### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-69) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (60-61)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have won each of the last two games to snap their season-high seven-game losing streak...are 8-10 over the last 18 games and 9-17 over the last 26 contests...are 53-69 (.434) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...it matches the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 122 games and is the worst since 1997 (49-73)...have spent 97 of the last 101 days in sole possession of last in the AL West (dating back to May 8)...the 97 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 19-28 (.404) since then.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** This three-game series with the Rays marks the A's final series against American League East competition...are 9-21 (.300), which is the worst record by any team against the AL East...the A's worst record ever against the East is 18-37 (.327) in 1998...currently have an eight-game losing streak against the AL East, which is tied for the A's second longest such streak over the last 17 years (10, May 30-July 22, 2011)...have lost 16 of their last 19 games against AL East competition.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's currently have a season-high five-game home winning streak and a season-high eight-game road losing streak...are 2-0 on this five-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)...are 29-34 (.460) at home compared to 24-35 (.407) on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League and are tied for the third worst road record...the 34 home losses are the most by an A's team since 2011 (43-38)...went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...it was the seventh winless road trip of seven or more games in Oakland history, the first since July 21-27, 1998 (0-7 vs. Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...now have an eight-game road losing streak, which matches the longest road losing streak by an A's team over the last 10 years (July 23-Aug. 7, 2008)...have not lost more than eight straight road games since losing 11 straight from May 21-June 9, 2005...have also lost 11 of the last 12 and 14 of the last 17 on the road...leave following the game Sunday for a six-game road trip to Seattle (three games) and Arizona (three games)...have a 2.95 ERA (190 er in 580.0 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (243 er in 505.0 ip) on the road.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 12-19 (.387) since the All-Star Break, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 11-21)...are batting .234 (244-for-1044) with 103 runs scored (3.32 runs per game)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors (Atlanta, 95), the third lowest batting average and are tied for the third fewest home runs (22).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed at least one home run in 14 consecutive games (22 home runs total), which is the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 15 consecutive games from Aug. 6-21, 1987...have allowed 109 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...have a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) and .138 (9-for-65) opponents batting average on the homestand after compiling a 6.93 ERA and .304 opponents average on the last road trip...have a 3.59 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL...lead the AL in shutouts (14) and opponents slugging percentage (.370), have allowed the second fewest extra base hits (301) and rank fourth in opponents batting average (.242) and on-base percentage (.301).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of the last 12 home games for a 1.89 ERA (17 er in 81.0 ip)...have a 3.20 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.80)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...lead the American League in fewest home runs (63), rank second in innings pitched (739.1) and tied for fourth in complete games (5).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .232 (363-for-1563) with 152 runs scored over the last 47 games (3.23 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank third in the American League in fewest strikeouts (812), fourth in stolen base percentage (66-for-87, 75.9%) and tied for fourth in doubles (214) and triples (29)...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.384) and second fewest home runs (96)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (127).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors with 99 errors and rank second with 53 unearned runs (San Diego, 60)...Marcus Semien has 31

errors and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 51 errors are the most by two teammates since Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19) combined for 52 for the 2000 Anaheim Angels.

**ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES:** Of the A's last 24 games, 16 have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 22-43 (.338) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is the worst record in the majors...are 14-27 (.341) in one-run games, which is second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 12-24)...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...the 27 losses are the most in the majors and tied for second most by an A's team over the last 29 years (had 28 last year)...the 41 games are tied for third most in the American League.

**OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's have five walk-off wins in their last 18 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have the second most extra-inning games to Seattle (19)...are 8-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the majors and the losses are third most in the American League.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third consecutive game today...have won each of the previous two games against lefties but are 11-22 (.333) for the season, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-20)...are 20-27 (.426) in day games, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...leads the majors in bases loaded sacrifice flies (14), are tied for the lead in plate appearances (122), rank third in RBI (88) and tied for third in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (16-for-85, .188)...are third in pinch plate appearances (103)...allowed an Oakland-record 26 hits last Sunday in Baltimore...those were the most hits allowed by an A's team since the Kansas City A's surrendered 29 hits to Chicago on April 23, 1955.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have four players on the disabled list (Davis Doolittle, Hahn, Parker)...Doolittle and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL a total of 19 times, which is one more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. RAYS:** The season series is even at two games each as the A's split a four-game series in Tampa Bay in May...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 19-13 against the Rays dating back to the start of the 2011 season...have won four of the last five games in Oakland...are batting .207 (175-for-845) with 75 runs scored in 25 games over the last four years (3.00 runs per game)...all-time, the A's are 95-59 (.617) against Tampa Bay...are 52-22 in Oakland and 43-37 at Tropicana Field.

**TODAY'S TIDBITS**  
**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (24) and multiple hit games (34) and tops American League rookies in hits (114) and total bases (147)...**Mark Canha** has three straight multiple hit games for the first time in his career (8-for-12, .667).

**THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY**  
In **1983** Rickey Henderson steals the 399th base of his career, breaking Bert Campaneris' Oakland record of 398...in **1997** Jason Giambi, Ernie Young, Jason McDonald and Jose Canseco all homer in the third inning of the A's 13-6 win over Boston...the four home runs in an inning sets an Oakland record...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses his second complete game one-hitter of the season in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland, extending his scoreless streak to 31 innings...the streak would end at 32 innings in his next start on August 26...in **2006** the A's tie what was then an Oakland record by overcoming an eight-run deficit to defeat Toronto, 12-10...Dan Haren allows eight runs in the first two innings and nine runs total, setting an Oakland record for runs allowed in a win.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-4, 2.60 ERA)

**LAST FIVE STARTS:** Is 1-2 with a 2.34 ERA (9 er in 34.2 ip) and .200 (24-for-120) opponents batting average in five starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's...the ERA is seventh lowest in the American League over that span...has tossed at least six innings and allowed six hits or fewer in each of his five starts...has walked just six batters (1.56 per nine innings) and struck out 33 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.50

**BRIEFLY:** Began the season at Triple-A Nashville and was called up for the first time April 23...logged a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in five relief appearances before being optioned May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...returned July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and had a no decision that day at Cleveland (2 er in 6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA)...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching...recalled for his fourth stint July 25.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received one run of support or fewer in five of his eight starts...his season run support average as a starter is 2.44 (14 rs in 51.2 ip)...has 24 runs of support in 13 career starting assignments (80.1 ip, 2.69 RSA).

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 1-4 with a 2.44 ERA (14 er in 51.2 ip) and .223 (41-for-184) opponents batting average in his eight starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked eight batters in 51.2 innings as a starter (1.24 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...all five of his relief appearances came during his first stint

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .190 (24-for-126) batting average but has issued 14 of his 17 walks to lefties for a .287 on-base percentage...has yielded a .179 (7-for-39) average with runners in scoring position...opponents are batting .217 (13-for-60) with a .266 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...has a .175 (30-for-171) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .320 (16-for-50) after that...the opponents number five hitter is 3-for-24 (.125).

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 3.38 ERA (3 er in 8.0 ip) and .267 (8-for-30) opponents batting average in the first inning, a 1.11 ERA (4 er in 32.1 ip) and .176 (19-for-108) opponents average in innings two through five and a 4.50 ERA (11 er in 22.0 ip) and .229 (19-for-83) opponents average from the sixth inning on.

**LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Tossed seven shutout innings Aug. 4 against Baltimore to snap a four-game losing streak that spanned five starts from June 30 to July 30 (3.00 ERA)...tossed at least five innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each start to become the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least five innings and allow three runs or fewer in five consecutive games without recording a win (last: Vin Mazzaro, Aug. 3-26, 2010)...is the only one of those six pitchers with four losses during their streak.

**IN RELIEF:** Yielded at least one run in three of his five outings and walked two batters or more four times...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch...tossed 4.1 innings in his first outing April 25 against Houston.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Colorado June 30 in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing back-to-back singles to Tulowitzki and Arenado in the fourth inning...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Blackmon...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 1-0.

**SECOND START:** He lost his second consecutive 2-1 game July 5 against Seattle...the A's scored a run in the third inning and he blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...retired the first two batters in the sixth before hitting Cano and allowing a double to Cruz...Smith then followed with a two-run single.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Cleveland July 11...the A's scored a run in the first and he shutout the Indians on three hits and a hit batter over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth but the A's scored once in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the bottom of the seventh and left after 6.1 innings with the scored tied 2-2.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at San Francisco July 25...allowed a solo home run to Bumgarner in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...allowed a RBI single to Duffy in the sixth inning for the loss.

**FIFTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Cleveland last Thursday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning on an error and a two-run home run by Santana...then retired 18 of the final 21 batters he faced, blanking the Indians on two hits and a walk over his final six innings...Carrasco tossed a two-hitter for Cleveland.

**SIXTH START:** He combined with Rodriguez and Abad on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Baltimore Aug. 4 in Oakland for his first win as an Athletic...tossed seven innings and allowed five of the hits while walking two...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position.

**SEVENTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Houston last Sunday in Oakland...struck out a career-high 10 batters and tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 6.2 innings...shut out the Astros on one hit and one walk over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-out RBI double to Correa in the sixth...left with the scored tied at 1-1.

**EIGHTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Baltimore last Saturday...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...shutout the Orioles on one hit over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Davis...allowed the tying run to score in the sixth inning on a solo home run by Parra...was relieved by Venditte to start the ninth inning and Venditte allowed a two-out home run to Davis for the loss.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Was 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters in 69.0 innings and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68...his .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on...went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA in seven games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA in five games on the road...the Sounds were 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just two of his starts.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Sonny Gray (12-5, 2.04 ERA):** Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.04 ERA...currently has the lowest ERA by an AL pitcher since Pedro Martinez posted a 1.74 ERA for Boston in 2000...has a 2.64 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Athletics history (min. 450 ip; since 1913, when earned runs became an official stat)...is 3-2 with a 1.71 ERA and .188 opponents batting average over his last seven starts...has three complete games, including two shutouts, over that stretch...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 8-2 with a 1.69 ERA in 15 starts on four days rest...the ERA is the lowest in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 loss at Baltimore last Monday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four career starts against the Rays...including a win in his only start this year, a 7-2 A's win at Tampa Bay May 24 (5.0 ip, 4 h, 4 so).

Saves/Opportunities: 21-for-39 (53.8%)

- The A's bullpen has a 6.32 ERA (44 er in 62.2 ip) over its past 20 games (beginning July 29)...is 3-6 with two saves and four blown saves over that span...has a 4.43 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.45).
- Is tied for the second fewest wins (13) in the AL and has the third most losses (24)...is tied for the third most doubles (71), is fourth in most home runs (46) and has tossed the fourth fewest innings (345.2).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (21), the lowest save percentage (53.8%) and is tied for the most blown saves (18).
- Has allowed the second most first batter RBI in the majors (48) and is tied for second in first batter home runs (14)...has the second highest opponents average against first batters faced in the AL (.258).
