OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-61) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (60-49)

THURSDAY, AUGUST 6, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP AARON BROOKS (1-0, 3.09) VS. RHP SCOTT FELDMAN (4-5, 4.58) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost nine of the last 13 games and are 7-11 (.389) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 48-61 (.440) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and have spent 82 of the last 86 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8)... the 82 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 14-20 (.412) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 82 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League and rank sixth in the majors with a 3.45 ERA...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...the shutouts are second most by an A's team over the last 12 years (17 in 2010)...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.362), fewest home runs (88) and fewest extra base hits (259), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and third in opponents batting average (.240).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last six games (11 er in 37.1 ip, 2.65 ERA) and have a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 51 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors to Pittsburgh (46), and have tossed 66.1 innings, which is second most behind New York-NL (681.1).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .178 (39-for-219) with 19 runs scored over the first seven games on the homestand (2.71 runs per game)...are hitting .224 (250-for-1118) with 108 runs scored over the last 34 games (3.18 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 17 of those contests...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (64-for-84, 76.2%) and fewest home runs (85), third in fewest strikeouts (720), fourth in triples (26) and tied for fourth in doubles (188)...rank second in the majors with 109 infield hits (Pittsburgh, 113)...are last in the majors with nine sacrifice hits, a figure which is currently tied with the 2005 Texas Rangers for the fewest in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 92 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 29 and Brett Lawrie 20, which ranks first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 46 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the AL.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 11-25 (.306) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (18-37, .327)... had their four-game extra inning winning streak snapped yesterday and are now 4-7 (.364) in games longer than nine innings...are tied for the third most extra inning games in the American League (11) and have the fourth worst record...are 6-13 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most in the AL...have three walk-off wins in their last 12 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 3-4 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (four games)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 24-33 (.421) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...the worst home winning percentages in Oakland history are .383 (1979), .429 (1994) and .432 (1977 and 1997)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road...begin a seven-game road trip to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (four games) on Tuesday...it will be the A's last trip to the Eastern time zone...have a 3.01

ERA (175 er in 524.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-20 (.286) when the opponent starts a lefthanded pitcher compared to 40-41 (.494) when they start a right-hander... the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-19)... are batting .241 (237-for-985) against lefties compared to .253 (697-for-2750) off righties...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .326 (30-for-92) with five home runs and 82 RBI with the bases loaded...are tied for second in the majors in RBI with the bases loaded and tied for third in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .188 (15-for-80) but have 15 walks...have the fourth lowest pinch-batting average in the American League but lead the league and are tied for fifth in the majors in walks...are tied for second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (97)...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch, which began immediately following the All-Star Break, where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

IN JULY: The A's went 10-14 in July, the third time in four months this year they finished with a losing record...it was their first losing July since 2009 (12-14)...had a .267 on-base percentage, which was second lowest by an American League team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)... they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)... scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July...the runs were second fewest by an A's team in any month of 12 or more games over the last 36 years (68 in April, 2012).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60day DL...Thompson is on a rehab assignment...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year... have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 3-6 against Houston...are 3-3 in Houston and 0-3 in Oakland...have a four-game losing streak in Oakland...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 34-19...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...11 of the A's 19 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-9 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run in his past 11 games and 11.2 innings (5 h, 2 bb, 13 so)...**Billy Burns** stole his 22nd base of the season yesterday, which matches the most by an A's rookie over the last 28 years (Weeks, 2011)...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (29)...tops American League rookies in hits (99) and total bases (127)...**Ike Davis** has hit safely in each of his six games against Houston this year and has an eight-game hitting streak against the Astros (10-for-24, .417)...**Eric Sogard** has a 52-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads AL second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1923** Joe Hauser has five hits and Sammy Hale and Bing Miller add four each as the A's collect 22 hits in a 14-4 win over Chicago...in **1933** Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in **2001** the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (1-0, 3.09 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the third of his career...was acquired from the Kansas City Royals with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland last Saturday...allowed one run in 7.1 innings that day against Cleveland for his first Major League win...was 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha.

WITH KANSAS CITY: Was recalled for the first time April 26 as the 26th man but did not pitch...recalled for his second stint May 12 and made one appearance on May 15 against New York, retiring the side in order in the ninth inning of the Royals 12-1 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...was optioned following the game...recalled for a third time June 20 and pitched the next day against Boston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was optioned back to Omaha the next day...was recalled July 7 as the 26th man and stayed one more day without pitching before he was optioned to Omaha for the final time July 8.

LAST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first start with the A's, a 5-1 victory over Cleveland last Saturday in Oakland...retired 13 of the first 14 batters he faced, allowing just a two-out single to Brantley in the first inning...then allowed his only home run on a one-out solo home run by Chisenhall in the fifth...that was the only run he would allow in 7.1 innings.

WITH OMAHA: Went 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...struck out 92 batters and ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts at the time of the trade on July 28...was also tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...walked just 21 batters for an average of 1.77 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .282 opponents batting average, including .259 (51-for-197 against left-handed hitters compared to .303 (67-for-221) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his nine home runs to righties...six were solo shots...yielded five home runs in his first four starts and 20.1 innings, four home runs over his final 14 games and 86.1 innings.

THIS AND THAT: Went 3-1 with a 3.09 ERA in eight games on the road compared to 3-4 with a 4.20 ERA in 10 starts at home...was 3-1 with a 2.35 ERA and .183 opponents batting average during the day, 3-4 with a 4.09 ERA and .307 opponents average in 14 starts at night...the Storm Chasers were 12-5 (.706) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer and tossed at least five innings in each of his 18 appearances.

OMAHA HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in his first start of the season April 9 at New Orleans, but allowed just three runs and had a no decision in a 10-6, 10-inning Omaha win...made his lone relief appearance in his second outing, April 15 at Memphis...entered the game to start the third inning with a 2-1 lead but ended up taking the loss in a 4-2 decision (5.0 in 4-2-2 and 2-1 lead but ended up taking the loss in a 4-2 decision (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...was 0-2 with a 4.70 ERA over his first three games before his promotion to Kansas City April 26...returned the next day and picked up the win in consecutive starts on April 28 at Oklahoma City and May 3 at Colorado Springs to start a sevenstart stretch where he went 4-1 with a 2.95 ERA ... struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings May 8 against Oklahoma City...allowed just two runs but took the loss in a 2-1 decision...was sent to Kansas City for the second time May 12 and was optioned back to Omaha May 15...allowed a season-high four runs (first of four times) May 21 against Reno but picked up the win in a 9-6 Storm Chasers win...matched his season high with nine strikeouts May 31 at Albuquerque...matched his season high by allowing 10 hits in 7.0 innings in a no decision against lowa, June 16...was promoted to Kansas City a third time June 20...then went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA over his first five starts from June 27 to July 21 following his return...joined the Royals for his fourth stint July 7...tossed his lone complete game of

CAREER: Was drafted by Kansas City in the ninth round of the 2011 draft... is 42-32 with 4.21 ERA in 111 career minor league appearances, including 106 starts, over five professional seasons...made his Major League debut with two stints with the Royals in 2014...compiled a 43.88 ERA in two games, including one start...is now 1-1 with a 10.67 ERA (17 er in 14.1 ip) in five career appearances, including two starts...was named Pitcher of the Year at Triple-A Omaha in 2014 and also earned Pacific Coast League Postseason MVP honors after tossing a two-hit shutout to clinch the PCL title...earned Northwest Arkansas Pitcher of the Year honors in 2013 and was a Pioneer League All-Star in 2011.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (11-4, 2.12 ERA): Ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors with a 2.12 ERA...the lowest ERA by an A's pitcher in the designated hitter era is 2.33 by Steve McCatty in 1981... now has a 2.69 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Oakland history... has compiled a 1.17 ERA and .205 opponents batting average over his last three starts but has just one win and two no decisions...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 7-2 with a 1.75 ERA in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 4-2 with a 2.78 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more...has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 0.94)...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's win in 10 innings over Cleveland last Sunday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 7 so)...is 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA in four career starts against the Astros, including a loss in his only start this year May 19 at Houston (5.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so).

- Has the fewest saves in the AL (19), the second lowest save percentage (55.9%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (15).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and the fifth most first batter home runs (12).
- The A's are 5-36 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 40-24 when it allows one run or fewer (four complete games).
