OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-68) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (60-56)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six straight games to start the road trip after winning each of the final three games on the last homestand...are now 7-16 (.304) over the last 23 games and are 51-68 (.429) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and the club's low-water mark for the season...have spent 93 of the last 97 days in sole possession of last place in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...the 93 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 17-27 (.386) since then...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 93 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed 28 runs in the first six games of the trip (26 er in 28.2 ip, 8.16 ERA) after allowing 19 runs in 11 games on the last homestand (2.19 ERA)...starters have a 3.25 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.76)...in the designated hitter era, the lowest ERAs by an American League starting pitching staff are 2.98 (Oakland, 1974), 3.08 (New York, 1978) and 3.16 (Oakland and New York, 1981)...lead the AL in fewest home runs (61) and most innings pitched (719.2) and are fourth in complete games (5).

PITCHING: The A's are third in the American League with a 3.63 ERA...lead the AL and are tied for third in the majors with 14 shutouts...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.372), are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (106) and are fourth in opponents batting average (.243)...are fourth in on-base percentage (.302) and second in fewest extra base hits (296).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .232 (340-for-1468) with 140 runs scored over the last 44 games (3.18 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, the A's have hit the third fewest home runs in the American League (94), rank third in fewest strikeouts (797) fourth in doubles (208) and triples (29), and third in stolen base percentage (66-for-87, 75.9%)...lead the AL and are third in the majors in infield hits (122)...are last in the majors with 11 sacrifice hits.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 96 errors, which is the most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 30 and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 50 errors are the most by two teammates since Carlos Guillen (28) and Brandon Inge (22) combined for 50 for the 2006 Detroit Tigers...the last time two teammates had more than 50 errors was in 2000 for the Anaheim Angels, who had 52 from Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19)...this marks the first time the A's have two players with 20 or more errors since 1983 (Phillips 30, Almon 20)...the A's 96 errors have led to 49 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 53)...A's outfielders have 19 assists, which are sixth fewest in the AL.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 13-27 (.325) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...the 27 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 40 games are third most in the American League...14 of the A's last 21 games have been decided by two runs or fewer and the A's are 21-42 (.333) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the majors.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-9 (.308) in extra inning games, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for second in most extra-inning games (13)...are 7-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are second fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second fewest...have four walk-off wins in their last 16 home games after collecting one over their first 45 home contests.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 10-18 (.370) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the worst record in the American League...are batting .233 (221-for-949) with 91 runs scored (3.25 runs per game)...have scored the second fewest runs in the majors, have hit the fourth fewest home runs (20), and have the fourth lowest batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-6 on their final road trip to the Eastern time zone, a seven-game trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-3)...now have a seven-game road losing streak, which is an ongoing season high...have also lost 10 of the last 11 road games and 13 of the last 16...are 24-34 (.414) on the road and 27-34 (.443) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...went 6-5 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Houston (3-1)...won the final three games of the homestand, which matches the A's longest home winning streak of the season (June 10-17)...return home following the game tonight for a five-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...have a 2.97 ERA (185 er in 561.0 ip) at home compared to 4.38 (242 er in 497.0 ip) on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 9-20 (.310) against American League East teams, which is the worst record by any team against the AL East...have lost 15 of their last 18 games against AL East competition...are 9-22 (.290) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-20)...are 19-27 (.413) in day games, which is the worst record in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are batting .320 (33-for-103) with five home runs and 87 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (120), rank third in RBI and tied for third in grand slams...A's pinch hitters are batting .188 (16-for-85) but have 15 walks...have the fourth lowest pinch-batting average in the AL but lead the league and are tied for sixth in the majors in walks...rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (102)...the A's are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

60 YEARS LATER: The A's allowed 26 hits yesterday, which is a new Oakland record...were the most hits allowed as a franchise since surrendering 29 hits to the Chicago White Sox on April 23, 1955, as the Kansas City Athletics...yesterday also marked the 10th time in Oakland history that the A's have allowed 18 or more runs in a game.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Ladendorf are on rehab assignments...the four players on the DL are a season low...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's are 1-5 against Baltimore after losing two of three in Oakland earlier this month...won the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Baltimore and Oakland...are now 14-2-1 in season series dating back to 1999, including this season...are 89-51 (.636) over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-257 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 128-132 in Oakland and 128-125 in Baltimore...are 61-51 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 992-937 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sam Fuld has recorded an RBI in each of the last two games, which marks the first time this season he's driven in a run in consecutive games...is 2-for-six this series since snapping a career-high 0-for-18 slump...**Coco Crisp** is 7-for-14 with four doubles and one RBI over his last three games after starting the season 6-for-69 with one double over his first 21 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Ed Coleman hits three consecutive home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago, a 9-8, 10 inning A's win...in **1980** Brian Kingman tosses the A's Oakland record ninth consecutive complete game in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle...in **1987** Reggie Jackson hits the 563rd and final home run of his career against his teammates from the previous season, the California Angels...he homers off Mike Witt, but the A's would go on to lose, 6-4...in **1990** Bob Welch wins his 20th game of the season en route to a club record 27 wins and the AL Cy Young...the 27 wins are the most by an American League pitcher since Denny McClain's 31 in 1968.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (12-4, 2.06 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.06 ERA...currently has the lowest ERA by an AL pitcher since Pedro Martinez posted a 1.74 ERA for Boston in 2000...now has a 2.65 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Oakland history.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on nine days rest today...missed his last scheduled start on Thursday in Toronto due to back spasms...is 8-2 with a 1.69 ERA (20 er in 106.2 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest compared to 4-2 with a 2.78 ERA (17 er in 55.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more...has the third lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 0.91).

GO THE DISTANCE: Has tossed two complete games in his last three starts and is 2-0 with a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) and .148 (12-for-81) opponents batting average over that span...has three complete games in his last six starts and is 3-1 with a 1.72 ERA (9 er in 47.0 ip) and .175 (28-for-160) opponents batting average over that span...his three complete games are tied for third in the American League.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents batting average (.198), on-base percentage (.251) and slugging percentage (.269), is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), third in winning percentage (.750), fifth in innings pitched (161.2), tied for sixth in wins (12) and tied for 10th in strikeouts (136)...has allowed nine home runs in 161.2 innings and his average of 0.50 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...also ranks second in fewest pitches per inning (14.4), fourth in wild pitches (10), and tied for ninth in opponents reaching base on an error (6).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-1 with a 1.64 ERA (15 er in 82.1 ip) in 12 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.50 ERA (22 er in 79.1 ip) in 11 starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins...has allowed two home runs in 82.1 innings on the road, seven in 79.1 innings at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.97 ERA (6 er in 55.2 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 7-3 with a 2.63 ERA (31 er in 106.0 ip) in 15 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors and is tied for the American League lead in day wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 19 of his 22 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .209 (41-for-196) with one double and two home runs (.245 slugging percentage) with runners on base...the batting average and slugging percentage are second lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...also ranks second among AL qualifiers with a .127 (37-for-291) batting average with two strikes and a .184 (58-for-315) average against left-handed hitters...opponents are batting .201 (31-for-154) with a .250 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are both sixth in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has 28 putouts, which ties the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...leads Major League pitchers in putouts...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances (48) and tied for seventh in assists (20).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-1 with a 2.13 ERA (9 er in 38.0 ip) in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...his ERA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchschere's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 11-11 with a 2.98 ERA (64 er in 193.1 ip) in 30 games after the break.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts in August... went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 (also 1.03 in July, 2014)... finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts.

30 CAREER WINS: Picked up the 30th victory of his career July 28 at Los Angeles (NL), which was the 66th appearance of his career...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to win 30 games in 66 or fewer games...the

others are Tim Hudson (52nd game), Barry Zito (61st), Mark Mulder (61st) and Trevor Cahill (66th).

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in four of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22)...is 6-1 in 12 starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 23 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 17 times, one earned run or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 17 times...the A's are 15-8 (.652) in his starting assignments and are 39-27 (.591) when he starts in his career...is 27-1 in 38 career starts with three runs of support or more...tossed a two-hit shutout July 12 at Cleveland and a three-hit shutout three starts later July 28 at Los Angeles (NL)...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts in a month since Barry Zito had two in August, 2001.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

LAST START: He tossed his fifth career complete game, a five-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Houston Aug. 7 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out five...it was his first complete game in the Coliseum and his first complete game in which he allowed a run...allowed his only run on a two-out home run by Valbuena in the fifth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Felix Doubront (1-1, 4.59 ERA): was acquired by Oakland on July 31 from the Toronto Blue Jays for cash considerations...has appeared in two games with Oakland since then, both in relief...tossed 6.1 innings Wednesday night, which was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 ip, May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota).....his 6.1 innings pitched Wednesday were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL)...began the year with Triple-A Buffalo and posted a 1-3 record and 2.44 ERA in nine starts...was selected from Buffalo July 3 and went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, including four starts, with Toronto...was designated for assignment July 29...is 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA (40 er in 48.2 ip) in 32 relief appearances in his career, 28-24 with a 4.47 ERA in 77 starting assignments.

- The A's bullpen allowed 12 runs yesterday afternoon, which was the most it has yielded since August 25, 2011 at New York (AL) when it allowed 16.
- Is 2-6 with a save, four blown saves and 6.67 ERA (41 er in 55.1 ip) over its past 17 games (beginning July 29)...has a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.55).
- Has the second fewest wins in the AL (12) and is tied for the second most losses (24)...has yielded the third most doubles (71), fourth most home runs (45) and has the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.415).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (20), the lowest save percentage (52.6%) and is tied for the most blown saves (18).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (48) and is tied for the second most first batter home runs (14).
- The A's are 6-40 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 41-27 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).
