OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-59) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (48-55)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three game losing streak last night and have lost seven of the last nine games...are 5-9 (.357) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League... are 46-59 (.438) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is ½ game short of the season high (last: May 27)... have spent 78 of the last 82 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...the 78 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 12-18 (.400) since then.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in three of the last five games and are 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (7 er in 35.0 ip) and .194 (24-for-124) opponents batting average over that span...have a 3.10 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 12 home runs in 14 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 49 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 44)...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (638.0).

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League and rank fifth in the majors with a 3.43 ERA...also lead the AL in shutouts (13), opponents slugging percentage (.361), fewest home runs (85) and fewest extra base hits (248), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and third in opponents batting average (.239).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .225 (222-for-987) with 96 runs scored over the last 30 games (3.20 runs per game), which dates back to June 26... have scored two runs or fewer in 15 of those contests...for the season, the A's lead the majors in stolen base percentage (61-for-78, 78.2%)... have 108 infield hits, which is second most to Pittsburgh (113)...rank last with nine sacrifice hits...the fewest sacrifice hits in Athletics history is 18 in 2007...have the second fewest strikeouts in the American League (686), are tied for third in fewest home runs (84) and rank fourth in triples (25).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last three games and have a Major League leading 91 errors for the season...the errors have led to 46 unearned runs, which is second most (San Diego, 51)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 1-2 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (1-2), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 22-31 (.415) at home for the season, which is tied for the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games... are 24-28 (.462) on the road...have a 2.93 ERA (158 er in 486.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-25 (.286) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (17-37, .315)... are 3-6 (.333) in extra innings, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have won each of their last three extra inning games after losing each of their first six...are 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat... the last at bat wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL...have two walk-off wins in their last eight home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 38-40 (.487) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-17)...are batting .242 (231-for-954) against lefties compared to .255 (675-for-2650) off righties.

IN JULY: The A's went 10-14 in July, the third time in four months this year they finished with a losing record...it was their first losing July since 2009 (12-14)...had a .267 on-base percentage, which was second lowest by an American League team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)... they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)... scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July...the runs were second fewest by an A's team in any month of 12 or more games over the last 36 years (68 in April, 2012).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .337 (30-for-89) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (NYY, 87) and tied for third in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .197 (15-for-76) but have 14 walks, which are the most in the American League and seventh most in the majors...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (92)...on Thursday night, Carlos Carrasco became the first pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's since Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City...it snapped a streak of 144 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Crisp, Thompson and Venditte are on rehab assignments...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's season series is even at three games each entering the final game today...have lost two of the first three games in Oakland after taking two of three in Cleveland in the final series before the All-Star Break...are batting .170 (31-for-182) with 15 runs scored in the six games (2.50 runs per game)...the lowest single season batting average in Oakland history against any team with more than three games played is .171 against Kansas City in 2012...since 1914, the A's lowest batting average against the Indians is .206 by the 1954 Philadelphia A's and the fewest runs per game is 2.43 by the 1995 Oakland A's...have won two season series and lost two season series over the previous four years and are 19-17 against Cleveland dating back to 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 267-232 against the Indians...that breaks down to 140-103 in Oakland and 127-129 in Cleveland...including 42-60 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 902-1025 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run in his past nine games and 9.1 innings (3 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and leads American League rookies in hits (96)...is batting .353 (54-for-153) in Oakland, which is the third best home batting average in the American League...**Fernando Rodriguez** has allowed just 2-of-20 (10.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the lowest percentage in the AL...**Eric Sogard** has a 49-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1924** Joe Hauser becomes the second American Leaguer to hit three home runs in a game...he also adds a double for a then-record 14 total bases...in **1933** Mickey Cochrane hits for the cycle for the second time in his career but the A's lose to New York, 16-3...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a five-hit shutout as the A's defeat Kansas City 5-0...it follows a three-hit shutout by Ken Holtzman, which followed a two-hit shutout by Vida Blue.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (11-4, 2.16 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors with a 2.16 ERA...the lowest ERA by an A's pitcher in the designated hitter era is 2.33 by Steve McCatty in 1981...now has a 2.71 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Oakland history.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents batting average (.200), on-base percentage (.254) and slugging percentage

(.272), is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), tied for third in winning percentage (.733), tied for fourth in wins (11) and complete games (2), ranks fifth in innings pitched (145.2) and 10th in strikeouts (124)...has allowed eight home runs in 145.2 innings and his average of 0.49 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...also ranks third in fewest pitches per inning (14.6), tied for fourth in wild pitches (9), tied for sixth in games started (21) and tied for eighth in opponents reaching base on an error (6).

SHUTOUT: Tossed his second complete game and shutout of the season last Tuesday at Los Angeles (NL), a three-hitter...had a two-hit shutout three starts earlier at Cleveland...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts in a month since Barry Zito had two in August, 2001...now has four complete games in his career, all shutouts and all on the road...the four career shutouts are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 12 years...has allowed three hits or fewer in three of the shutouts.

30 CAREER WINS: Picked up the 30th victory of his career in his last start, which was the 66th appearance of his career...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to win 30 games in 66 or fewer games...the others are Tim Hudson (52nd game), Barry Zito (61st), Mark Mulder (61st) and Trevor Cahill (66th).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.92 ERA (5 er in 48.2 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 6-3 with a 2.78 ERA (30 er in 97.0 ip) in 14 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League and is tied for the lead in day wins.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 7-2 with a 1.79 ERA (18 er in 90.2 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest compared to 4-2 with a 2.78 ERA (17 er in 55.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more... has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 0.94).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA (7 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 18 starts before the break...went 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 19 starts before the break last year...his 2.04 ERA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchscherer's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 10-11 with a 3.15 ERA (62 er in 177.1 ip) in 28 games after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has 28 putouts, which ties the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...leads Major League pitchers in putouts...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances (47) and tied for fifth in assists (19).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 18 of his 21 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .215 (39-for-181) with one double and two home runs (.254 slugging percentage) with runners on base... the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the batting average is third lowest...has yielded a .122 (33-for-270) batting average with two strikes, which is second lowest among AL qualifiers...left-handed hitters are batting .181 (52-for-287), which is second lowest among AL qualifiers...opponents are batting .201 (28-for-139) with a .250 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are fourth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-1 with a 1.64 ERA (15 er in 82.1 ip) in 12 starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 2.84 ERA (20 er in 63.1 ip) in nine starts at home...leads the majors in road wins and ranks second in ERA...the lowest road ERA in Oakland history is 2.41 by Jim Nash in 1968...has allowed two home runs in 82.1 innings on the road, six in 63.1 innings at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in four of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22)...is 5-1 in 11 starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in 12 of his 21 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times, one earned run or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 16 times...the A's are 13-8 (.619) in his starting assignments and are 37-27 (.578) when he starts in his career...is 26-1 in 37 ca-

reer starts with three runs of support or more... went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 (also 1.03 in July, 2014)...finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...went 5-3 with a 1.37 ERA and .190 opponents average over a nine-start stretch from May 3 to June 14...started the A's final game before the All-Star Break and the first game after the break to become the seventh pitcher in Oakland history to start consecutive team games...is the first to do it since Dave Stewart in 1991.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

LAST START: He tossed his fourth career complete game and shutout, a three-hitter in a 2-0 win at Los Angeles (NL) last Tuesday...walked a batter and struck out nine...retired each of the first 11 batters he faced before Gonzalez doubled with two outs in the fourth...allowed only one other base runners as far as second base...singled in the eighth inning for his first Major League hit.
