THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:

Aug. 6

2000 - Chris Truby has a career night with a grand slam and 6 RBI in an 8-1 win over Montreal. Jeff Bagwell adds four hits. Scott Elarton scatters four hits to pick up his 12th win of the season.

1990 - Although he goes in as a member of the Reds, Joe Morgan becomes the 1st player inducted into baseball's Hall of Fame who has played a significant part of his career with Houston (1963-1971). Morgan won two NL MVPs and two World Series titles while with Cincinnati as a key member of the Big Red Machine.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros and A's begin a 4-game series at O.co Coliseum tonight...**RHP Scott Feldman** (4-5) will start for the Astros vs. A's **RHP Aaron Brooks** (1-0)...Feldman defeated the A's, 9-3, on 4/25 at O.co earlier this season (6.2 IP, 3 ER).

ROLE REVERSAL AT THE 'O'?: The Astros swept a 3-game series from the A's in their 1st visit to O.co in 2015 (4/24-26)...HOU has won 4 straight and five of their last six here in OAK... prior to that, the Astros were just 4-15 in their 1st 19 games at this venue...HOU is 6-3 overall vs. the A's this season.

ABOUT THE TRIP: Tonight is the 4th game (0-3 thus far) of a 9-game road trip for the Astros... they were swept in a 3-game set at TEX (Mon-Wed) on the 1st stop of the trip...following this 4-game set in OAK (8/6-9), the Astros will take on the defending champion Giants in a 2-game series at SF (8/11-12).

IN THE STANDINGS: At 60-49 (.550), the Astros are in 1st place in the AL West with a 2.0-game lead over the 2nd-place Angels...the last time the Astros were in sole possession of 1st place in their division this late in a season was on Sept. 21, 2003, when they were 84-71 and leading the NL Central Division by 0.5 game...**By Comparison:** through Aug. 6 of last season, the Astros were 47-67 and 22.5 games behind the 1st place A's.

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1999: The Astros 60-49 (.550) record is their best after 109 games since 1999, when they were 66-43 (.606).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros were edged by the Rangers by a 4-3 score for the 2nd consecutive night on Wednesday in Arlington...**LHP Scott Kazmir** (6-6) took his 1st loss since joining the Astros...three of the four runs he allowed in 5.2 IP were unearned...offensively, the Astros managed to tally a season-high eight walks, but were held to just four hits...**Jed Lowrie** was 1x2 with an RBI-double and two walks.

PITCHING IN: The Astros are 2nd in the AL in both overall team ERA (3.54) and bullpen ERA (2.74)...two pitchers in the Astros starting rotation are in the top three in the AL for lowest ERA.

HOMER-HAPPY: The Astros lead the Majors in HR with 152...they have hit multiple home runs in 45 games this season, which also ranks 1st in the Majors... they are 38-7 in those 45 contests... HOU is 3rd in the AL in runs scored (488).

WHAT A STEAL: The Astros lead the AL in stolen bases with 81...Jose Altuve's 28 steals are tops in the AL as well...Altuve led the AL in steals in 2014 with 56.

RECENT STROS: The Astros are 2-3 in their last five games and 5-4 in their last nine...**SINCE THE BREAK:** HOU is 11-7 (.611) since the All-Star Break, outscoring opponents 93-62 in that span.

100 CLUB: Carlos Gomez' solo HR Tues. night at TEX off RHP Yovani Gallardo was the 100th of his career.

AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH: **LHP Scott Kazmir** was named AL Pitcher of the Month on Monday after an historic month of July...for the month, he was 2-0 in five starts with an 0.26 ERA (1ER/34IP), giving him the 3rd-lowest ERA for July in MLB history...marked the 2nd time Kazmir has won this award, with the other coming in May of 2008 while with TB...Astros pitchers have now won the AL Pitcher of the Month Award three times in 2015, with **LHP Dallas Keuchel** winning in both April and May.

DYNAMIC DUO: Astros starters **LHP Dallas Keuchel** and **RHP Collin McHugh** both sport 13-5 records, tying them for the AL lead in victories...their 26 combined wins are tops among any two starters in the Majors...the last time the Astros had two pitchers with 13 or more wins in the same season was in 2006 (**Roy Oswalt: 15-8; Andy Pettitte: 14-13**).

20-GAME WINNER: With Sunday's 4-1 win vs. ARI, **RHP Collin McHugh** has now posted a 20-5 record in 32 starts over the course of one year (since 8/1/2014) with a 3.47 ERA (79ER/205IP)... he leads the Majors in wins in that span.

CALIENTE CARLOS: Rookie **SS Carlos Correa** is T-2nd in the AL in extra-base hits with 27 since making his ML debut on June 8...he currently leads all AL SS's in HR despite playing in just 50g, and is the only SS in the last century to tally 13 HR in his 1st 50 ML gms...among AL rookies, Correa ranks 1st in slugging (.553), 2nd in HR (13) and T-3rd in doubles (13) and RBI (34)...**Youngblood:** At 20 years old, Correa is currently the youngest position player in the Majors.

GRAND SALAMIS: **Jason Castro's** grand slam Mon. night at TEX was the 3rd of his career and the 2nd by an Astro in 2015...the other was by **Hank Conger** on 8/1 vs. ARI...according to Elias, it is the 1st time that two Astros catchers have hit slams in the same season since 1985 (**Mark Bailey-2; Alan Ashby-1**).

CATCHING ON: The Astros have received tremendous production from catchers **Jason Castro** and **Hank Conger** over the past nine games...in that span, the two backstops have combined to hit .375 (12x32) with five HR and 17 RBI...below are their individual numbers:

Castro: 5g, .300, 20 AB, 6 H, 3 HR, 10 RBI, .850 SLG
Conger: 4g, .500, 12 AB, 6 H, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 1.083 SLG

HOME-COOKIN: The Astros have won 14 of their last 16 at Minute Maid Park...HOU has the best overall home record in the AL at 38-18 (.679).

SPREADING THE WEALTH: The Astros have 8 players with 10-or-more homers this season...the franchise record is 9, set in 2000...**Jose Altuve** (9 HR) and **Hank Conger** (8) are closing in on 10.

WORKHORSE: In his last start, **LHP Dallas Keuchel** set a franchise record by hurling at least 6.0 inn. in his 33rd cons. start...Keuchel, the AL starter for the All-Star Game, is 2nd in the AL in IP (157.2), T-1st in wins (13) and 3rd in ERA (2.35).

LAST START - 7/31 vs. ARI: did not factor into the decision after allowing 3 runs on 7 hits in 5.1 innings in the Astros 6-4 loss in 10 innings to the D-backs...left the game carrying a 4-3 lead.

ABOUT FELDMAN: the 32-year-old veteran will make his 4th start tonight after being activated from the 15-day Disabled List...was originally placed on the DL on May 29 (retro to May 27) with a torn right medial meniscus in his knee.

- since his return from the DL, has posted a 3.86 ERA (8ER/18.2IP) in his 3 starts.

- is in his 11th Major League season...is in the 2nd year of a 3-year contract he signed with Houston as free-agent on Dec. 6, 2013, and will remain in an Astros uniform through the 2016 season.

THAT'S QUALITY: has 8 quality starts in his 13 chances this season, giving him quality starts in 15 of his last 20 appearances dating back to Aug. 20, 2014...over that stretch, Feldman has posted a 3.54 ERA (51ER/129.2IP).

MASTERING THE MAGNUS EFFECT: according to PITCHf/x, has thrown the 5th-highest percentage of curveballs (22.6%) and highest percentage of cutters (38.1%) among American League pitchers (min. 70IP).

- last season, he threw the highest percent of curveballs among all Major League pitchers at 28.9%.

SETTLING IN: has had trouble in the 1st inning of his starts this season, allowing 11 earned runs in 13.0 innings for a 7.62 ERA...has allowed 29 earned runs in the 2nd through 7th innings of his starts (65.2IP) for a 3.97 ERA.

- opponents are hitting .260 (65x250) against him from the 2nd inning on, as opposed to .411 (23x56) in the 1st inning.

FLIP THE SWITCH: started his season with a 2-3 record and a 5.50 ERA (21ER/34.1IP) in his 1st 6 starts (April 8-May 5)...allowed a .314 opponents average with a 1.43 WHIP.

- in his last 7 starts (since May 10) is 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA (19ER/44.1IP)...opponents have hit .266 and he's lowered his WHIP to 1.26 in that span.

vs. OAK: a Bay Area resident, Feldman will make his 29th appearance (20th start) against the Athletics tonight...his 19 starts against Oakland are his most against any single opponent.

- has faced the A's twice the season and earned the win in his last start at Oakland, pitching 6.2 innings, while allowing 3 runs on 5 hits in the Astros 9-3 win on 4/25.

REHAB STINT: made 2 rehab starts for Double A Corpus Christi, going 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (4ER/8IP) and 7 strikeouts while recovering from his right knee surgery.

FELDMAN IN 2014: spent the entire 2014 season on the Astros roster, starting 29 games and hurling 180.1 innings...his 3.74 ERA (75ER/180.1IP) marked the lowest he has produced over a full season in his entire career.
