OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-67) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (59-56)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five straight games to start the road trip after winning each of the final three games on the last homestand...are now 7-15 (.318) over the last 22 games and are 51-67 (.432) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and ties the club's low-water mark for the season (also 14-30 on May 22)...have spent 92 of the last 96 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...the 92 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 17-26 (.395) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 92 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed 22 runs in the first five games of the trip (20 er in 25.1 ip, 7.11 ERA) after allowing 19 runs in 11 games on the last homestand (2.19 ERA)...starters have a 3.19 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.77)...in the designated hitter era, the lowest ERAs by an American League starting pitching staff are 2.98 (Oakland, 1974), 3.08 (New York, 1978) and 3.16 (Oakland and New York, 1981)...lead the AL in fewest home runs (57) and most innings pitched (708.1) and are fourth in complete games (5).

PITCHING: The A's are second in the American League and rank sixth in the majors with a 3.51 ERA...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with 14 shutouts...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.365), have allowed the third fewest home runs (102) and are third in opponents batting average (.239)...are second in on-base percentage (.299) and fewest extra base hits (285).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .231 (331-for-1432) with 138 runs scored over the last 43 games (3.21 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, the A's are tied for the second fewest home runs in the American League (93), rank third in fewest strikeouts (787) fourth in doubles (205), stolen base percentage (66-for-87, 75.9%), and triples (29)...lead the AL and are third in the majors in infield hits (121)...are last in the majors with 11 sacrifice hits.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 96 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 30 and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 50 errors are the most by two teammates since Carlos Guillen (28) and Brandon Inge (22) combined for 50 for the 2006 Detroit Tigers...the last time two teammates had more than 50 errors was in 2000 for the Anaheim Angels, who had 52 from Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19)...this marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the A's 96 errors have led to 49 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which are tied for the fewest in the AL.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 13-27 (.325) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...the 27 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 40 games are third most in the American League...14 of the A's last 20 games have been decided by two runs or fewer and the A's are 21-42 (.333) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the majors.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-9 (.308) in extra inning games, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for second in most extra-inning games (13)...are 7-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are second fewest in the majors and the losses are also second...have four walk-off wins in their last 16 home games after collecting one over their first 45 home contests.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 10-17 (.370) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are batting .232 (212-for-913) with 89 runs scored (3.30 runs per game)...have scored the second fewest runs in the majors, have hit the fourth fewest home runs (19), and have the third lowest batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-5 on their final road trip to the Eastern time zone, a seven-game trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-2)...now have a six-game road losing streak, which is a new season high...have also lost nine of the last 10 road games and 12 of the last 15...are 24-33 (.421) on the road and 27-34 (.443) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...went 6-5 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (3-1)...won the final three games of the homestand, which matches the A's longest home winning streak of the season (June 10-17)...return home following the game Monday for a five-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...have a 2.96 ERA (185 er in 561.0 ip) at home compared to 4.12 (224 er in 489.0 ip) on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 9-19 (.321) against American League East teams, which is the worst record by any team against the AL East...have lost 14 of their last 17 games against AL East competition...are 9-21 (.300) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-20)...are 19-26 (.422) in day games, which is the second worst record in the AL (Chicago, 20-28, .417).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .320 (33-for-103) with five home runs and 87 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (120), rank third in RBI and tied for third in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .188 (16-for-85) but have 15 walks...have the fourth lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for sixth in the majors in walks...rank second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (102)...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Ladendorf are on rehab assignments...the four players on the DL are a season low...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's are 1-4 against Baltimore after losing two of three in Oakland earlier this month...won the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Baltimore and Oakland...it was their sixth season series win in the last seven years and the A's are now 14-2-1 in season series dating back to 1999, including this season...are 89-50 (.640) over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-256 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 128-132 in Oakland and 128-124 in Baltimore...are 61-50 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 992-936 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

Mark Canha now has a career-high seven-game hitting streak...during the streak, he is 9-for-26 (.346) with three doubles and three RBI...**Sam Fuld** hit a home run in the third inning last night, snapping a career-high tying 0-for-18 slump...12 of **Josh Reddick's** last 22 hits have gone for extra bases (nine doubles, three home runs).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** Lefty Grove wins his 20th game of the season, defeating St. Louis in Philadelphia, 4-2...in **1983** Chris Codioli and Dave Beard combine on a 4-0 shutout against California, the A's third consecutive shutout...the shutout comes as part of an Oakland record 37 consecutive scoreless innings...in **1991** Dennis Eckersley strikes out Chili Davis at Minnesota for his 2000th career strikeout...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits two home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Boston, the A's 199th and 200th of the season...that broke the A's franchise record of 199.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-8, 3.89 ERA)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 5.83 ERA (19 er in 29.1 ip) and .293 (36-for-123) opponents batting average over his last six starts... the losing streak is a career high and it matches the A's season high...the losing streak follows a six-start stretch where he went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA and .236 opponents batting average...went 3-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first seven starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in games started (19) and innings pitched (106.1), tied for third in wins (6) and fifth in strikeouts (70)...has one of six complete games by an AL rookie.

SECOND STINT: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-6 with a 3.10 ERA (31 er in 90.0 ip) and .261 (91-for-349) opponents batting average in 15 starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...walked nine batters in 16.1 innings during his first stint (4.96 per nine innings) and has 27 in 90.0 innings during his current stint (2.70 per nine innings).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-3 with a 3.13 ERA (22 er in 63.1 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 2-5 with a 5.02 ERA (24 er in 43.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-4 with a 3.17 ERA (19 er in 54.0 ip) in 10 starts on the road compared to 2-4 with a 4.64 ERA (27 er in 52.1 ip) in nine starts at home...has surrendered four home runs in 54.0 innings on the road compared to nine in 52.1 innings in Oakland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .272 (55-for-202) average against left-handed hitters compared to .276 (60-for-217) against right-handers... has surrendered 10 of his 13 home runs to righties but has issued 24 of 36 walks to lefties...has a .235 (36-for-153) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .282 (42-for-149) the second time and .3167 (37-for-117) after that...has yielded a .132 (7-for-53) batting average to the opponents number one hitter but the three hitter is batting .400 (20-for-50).

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-3 with a 4.85 ERA in five starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in the month of June...ranked fifth in the American League in June ERA...was 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts in May...compiled a 1-2 record and an 8.27 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Has received nine runs of support in his last seven starts (36.1 ip, 2.23 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 19 starts and is 1-8 in those games...is 5-0 in eight starts with support of three or more runs...has a 3.62 ERA (35 er in 87.0 ip) over the first five innings of a game compared to a 5.12 ERA (11 er in 19.1 ip) from the sixth inning on...the A's are 8-11 (.421) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 19 starts.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 10-1 A's loss to Texas **April 9** in Oakland...allowed the first two home runs of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career **April 14** at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...took the loss **April 25** against Houston to fall to 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts...was optioned to Nashville the next day...was recalled **May 23** and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay **May 23**...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a six-start streak from **June 7** to **July 4** where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963)...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston **June 7**...left the game with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed six runs in the eighth inning, with Clippard getting the blown save and loss...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth ML start, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 13**...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches...allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks...be-

came the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to lose a 1-0 complete game, the third in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle)...also took the loss in his next start **June 18** against San Diego for the first losing streak of his career... had a career-high three-game winning streak from **June 24** to **July 4**... allowed just two earned runs during the streak for a 0.86 ERA...tossed a career-high tying 111 pitches in 7.0 shutout innings for the win **June 29** against Colorado...combined with Pomeranz and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 4** in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed five of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Cleveland **July 10**...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extended his scoreless streak to a career-high and A's season high 19.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Toronto **July 21** in Oakland...allowed a career-high three home runs...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 4-3 loss at San Francisco **July 26**...tossed just 1.1 innings, which is the shortest outing of his career as a starter.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto on Tuesday...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs, one earned, in the second inning on an error, a Smoak RBI double and a ground out...also allowed a two-out home run to Bautista in the fifth inning and left after 4.2 innings trailing 4-1.

GRAVEMAN vs. BALTIMORE: Is 0-0 with a 3.68 ERA (7.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so) in three career appearances, including one start...the start came this year in the A's 7-3, 10-inning loss in Oakland Aug. 5...allowed a RBI single to Reimold in the third inning but the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth...allowed RBI singles to Paredes and Hardy in the sixth inning to tie the game...the other two appearances came in relief last year with Toronto...retired the final two batters in the seventh inning Sept. 16 at Baltimore (0.2 ip, 1 so) and then pitched a scoreless seventh inning Sept. 28 at Toronto (1.0 ip, 1 so).
