### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-60) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (54-51)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 4, 2015 - O.CO COLISEUM - 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP CHRIS BASSITT (0-4, 3.10) VS. RHP MIGUEL GONZALEZ (9-7, 4.28) CSNCA - A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) - EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games and eight of the last 11...are 6-10 (.375) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 47-60 (.439) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is ½ game short of the season high (last: May 27)...have spent 80 of the last 84 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...the 80 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 13-19 (.406) since then.

STARTING PITCHING: Jesse Chavez allowed six runs last night after A's starters allowed nine runs over the previous six games and 42.0 innings... starters now have a 3.15 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 14 home runs in 16 games since the All-Star Break after allowing three home runs in the final 15 games before the break...have surrendered 51 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 44)...rank fourth in innings pitched (648.2).

PITCHING: The A's allowed nine runs last night after yielding seven runs in the four-game series against Cleveland to start the homestand...have a 3.45 ERA, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (13), opponents slugging percentage (.362), fewest home runs (87) and fewest extra base hits (254), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and third in opponents batting average (.240).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .155 (24-for-155) with 11 runs scored over the first five games on the homestand (2.20 runs per game)...are hitting .223 (235-for-1054) with 100 runs scored over the last 32 games (3.13 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 17 of those contests...for the season, the A's rank second in majors in stolen base percentage (61-for-79, 77.2%) and infield hits (109)... rank last with nine sacrifice hits...the fewest sacrifice hits in Athletics history is 18 in 2007...have the second fewest home runs in the American League (86), the third fewest strikeouts (701) and rank fourth in triples (25).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors in the last five games and have a Major League leading 92 for the season...Marcus Semien has 29 and Brett Lawrie 20, which ranks first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 46 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 52)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 2-3 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (0-1) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 23-32 (.418) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road... have a 2.99 ERA (168 er in 505.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their fourth walk-off win of the season Sunday...have three walk-off wins in their last 10 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests...improved to 4-6 (.400) in extra inning games with the win Sunday and have now won each of their last four extra inning games after losing each of their first six...the 10 extra inning games are fourth most in the American League...are 11-25 (.306) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (18-37, .327)...are 6-12 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-19 (.296) when the opponent starts a lefthander compared to 39-41 (.488) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-18)...are batting .242 (231-for-954) against lefties compared to .253 (688-for-2717) off righties...the A's have not faced a left-handed pitcher (starter or reliever) since last Wednesday.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .333 (30-for-90) with five home runs and 81 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (NYY, 90) and tied for third in grand slams (NYY and SF, 6)...A's pinch hitters are batting .192 (15-for-78) but have 14 walks... lead the American League in walks but have the fourth lowest batting average...are second in pinch plate appearances (94)...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area... the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

IN JULY: The A's went 10-14 in July, the third time in four months this year they finished with a losing record...it was their first losing July since 2009 (12-14)...had a .267 on-base percentage, which was second lowest by an American League team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)... they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)... scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July...the runs were second fewest by an A's team in any month of 12 or more games over the last 36 years (68 in April, 2012).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60day DL...Thompson is on a rehab assignment...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year. have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lost the first meeting of 2015 last night after winning the season last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Baltimore and Oakland...it was their sixth season series win in the last seven years and the A's are now 14-1-1 in season series dating back to 1999...are 88-47 (.652) over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-253 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 127-131 in Oakland and 128-

122 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 991-933 against the Orioles/Browns/ Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run in his past 10 games and 10.2 innings (3 h, 2 bb, 11 so)...Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (21) and multiple hit games (29) and leads American League rookies in hits (97) and total bases (125)...is batting .342 (55-for-161) in Oakland, which is the seventh best home batting average in the American League... Eric Sogard has a 51-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1910 Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...in 1992 Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...in 2002 Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-4, 3.10 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts since his return...was called up for the first time April 23 and logged a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in five relief appearances before being optioned May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...returned July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and had a no decision that day at Cleveland (2 er in 6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA)...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his five starts but is 0-4 with a 3.00 ERA (10 er in 30.0 ip) and .255 (28-for-110) opponents batting average...is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least five innings and allow three runs or fewer in five consecutive games without recording a win (last: Vin Mazzaro, Aug. 3-26, 2010)...is the only one of those six pitchers with four losses during their streak...the losing streak matches the longest by an Athletic this year (Kazmir, May 6-June 5)...was 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked three batters in 30.0 innings as a starter (0.90 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...all five of his relief appearances came during his first stint.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received a total of five runs of support in his five starting assignments (30.0 ip, 1.50 ERA)...that includes no runs once, one run three times and two runs once...has 15 runs of support in 10 career starting assignments (58.2 ip, 2.30 RSA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued 11 of his 12 walks to left-handed hitters...has a .167 (12-for-72) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .220 (11-for-50) the second time and .400 (10-for-25) the third time.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 5.40 ERA (3 er in 5.0 ip) in the first inning, a 0.89 ERA (2 er in 20.1 ip) in innings two through five and a 5.28 ERA (9 er in 15.1 ip) from the sixth inning on.

**IN RELIEF:** Yielded at least one run in three of his five outings and walked two batters or more four times...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch... tossed 4.1 innings in his first outing April 25 against Houston, which matches the longest outing by an A's reliever this year.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Colorado June 30 in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing back-to-back singles to Tulowitzki and Arenado in the fourth inning...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Blackmon... was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 1-0.

**SECOND START:** He lost his second consecutive 2-1 game July 5 against Seattle...the A's scored a run in the third inning and he blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...retired the first two batters in the sixth before hitting Cano and allowing a double to Cruz... Smith then followed with a two-run single.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Cleveland July 11...the A's scored a run in the first and he shutout the Indians on three hits and a hit batter over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth but the A's scored once in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the bottom of the seventh and left after 6.1 innings with the scored tied 2-2.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at San Francisco July 25...allowed a solo home run to Bumgarner in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...allowed a RBI single to Duffy in the sixth inning for the loss.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Cleveland last Thursday in Oakland...struck out a career-high six...allowed three runs in the first inning on an error and a two-run home run by Santana... then retired 18 of the final 21 batters he faced, blanking the Indians on two hits and a walk over his final six innings...Carrasco tossed a two-hitter for Cleveland.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters in 69.0 innings and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68... went 1-5 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games following his May 11 option...did not pitch for the Sounds following his July 5 option...had a loss in his only start following his only July 12 option despite allowing just two runs in 6.0 innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on.

THIS AND THAT: Went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA and .245 opponents average in five games on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-6 with a 3.79 ERA in nine starts...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...the Sounds were 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just two of his starts.

2015 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: His first win came in his third appearance of the season, a relief outing against Colorado Springs when he tossed 4.2 scoreless innings...that ran his record to 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA before his April 23 promotion to Oakland...return to Nashville May 11 and pitched in relief in each of his first two outings...returned to the starting rotation for good May 24...picked up his second and final win of the season May 29 against Las Vegas, allowing a run on four hits in 5.2 innings...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.0 innings June 3 against Salt Lake...allowed just one unearned run in that game but had a no decision in the Sounds 5-1 win...then walked a season-high four batters in his next start June 8 at New Orleans, a six-inning complete game...allowed three runs and took the loss in a 3-1 decision...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 20 against Omaha but took the loss in a 5-3 decision...logged 5.0 scoreless innings in a no decision against Oklahoma City June 26, a 3-2 Sounds win.

- The A's bullpen is 3-3 with three blown saves and a 3.76 ERA (22 er in 52.2 ip) in 15 games since the All-Star Break.
- Has the third highest ERA in the American League (4.11) and has yielded the fifth most home runs (36)...is tied for the second fewest wins (11) and tied for the third most losses (20).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (15) and the second lowest save percentage (55.9%)
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and the fifth most first batter home runs (12).
- Has allowed 54-of-170 (31.8%) of inherited runners to score, which is the sixth highest percentage in the AL.
- The A's are 5-35 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 39-24 when it allows one run or fewer (four complete games).

- Has not allowed a run in his past 10 games and 10.2 innings (3 h, 2 bb, 11 so)...has not yielded a run in 18 of his past 20 games (2 er in 20.0 ip, 0.90 ERA) after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Has allowed a .136 (6-for-44) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .246 (16-for-65) with 10 of his 12 extra base hits (.569 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (4) and is second
