a 4.47 ERA in 77 games in his career as a starter, 1-0 with an 8.29 ERA (35 er in 38.0 ip) in 30 relief appearances.
- Is 2-1 with a 3.80 ERA (9 er in 21.1 ip) in four career appearances, all starts, against the Indians...has not faced Cleveland since May 26, 2013.

Last Year: Combined for a 4-5 record and 5.54 ERA in 21 games, 14 starts, for Boston and Chicago (NL)...began the season with the Red Sox and was traded to the Cubs July 30 for cash considerations.

- Is 0-2 with a blown save and 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) in 13 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day DL June 18.
- Has 49 career saves, including 37 with St. Louis in 2013...his last save came on Sept. 21, 2014 at Baltimore.
- Ranks third among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8).
- Has two losses in five career games against Cleveland (3.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 so)...made his Major League debut with the Indians and was 3-3 with a 6.04 ERA in 53 relief appearances from 2006 to 2008.
- Was on the DL from May 22 to June 17 with a fractured right thumb.
- Began the year with Boston and was designated for assignment May 8...was traded to Oakland the next day for a player to be named later or cash.

- Is 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA (1 er in 8.0 ip) in four career outings against the Indians.
- Began the year with the A's and was 2-3 with a 6.29 ERA in 23 relief appearances...was optioned to Nashville June 5.
- Did not allow a run over his last six games and 11.0 innings with Nashville...his complete stats with the Sounds:

- Has not allowed a home run and his 31.0 innings pitched are third most among American League relievers that have not allowed a home run...has not allowed a home run in two seasons and 39 games pitched with the A's (40.0 ip).
- Has allowed just 2-of-20 (10.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the lowest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .100 (3-for-30), which is fourth lowest in the AL.
- Has not allowed a run in four games and 3.2 innings in his career against the Indians (2 bb, 5 so).

- Has allowed 11 home runs, which are the most in the majors among relievers...they are tied for eighth most in Oakland history among relievers and are the most since 2004 (13, Justin Duchscherer).
- Leads the majors in first batter RBI (13) and highest batting average (.419) and is tied for the lead in first batter home runs (4).
- Has faced Cleveland six times in his career (7.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 5 so, 9.00 ERA).

- Is 4-for-24 (.167) over his last eight games which has dropped his average under .300 (.299) for the first time May 27 (.293).
- Batted .258 in July after hitting .327 in May and .307 in June.
- Leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and tops American League rookies in hits (96)...is tied for the AL lead in total bases (124), ranks second in runs (45) and tied for third in triples (5)...the triples are tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a rookie...is the eighth Oakland rookie to steal 20 or more bases, the second in the last 28 years (Weeks, 22 in 2011).
- Ranks second in the AL in stolen bases (21), fifth in stolen base percentage (84.0%), seventh in at bats per grounded into double play (107.7) and tied for 10th in triples (5).
- Had his 10-game home hitting streak snapped Friday night and is now batting .353 (54-for-153) in Oakland, which is the third best home batting average in the AL...is batting .250 (42-for-168) on the road.
- Has 27 infield hits, which ranks second in the majors (Gordon, MIA 32).
- Has not committed an error and his 156 total chances are fourth most among AL outfielders with no errors.
- Is batting .471 (33-for-70) with six doubles, three triples and two home runs (.729 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

Last Year: Went 1-for-6 (.167) in 13 games over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...combined to hit .237 with one home run and 28 RBI in 119 games with Midland and Sacramento...tied for fourth in the minors in steals (54).

- Is tied for third in the American League in grounded into double plays (16).

Last Year: Batted .271 with nine home runs and 66 RBI in 151 games in his eighth and final season with Kansas City...the batting average was a career-low as was his .323 on-base percentage and .379 slugging percentage.

- Is hitting .269 (42-for-156) with 17 of his 18 extra base hits against right-handers compared to .143 (11-for-77) with a double against left-handers...the average against lefties is the lowest in the majors (Howard, PHI .145)...is slugging .487 against righties, .156 against lefties.
- Snapped a 0-for-16 streak with his fifth inning single a week ago today.
- Is 0-for-10 with six strikeouts and a RBI as a pinch hitter...is tied for second in the AL in pinch strikeouts.

- Batted .152 with no home runs and two RBI in 19 games in July...it was the lowest single-month batting average of his career to his mark of .154 in May, 2012 (min. 10 games)
- Has made each of his 52 starts against right-handed pitchers and is batting .250 (42-for-168) against righties...is 2-for-15 (.133) against lefties...each of his 152 starts over the last two years have come in games in which the opponent starts a right-hander...is 5-for-47 (.106) against lefties over the last two years.
- Is batting .286 (32-for-112) at night, .169 (12-for-71) during the day.
- Was on the DL from May 14 to June 18 with a strained left quad.
