THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:

Aug. 8

2008 - Carlos Lee reaches a couple of milestones while leading the Astros to a 9-5 win over the Reds. Lee records his 100th RBI of the season and the 1,000th RBI of his career while tallying 4 hits. The next day, Lee's season would end when he is plunked by Bronson Arroyo, breaking his pinkie finger.

1986 - Jose Cruz celebrates his 39th birthday with his 1,000th career RBI during a 5-0 win over SD. Mike Scott goes the distance for his third shutout of the season.

TODAY'S GAME: The Astros and A's play the 3rd game of their 4-game set this afternoon at 3:05 pm CT at O.co Coliseum...**RHP Collin McHugh** (2ER/14.1IP)...he last faced OAK on 4/15 at Minute Maid Park, tallying 11 K's in 5.2 innings of work in a 6-1 Astros victory...today will be McHugh's 1st career app. at O.co Coliseum.

ABOUT COLLIN: RHP Collin McHugh is 1-0 in two career starts vs. the A's with a 1.26 ERA (2ER/14.1IP)...he last faced OAK on 4/15 at Minute Maid Park, tallying 11 K's in 5.2 innings of work in a 6-1 Astros victory...today will be McHugh's 1st career app. at O.co Coliseum.

20-GAME WINNER: With Sunday's 4-1 win vs. ARI, RHP Collin McHugh has now posted a 20-5 record in 32 starts over the course of one year (since 8/1/2014) with a 3.47 ERA (79ER/205IP)... he leads the Majors in wins in that span.

ROLE REVERSAL AT THE 'O'?: HOU has won five of six and six of their last eight games here at O.co Coliseum....prior to that, the Astros were just 4-15 in their 1st 19 games at this venue...HOU is 7-4 overall vs. the A's this season.

ABOUT THE TRIP: Today is the 6th game (1-4 thus far) of a 9-game road trip for the Astros... they were swept in a 3-game set at TEX (Mon-Wed) on the 1st stop of the trip...following this 4-game set in OAK (8/6-9), the Astros will take on the defending champion SF Giants in a 2-game series at AT&T Park (8/11-12).

IN THE STANDINGS: At 61-50 (.550), the Astros are in 1st place in the AL West with a 1.5-game lead over the 2nd-place Angels...the last time the Astros were in sole possession of 1st place in their division this late in a season was on Sept. 21, 2003, when they were 84-71 and leading the NL Central Division by 0.5 game...**By Comparison:** through Aug. 8 of last season, the Astros were 48-68 and 23.5 games behind the 1st place A's.

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1999: The Astros 61-50 (.550) record is their best after 111 games since 2001, when they were 62-49 (.559).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros lost to the A's in the 2nd game of the series last night, 3-1... **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (13-6) took the loss, but did register a quality start (7.2 IP, 3 ER)...the Astros were held to five hits by A's starter RHP Sonny Gray, who went the distance for win...the Astros run came on a solo HR by Luis Valbuena (#21) in the 5th inn....**Streak Snapped:** The Astros had won five straight games at O.co prior to last night's defeat.

WORKHORSE: Despite taking the loss last night, **LHP Dallas Keuchel** extended his club record streak of lasting 6.0-or-more innings to 34 straight starts...Keuchel leads the Majors in IP with 164.2.

STREAK EXTENDED: Jose Altuve was 1x4 last night to extend his hit streak at O.co Coliseum to 18 games...he has hit .375 (30x80) during the streak, which began on 9/5/2013...his 18g streak is tied with LAA's Erik Aybar for longest active streak at O.co.

PITCHING IN: The Astros are 2nd in the AL in both overall team ERA (3.52) and bullpen ERA (2.70)...two pitchers in the Astros starting rotation are in the top three in the AL for lowest ERA.

HOMER-HAPPY: The Astros lead the Majors in HR (154) and have hit multiple home runs in 45 games this season, which also ranks 1st in the Majors...they are 38-7 in those 45 contests...HOU is 3rd in the AL in runs scored with 494.

WHAT A STEAL: The Astros lead the AL in stolen bases with 83.

EXCLUSIVE CLUB: With his two SB in Thursday's 5-4 win, Jose Altuve has reached 30-or-more steals in four consecutive seasons...he joins Michael Bourn (2008-11), Jose Cruz (1977-80), Cesar Cedeno (1972-77) and Enos Cabell (1976-79) as the only players in club history with 4 straight 30-plus steal seasons...Altuve currently leads the AL in steals (also led AL in 2014 with 56).

RECENT STROS: The Astros are 3-4 in their last seven games and 6-5 in their last 11...**SINCE THE BREAK:** HOU is 12-8 (.600) since the All-Star Break, outscoring opponents 99-69 in that span.

AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH: LHP Scott Kazmir was named AL Pitcher of the Month on Monday after an historic month of July...for the month, he was 2-0 in five starts with an 0.26 ERA (1ER/34IP), giving him the 3rd-lowest ERA for July in MLB history...marked the 2nd time Kazmir has won this award, with the other coming in May of 2008 while with TB...Astros pitchers have now won the AL Pitcher of the Month Award three times in 2015, with LHP Dallas Keuchel winning in both April and May.

DYNAMIC DUO: Astros starters LHP Dallas Keuchel (13-6) and RHP Collin McHugh (13-5) are each tied for the AL lead in victories...their 26 combined wins are tops among any two starters in the Majors...the last time the Astros had two pitchers with 13 or more wins in the same season was in 2006 (**Roy Oswalt: 15-8; Andy Pettitte: 14-13**).

CALIENTE CARLOS: Rookie SS Carlos Correa is 2nd in the AL in extra-base hits with 28 since making his ML debut on June 8...he currently leads all AL SS's in HR (14) despite playing in just 52g, and is the only SS in the last century to tally 14 HR in his 1st 51 ML gms...among AL rookies, Correa ranks 1st in slugging (.560) and RBI (36), 2nd in HR (14) and T-4th in doubles (13)...**Youngblood:** At 20 years old, Correa is currently the youngest position player in the Majors.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: The Astros have 8 players with 10-or-more homers this season...the franchise record is 9, set in 2000...Jose Altuve (9 HR) and Hank Conger (8) are closing in on 10.

BANDITS WIN AGAIN: Quad Cities (A) won their 11th straight game last night, 7-1 vs. Dayton...their 73-36 (.670) overall record is tops among full-season minor league teams...they also had a 12g win streak this season (April 29-May 11).

LAST START - 8/2 vs. ARI: won his 4th consecutive start, and 13th game of the season, 4-1 (7 IP, 1 R, 1 BB, 6 SO).

*is tied for the American League lead in wins with **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (13-5) and **RHP Felix Hernandez** (13-6)...the last time the Astros had multiple 13-game winners was in 2006, when **RHP Roy Oswalt** went 15-8 and **LHP Andy Pettitte** went 14-13...
 *McHugh has won 7 of his last 9 starts, allowing 3 earned runs or less in 8 of those 9 outings (7-2, 3.19 ERA, 21ER/59.1IP).

*13 wins are a new career high for a single season (went 11-9 in 2014).

• **20-GAME WINNER:** With Sunday's 4-1 win vs. ARI, McHugh has now posted a 20-5 record in 32 starts over the course of one year (since 8/1/2014) with a 3.47 ERA (79ER/205IP)...he leads the Majors in wins in that span...HOU has gone 23-9 in those starts.

IN A GROOVE: has won 7 of his last 9 starts, while allowing 3 earned runs or less in 8 of those 9 outings...has gone 7-2 with a 3.20 ERA (21ER/59.1IP) in that span.

DYNAMIC DUO: McHugh and **LHP Dallas Keuchel** have combined to go 26-10 this season, which is the most combined wins by a pair of teammates in the Majors, ahead of STL's **RHP Carlos Martinez** (11) and **RHP Michael Wacha** (13).

• the Astros have gone a combined 30-15 (.667) in McHugh and Keuchel starts this season...over the last 2 seasons since the start of 2014, the Astros have gone 60-39 (.606) in games started by McHugh and Keuchel.

CAN'T SQUARE HIM UP: per Fangraphs.com, has generated the 6th-highest % of soft contact in the American League this season (21.0%)...over the last 2 seasons, the only AL pitcher who has posted a higher soft contact % than McHugh (21.8%) has been teammate **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (23.5%).

• is inducing groundballs at a career high clip, as both his 1.36 groundball to flyball ratio and 46.4% groundball rate are the highest of his career.

CAREER TURNAROUND: since joining the Astros rotation on April 22, 2014, has gone 24-14 with a 3.46 ERA (113ER/293.2IP) in 47 starts...this followed Major League stints with the Mets and Rockies from 2012-13, during which he posted an 0-8 record and a 8.94 ERA (47ER/47.1IP) in 15 games (9 starts).

FRANCHISE RECORD ACCOMPLISHED: the Astros won a franchise-record, 11-straight starts made by McHugh from Aug. 28, 2014-May 7, 2015.

MCHUGH'S WIN STREAK: posted a career-long 11-game winning streak from Aug. 12, 2014-May 2, 2015...over the course of the streak, he posted a 2.45 ERA (23ER/84.1IP) in 13 starts.

• the streak was 1 game shy of tying the franchise record win streak of 12, accomplished twice by **RHP Wade Miller** (July 7-Sept. 21, 2002) and **RHP Mark Portugal** (July 11-Oct. 2, 1993)...the only other Astros pitcher to post an 11-game winning streak was **LHP Mike Hampton** from June 30-Sept. 13, 1999.

vs. OAK: is making his 3rd career start against the A's...has gone 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA (2ER/14.1IP) with 18 strikeouts in his 2 previous starts against the A's.

• tossed 5.2 innings, allowing just 1 run, while fanning 11 batters in his only start against the A's this season on April 15.
