OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-62) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (61-50)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 4-3 over the last seven games but have lost 10 of the last 15 contests...are 8-12 (.400) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 49-62 (.441) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 84 of the last 88 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...the 84 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 15-21 (.417) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 84 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray tossed the A's fifth complete game of the season last night, which is tied for third in the American League...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last eight games (13 er in 53.1 ip, 2.19 ERA) and have a 3.08 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.78)...in the designated hitter era, the lowest ERA's by an AL starting pitching staff are 2.98 (Oakland, 1974), 3.08 (New York, 1978) and 3.16 (Oakland and New York, 1981)...have allowed 52 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors to Pittsburgh (46), and have tossed 677.1 innings, which is second most behind New York-NL (687.1).

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League and rank sixth in the majors with a 3.43 ERA...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...the shutouts are second most by an A's team over the last 12 years (17 in 2010)...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.361), fewest home runs (90) and fewest extra base hits (262) and rank second in batting average (.239) and on-base percentage (.299).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .195 (56-for-287) with 26 runs scored over the first nine games on the homestand (2.89 runs per game)...are hitting .225 (267-for-1186) with 115 runs scored over the last 36 games (3.19 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 17 of those contests...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (88) and fewest strikeouts (728), third in stolen base percentage (64-for-84, 76.2%) and fourth in triples (26)...are tied for second in the majors with 112 infield hits (Pittsburgh, 117)...are last in the majors with nine sacrifice hits, a figure which is currently tied with the 2005 Texas Rangers for the fewest in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 94 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 29 and Brett Lawrie 20, which ranks first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 47 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 4-5 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (1-1)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 25-34 (.424) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 20-33)...the worst home winning percentages in Oakland history are .383 (1979), .429 (1994) and .432 (1977 and 1997)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road...begin a seven-game road trip to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (four games) on Tuesday...it will be the A's last trip to the Eastern time zone...have a 2.98 ERA (180 er in 543.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 11-26 (.297) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the second worst mark in Athletics history between the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...the 26 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 37 games are tied for third most in the American League...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (19-38, .333).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-8 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are tied for the second most games (12)...are 6-14 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...have three walk-off wins in their last 14 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests...lost for the sixth time when leading after seven innings Thursday night, which is second most in the AL (Seattle, 8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-25 (.405) in day games, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are 9-20 (.310) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-19)...the start by Sonny Gray last night marked the 14th consecutive game in which the A's started a right-handed pitcher...that is the second longest streak by an A's team over the last 16 years (17, Aug. 28-Sept. 14, 2013)...are batting .316 (30-for-95) with five home runs and 84 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the AL in grand slams and tied for second in RBI with the bases loaded...A's pinch hitters are batting .188 (15-for-80) but have 15 walks...have the third lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for fifth in the majors in walks...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (97)...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch, which began immediately following the All-Star Break, where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...the A's had a .267 on-base percentage in July, which was second lowest by an AL team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)...they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)...scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Thompson are on rehab assignments...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 4-7 against the Astros...are 3-3 in Houston and 1-4 in Oakland...snapped a five-game losing streak in Oakland with the win last night...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 35-20...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 20 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 17-10 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

Billy Burns stole his 22nd base of the season Wednesday, which matches the most by an A's rookie over the last 28 years (Weeks, 2011)...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (3)...tops American League rookies in hits (101) and total bases (129)...**Ike Davis** has a nine-game hitting streak against Houston dating back to last year (11-for-27, .407).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** Dave Kingman's eighth inning homer in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota gives him homers in five consecutive games, an Oakland record at the time...in **2004** the A's defeat Minnesota 6-5 in 18 innings in the longest A's game since 1972...Oakland scores three times in the top of the 18th on RBI singles by Jermaine Dye, Erubiel Durazo and Damian Miller before the Twins score twice in the bottom of the 18th...in **2006** Nick Swisher hits his 24th home run of the season in the A's 7-6 win over Texas, setting an all-time Athletics record for home runs by a switch hitter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (5-11, 3.88 ERA)

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 1-5 with a 6.23 ERA (24 er in 34.2 ip), .322 (47-for-146) opponents batting average and six home runs in 34.2 innings (1.56 hr per nine innings) over his last seven starts dating back to June 28...was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA, .246 opponents average and five home runs in 77.0 innings (0.58 hr per nine innings) over his first 12 starts

LOSSES: Has 11 losses, which are tied for second in the American League...his .313 winning percentage is tied for second lowest...the losses are a career high and match the most by an A's pitcher over the last four years (Tyson Ross, 2012)...nine came before the break, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 1-2 with a 6.62 ERA (13 er in 17.2 ip) and .338 (25-for-74) opponents batting average in four starts since the All-Star Break after going 4-9 with a 3.40 ERA and .254 opponents average in 19 games before the break...last year, he was 7-6 with a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the break, 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games after the break...has a 3.72 career ERA before the break, 6.17 (11 er in 160.1 ip) after the break.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-5 with a 3.97 ERA (31 er in 70.1 ip) in 14 games at night compared to 2-6 with a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip) in nine games during the day...leads the America League in day losses...the day losses match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last A's pitcher to lose more than six games during the day is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (8).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-5 with a 3.12 ERA (20 er in 57.2 ip) in 11 games at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.60 ERA (31 er in 60.2 ip) in 12 games on the road...over the last two seasons, he is 8-6 with a 2.88 ERA (40 er in 125.0 ip) in 26 games at home compared to 5-12 with a 4.33 ERA (67 er in 139.1 ip) in 29 contests on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed eight home runs in his last 10 starts and 53.2 innings after surrendering three over his first 13 games and 64.2 innings...has yielded eight of his 11 home runs to left-handed hitters...eight have come with runners on base...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .058 (3-for-51), which is the lowest mark in the majors...has walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his 19 starts.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 5-11 with a 4.11 ERA (51 er in 111.2 ip) in his 19 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 13-19 with a 4.02 ERA (110 er in 246.0 ip) in 42 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-8 with a 3.59 ERA (29 er in 72.2 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 2-3 with a 5.08 ERA (22 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 19 starts...has one start with 11 runs of support and another with nine...has 30 runs of support in his other 17 starts (98.2 ip, 2.73 RSA).

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 15-23 with a 3.69 ERA (132 er in 321.2 ip) in 90 games, including 40 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded the save in his final relief appearance **April 18** at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit...the A's were shutout in three of his first seven starts...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit in his first start, a two-run home run by Calhoun, in a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) **April 23**...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota **May 5**...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits in a 1-0 loss to Detroit **May 26** in Oakland...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on **May 31**...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston **June 6**...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 12**...left with a 4-3 lead...was relieved

by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego **June 17** in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 14-1 win over Minnesota **July 19** in Oakland...the win snapped a three-game losing streak...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .306 opponents average during the streak, which spanned three starts from June 28 to July 9...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss at San Francisco **July 24**...tossed just 3.0 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter since June 19, 2012 at Milwaukee (2.2 ip).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Baltimore last Monday in Oakland...surrendered a three-run home run to Davis in the first inning, a RBI double to Jones in the third and a two-run home run to Joseph in the fourth...was relieved by Doubront with two outs in the third inning and the A's trailing 6-0.

CHAVEZ vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-1 with a 3.16 ERA (42.2 ip, 40 h, 19 r, 15 er, 18 bb, 44 so, 5 hr) in 20 career appearances, including four starts...is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (4 er in 21.1 ip) in eight games in his home ballparks and 0-1 with a 4.64 ERA (11 er in 21.1 ip) in 12 games at Minute Maid Park...is 2-1 with a 5.32 ERA (13 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts, all last year...has faced the Astros each this year and it came in relief at Houston on April 13 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so)...pitched the ninth inning of the A's 8-1 win...allowed a leadoff single to Gattis but then retired the final three hitters.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (1-4, 2.64 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA in three starts since his return...tossed seven shutout innings in his last start to snap a four-game losing streak that spanned five starts from June 30 to July 30 (3.00 ERA)...received five runs of support in his last start after receiving a total of five runs of support over his first five starts...his season run support average as a starter is 2.43...is 1-4 with a 2.43 ERA in his six starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA in his five relief appearances...has walked five batters in 37.0 innings as a starter (1.22 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...picked up his first win as an Athletic in his last start, a 5-0 win over Baltimore on Tuesday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...has faced the Astros once in his career and it came in relief earlier this year on April 25 in Oakland (4.1 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)

- The A's bullpen has allowed three or more runs in four of its past nine games for a 6.08 ERA (18 er in 26.2 ip)...has a 4.19 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League.
- The A's have not recorded a save since July 11 at Cleveland...have a streak of 21 consecutive games (including complete games) without a save, which is the longest single season streak by an A's team since a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6, 1994.
