OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-69) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (67-51)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost a season-high seven straight games to fall to a season-high 18 games under .500, marking the first time the A's have been at least 18 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...are 51-69 (.425), which is the worst record in the American League and tied for fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the fourth worst record in Oakland history after 120 games and is the worst since 1997 (47-73)...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 13½ games for the second consecutive day...have spent 94 of the last 98 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8)...the 94 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 17-28 (.378) since then.

SEVEN-GAME LOSING STREAK: The A's seven-game losing streak is their longest since 2012 when they lost nine straight from May 22 to June 1...have been out-scored 52-20 during the losing streak (7.4 to 2.9) but five of the seven games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are batting .241 (59-for-245) and have a 6.93 ERA (47 er in 61.0 ip) and .304 (78-for-257) opponents batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...it was the seventh winless road trip of seven or more games in Oakland history, the first since July 21-27, 1998 (0-7 vs. Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...begin a five-game homestand tonight against Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...have won each of their last three home games, which matches the A's longest home winning streak of the season (June 10-17)...are 27-34 (.443) at home compared to 24-35 (.407) on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League and are tied for the third worst road record...have a 2.97 ERA (185 er in 561.0 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (243 er in 505.0 ip) on the road.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 6-6 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-1 vs. Los Angeles)...are 2-5 over the last seven games after going 4-1 over their first five...the 12 interleague games are tied with the Mets and Dodgers for the fewest in the majors...the A's are batting .273 (112-for-410), which is the seventh best interleague average...are averaging 5.00 runs per game (60 runs in 12 games), which is tied for fourth best...after this two-game series, the A's have two remaining interleague series: at Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and vs. San Francisco in Oakland (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 186-150 (.554)...have won 20 of their last 26 interleague games in the Coliseum...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 10-19 (.345) since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Boston and Minnesota for the worst record in the American League...are batting .229 (220-for-991) with 93 runs scored (3.21 runs per game)...have the second lowest batting average (Washington, .222) in the majors, the second fewest runs scored (Atlanta, 92) and the fourth fewest home runs (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers allowed 32 runs in seven games on the road trip (27 er in 34.1 ip, 7.08 ERA) after allowing 19 runs in 11 games on the last homestand (2.19 ERA)...now have a 3.24 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...also lead the AL in fewest home runs (62), are tied for the lead in innings pitched (725.1) and tied for fourth in complete games (5).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed at least one home run in 12 consecutive games (20 home runs total), which is the second longest streak by an A's team over the last 27 years (13, Sept. 11-24, 2012)...have allowed 107 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14) and opponents slugging percentage (.372), have allowed the second fewest extra base hits (298), rank third in ERA (3.61) and fourth in opponents batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.301).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .229 (343-for-1496) with 142 runs scored over the last 45 games (3.16 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank third in the American League in fewest strikeouts (801) and stolen base percentage (66-for-87, 75.9%) and fourth in doubles (208) and triples (29)...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.384) and third fewest home runs (96)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (122).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed three errors last night, which led to three unearned runs...lead the majors with 99 errors and rank second with 52 unearned runs (San Diego, 60)...Marcus Semien has 31 errors and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 51 errors are the most by two teammates since Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19) combined for 52 for the 2000 Anaheim Angels.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: Of the A's last 22 games, 15 have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 21-43 (.328) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is the worst record in the majors...are 13-27 (.325) in one-run games, which is also the worst record in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...the 27 losses are the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 28 years (had 28 last year)...the 40 games are tied for third most in the American League.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-9 (.308) in extra inning games, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for second in most extra-inning games (13)...are 7-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are second most...have four walk-off wins in their last 16 home games after collecting one over their first 45 home contests.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-22 (.290) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-20)...are 19-27 (.413) in day games, which is the worst record in the American League...are tied with the Yankees for the Major League lead in plate appearances with the bases loaded (120), rank third in RBI (87) and tied for third in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (16-for-85, .188)...are third in pinch plate appearances (102)...allowed an Oakland-record 26 hits Sunday in Baltimore...those were the most hits allowed by an A's team since the Kansas City A's surrendered 29 hits to Chicago on April 23, 1955.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker)...all but Hahn are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Ladendorf are on rehab assignments...the four players on the DL are a season low...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. DODGERS: The season series is even at one game each as the A's split a two-game series at Los Angeles July 28-29...the A's have won 15 of their last 20 games against the Dodgers and have a six-game winning streak in the Coliseum...have won five of the eight season series and lead the all-time series 17-10 (.630)...the only team with a better winning percentage against the Dodgers is the White Sox (14-7, .667)...are 12-2 in Oakland and 5-8 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (24) and multiple hit games (33) and tops American League rookies in hits (110) and total bases (142)...**Billy Butler** is batting .457 (16-for-35) in interleague play, which ranks second in the majors (min. 37 pa) to Ben Zobrist (.484).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson hits a two-run homer to break a 1-1 tie in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore...it is Henderson 744th run as an Athletic, most ever by an Oakland player...in **1991** Dave Stewart records his 1000th strikeout in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-4 loss at Minnesota...he becomes the third pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 1000...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 145th career home run in the Coliseum, breaking Reggie Jackson's Coliseum career home run record...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo hits three home runs to account for all of the A's scoring in a 5-4 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Felix Doubront (1-1, 5.75 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and fifth start of the season...it will be his third appearance and first start with the A's...was released by Chicago (NL) March 28 and signed a minor league contract with Toronto April 2...began the season on the disabled list at Triple-A Buffalo with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13 and went 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA in nine starts with the Bisons before he was selected by the Blue Jays July 3...was 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29...was traded to Oakland July 31 for cash considerations and is 0-0 with a 4.22 ERA in two relief appearances with the A's.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-1 with a 4.87 ERA (11 er in 20.1 ip) and .341 (29-for-85) opponents batting average in his four starts compared to 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .255 (13-for-51) opponents average in three relief appearances...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 1-for-3 in his relief appearances...is now 28-24 with a 4.47 ERA (210 er in 423.0 ip) in 77 career starts, 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA (40 er in 48.2 ip) in 32 relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .309 opponents batting average, which includes .235 (8-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .333 (34-for-102) against right-handers...has issued all six of his walks and 13 of his 14 extra base hits to righties...lefties are slugging .265 (1 double) compared to .500 by righties...has not walked any of the 34 batters he has faced to lead off an inning...opponents are batting .263 (23-for-80) with the bases empty compared to .375 (21-for-56) with runners on base...has allowed a .438 (14-for-32) average with runners in scoring position

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Was the losing pitcher in his only interleague appearance this year, a start in a 3-2 Toronto loss to Philadelphia on July 28 (3 er in 4.0 ip, 6.75 ERA)...is now 5-2 with a 4.34 ERA (23 er in 47.2 ip) in nine career interleague appearances, including eight starts.

WITH TORONTO: Made his Blue Jays debut in relief on **July 3** at Detroit, allowing one run in 2.1 innings in relief of Drew Hutchison...picked up his first and only win of the season in his first start, a 2-1 Toronto win at Chicago (AL) **July 7**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a Sanchez RBI single...shutout the White Sox on three hits over his final 4.2 innings...had a no decision in an 11-10 loss at Kansas City **July 12**...yielded a career-high tying seven runs, including six runs in the first inning and another in the fifth...the Blue Jays then scored eight times in the in the sixth inning and he was relieved by Delabar to start the sixth with an 8-7 lead...Delabar allowed three runs for the blown save...had a no decision in a 4-3, 10-inning loss at Oakland **July 22**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Phegley RBI single in the fourth...then allowed a Vogt RBI single and a Smolinski sacrifice fly in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 3-1.

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed 4.1 innings of relief **Aug. 3** against Baltimore in his Oakland debut, which was an A's season-high for a reliever at the time...enter the game in the fourth inning in relief of Jesse Chavez...allowed RBI doubles to Paredes and Joseph in the fifth inning and a RBI single to Machado in the eighth...then tossed 6.1 innings of relief at Toronto **Aug. 12**...it was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 on May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota) and the longest by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.1 innings July 7, 2007 vs. Seattle...did not strike out a batter and his 6.1 innings pitched were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in Toronto's 3-2 loss to Philadelphia on July 28...the Blue Jays scored single runs in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Phillies on two hits and two walks over the first four innings...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Asche and a RBI double by Blanco.

WITH BUFFALO: Was 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in nine games, all starts, with Triple-A Buffalo...signed a minor league deal with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the Triple-A DL with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13...surrendered just one home run in 48.0 innings...allowed a .197 (24-for-122) batting average and his lone home run against right-handed hitters compared to .222 (12-for-54) against left-handers...opponents hit .178 with runners in scoring position and .190 when leading off an inning...went 1-2 with a 1.69 ERA in six starts on the road, 0-1 with a 3.94 ERA in three starts at home...did not allow a run in the fourth (8.0 ip), fifth (6.0 ip) or seventh (3.0 ip) innings...the Bisons were 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed five innings or fewer in five of his nine starts.

BUFFALO HIGHLIGHTS: Did not allow an earned run over his first three starts (15.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 10 so) and went 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA in four starts in May...lost three consecutive starts from June 5 to 15 (6.00 ERA)...struck out a season-high eight batters in 5.0 innings June 5 at Louisville...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings June 10 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...then tossed a season-low 3.0 innings in his next start at Lehigh Valley on June 15...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts June 20 at Syracuse...picked up his lone win of the season in his final start June 28 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre when he tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...issued a season-high four walks.

RHP Jesse Chavez (6-12, 3.84 ERA): Is 2-6 with a 5.48 ERA, .303 opponents batting average and eight home runs in 47.2 innings over his last nine starts dating back to June 28...has 12 losses, which are tied for the most in the American League and are the most by an A's pitcher over the last four years...is 4-5 with a 2.92 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 2-7 with a 4.73 ERA in 13 games on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss at Toronto last Thursday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 9 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA in nine career appearances, including one start, against Los Angeles...the start came in his only outing this year, a no decision in the A's 10-7 loss at Los Angeles (NL) July 29 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.80 ERA in three interleague starts...is 2-3 with a 4.40 ERA in 23 career interleague appearances, including seven starts.

- Has the second fewest wins in the AL (12) and is tied for the second most losses (24)...has yielded the third most doubles (71), fourth most home runs (45) and tossed the fourth fewest innings (340.2).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (20), the lowest save percentage (52.6%) and is tied for the most blown saves (18).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (48) and is tied for the second most first batter home runs (14)...has the third highest opponents average against first batters faced in the AL (.252).
- Allowed 12 runs Sunday afternoon, which was the most it has yielded since August 25, 2011 at New York (AL) when it allowed 16.
- The A's are 6-40 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 41-28 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has a 1.61 ERA (4 er in 22.1 ip) over his past 25 games (beginning May 22)...posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Allowed two runs Friday night...had not yielded an earned run in his previous 13 games and 12.2 innings.
- Has allowed a .160 (8-for-50) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .278 (20-for-72) with 11 of his 13 extra base hits (.611 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a 1.40 ERA (3 er in 19.1 ip) in 25 games at home compared to 6.43 (10 er in 14.0 ip) in 20 contests on the road.
