OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-64) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (63-52)

THURSDAY, AUGUST 13, 2015 – ROGERS CENTRE – 12:35 P.M. EDT RHP SONNY GRAY (12-4, 2.06) VS. LHP MARK BUEHRLE (12-5, 3.34) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the past two games to snap their three-game winning streak...the winning streak marked the first time the A's won more than two straight since June 20-25 when they had a season-high five-game winning streak...are 51-64 (.443), which is the second worst record in the American League...have spent 89 of the last 93 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...the 89 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 17-23 (.425) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 89 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Aaron Brooks allowed eight runs last night after A's starting pitchers yielded one run or fewer in eight of the previous 11 games (2.13 ERA)...now have a 3.15 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.77)...in the designated hitter era, the lowest ERAs by an American League starting pitching staff are 2.98 (Oakland, 1974), 3.08 (New York, 1978) and 3.16 (Oakland and New York, 1981)... lead the AL in fewest home runs (55), has the second most innings pitched (697.1) and are fourth in complete games (5).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.60 ERA (40 er in 100.0 ip) in August, which is fifth lowest in the American League...are seventh in the AL in strikeouts in August (87)...have a 3.46 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...the shutouts are second most by an A's team over the last 12 years (17 in 2010)...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.362) and fewest home runs (95), and are second in opponents on-base percentage (.299)...have allowed the second fewest extra base hits (276) and rank second in opponents batting average (.239).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .227 (299-for-1315) with 127 runs scored over the last 40 games (3.18 runs per game), which dates back to June 26...have scored two runs or fewer in 19 of those contests...for the season, the A's have hit the second fewest home runs in the American League (90), rank second in fewest strikeouts (761), third in stolen base percentage (65-for-86, 75.6%) and fourth in doubles (200) and triples (26)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (116)...are last in the majors with 10 sacrifice hits, a figure which is one more than the fewest in Major League history (9, 2005 Texas Rangers).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 96 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 30 and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...it marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the errors have led to 49 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which are tied for the fewest in the AL.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's won back-to-back games by one run Saturday and Sunday for the first time since June 28-29, 2014...are 13-26 (.333) in one-run games for the season, which is the worst record in the majors...Toronto is second worst at 12-23 (.343)...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...the 26 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 39 games are third most in the American League...seven of the A's 11 games on the last homestand were decided by two runs or fewer and the A's were 4-3 in those seven games... are 21-39 (.350) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the second worst record in the majors.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-8 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have played in the third most games (12)...are 7-14 in games decided in the last at bat... the last at bat wins are second fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...have four walk-off wins in their last 16 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests...lost for the sixth time when leading after seven innings a week ago tonight, which is second most in the AL (Seattle, 8).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 10-14 (.417) since the All-Star Break...are batting .226 (180-for-796) with 78 runs scored (3.25 runs per game)...rank last in the majors in batting average, have the fewest runs scored, and have the third fewest home runs (16).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on their final road trip to the Eastern time zone, a seven-game trip to Toronto (0-2) and Baltimore (four games)...went 1-4 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and have lost nine of the last 12 road games...are 24-30 (.444) on the road and 27-34 (.443) at home...have the fourth worst home record in the American League...went 6-5 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (3-1)...won the final three games of the homestand, which matches the A's longest home winning streak of the season (June 10-17)...have a 2.96 ERA (185 er in 561.0 ip) at home compared to 4.07 (208 er in 460.0 ip) on the road.

IT'S ALL RIGHT: Aaron Brooks started last night, which was the A's 18th consecutive game started by a right-handed pitcher...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since July 21-Oct. 2, 1999 when they did it in 68 straight contests.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 9-20 (.310) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-20)...are 19-25 (.432) in day games, which is the third worst record in the AL...are 9-16 (.360) against American League East teams.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .320 (32-for-100) with five home runs and 86 RBI with the bases loaded...rank second in the AL in grand slams and third in RBI with the bases loaded...A's pinch hitters are batting .195 (16-for-82) but have 15 walks...have the fourth lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for sixth in the majors in walks...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (99)...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...the A's had a .267 onbase percentage in July, which was second lowest by an AL team in July since at least 1914 (Seattle, .266 in 2011)...it was the lowest single-month on-base percentage in Oakland history (min. 3 games).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Ladendorf are on rehab assignments...the four players on the DL are a season low...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's have lost the season series as they trail 1-4 with today's game remaining...have lost the first two games of this series in Toronto after losing two of three in Oakland in July...won each of the previous three season series but are 25-29 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2009...the A's are 212-186 all-time against Toronto...that includes 105-95 in Oakland, 107-89 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 66-57 at Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed an earned run in his past 13 games and 12.2 innings...Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (23) and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (32)...tops American League rookies in hits (106) and total bases (134)...his stolen bases are the most by an A's rookie since Luis Polonia had 29 in 1987... Marcus Semien is 12-for-31 (.387) with two doubles, two home runs and six RBI over his last 10 games...Danny Valencia has hit safely in each of his six games with the A's since being claimed off waivers from Toronto Aug. 3...is 9-for-23 (.391) with three doubles, three home runs and seven RBI.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1977** Mitchell Page steals his 26th consecutive base without being caught, setting an American League record...the record comes to an end two days later when he is picked off by Cleveland's Rick Waits...in **2005** Dennis Eckersley becomes the fourth player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 43.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (12-4, 2.06 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.06 ERA (Greinke, LAD 1.71)...currently has the lowest ERA by an AL pitcher since Pedro Martinez posted a 1.74 ERA for Boston in 2000...now has a 2.65 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Oakland history.

GO THE DISTANCE: Has tossed two complete games in his last three starts and is 2-0 with a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) and .148 (12-for-81) opponents batting average over that span...has three complete games in his last six starts and is 3-1 with a 1.72 ERA (9 er in 47.0 ip) and .175 (28-for-160) opponents batting average over that span...his three complete games are tied for second in the American League.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents batting average (.198) and slugging percentage (.269), is tied for the lead

in shutouts (2), is first in opponents on-base percentage (.251), third in winning percentage (.750), third in innings pitched (161.2), tied for fourth in wins (12) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (136)...has allowed nine home runs in 161.2 innings and his average of 0.50 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...also ranks second in fewest pitches per inning (14.4), fourth in wild pitches (10), tied for seventh in games started (23) and tied for ninth in opponents reaching base on an error (6).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-1 with a 1.64 ERA (15 er in 82.1 ip) in 12 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.50 ERA (22 er in 79.1 ip) in 11 starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins...has allowed two home runs in 82.1 innings on the road, seven in 79.1 innings at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.97 ERA (6 er in 55.2 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 7-3 with a 2.63 ERA (31 er in 106.0 ip) in 15 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League and is tied for the American League lead in day wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 19 of his 22 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .209 (41-for-196) with one double and two home runs (.245 slugging percentage) with runners on base... the batting average and slugging percentage are third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...also ranks second among AL qualifiers with a .127 (37-for-291) batting average with two strikes and a .184 (58-for-315) average against left-handed hitters...opponents are batting .201 (31-for-154) with a .250 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is fourth lowest in the AL and the batting average is seventh.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has 28 putouts, which ties the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...leads Major League pitchers in putouts...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances (48) and tied for sixth in assists (20).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-2 with a 1.69 ERA (20 er in 106.2 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest compared to 4-2 with a 2.78 ERA (17 er in 55.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more...has the third lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 0.87)

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-1 with a 2.13 ERA (9 er in 38.0 ip) in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...his ERA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchscherer's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 11-11 with a 2.98 ERA (64 er in 193.1 ip) in 30 games after the break.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts in August... went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 (also 1.03 in July, 2014)... finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts.

30 CAREER WINS: Picked up the 30th victory of his career July 28 at Los Angeles (NL), which was the 66th appearance of his career...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to win 30 games in 66 or fewer games...the

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in four of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22)...is 6-1 in 12 starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 23 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 17 times, one earned run or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 17 times...the A's are 15-8 (.652) in his starting assignments and are 39-27 (.591) when he starts in his career...is 27-1 in 38 career starts with three runs of support or more...tossed a two-hit shutout July 12 at Cleveland and a three-hit shutout three starts later July 28 at Los Angeles (NL)...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts in a month since Barry Zito had two in August, 2001...the four career shutouts are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 12 years...has allowed three hits or fewer in three of the shutouts.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

LAST START: He tossed his fifth career complete game, a five-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Houston last Friday in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out five...it was his first complete game in the Coliseum and his first complete game in which he allowed a run...allowed his only run on a two-out home run by Valbuena in the fifth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (6-11, 3.73 ERA): Is 2-5 with a 5.40 ERA, .308 opponents batting average and seven home runs in 41.2 innings (1.51 hr per nine innings) over his last eight starts dating back to June 28...was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA, .246 opponents average and five home runs in 77.0 innings (0.58 hr per nine innings) over his first 12 starts...is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season tomorrow, which matches his career high from last year...already has a career-high 11 losses...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's win over Houston last Saturday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 9.58 ERA in five career appearances against Baltimore, including one start...the start came in his only outing this year, a 9-2 loss in Oakland Aug. 3 (3.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...is 1-4 with a 5.53 ERA in five starts against American League East competition compared to 5-7 with a 3.23 ERA in 19 games against all other teams.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

12-22, 4.14 ERA (149 er in 323.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 20-for-37 (54.1%)

- The A's bullpen has a 5.09 ERA (23 er in 40.2 ip) over its past 13 games...has a 4.14 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League.
- Has the second fewest wins in the AL (12) and the third most losses (22)...has yielded the fourth most doubles (66), the fifth most home runs (40) and has the sixth highest opponents slugging percentage (.400).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (20), the lowest save percentage (54,1%) and is tied for the most blown saves (17).
- Edward Mujica recorded the save Saturday, which was the A's first since July 11 at Cleveland ... it snapped a streak of 21 consecutive games (including complete games) without a save, which was the longest single season streak by an A's team since a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6. 1994.
- Tied for the Major League lead in first batter RBI allowed (44) and has allowed the sixth most first batter home runs (12).
- The A's are 6-38 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 41-25 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).
