### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-65) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (57-56)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 14, 2015 – CAMDEN YARDS – 7:05 P.M. EDT LHP BRAD MILLS (0-0, ---) VS. RHP UBALDO JIMENEZ (9-7, 3.79) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Toronto to start the road trip after winning each of the final three games on the last homestand...are now 7-13 (.350) over the last 20 games and are 51-65 (.440) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League... have spent 90 of the last 94 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...the 90 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 17-24 (.415) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 90 days in fifth.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers allowed 16 runs in the three-game series at Toronto (14 er in 12.1 ip, 10.22 ERA) after allowing 19 runs in 11 games on the last homestand (2.19 ERA)...starters have a 3.17 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.81)...in the designated hitter era, the lowest ERAs by an American League starting pitching staff are 2.98 (Oakland, 1974), 3.08 (New York, 1978) and 3.16 (Oakland and New York, 1981)...lead the AL in fewest home runs (56) and most innings pitched (703.1) and are fourth in complete games (5).

**PITCHING:** The A's lead the American League and rank fifth in the majors with a 3.47 ERA...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.362), are tied for the lead in fewest home runs (96) and are second in opponents batting average (.238), on-base percentage (.298) and fewest extra base hits (277).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .228 (307-for-1348) with 129 runs scored over the last 41 games (3.15 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, the A's are tied for the fewest home runs in the American League (90), rank third in fewest strikeouts (764) and stolen base percentage (65-for-86, 75.6%), fourth in triples (27) and tied for fourth in doubles (201)... lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (118)...are last in the majors with 10 sacrifice hits, which is second fewest in Major League history (9, Texas in 2005).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 96 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 30 and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 50 errors are the most by two teammates since Carlos Guillen (28) and Brandon Inge (22) combined for 50 for the 2006 Detroit Tigers...the last time two teammates had more than 50 errors was in 2000 for the Anaheim Angels, who had 52 from Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19)...this marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the A's 96 errors have led to 49 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which are tied for the fewest in the AL.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 13-26 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...the 26 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 39 games are tied for third most in the American League...12 of the A's last 18 games have been decided by two runs or fewer and the A's are 21-40 (.344) in those games for the season, which is the second worst record in the majors (Miami, 18-36, .333).

**OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 4-8 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have played in the third most games (12)...are 7-14 in games decided in the last at bat... the last at bat wins are second fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the AL...have four walk-off wins in their last 16 home games after collecting just one over their first 45 home contests.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 10-15 (.400) since the All-Star Break, which is the third worst record in the American League...are batting .227 (188-for-829) with 80 runs scored (3.20 runs per game)...are tied with Atlanta for the fewest runs scored in the majors, have the second lowest batting average (Washington, .224) and third fewest home runs (16).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-3 on their final road trip to the Eastern time zone, a seven-game trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (four games)...now have a four-game road losing streak, which is one short of the season high of five (May 6-10 and June 5-13)...have also lost seven of the last eight road games and 10 of the last 13...are 24-31 (.436) on the road and 27-34 (.443) at home...have the fourth worst home record in the American League...went 6-5 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (3-1)...won the final three games of the homestand, which matches the A's longest home winning streak of the season (June 10-17)...return home following the game Monday for a five-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...have a 2.96 ERA (185 er in 561.0 ip) at home compared to 4.07 (212 er in 469.0 ip) on the road.

IT'S NOT ALL RIGHT: Brad Mills is scheduled to become the first left-handed pitcher to start a game for the A's since Drew Pomeranz started against Toronto July 23...that ends a string of 19 consecutive games started by right-handed pitchers, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since July 21-Oct. 2, 1999 when they did it in 68 straight contests.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 9-17 (.346) against American League East teams, which is the worst record by any team against the AL East... have lost 12 of their last 15 games against AL East competition...are 9-21 (.300) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-20)...are 19-26 (.422) in day games, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .317 (32-for-101) with five home runs and 86 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (118), rank third in RBI and tied for third in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .193 (16-for-83) but have 15 walks... have the fourth lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for sixth in the majors in walks...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (100)...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have four players on the disabled list (Doo-little, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Doo-little and Ladendorf are on rehab assignments...the four players on the DL are a season low...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's are 1-2 against Baltimore after losing two of three in Oakland earlier this month...won the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Baltimore and Oakland...it was their sixth season series win in the last seven years and the A's are now 14-1-1 in season series dating back to 1999...are 89-48 (.650) over that span... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-254 against the Orioles...that breaks

down to 128-132 in Oakland and 128-122 in Baltimore...are 61-48 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 992-934 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

#### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

Fernando Abad has not allowed an earned run in his past 13 games and 12.2 innings...Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (23) and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (32)...tops American League rookies in hits (107) and total bases (137)...Marcus Semien extended his hitting streak to eight games yesterday, which matches his career high (May 12-20, 2015)...is 11-for-26 (.423) during the streak.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx hits for the cycle and drives in nine runs in the A's 11-5 win over Cleveland...in **1987** Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brad Mills (4-11, 4.45 ERA with Nashville)

**BRIEFLY:** Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making the 21st appearance and 14th start of his Major League career...has spent the entire season with the Sounds and is 4-11 with a 4.45 ERA in 22 starts...was a non-roster invitee with the A's this spring and went 1-0 with an 11.25 ERA in three games, one start...went 1-1 with a 4.41 ERA in three starts with the A's last year before he was claimed off waivers by Toronto July 17.

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START:** His last Major League start came as an Athletic on July 1 of last year at Detroit...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss...retired each of the first eight batters and did not allow a run until Cabrera scored on a Hunter ground out in the fourth...also allowed a two-run home run to Martinez in the sixth...Porcello shutout the A's on four hits.

MILLS vs. BALTIMORE: Is 3-0 with a 1.56 ERA (17.1 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, all starts...is 1-4 with a 10.16 ERA (64 er in 56.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against all other teams... is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (12.0 ip) in

two starts in his home ballparks against Baltimore...including his last start against the Orioles on July 8, 2012 while pitching for Los Angeles (AL)... combined with four Angels relievers on a five-hit, 6-0 shutout...tossed five of the innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed a leadoff double to Andino in the first, a one-out single to Davis in the second and a one-out single to Pearce in the fifth...his only appearance at Camden Yards came in a 5-4 Toronto win on Aug. 5, 2011...allowed a two-run home run to Jones in the first and had a 4-2 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Wieters in the sixth

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-11 with a 4.45 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 22 starts...his 11 losses are a minor league career high, surpassing his previous high of 10 with Salt Lake in 2012...is tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in losses and ranks sixth in innings pitched and most walks (49)...the Sounds were 6-16 (.273) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 14 of his 22 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 0-8 with a 4.02 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 4.87 ERA in 12 starts on the road...allowed three home runs in 62.2 innings at home, eight in 64.2 innings on the road.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .265 opponents batting average, which included a .240 (84-for-350) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (42-for-126) against left-handers...10 of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots, including six leading off an inning...yielded a .288 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 5-for-9 (.556) with two doubles and 15 RBI with the bases loaded.

**INNING BY INNING:** Had a 3.27 ERA (16 er in 44.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 6.00 ERA (38 er in 57.0 ip) in the third through fifth innings and a 3.08 ERA (9 er in 26.1 ip) from the sixth inning on.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Lost each of his first three starts and began the season with a four-game losing streak over his first five starts through May 7...had a 5.19 ERA and .282 opponents batting average over that stretch...walked a season-high five batters in 3.2 innings in his first start of the season April 13 at Oklahoma City...struck out a season-high six batters May 2 at Round Rock, his first of four six-strikeout games...picked up his first win of the season May 12 at lowa and went 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA over a four-start stretch from May 12 to 28...then went 0-2 with a 4.72 ERA over his next three starts from June 2 to 14...did not allow a run in back-to-back starts on June 19 against Omaha (7.0 i[p) and June 25 at Memphis (8.0 ip)...ended up with a no decision in a 10-inning, 1-0 loss to Omaha but picked up his third win of the season in a 5-0 win against Memphis...then went 0-2 with an 8.40 ERA over his next three starts...including July 6 at Round Rock when he yielded a season-high 10 hits...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings July 11 at Memphis...tossed a season-high 8.2 innings two starts later on July 25 against New Orleans but was the losing pitcher in a 3-1 Sounds loss...allowed 13 runs on 15 hits and six walks in 8.1 innings (14.04 ERA) over his final two starts before being called up by Oakland.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Was signed by Toronto after being selected in the fourth round of the 2007 draft and made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays in 2009...spent parts of three seasons with Toronto from 2009-11 and went 2-3 with an 8.57 ERA in 14 games, including nine starts...was traded to the Angels following the 2011 season and made one start with Los Angeles in 2012...was claimed off waivers by Texas at the end of Spring Training in 2013 and spent his time at Triple-A Round Rock before being released July 18...pitched for both the A's and Blue Jays in 2014...is 4-4 with an 8.15 ERA in 20 career appearances, including 13 starts...is 1-1 with a 4.41 ERA (8 er in 16.1 ip) in three career starts with the A's and 3-3 with a 9.21 ERA in 17 games with everyone else.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-4, 2.48 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with a 2.03 ERA in four starts since his return...received one run of support in his last start, the fifth time in his seven starts he received support of one run or fewer... his season run support average as a starter is 2.27...is 1-4 with a 2.27 ERA and .228 opponents batting average in his seven starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked seven batters in 43.2 innings as a starter (1.44 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win over Houston last Sunday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 10 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Baltimore, a start in the A's 5-0 win earlier this year on Aug. 4 in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 bb, 7 so).

#### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

12-22, 4.12 ERA (149 er in 325.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 20-for-37 (54.1%)

- The A's bullpen is 2-4 with a save, three blown saves and 4.85 ERA (23 er in 42.2 ip) over its past 14 games (beginning July 29)...has a 4.12 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League.
- Has the second fewest wins in the AL (12) and the third most losses (22)...has yielded the fourth most doubles (66) and fifth most home runs (40)
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (20), the lowest save percentage (54.1%) and is tied for the most blown saves (17).
- Is tied for the Major League lead in first batter RBI (44)...has allowed the fourth most first batter home runs in the AL (12).
- Edward Mujica recorded the save last Saturday, which was the A's first since July 11 at Cleveland...it snapped a streak of 21 consecutive games (including complete games) without a save, which was the longest single season streak by an A's team since a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6, 1994.
- The A's are 6-38 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 41-26 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has not allowed an earned run in his past 13 games and 12.2 innings (6 h, 1 r, 3 bb, 13 so)...has not yielded a run in 20 of his past 23 games (2 er in 21.2 ip, 0.83 ERA) after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances
- Has allowed a .160 (8-for-50) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .250 (17-for-68) with 10 of his 12 extra base hits (.559 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a 1.40 ERA (3 er in 19.1 ip) in 25 games at home compared to 5.40 (8 er in 13.1 ip) in 18 contests on the road.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (4) and tied for second in first batter RBI (12).
- Has not allowed a run in seven games and 5.1 innings in his career against the Orioles (7 h, 1 bb, 3 so).

Last Year: Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors... ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.

- Was acquired from Toronto July 31 for cash considerations and has appeared in two games since then (10.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 5 so).
- Tossed 6.1 innings Wednesday night, which was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 ip, May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota). it was the longest relief appearance by an A's reliever since Lenny Di-Nardo tossed 6.1 innings July 7, 2007 vs. Seattle.
- Did not strike out a batter Wednesday and his 6.1 innings pitched were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL).
- Began the year with Triple-A Buffalo and posted a 1-3 record and 2.44 ERA in nine starts...was selected from Buffalo July 3 and went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, including four starts, with Toronto...was designated for assignment July 29.
- Is 2-2 with a 4.50 ERA (26 er in 52.0 ip) in 12 appearances, seven starts, in his career against Baltimore.
- Is 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA (40 er in 48.2 ip) in 32 relief appearances in his career, 28-24 with a 4.47 ERA in 77 starting assignments

Last Year: Combined for a 4-5 record and 5.54 ERA in 21 games, 14 starts, for Boston and Chicago (NL)...began the season with the Red Sox and was traded to the Cubs July 30 for cash considerations.
