# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-59) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (53-51)

MONDAY, AUGUST 3, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP JESSE CHAVEZ (5-10, 3.53) VS. RHP TYLER WILSON (1-1, 2.12) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight after losing three in a row and are now 3-7 over their last 10 games...are 6-9 (.400) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...are 47-59 (.443) overall, which is tied with Boston for the worst record in the AL and tied for fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is ½ game short of the season high (last: May 27)...have spent 79 of the last 83 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...the 79 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 13-18 (.419) since then.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run in each of the last three games (2 er in 21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA) and one run or fewer in four of the last six contests (8 er in 42.0 ip, 1.71 ERA)...have a 3.08 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 12 home runs in 15 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 44)...rank third in innings pitched (645.0).

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed seven runs in the four-game series against Cleveland (6 er in 37.0 ip, 1.46 ERA) to lower their season ERA to 3.40, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors... also lead the AL in shutouts (13), opponents slugging percentage (.359), fewest home runs (85) and fewest extra base hits (248), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.299) and third in opponents batting average (.238).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .224 (229-for-1022) with 98 runs scored over the last 31 games (3.16 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 16 of those contests...for the season, the A's lead the majors in stolen base percentage (61-for-78, 78.2%)... have 109 infield hits, which is second most to Pittsburgh (113)...rank last with nine sacrifice hits...the fewest sacrifice hits in Athletics history is 18 in 2007...have the second fewest strikeouts in the American League (695), are tied for third in fewest home runs (84) and rank fourth in triples (25).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 91 errors...the errors have led to 46 unearned runs, which is second most (San Diego, 51)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the American League.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's recorded their fourth walk-off win of the season yesterday...have three walk-off wins in their last nine home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests...improved to 4-6 (.400) in extra inning games with the win yesterday and have now won each of their last four extra inning games after losing each of their first six...the 10 extra inning games are fourth most in the American League...are 11-25 (.306) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (18-37, .327)... are 6-12 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The are 2-2 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (three games) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 23-31 (.426) at home for the season, which is the fourth worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games... are 24-28 (.462) on the road...have a 2.89 ERA (159 er in 496.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 39-40 (.494) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-18)...are

batting .242 (231-for-954) against lefties compared to .254 (682-for-2685) off righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-2 (.778) on Monday's, which is the second best record in the majors (NYM, 8-2)...are batting .333 (30-for-90) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (NYY, 90) and tied for third in grand slams (NYY and SF, 6)...A's pinch hitters are batting .192 (15-for-78) but have 14 walks...lead the American League in walks but have the fourth lowest batting average...are second in pinch plate appearances (94)...last Thursday night, Carlos Carrasco became the first pitcher to toss a complete game against the A's since Jason Vargas on Aug. 13, 2014 at Kansas City...it snapped a streak of 144 consecutive games without the opponent tossing a complete game, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history... this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

**IN JULY:** The A's went 10-14 in July, the third time in four months this year they finished with a losing record...it was their first losing July since 2009 (12-14)...had a .267 on-base percentage, which was second lowest by an American League team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)... they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)... scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July...the runs were second fewest by an A's team in any month of 12 or more games over the last 36 years (68 in April, 2012).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60day DL...Thompson is on a rehab assignment...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year... have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ORIOLES:** The A's and Orioles meet for the first time in 2015 tonight...Baltimore is the only team the A's have not played... the A's won the season last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Baltimore and Oakland... it was their sixth season series win in the last seven years and the A's are now 14-1-1 in season series dating back to 1999...are 88-46 (.657) over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-252 against

the Orioles...that breaks down to 127-130 in Oakland and 128-122 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 991-932 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers... of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Fernando Abad** has not allowed a run in his past 10 games and 10.2 innings (3 h, 2 bb, 11 so)...**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and leads American League rookies in hits (97) and total bases (125)...is batting .350 (55-for-157) in Oakland, which is the fourth best home batting average in the American League...**Eric Sogard** has a 50-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933** Lefty Grove became the first pitcher since August 2, 1931, a span of 308 games, to shutout the New York Yankees, winning 7-0... in **1991** Dave Henderson hits three home runs and the A's blast a total of six, but all are solo shots as the A's lose 8-6 to Minnesota...the Twins score seven runs in the eighth and add an insurance run in the ninth... in **1998** Matt Stairs homers in his fifth consecutive game to tie what was then the Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a home run...Kansas City's George Alusik set the record in 1962 and Dave Kingman matched it in 1986...in **2002** Mark Ellis ties an Oakland record with two triples and the A's tie an Oakland record with three as a team in an 8-4 win over Detroit.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (5-10, 3.53 ERA)

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 3-5 with a 5.07 ERA (31 er in 55.0 ip) and .297 (66-for-222) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 2-5 with a 2.38 ERA and .221 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 5-10 with a 3.75 ERA (45 er in 108.0 ip) in his 18 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 13-18 with a 3.86 ERA (104 er in 242.1 ip) in 41 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

**LOSSES:** Has 10 losses, which are tied for third in the American League... his .333 winning percentage is tied for third lowest...the losses are a career high and match Sonny Gray's team-leading total from a year ago... nine came before the break, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-4 with a 2.33 ERA (14 er in 54.0 ip) in 10 games at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.60 ERA (31 er in 60.2 ip) in 12 games on the road...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League... over the last two seasons, he is 8-6 with a 2.52 ERA (34 er in 121.1 ip) in 25 games at home compared to 5-12 with a 4.33 ERA (67 er in 139.1 ip) in 29 contests on the road.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-7 with a 3.00 ERA (23 er in 69.0 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 2-3 with a 5.08 ERA (22 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more...has the sixth lowest ERA in the American League when starting on four days rest.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .226 (45-for-199) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (68-for-238) with seven of his nine home runs against left-handers...six of his nine home runs have come with runners on base...has allowed six home runs in his last nine starts and 50.0 innings after surrendering three over his first 13 games and 64.2 innings...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .060 (3-for-50), which is the lowest mark in the majors...has a .223 (37-for-166) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .280 (76-for-271) after that...has walked two batters or fewer in 15 of his 18 starts.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 18 starts...has one start with 11 runs of support and another with nine...has 30 runs of support in his other 16 starts (95.0 ip, 2.84 RSA).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-4 with a 3.38 ERA (25 er in 66.2 ip) in 13 games at night compared to 2-6 with a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip) in nine games during the day...leads the America League in day losses...the day losses match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last A's pitcher to lose more than six games during the day is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (8).

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 2.50 ERA (10 er in 36.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 4.62 ERA (33 er in 64.1 ip) in the third through sixth innings and a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.

**THE LAST THREE YEARS:** Is 15-22 with a 3.57 ERA (126 er in 318.0 ip) in 89 games, including 39 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit...took the loss in his first start, a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) April 23. tossed six innings and allowed just one hit, a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, in April...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota May 5...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 21 ... Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit May 26 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits ... Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on May 31 ... tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...was the losing pitcher in

the A's 4-2 loss at Boston *June 6*...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) *June 12*...left with a 4-3 lead... was relieved by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego **June 17** in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 14-1 win over Minnesota *July 19* in Oakland...the win snapped a three-game losing streak...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .306 opponents average during the streak, which A's 9-3 loss at San Francisco *July 24*...tossed just 3.0 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter since June 19, 2012 at Milwaukee (2.2 ip).

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 10-7 loss at Los Angeles (NL) last Wednesday...allowed a RBI single to Ethier in the first inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...surrendered a two-run home run to Puig in the bottom of the fourth but the A's scored a run in the fifth and he left after five innings with the scored tied 2-2.

**CHAVEZ vs. BALTIMORE:** Is 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (6.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, all in relief...last faced the Orioles Aug. 23, 2013 at Baltimore (2.2 ip, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...relieved Straily with one out in the fourth innings and the A's trailing 6-3...retired eight of the first nine batters he faced before walking McLouth to start the seventh...was relieved by Cook, who allowed the inherited runner to score...his other three appearances came in his home ballparks (4 er in 4.0 ip, 9.00 ERA).

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (0-4, 3.10 ERA): Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his five starts but is 0-4 with a 3.00 ERA...is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least five innings and allow three runs or fewer in five consecutive games without recording a win...has received a total of five runs of support in his five starting assignments (30.0 ip, 1.50 ERA)... has walked three batters in 30.0 innings as a starter (0.90 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts since his return...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss to Cleveland last Thursday (7.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the Orioles in his career...was 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville.

#### 11-20, 4.09 ERA (134 er in 295.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 19-for-34 (55.9%)

- The A's bullpen is 3-3 with three blown saves and a 3.61 ERA (19 er in 47.1 ip) in 14 games since the All-Star Break.
- Has the third highest ERA in the American League (4.09) and has yielded the fifth most home runs (36)...is tied for the second fewest wins (11) and tied for the third most losses (20).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (15) and the second lowest save percentage (55.9%).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and the fifth most first batter home runs (12).
- Has allowed 54-of-168 (32.1%) of inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.
- The A's are 5-34 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 39-24 when it allows one run or fewer (four complete games).
