OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-62) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (61-49)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, six of the last nine and 10 of the last 14 games...are 7-12 (.368) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...are 48-62 (.440) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is one-half game short of the season high (last: May 27)...have spent 83 of the last 87 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8)...the 83 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 14-21 (.400) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 83 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-20 (.286) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 40-42 (.488) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-19)...are batting .240 (237-for-988) against lefties compared to .253 (704-for-2784) off righties...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 11-26 (.297) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...the 26 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 37 games are third most in the American League...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (18-38, .321).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have played back-to-back extra inning games for the second time this year (April 11-12)...are now 4-8 (.333) in extra innings, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are tied for the second most games (12)...lost for the sixth time when leading after seven innings last night, which is second most in the AL (Seattle, 8)...are 6-14 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...have three walk-off wins in their last 13 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last seven games (12 er in 44.1 ip, 2.44 ERA) and have a 3.11 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters finished a season with an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have allowed 51 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors to Pittsburgh (46), and have tossed 668.1 innings, which is second most behind New York-NL (681.1).

PITCHING: The A's struck out 10 batters last night and have fanned at least eight batters in each of the last seven games, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team since at least 1914 (Aug. 31-Sept. 6, 2011)...have 63 strikeouts in 66.0 innings during the streak...for the season, the A's lead the American League and rank sixth in the majors with a 3.45 ERA...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...the shutouts are second most by an A's team over the last 12 years (17 in 2010)...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.362), fewest home runs (89) and fewest extra base hits (261), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and third in opponents batting average (.240).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .180 (46-for-256) with 23 runs scored over the first eight games on the homestand (2.88 runs per game)...are hitting .223 (257-for-1155) with 112 runs scored over the last 35 games (3.20 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 17 of those contests...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (87) and fewest strikeouts (725), third in stolen base percentage (64-for-84, 76.2%) and fourth in doubles (189) and triples (26)...are tied for second in the majors with 100 infield hits (Pittsburgh, 113)...are last in the majors with nine sacrifice hits, a figure which is currently tied with the 2005 Texas Rangers for the fewest in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 94 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 29 and Brett Lawrie 20, which ranks first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the

A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 47 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Houston and Seattle for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 3-5 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (0-1)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 24-34 (.414) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...the worst home winning percentages in Oakland history are .383 (1979), .429 (1994) and .432 (1977 and 1997)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road...begin a seven-game road trip to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (four games) on Tuesday...it will be the A's last trip to the Eastern time zone...have a 3.02 ERA (179 er in 534.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-25 (.405) in day games, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are batting .323 (30-for-93) with five home runs and 83 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the AL in grand slams and third in RBI with the bases loaded...A's pinch hitters are batting .188 (15-for-80) but have 15 walks...have the third lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for fifth in the majors in walks...are tied for second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (97)...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch, which began immediately following the All-Star Break, where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...the A's had a .267 on-base percentage in July, which was second lowest by an AL team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)...they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)...scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Thompson is on a rehab assignment...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 3-7 against the Astros...are 3-3 in Houston and 0-4 in Oakland...now have a five-game losing streak in Oakland...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 34-20...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 20 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-10 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Billy Burns stole his 22nd base of the season Wednesday, which matches the most by an A's rookie over the last 28 years (Weeks, 2011)...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases and tops American League rookies in hits (99), multiple hit games (29) and total bases (127)...**Ike Davis** has hit safely in each of his seven games against Houston this year and has a nine-game hitting streak against the Astros (11-for-27, .407).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1968 Joe Keough homers in his first major league at bat off New York's Lindy McDaniel at Yankee Stadium...in 1971 Vida Blue becomes Oakland's first 20-game winner when he shuts out the White Sox 1-0 on a five hitter at the Coliseum...he would go on to win 24 games and the American League MVP and Cy Young awards.

Saves/Opportunities: 19-for-35 (54.3%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed three or more runs in four of its past nine games for a 6.08 ERA (18 er in 26.2 ip)...has a 4.19 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League
- Has the second fewest wins in the AL (11) and is tied for the second most losses (22)...has allowed the third most doubles (63), is tied for the fourth most home runs (38) and has the fifth highest opponents slugging percentage (.401).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (19), the second most blown saves (16) and the second lowest save percentage (54.3%).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and the fifth most first batter home runs (12).
- The A's are 5-37 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 40-24 when it allows one run or fewer (four complete games).

56 LHP FERNANDO ABAD

- Has not allowed an earned run in his past 12 games and 11.2 innings (6 h, 1 r, 3 bb, 13 so)...has not yielded a run in 19 of his past 22 games (2 er in 20.2 ip, 0.87 ERA) after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (4) and is second in first batter RBI (12).
- Has allowed a .167 (8-for-48) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .254 (17-for-67) with 10 of his 12 extra base hits (.567 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a 1.47 ERA (3 er in 18.1 ip) in 24 games at home compared to 5.40 (8 er in 13.1 ip) in 18 contests on the road.
- Is 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in 14 games in his career against the Astros...began his career with Houston and was 1-11 with a 5.10 ERA in 88 games, including six starts, from 2010 to 2012.

- Tossed 4.1 innings Monday night, the second longest relief appearance of his career (5.1 ip, May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota).
- Began the year with Triple-A Buffalo and posted a 1-3 record and 2.44 ERA in nine starts...was selected from Buffalo July 3 and went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, including four starts, with Toronto...was designated for assignment July 29.
- Is 1-0 with an 8.08 ERA (38 er in 42.1 ip) in 31 relief appearances in his career, 28-24 with a 4.47 ERA in 77 starting assignments.

- Was called up for the first time April 22 and made his Major League debut that day before being optioned back to Nashville the next day...posted a 4.15 ERA in four games during his second stint from May 20 to June 3...made one appearance during his third stay from June 12 to 18...was recalled for his fourth stint July 23, allowed a run in 3.1 innings and was optioned the next day.
- Faced the Astros for the only time in his career May 20 (0.2 ip, 2 h, 1 so).
- Pitched twice for the Sounds following his July 24 option and did not allow a run in 4.2 innings...had a .234 opponents batting average in 17 games overall...his complete 2015 stats with the Sounds:

- Ranks third among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (9) and is tied for sixth in losses (4).
- Has a 3.43 ERA (8 er in 21.0 ip) in 20 games in his home ballparks, a 5.40 ERA (7 er in 11.2 ip) in 12 games on the road.

- His home run allowed last night (Correa) was his first since September 24, 2012 against St. Louis, a span of 44 games and 44.2 innings.
- Has allowed six runs in his past eight games (6.2 ip, 8.10 ERA)...yielded just two earned runs in his previous 16 games (1.17 ERA) after posting a 5.68 ERA over his first 12 contests.
- Has the lowest percentage of inherited runners scored in the AL (9.1%)...is tied for second in batting average against first batters faced (.088).
- Has faced the Astros two times in his career (3.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville May 7 after logging a 2.81 ERA and .143 opponents average in 10 relief appearances with the Sounds.

- Leads Major League relievers in fewest walks per nine innings (0.71) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (13.50)...is fifth in the American League in innings pitched (50.2) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (54)...is tied for third in blown saves (4).
- Has allowed 11 home runs, which are tied for the most in the majors among relievers (Ogando, BOS)...they are tied for eighth most in Oakland history among relievers and are the most since 2004 (13, Justin Duchscherer).
- First batters faced are 18-for-45 (.400) with four home runs and 13 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors, the home runs are tied for the most and the batting average is second highest.
- Has not allowed a run in eight of his 10 career games against the Astros (2 er in 13.0 ip, 1.38 ERA).

- Is 7-for-43 (.163) over his last 13 games, which has dropped his average to .291...that is the lowest his average has been since May 23 when it was .289.
- Stole his 22nd base of the season Wednesday, which matches the most by an A's rookie over the last 28 years (Weeks, 2011)...the last A's rookie to steal more than 22 bases was Luis Polonia (29 in 1987).
- Leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (22)...leads American League rookies in hits (99), multiple hit games (29) and total bases (127), ranks third in runs (45) and tied for third in triples (5)...the triples are tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a rookie.
- Ranks second in the AL in stolen bases (22), sixth in at bats per grounded into double play (113.3) and eighth in stolen base percentage (81.5%)...has the sixth best home batting average (.331).
- Has 27 infield hits, which is tied for second in the majors (Gordon, MIA 33).
- Committed his first error of the season yesterday, snapping an 81-game errorless streak as an outfielder dating back to his last error on July 30, 2014, also against Houston.
- Is batting .473 (35-for-74) with six doubles, three triples and two home runs (.716 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.
- Hit .327 in May, .307 in June and .258 in July.

Last Year: Went 1-for-6 (.167) in 13 games over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...combined to hit .237 with one home run and 28 RBI in 119 games with Midland and Sacramento...tied for fourth in the minors in steals (54).

16 BILLY BUTLER

- Is 9-for-51 (.176) no home runs and three RBI over his last 16 games
- Is batting .258 (73-for-283) with five home runs against right-handed pitching (56.6 at bats per home run) compared to .194 (18-for-93) with four home runs against left-handers (23.3 at bats per home run)...has 19 walks against lefties, 13 against righties.
- Is tied for third in the American League in grounded into double plays (17).
- Doubled in back-to-back games Tuesday and Wednesday after going 13 consecutive games without an extra base hit.
- Hit .197 in July, which was the lowest single month average of his career (.221, July 2008)...batted .287 in April, .241 in May, .237 in June.

Last Year: Batted .271 with nine home runs and 66 RBI in 151 games in his eighth and final season with Kansas City...the batting average was a career-low as was his .323 on-base percentage and .379 slugging percentage.

- Is 4-for-36 (.111) with no home runs and two RBI in 14 games since the All-Star Break after hitting .246 with eight home runs and 33 RBI in 62 games before the break.
- Is tied for second among American League rookies in RBI (35) and tied for fourth in home runs (8) and walks (18).
- Is hitting .262 (43-for-164) with 18 of his 20 extra base hits against right-handers compared to .152 (12-for-79) with two doubles against left-handers...the average against lefties is the lowest in the AL and tied for second lowest in the majors...is slugging .476 against righties, .177 against lefties.
- Had his first career walk-off RBI last Sunday against Cleveland, a two-out double in the bottom of the 10th inning.
- Is 0-for-11 with six strikeouts and a RBI as a pinch hitter...is tied for second in the AL in pinch strikeouts.

Last Year: Spent the entire season at Triple-A New Orleans in the Miami farm system where he batted a career-high .303 with 20 home runs and 82 RBI in 127 games...added 57 walks for a career-high .384 on-base percentage.

4 COCO CRISP

Homestand: 3-13, r, bb, 2 so

- Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list Monday and is 3-for-13 (.231) in four games, including three starts (all in left field batting second), since his return...went 2-for-45 (.044) in 13 games to start the season.
- Has made eight starts batting leadoff, four hitting second and one each batting sixth and seventh...each of his 14 starts have come in left field.
- Has 298 career stolen bases and needs two more to become one of nine active players with 300 career steals.
- Was placed on the 15-day DL May 23 retroactive to May 20 with a cervical strain...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 5...went 4-for-19 (.211) with five runs, two home runs, three RBI, three walks and three strikeouts on a five-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton from July 27-Aug. 1 (three games in left, two at DH).
- Began the season on the 15-day DL after undergoing surgery on his right elbow...was reinstated May 6.

Last Year: Batted .246 in 126 games but added a career-high 66 walks for a .336 on-base percentage...stole 19 bases, his 12th consecutive season with 10 or more steals...is one of four in MLB with 10 or more steals in each of the previous 12 seasons.
