### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-69) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (67-52)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 19, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP JESSE CHAVEZ (6-12, 3.84) VS. LHP ALEX WOOD (8-7, 3.74, 4.81) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's snapped their season-high seven-game losing streak last night...are 7-10 over the last 17 games and 8-17 over the last 25 contests...are 52-69 (.430) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...it is the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 121 games and is the worst since 1997 (48-73)...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 13½ games for the third consecutive day...have spent 95 of the last 99 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...the 95 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games 25, and are 18-28 (.391) since then.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's currently have a season-high four-game home winning streak and a season-high eight-game road losing streak...are 1-0 on this five-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (1-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)...are 28-34 (.452) at home compared to 24-35 (.407) on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League and are tied for the third worst road record...the 34 home losses are the most by an A's team since 2011 (43-38)...went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...it was the seventh winless road trip of seven or more games in Oakland history, the first since July 21-27, 1998 (0-7 vs. Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...have a 2.96 ERA (188 er in 571.0 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (243 er in 505.0 ip) on the road.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 7-6 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-3 vs. San Francisco, 2-1 vs. Los Angeles)...are 3-5 over the last eight games after going 4-1 over their first five...the 13 interleague games are tied with the Mets and Dodgers for the fewest in the majors...the A's are batting .276 (124-for-449), which is the fourth best interleague average...are aver-

aging 5.00 runs per game (65 runs in 13 games), which is tied for fourth best...after this two-game series, the A's have two remaining interleague series: at Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and vs. San Francisco in Oakland (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 187-150 (.555)...have won 21 of their last 27 interleague games in the Coliseum...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

WALK OFF WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their fifth walk-off win in their last 17 home games last night...had just one over their first 45 home contests...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have the second most extra-inning games to Seattle (19)...are 8-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the American League.

**ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES:** Of the A's last 23 games, 16 have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 22-43 (.338) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is the worst record in the majors...are 14-27 (.341) in one-run games, which is second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 12-24)...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...the 27 losses are the most in the majors and tied for second most by an A's team over the last 29 years (had 28 last year)...the 41 games are tied for third most in the American League.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 11-19 (.367) since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Boston for the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 10-20)...are batting .232 (236-for-1016) with 98 runs scored (3.27 runs per game)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors (Atlanta, 92), the fourth lowest batting average and the fourth fewest home runs (22).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed at least one home run in 13 consecutive games (21 home runs total), which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 15 consecutive games from Aug. 6-21, 1987...have allowed 108 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...have a 6.86 ERA (48 er in 63.0 ip) and .303 (79-for-261) opponents batting average over the last seven games...however,

have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL...lead the AL in shutouts (14) and opponents slugging percentage (.371), have allowed the second fewest extra base hits (299) and rank fourth in opponents batting average (.242) and on-base percentage (.302).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 0-4 with a 6.31 ERA (25 er in 35.2 ip) over the last seven games after going 5-3 with a 2.23 ERA over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.21 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.75)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...lead the American League in fewest home runs (62), rank second in innings pitched (731.1) and tied for fourth in complete games (5).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .231 (355-for-1535) with 147 runs scored over the last 46 games (3.20 runs per game) dating back to June 26... hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank third in the American League in fewest strikeouts (810), tied for third in doubles (212) and fourth in stolen base percentage (66-for-87, 75.9%) and triples (29)...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.385) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (96)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (124).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors with 99 errors and rank second with 53 unearned runs (San Diego, 60)...Marcus Semien has 31 errors and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 51 errors are the most by two teammates since Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19) combined for 52 for the 2000 Anaheim Angels.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-22 (.313) when the opponent starts a lefthanded pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-20)...are 19-27 (.413) in day games, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...will have the day off tomorrow, their first of four consecutive Thursdays off...will play on only two of the remaining six Thursday's...rank second in the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (120), third in RBI (87) and tied for third in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (16-for-85, .188)...are third in pinch plate appearances (102)...allowed an Oakland-record 26 hits Sunday in Baltimore...those were the most hits allowed by an A's team since the Kansas City A's surrendered 29 hits to Chicago on April 23, 1955.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Davis Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker)...all but Davis and Hahn are on the 60day DL...Doolittle and Ladendorf are on rehab assignments...have used the DL a total of 19 times, which is one more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. DODGERS:** The A's lead the season series, 2-1...won the first game in Oakland last night after splitting a two-game series at Los Angeles July 28-29...the A's have won 16 of their last 21 games against the Dodgers and have a seven-game winning streak in the Coliseum...have won five of the eight season series and lead the all-time series 18-10 (.643)... the only team with a better winning percentage against the Dodgers is the White Sox (14-7, .667)...are 13-2 in Oakland and 5-8 in Los Angeles.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (24) and multiple hit games (33) and tops American League rookies in hits (111) and total bases (143)...**Billy Butler** is batting .436 (17-for-39) in interleague play, which ranks second in the majors (min. 40 pa) to Ben Zobrist (.459).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove wins his 16<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, tying the American League record set by Walter Johnson and Joe Wood in 1912...in **1989**, in the midst of a 19-game hitting streak, Carney Lansford records his 1000<sup>th</sup> hit in an A's uniform...in **1991** Jose Canseco hits his 200<sup>th</sup> career home run in the A's 8-7 win at Minnesota...he becomes the second Oakland Athletic and fifth Athletic all-time to reach the 200 plateau...in **2010** Trevor Cahill allows seven hits, ending a modern major league record tying stretch of 20 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer and five innings or more.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (6-12, 3.84 ERA)

**LAST NINE STARTS:** Is 2-6 with a 5.48 ERA (29 er in 47.2 ip), .303 (59for-195) opponents batting average and eight home runs in 47.2 innings (1.51 hr per nine innings) over his last nine starts dating back to June 28... was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA, .246 opponents average and five home runs in 77.0 innings (0.58 hr per nine innings) over his first 12 starts.

**CAREER HIGHS:** Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season today, which will be a new career high, surpassing his 21 from last year...already has a career-high 12 losses and has matched his high in earned runs (56)...his six wins are two short of his best from last year.

**LOSSES:** Has 12 losses, which are tied for the most in the American League (Kluber, CLE)...his .333 winning percentage is tied for fifth lowest...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher since 2011 (Cahill 14, Gonzalez 12)...nine came before the break, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008).

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Is 2-3 with a 5.28 ERA (18 er in 30.2 ip) and .301 (37-for-123) opponents batting average in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 4-9 with a 3.40 ERA and .254 opponents average in 19 games before the break...last year, he was 7-6 with a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the break, 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games after the break...has a 3.72 career ERA before the break, 5.97 (115 er in 173.1 ip) after the break.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is 1-1 with a 4.80 ERA (8 er in 15.0 ip) in three interleague starts...is 2-3 with a 4.40 ERA (30 er in 61.1 ip) in 23 career interleague appearances...that includes 2-2 with a 5.71 ERA (22 er in 34.2 ip) in seven starts.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-5 with a 3.97 ERA (31 er in 70.1 ip) in 14 games at night compared to 3-7 with a 3.69 ERA (25 er in 61.0 ip) in 11 games during the day...is tied for the Major League lead in day losses (Lohse, MIL)...the day losses are the most by an A's pitcher since Tom Candiotti had eight in 1998.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-5 with a 2.92 ERA (21 er in 64.2 ip) in 12 games at home compared to 2-7 with a 4.73 ERA (35 er in 66.2 ip) in 13 games on the road...over the last two seasons, he is 9-6 with a 2.80 ERA (41 er in 132.0 ip) in 27 games at home compared to 5-13 with a 4.40 ERA (71 er in 145.1 ip) in 30 contests on the road.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 21 starts...his season RSA of 3.56 (52 rs in 131.1 ip) is third lowest in the American League...has one start with 11 runs of support and another with nine...has 32 runs of support in his other 19 starts (111.2 ip, 2.58 RSA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed 10 home runs in his last 12 starts and 66.2 innings after surrendering three over his first 13 games and 64.2 innings...has yielded 10 of his 13 home runs to left-handed hitters...nine have come with runners on base...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .089 (5-for-56), which is the lowest mark in the majors...the opponents one, two and three hitters are batting a combined .330 (58-for-176)...has walked two batters or fewer in 17 of his 21 starts...has allowed a .182 (8-for-44) average with runners in scoring position and two outs.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 6-12 with a 4.04 ERA (56 er in 124.2 ip) in his 21 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26... is now 14-20 with a 4.00 ERA (115 er in 259.0 ip) in 44 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-9 with a 3.57 ERA (34 er in 85.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 2-3 with a 5.08 ERA (22 er in 39.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

**THE LAST THREE YEARS:** Is 16-24 with a 3.68 ERA (137 er in 334.2 ip) in 92 games, including 42 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12.

**2015 HIGHLIGHTS:** Tossed 3.2 scoreless innings for the save in his final relief appearance *April 18* at Kansas City...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit...the A's were shutout in three of his first seven starts...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit in his first start, a two-run home run by Calhoun, in a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) *April 23*...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota *May 5*...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 in-

nings and allowed just five hits in a 1-0 loss to Detroit *May* 26 in Oakland. combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on May 31 ... tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning June 6 at Boston to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...left his start at Los Angeles (AL) June 12 with a 4-3 lead but Scribner allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego June 17 in Oakland ... struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia)...snapped a three-game losing streak in a 14-1 win over Minnesota July 19 in Oakland...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .306 opponents average during the streak, which spanned three starts from June 28 to July 9.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto last Thursday...allowed all four of the runs in the second inning on a Pillar RBI single and a Goins three-run home run...blanked the Blue Jays on one hit over his final four innings and retired 14 of the final 15 batters he faced.

#### FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-4, 2.60 ERA): Is 1-2 with a 2.34 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in five starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's...the ERA is eighth lowest in the American League over that span...has received one run of support or fewer in five of his eight starts...his season run support average as a starter is 2.44...is 1-4 with a 2.44 ERA and .223 opponents batting average in his eight starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked eight batters in 51.2 innings as a starter (1.24 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...has tossed at least six innings and allowed six hits or fewer in each of his five starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Baltimore last Saturday (8.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)... has never faced the Rays in his career.

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS
