OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-62) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (61-49)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 7, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (11-4, 2.12) VS. LHP DALLAS KEUCHEL (13-5, 2.35) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, six of the last nine and 10 of the last 14 games...are 7-12 (.368) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...are 48-62 (.440) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is one-half game short of the season high (last: May 27)...have spent 83 of the last 87 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8)...the 83 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 14-21 (.400) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 83 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-20 (.286) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 40-42 (.488) when they start a right-hander... the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-19)... are batting .240 (237-for-988) against lefties compared to .253 (704-for-2784) off righties...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 11-26 (.297) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...the 26 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 37 games are third most in the American League...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (18-38, .321).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have played back-to-back extra inning games for the second time this year (April 11-12)...are now 4-8 (.333) in extra innings, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are tied for the second most games (12)...lost for the sixth time when leading after seven innings last night, which is second most in the AL (Seattle, 8)...are 6-14 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...have three walk-off wins in their last 13 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last seven games (12 er in 44.1 ip, 2.44 ERA) and have a 3.11 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 51 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors to Pittsburgh (46), and have tossed 668.1 innings, which is second most behind New York-NL (681.1).

PITCHING: The A's struck out 10 batters last night and have fanned at least eight batters in each of the last seven games, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team since at least 1914 (Aug. 31-Sept. 6, 2011)...have 63 strikeouts in 66.0 innings during the streak...for the season, the A's lead the American League and rank sixth in the majors with a 3.45 ERA...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...the shutouts are second most by an A's team over the last 12 years (17 in 2010)...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.362), fewest home runs (89) and fewest extra base hits (261), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and third in opponents batting average (.240).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .180 (46-for-256) with 23 runs scored over the first eight games on the homestand (2.88 runs per game)...are hitting .223 (257-for-1155) with 112 runs scored over the last 35 games (3.20 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 17 of those contests...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (87) and fewest strikeouts (725), third in stolen base percentage (64-for-84, 76.2%) and fourth in doubles (189) and triples (26)...are tied for second in the majors with 100 infield hits (Pittsburgh, 113)...are last in the majors with nine sacrifice hits, a figure which is currently tied with the 2005 Texas Rangers for the fewest in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 94 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 29 and Brett Lawrie 20, which ranks first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the

A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 47 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 3-5 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (0-1)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 24-34 (.414) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...the worst home winning percentages in Oakland history are .383 (1979), .429 (1994) and .432 (1977 and 1997)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road...begin a sevengame road trip to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (four games) on Tuesday...it will be the A's last trip to the Eastern time zone...have a 3.02 ERA (179 er in 534.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-25 (.405) in day games, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are batting .323 (30-for-93) with five home runs and 83 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the AL in grand slams and third in RBI with the bases loaded...A's pinch hitters are batting .188 (15-for-80) but have 15 walks...have the third lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for fifth in the majors in walks...are tied for second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (97)...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch, which began immediately following the All-Star Break, where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...the A's had a .267 on-base percentage in July, which was second lowest by an AL team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)...they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)...scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doo-little, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Thompson is on a rehab assignment...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year... have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 3-7 against the Astros...are 3-3 in Houston and 0-4 in Oakland...now have a five-game losing streak in Oakland...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 34-20...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 20 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-10 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns stole his 22nd base of the season Wednesday, which matches the most by an A's rookie over the last 28 years (Weeks, 2011)...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases and tops American League rookies in hits (99), multiple hit games (29) and total bases (127)...lke Davis has hit safely in each of his seven games against Houston this year and has a nine-game hitting streak against the Astros (11-for-27, .407).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1968 Joe Keough homers in his first major league at bat off New York's Lindy McDaniel at Yankee Stadium...in 1971 Vida Blue becomes Oakland's first 20-game winner when he shuts out the White Sox 1-0 on a five hitter at the Coliseum...he would go on to win 24 games and the American League MVP and Cy Young awards.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (11-4, 2.12 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors with a 2.12 ERA...the lowest ERA by an A's pitcher in the designated hitter era is 2.33 by Steve McCatty in 1981...now has a 2.69 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Oakland history.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents batting average (.200) and slugging percentage (.269), is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.256), fourth in winning percentage (.733), tied for fourth in complete games (2), fifth in innings pitched (152.2), tied for sixth in wins (11) and 10th in strikeouts (131)...has allowed

eight home runs in 152.2 innings and his average of 0.47 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the AL...also ranks third in fewest pitches per inning (14.5), fourth in wild pitches (10), tied for fifth in games started (22) and tied for ninth in opponents reaching base on an error (6).

LAST THREE STARTS: Has compiled a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) and .205 (16-for-78) opponents batting average over his last three starts but has just one win and two no decisions...has received six runs of support (2.35 ERA)...that follows a five-start stretch where he went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 7-2 with a 1.75 ERA (19 er in 97.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 4-2 with a 2.78 ERA (17 er in 55.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more... has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 0.94).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 18 of his 21 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .209 (40-for-191) with one double and two home runs (.246 slugging percentage) with runners on base...the batting average and slugging percentage are second lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has yielded a .122 (34-for-279) batting average with two strikes, which is second lowest among AL qualifiers (Keuchel, .105)...left-handed hitters are batting .184 (55-for-299), which is second lowest among AL qualifiers (Keuchel, .138)... the number eight hitter in the order is batting .103 (6-for-58), which is the lowest in the majors...opponents are batting .214 (31-for-145) with a .265 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is fourth lowest in the AL and the batting average is sixth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has 28 putouts, which ties the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...leads Major League pitchers in putouts...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances (47) and sixth in assists (19).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.97 ERA (6 er in 55.2 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 6-3 with a 2.78 ERA (30 er in 97.0 ip) in 14 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors and is tied for the AL lead in day wins.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-1 with a 1.64 ERA (15 er in 82.1 ip) in 12 starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 2.69 ERA (21 er in 70.1 ip) in 10 starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins...the lowest road ERA in Oakland history is 2.41 by Jim Nash in 1968...has allowed two home runs in 82.1 innings on the road, six in 70.1 innings at home.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 1-1 with a 2.48 ERA (8 er in 29.0 ip) in four starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 18 starts before the break...went 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 19 starts before the break last year...his 2.04 ERA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchscherer's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 10-11 with a 3.08 ERA (63 er in 184.1 ip) in 29 games after the break.

30 CAREER WINS: Picked up the 30th victory of his career July 28 at Los Angeles (NL), which was the 66th appearance of his career...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to win 30 games in 66 or fewer games...the others are Tim Hudson (52nd game), Barry Zito (61st), Mark Mulder (61st) and Trevor Cahill (66th).

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in four of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22)...is 5-1 in 11 starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in 13 of his 22 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times, one earned run or fewer 12 times and walked two

batters or fewer 16 times...the A's are 14-8 (.636) in his starting assignments and are 38-27 (.585) when he starts in his career...is 26-1 in 37 career starts with three runs of support or more... went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 (also 1.03 in July, 2014)...finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...went 5-3 with a 1.37 ERA and .190 opponents average over a nine-start stretch from May 3 to June 14...tossed a two-hit shutout July 12 at Cleveland and a three-hit shutout three starts later July 28 at Los Angeles (NL)...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts in a month since Barry Zito had two in August, 2001...now has four complete games in his career, all shutouts and all on the road...the four career shutouts are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 12 years...has allowed three hits or fewer in three of the shutouts.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning win over Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland...walked Chisenhall to start the game and he went to second on a Brantley walk, third on a Santana single and scored on a Sands sacrifice fly...Gray then shutout the Indians on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

RHP Jesse Chavez (5-11, 3.88 ERA): Is 1-5 with a 6.23 ERA), .322 opponents batting average and six home runs in 34.2 innings (1.56 hr per nine innings) over his last seven starts dating back to June 28...is 1-2 with a 6.62 ERA and .338 opponents batting average in four starts since the All-Star Break after going 4-9 with a 3.40 ERA and .254 opponents average in 19 games before the break...last year, he was 7-6 with a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the break, 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games after the break... has a 3.72 career ERA before the break, 6.17 after the break...leads the America League in day losses (6)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-2 A's loss to Baltimore last Monday (3.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 1 so)... is 2-1 with a 3.16 ERA in 20 career appearances, including four starts, against Houston...has faced the Astros once this year and it came in relief at Houston on April 13 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so).
