THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:

Aug. 6

1999 - Russ Johnson has a career day with 4 hits and 6 RBI in a 10-4 win over the Cubs. Carl Everett adds 2 HR.

1998 - Randy Johnson makes his Astros home debut by blanking the Phillies, 9-0, in a 5-hit CG with 8 punchouts. Jeff Bagwell provides the run support with two 2 HR and 5 RBI. Moises Alou also homers.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros and A's will play the 2nd game of their 4-game set tonight... **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (13-5) will face **RHP Sonny Gray** (11-4)...Keuchel has posted a 0.00 ERA (16.0 IP) in his two starts vs. the A's this season with a 1-0 record...in his no-decision on 4/24 at OAK, he hurled 9.0 scoreless inn. in a 5-4, 11-inning win...**LHP Scott Kazmir** was the opposing starter that day (7 IP, 0 R).

BIG D: **LHP Dallas Keuchel** has been one of the top starters in the Majors this season:
***T-1st in AL in wins (13), 2nd in IP (157.0), 3rd in ERA (2.35), T-2nd in CG (3), T-3rd in opp. avg. (.207).**
***AL Pitcher of the Month for both April and May.**
***AL starter for 2015 All-Star Game.**
***has set a franchise record by hurling at least 6.0 inn. in his last 33 starts.**

ROLE REVERSAL AT THE 'O': HOU has won five straight and six of their last seven here at O.co Coliseum....prior to that, the Astros were just 4-15 in their 1st 19 games at this venue...HOU is 7-3 overall vs. the A's this season.

ABOUT THE TRIP: Tonight is the 5th game (1-3 thus far) of a 9-game road trip for the Astros... they were swept in a 3-game set at TEX (Mon-Wed) on the 1st stop of the trip...following this 4-game set in OAK (8/6-9), the Astros will take on the defending champion SF Giants in a 2-game series at AT&T Park (8/11-12).

IN THE STANDINGS: At 61-49 (.555), the Astros are in 1st place in the AL West with a 2.5-game lead over the 2nd-place Angels...the last time the Astros were in sole possession of 1st place in their division this late in a season was on Sept. 21, 2003, when they were 84-71 and leading the NL Central Division by 0.5 game...**By Comparison:** through Aug. 7 of last season, the Astros were 47-68 and 23.5 games behind the 1st place A's.

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1999: The Astros 61-49 (.555) record is their best after 110 games since 1999, when they were 67-43 (.609).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros edged the A's in 10 innings last night, 5-4...**Jed Lowrie's** 2-out double in the 10th plated **Jose Altuve** with the game-winner...**RHP Will Harris** hurled the bott. of the 10th to earn his 1st career SV...**RHP Luke Gregerson** (5-1) was credited with the win...**RHP Scott Feldman** had ND, but did register a quality start (6 IP, 2 ER)...**Carlos Correa** was 2x4 with a 2-run HR in the 8th that put the Astros ahead temporarily, 4-2...**Altuve** added his 12th 3-hit game of the season.

PITCHING IN: The Astros are 2nd in the AL in both overall team ERA (3.52) and bullpen ERA (2.70)...two pitchers in the Astros starting rotation are in the top three in the AL for lowest ERA.

HOMER-HAPPY: The Astros lead the Majors in HR (153) and have hit multiple home runs in 45 games this season, which also ranks 1st in the Majors...they are 38-7 in those 45 contests...HOU is 3rd in the AL in runs scored (493).

WHAT A STEAL: The Astros lead the AL in stolen bases with 83.

EXCLUSIVE CLUB: With his two SB last night, **Jose Altuve** has now reached 30-or-more steals in four consecutive seasons...he joins **Michael Bourn** (2008-11), **Jose Cruz** (1977-80), **Cesar Cedeño** (1972-77) and **Enos Cabell** (1976-79) as the only players in club history with 4 straight 30-plus steal seasons...**Altuve** currently leads the AL in steals (also led AL in 2014 with 56).

RECENT STROS: The Astros are 3-3 in their last six games and 6-4 in their last nine...**SINCE THE BREAK:** HOU is 12-7 (.632) since the All-Star Break, outscoring opponents 98-66.

AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH: **LHP Scott Kazmir** was named AL Pitcher of the Month on Monday after an historic month of July...for the month, he was 2-0 in five starts with an 0.26 ERA (1ER/34IP), giving him the 3rd-lowest ERA for July in MLB history...marked the 2nd time **Kazmir** has won this award, with the other coming in May of 2008 while with TB...Astros pitchers have now won the AL Pitcher of the Month Award three times in 2015, with **LHP Dallas Keuchel** winning in both April and May.

DYNAMIC DUO: Astros starters **LHP Dallas Keuchel** and **RHP Collin McHugh** both sport 13-5 records, tying them for the AL lead in victories...their 26 combined wins are tops among any two starters in the Majors...the last time the Astros had two pitchers with 13 or more wins in the same season was in 2006 (**Roy Oswalt: 15-8; Andy Pettitte: 14-13**).

20-GAME WINNER: With Sunday's 4-1 win vs. ARI, **RHP Collin McHugh** has now posted a 20-5 record in 32 starts over the course of one year (since 8/1/2014) with a 3.47 ERA (79ER/205IP)...he leads the Majors in wins in that span.

CALIENTE CARLOS: Rookie **SS Carlos Correa** is 2nd in the AL in extra-base hits with 28 since making his ML debut on June 8...he currently leads all AL SS's in HR (14) despite playing in just 51g, and is the only SS in the last century to tally 14 HR in his 1st 51 ML gms...among AL rookies, **Correa** ranks 1st in slugging (.567) and RBI (36), 2nd in HR (14) and T-3rd in doubles (13)...**Youngblood:** At 20 years old, **Correa** is currently the youngest position player in the Majors.

GRAND SALAMIS: **Jason Castro's** grand slam Mon. at TEX was the 3rd of his career and the 2nd by an Astro in 2015...the other was by **Hank Conger** on 8/1 vs. ARI...per **Elias**, it is the 1st time that two Astros catchers have hit slams in the same year since 1985 (**Mark Bailey-2; Alan Ashby-1**).

SPREADING THE WEALTH: The Astros have 8 players with 10-or-more homers this season...the franchise record is 9, set in 2000...**Jose Altuve** (9 HR) and **Hank Conger** (8) are closing in on 10.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Quad Cities (A) won their 10th straight game last night...their 72-36 (.667) overall record is tops among all full-season minor league teams.

LAST START - 8/1 vs. ARI: earned his 13th win of the season in Houston's 9-2 win over the D-Backs...tossed 6.0 innings, allowing 2 runs on 2 hits...walked 3 with 8 strikeouts...allowed both runs in the 2nd inning before going on to retire 12 of his last 13 batters faced.

ABOUT BIG D: tonight will be his 23rd start of the season...in 22 total outings, has 17 quality starts, which is tied for the AL-lead with **RHP Sonny Gray** and **LHP Jose Quintana**.

GOIN' DEEP: has gone at least 6.0 innings in 33 consecutive outings, which is a new club record and the longest active streak in the Majors...prior to Keuchel, **RHP Brett Myers** held the Astros record by going 6.0 innings in 32 straight starts from April 7-Sept. 24, 2010.

- the last Major League pitcher to go 6.0 innings in 33 consecutive outings was **RHP Justin Verlander**, who did so in 63 straight outings from Aug. 22, 2010-July 26, 2012.

TOP OF THE CHARTS: leads all of Major League Baseball in groundball to flyball ratio (4.82)...ranks T-1st in the AL in wins (13), 2nd in innings pitched (157) and WAR (5.1), T-2nd in complete games (3), 3rd in ERA (2.35) and 4th in opponent batting average (.207).

DEFENDING HOUSTON: is undefeated at home this season, as he has gone 10-0 with a 1.26 ERA (12ER/85.2IP) and 82 strikeouts at Minute Maid Park...ranks 2nd in the Majors in home ERA behind teammate **LHP Scott Kazmir** (1.22).

- is the 1st pitcher in club history to win his first 10 home decisions...the last Major Leaguer to start a season 10-0 at home was **RHP Zack Greinke**, who started the 2011 season 11-0 at home.
- also leads the Majors in wins at home (10).

- from June 25-July 19, put up 3 consecutive scoreless starts at home...prior to Keuchel, the last Astros pitcher to throw 3 consecutive scoreless starts at home was **LHP Randy Johnson** from Aug. 7-Sept. 7, 1998 (4 starts).

- in his 4 home starts since the debut of the new fan section 'Keuchel's Korner', has gone 4-0 with a 0.60 ERA (2ER/30IP) and 40 strikeouts.

THE MIDAS TOUCH: after becoming the 1st pitcher in club history to win a **Gold Glove Award** last year, currently leads all MLB pitchers in assists (40) and leads all AL pitchers in total chances (50)...has not committed an error this season.

CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK: was named the AL Co-Player of the Week with **OF Lorenzo Cain** on July 20, following his dominating performance over the Rangers on July 19.

- marked his 1st weekly award this season, but has 2 AL Pitcher of the Month awards under his belt this year (April and May)... is the 1st player in club history to win 2 monthly awards and 1 weekly award in the same season.

- became the 2nd Astro this year to win an AL Player of the Week award, joining **2B Jose Altuve** (May 19-25).

KEUCHEL'S RISE: was the starting pitcher for the American League in the 2015 All-Star Game in what was his 1st ever All-Star selection...became the 4th pitcher in club history to start an All-Star Game, joining **RHP Roger Clemens** (2004), **RHP Mike Scott** (1987) and **RHP J.R. Richard** (1980).

vs. OAK: is making his 3rd start of the season against the A's... has allowed just 1 unearned run in 16.0 innings against the club this year...has thrown 6 consecutive quality starts against the A's dating back to April 26, 2014.
