OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-62) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (61-51)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 9, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 1:05 P.M. PDT RHP CHRIS BASSITT (1-4, 2.64) VS. RHP MIKE FIERS (0-0, 10.80) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and five of the last eight games... are 9-12 (.429) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 50-62 (.446) overall, which is the second worst record in the AL...have spent 85 of the last 89 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...the 85 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)... went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 16-21 (.432) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 85 days in fifth.

ON THE HOMESTAND: The A's and their opponents have combined to score 58 runs in the first 10 games of the homestand, an average of 5.8 per game...the A's have been outscored 30-28...six of the 10 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are batting .193 (61-for-316) and have a 2.71 ERA (28 er in 93.0 ip).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed seven or more innings and allowed one run in each of the last three games (3 er in 23.0 ip, 1.17 ERA)...have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last nine games (14 er in 60.1 ip, 2.09 ERA) and have a 3.06 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.75)...in the designated hitter era, the lowest ERA's by an AL starting pitching staff are 2.98 (Oakland, 1974), 3.08 (New York, 1978) and 3.16 (Oakland and New York, 1981)...lead the American League in fewest home runs (53) and most innings pitched (684.1) and are tied for third in complete games (5).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last eight games (24 er in 75.0 ip, 2.88 ERA) and now have a 3.41 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...the shutouts are second most by an A's team over the last 12 years (17 in 2010)...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.360), fewest home runs (91) and fewest extra base hits (264) and rank second in batting average (.239) and on-base percentage (.299).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .224 (272-for-1215) with 117 runs scored over the last 37 games (3.16 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 18 of those contests...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (88), tied for second in fewest strikeouts (738), third in stolen base percentage (65-for-85, 76.5%), tied for third in doubles (193) and fourth in triples (26)... lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (112)...are last in the majors with nine sacrifice hits, a figure which is currently tied with the 2005 Texas Rangers for the fewest in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 94 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 29 and Brett Lawrie 20, which ranks first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 47 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 5-5 on this season-long 11 game homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (2-1)...it is the first A's homestand longer than 10 games since a 12-game stand from Aug. 9-21, 2005...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 26-34 (.433) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...the worst home winning percentages in Oakland history are .383 (1979), .429 (1994) and .432 (1977 and 1997)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost seven of the last 10 road games...are 24-28 (.462) on the road...begin a sevengame road trip to Toronto (three games) and Baltimore (four games) on Tuesday...it will be the A's last trip to the Eastern time zone...have a 2.95 ERA (181 er in 552.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (196 er in 444.0 ip) on the road.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 12-26 (.316) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...it is currently the third worst mark in Athletics history behind the 1916 (11-32, .256) and 1946 (13-29, .310) Philadelphia A's...the 26 losses are the most in the majors and second

most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 38 games are third most in the American League...have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (20-38, .345).

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-8 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are tied for the second most games (12)...are 6-14 in games decided in the last at bat... the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...have three walk-off wins in their last 15 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests...lost for the sixth time when leading after seven innings Thursday night, which is second most in the AL (Seattle, 8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 18-25 (.419) in day games, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 9-20 (.310) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-19)...the start by Jesse Chavez yesterday marked the 15th consecutive game in which the A's started a right-handed pitcher...that is the second longest streak by an A's team over the last 16 years (17, Aug. 28-Sept. 14, 2013)...are batting .316 (30-for-95) with five home runs and 84 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the AL in grand slams and third in RBI with the bases loaded...A's pinch hitters are batting .188 (15for-80) but have 15 walks...have the third lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for sixth in the majors in walks... rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (97)...this 11-game homestand concludes a 22-game stretch, which began immediately following the All-Star Break, where the A's play all their games in California...that includes 17 games in Oakland and 20 in the Bay Area...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...the A's had a .267 on-base percentage in July, which was second lowest by an AL team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games)...walked just 43 times, which was second fewest by a Major League team in July since at least 1914 (Montreal, 42 in 1999)...they were the fewest in any month in Oakland history (min. 12 games)...scored 76 runs and hit 15 home runs, which were the fewest in Oakland history in July.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson)...all but Hahn are on the 60day DL...Doolittle and Thompson are on rehab assignments...this marks the first time this year the A's have had fewer than six players on the DL... have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 5-7 against the Astros...are 3-3 in Houston and 2-4 in Oakland...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 36-20...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 20 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 18-10 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

Billy Burns stole his 23rd base of the season last night, which are the most by an A's rookie since Luis Polonia stole 29 bases in 1987...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (30)...tops American League rookies in hits (101) and total bases (129)...**Ike Davis** has a 10-game hitting streak against Houston dating back to last year (12-for-30, .400)...**Danny Valencia** has hit safely in all 10 of his career games against the Astros in which he has an at bat (15-for-36, .417).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...in **2002** the A's win a 16-inning game at New York 3-2 in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-4, 2.64 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts since his return...was called up for the first time April 23 and logged a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in five relief appearances before being optioned May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...returned July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and had a no decision that day at Cleveland (2 er in 6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA)...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed seven shutout innings in his last start to snap a four-game losing streak that spanned five starts from June 30 to July 30 (3.00 ERA)...tossed at least five innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each start to become the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least five innings and allow three runs or fewer in five consecutive games without recording a win (last: Vin Mazzaro, Aug. 3-26, 2010)...is the only one of those six pitchers with four losses during their streak.

RUN SUPPORT: Received five runs of support in his last start after receiving a total of five runs of support over his first five starts...his season run support average as a starter is 2.43 (10 rs in 37.0 ip)...has received one run of support or fewer in four of his six starts...has 20 runs of support in 11 career starting assignments (65.2 ip, 2.74 RSA).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-4 with a 2.43 ERA (10 er in 37.0 ip) and .244 (33-for-135) opponents batting average in his six starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked five batters in 37.0 innings as a starter (1.22 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...all five of his relief appearances came during his first stint

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .198 (20-for-101) batting average but has issued 13 of his 14 walks to lefties for a .308 on-base percentage...has yielded a .185 (12-for-65) average with runners on base...has a .175 (14-for-80) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .207 (12-for-58) the second time and .353 (12-for-34) the third time.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.50 ERA (3 er in 6.0 ip) and .304 (7-for-23) opponents batting average in the first inning, a 0.74 ERA (2 er in 24.1 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents average in innings two through five and a 4.67 ERA (9 er in 17.1 ip) and .227 (15-for-66) opponents average from the sixth inning on.

IN RELIEF: Yielded at least one run in three of his five outings and walked two batters or more four times...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch... tossed 4.1 innings in his first outing April 25 against Houston, which matches the longest outing by an A's reliever this year.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Colorado June 30 in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing back-to-back singles to Tulowitzki and Arenado in the fourth inning...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Blackmon... was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 1-0.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive 2-1 game July 5 against Seattle...the A's scored a run in the third inning and he blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...retired the first two batters in the sixth before hitting Cano and allowing a double to Cruz... Smith then followed with a two-run single.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Cleveland July 11...the A's scored a run in the first and he shutout the Indians on three hits and a hit batter over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth but the A's scored once in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the bottom of the seventh and left after 6.1 innings with the scored tied 2-2.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at San Francisco July 25...allowed a solo home run to Bumgarner in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...allowed a RBI single to Duffy in the sixth inning for the loss.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Cleveland last Thursday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning on an error and a two-run home run by Santana...then retired 18 of the final 21 batters he faced, blanking the Indians on two hits and a walk over his final six innings...Carrasco tossed a two-hitter for Cleveland.

LAST START: He combined with Rodriguez and Abad on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Baltimore last Tuesday in Oakland for his

BASSITT vs. HOUSTON: Has faced the Astros once in his career and it came in relief in his A's debut earlier this year on April 25 in Oakland (4.1 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...relieved Graveman with two outs in the fifth inning and pitched the final 4.1 innings, allowing two runs in the seventh inning and a solo home run to Springer in the ninth.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters in 69.0 innings and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68... went 1-5 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games following his May 11 option...did not pitch for the Sounds following his July 5 option...had a loss in his only start following his only July 12 option despite allowing just two runs in 6.0 innings.

THIS AND THAT: His .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on...went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA and .245 opponents average in five games on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-6 with a 3.79 ERA in nine starts... allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...the Sounds were 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just two of his starts.

RHP Kendall Graveman (6-7, 3.90 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 6.20 ERA, .304 opponents batting average, four home runs and 11 walks in 24.2 innings over his last five starts after going 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA, .236 opponents average, four home runs and nine walks in 43.0 innings over his previous six starts from June 7 to July 4...is tied for third among American League rookies in wins (6)...is 4-3 with a 3.10 ERA in nine starts on the road compared to 2-4 with a 4.64 ERA in nine starts at home...has surrendered three home runs in 49.1 innings on the road compared to nine in 52.1 innings in Oakland...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss in 10 innings against Baltimore last Wednesday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Toronto, a start in the A's 7-1 loss in Oakland on July 21 (5.1 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 4 so).

11-22, 4.16 ERA (144 er in 311.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 20-for-36 (55.6%)

- Edward Mujica recorded the save yesterday, which was the A's first since July 11 at Cleveland...it snapped a streak of 21 consecutive games (including complete games) without a save, which was the longest single season streak by an A's team since a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6, 1994.
- The A's bullpen has allowed three or more runs in four of its past 10 games for a 5.65 ERA (18 er in 28.2 ip)...has a 4.16 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League.
- Has the second fewest wins in the AL (11) and the third most losses (22)...has yielded the fourth most doubles (63), the fifth most home runs (38) and has the sixth highest opponents slugging percentage (.399).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (20), the second most blown saves (16) and the second lowest save percentage (55.6%).
- Has allowed the second most first batter RBI in the majors (43) and is tied for the fifth most first batter home runs (12).
- The A's are 5-37 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 41-24 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has not allowed an earned run in his past 12 games and 11.2 innings (6 h, 1 r, 3 bb, 13 so)...has not yielded a run in 19 of his past 22 games (2 er in 20.2 ip, 0.87 ERA) after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Has allowed a .167 (8-for-48) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .254 (17-for-67) with 10 of his 12 extra base hits (.567 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
