RAY MATTER—The Rays earned a split of their 4-game series at Houston last night as Chris Archer threw the fourth complete game one-hitter in club history, first by a 1-0 score...the Rays are now 2-5 on this 10-game, 10-day road trip through the AL West (0-3 at Texas and 2-2 at Houston)...in 3 of the losses, the Rays bullpen failed to hold late leads in 3 of the losses: in the 7th inning (Fri at TEX), 8th (Tue at HOU) and 9th (Wed at HOU)...the Rays brought a 4-game win streak on this road trip...despite their 2-5 mark on this trip, the Rays have out-hit the opposition, 76-58...the Rays have been between one game under .500 and one game over .500 for 60 days this season and for 35 of the last 43 days...Rays 60-61 record matches last season after 121 games.

McGEE SURGERY SUCCESSFUL—This morning, LH Jake McGee underwent successful arthroscopic surgery to repair a meniscus tear in his left knee...he suffered the injury on Tuesday at Houston...the surgery was performed at St. Anthony's Outpatient Center in St. Petersburg by team orthopedist Dr. Koco

Eaton... Jake is expected to miss 6-8 weeks...the Rays have had 23 DL stints this season...McGee is the fourth Ray to undergo surgery during the season, joining OF **Desmond Jennings**, LH **Jeff Beliveau** and RH **Alex Cobb**.

ASTROS SERIES REVIEW—The Rays earned a split in the just-completed 4-game series at Minute Maid Park, and their two losses were 3-2, extra inning walk-offs...the Rays held the Astros to 8 runs in the series, the 3rd fewest runs they have ever allowed in a 4-game road series...they also struck out 50 Astros, a Rays club record for a series of any length and matching the most times the Astros have ever fanned in a 4-game series in their 53-year history...Rays starters worked to a 1.35 ERA (26.2-IP, 19-H, 4-ER, 5-BB, 30-SO).

ONE-HITTER—Last night, Chris Archer joined Matt Garza (2008), James Shields (2008) and Joe Kennedy (2002) as the only Rays to throw a complete game, 1-hitter and the first to do it in a 1-0 win...the last pitcher to win a 1-0, one-hitter was WAS Jordan Zimmermann on April 26, 2013 vs. CIN...it was the first 1-0, one-hit win the AL since TOR Brandon Morrow did it against the Rays on Aug 8, 2010...Archer is the first major league pitcher to register a 1-hit, 1-0 complete-game road victory since SD Mat Latos on May 13, 2010 at SF...the last to do it in the AL was BOS Curt Schilling on June 7, 2007 here in Oakland...finally, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Arch joined Jorge Sosa (2003), Steve Trachsel (2000) and Kennedy as the only Rays to win a complete game by a 1-0 score.

TWIN ONE-HITTERS—DET Alfredo Simon also pitched a complete game 1-hitter last night at home over Texas...the last time two American League pitchers threw CG one-hitters on the same day was June 16, 2012, when BAL Jason Hammel and LAA Ervin Santana both did it.

AL'S LONGEST STREAK ENDS—Chris Archer's victory last night ended the Rays streak of 154 games without a complete game...it had been the longest active streak in the American League...it was the Rays first CG since Aug 22, 2014 (Drew Smyly won 8-0 at Toronto).

SHUTOUT SHOUTOUT—Last night was the Rays 9th 1-0 shutout win in the past two seasons, tops in the majors...it was the 109th shutout since **Jim Hickey** became the Rays pitching coach in 2007, most in the AL since then, one ahead of the A's...it was also the 65th since 2012, tied with the Dodgers for most in the majors since then.

CLOSE CALLS—Last night was the Rays 69th game decided by 2 runs or fewer, tied for the major league lead...it was their 14th game out of the last 19...8 of the Rays last 10 losses have been by 1 or 2 runs.

Rays had the best road record in the majors (21-11), but since then they are 8-19 (.296)...the Rays are 1-6-1 in their last 8 road series.

ARCH TIES, SETS CLUB MARKS—Last night was the 8th start of 2015 in which Chris Archer has not allowed an earned run...that tops the AL and ties Matt Moore (2013) for the most in one season by a Ray...also last night, Arch and WAS Max Scherzer became the 4th and 5th pithers to surpass 200 strikeouts this season...Archer became just the 4th Rays pitcher to reach 200 SO in a season, joining Scott Kazmir (2007), David Price (2011, 2012) and James Shields (2011, 2012)....however, none of them reached the 200-plateau quicker than Archer.

SABR HAS KIERMAIER No. 1—SABR (Society for American Baseball Research) today released its Defensive Index rankings and Rays CF Kevin Kiermaier has extended his commanding lead in the AL in the SABR Defensive Index™ rankings through games of Aug 16...the SABR Defensive Index accounts for approximately 25 pct. of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award selection process...major league managers and coaches, voting only within their league and unable to vote for players on their own teams, account for 75 pct. of the selection process...Kiermaier's SDI of 21.8 is the best in the majors among all qualified defenders, followed by Giants SS Brandon Crawford (14.0), Rockies 3B Nolan Arenado (11.9), Orioles 3B Manny Machado (10.3), Giants C Buster Posey (10.0) and Tigers LF Yoenis Cespedes (9.9).

RAYS OWN VERSION OF PRIME NUMBERS—Last night was the 23rd game a Rays starter has not allowed a run, tied with Dodgers for the major league lead...the Rays had 32 such games last year, the most by an AL club since the 1964 Angels (34)...it was the 52nd game a Rays starter has allowed one run or fewer, 2nd in the majors behind the Cardinals (56)...the Rays have lost 17 of those games, 6 more than any other team.

COMING TO LIFE IN AUGUST—The Rays are hitting .292 in 17 games this month (9-8), 2nd best in the majors (Boston .311)...Rays are 4th in the majors in OPS (.788) and are averaging 4.65 runs per game...Rays entered August batting .239 (28th in the majors) and sporting a .684 OPS (24th) while averaging 3.58 runs per game (28th)...the Rays batted just .229 in July...SS **Asdrubal Cabrera** is 4th in the majors this month with a .403 (27-for-67) batting average...OF **Brandon Guyer** is batting .371 (13-for-35).

CABRERA 2ND IN MAJORS SINCE RETURN—In 20 games since returning from the DL on July 28, SS Asdrubal Cabrera is 2nd in the the majors with a .410 avg (32-78)...on June 17, he was hitting .199...in 43 games since then, he has batted .348 (55-for-158).

RAYS vs. A'S—The Rays 59-95 (.383) all-time record vs. the A's is their worst vs. an AL opponent, as is their 22-52 (.297) mark at O.co Colisuem... the two two teams split a 4-game series at Tropicana Field in May...Rays scored only 10 runs in the 4 games, Oakland only 14...Rays are 4-9 in their last 13 games and haven't won a season series vs. the A's since 2010... Rays have lost 5 of their last 6 at O.co and in their last 7 visits there have won only one series (1-5-1).

JENNINGS IS BACK—Last night, OF **Desmond Jennings** became the 20th Ray to have a run-scoring hit in a 1-0 game...his 2-out, 2 strike single off **Collin McHugh** drove in the game's only run...returned from the 60-day disabled list (left knee bursitis) one week ago and has hit safely in 5 of this 6 games (.333, 8-for-24) with 2 RBI, as many as he had in 19 games before going on the DL.

ERASMO!—The Rays are 13-6 (.684) when tomorrow night's starter **Erasmo Ramirez** is on the mound...only six other major league starters (min. 18 starts) have seen their teams win a higher pct. of their starts: STL **Carlos Martinez** (.818), STL **Michael Wacha** (.782), TOR **David Price** (.708), TOR **Drew Hutchison** (.708), LAD **Zack Greinke** (.708) and NYM **Jacob deGrom** (.696)...overall, has the 7th-best winning pct. in the majors (10-4, .714).

- + LAST START—On Sun at TEX, made his first start with the Rays in 102 days, returning from a torn left labrum...allowed runs in each of his 4 IP, including 2 HR (Adrian Beltre, Ryan Strausborger)...marked his shortest start since June 29, 2014 at HOU (with DET)...his line: L, 4 IP, 7 H, 5 R/ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, 95 pitches, 61 strikes...allowed:
 - + 7 H, his most since Aug 5, 2014 at OAK (his Rays debut)
 - + 4 XBH, his most since July 31, 2014 vs. CWS (with DET)
 - + 5 R, his most since July 4, 2014 vs. TB (with DET)
- + LOOKING FOR A "W"—Is seeking his first win since Aug 27, 2014 at BAL...has been 358 days since his last victory, though he's only made 6 starts in between...was shut down following his Sep 6 start last season, and has missed time this season with a pair of injuries (torn left labrum, left shoulder tendonitis)...this stretch of 6 starts without a win (0-2) is the longest of his career without one (as a starter).
 - + Has missed a total of 105 games between his 2 DL stints.
- + THE LONG BALL—Has allowed a total of 10 R/ER in 20.2 IP this season with the Rays, 6 of them coming via solo home run...has allowed homers in 7 straight starts dating back to Aug 27, 2014 at BAL, longest streak by a Ray since Jeremy Hellickson in 2013...no Rays pitcher has done so in 8 straight since Andy Sonnanstine, May 12—June 19, 2009.
 - Yielded 3 HR in 14 IP on his most recent rehab assignment... before it, only allowed 5 HR in 152.1 career minor league innings.
- + REHAB REVIEW—Made 4 rehab starts on his most recent DL stint—3 for Triple-A Durham, 1 for Class-A Charlotte—going 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA (14-IP, 22-H, 15-ER, 6-BB, 17-SO)...opponents hit .361/.414/.607 (22-for-61)...stretched out to 94 pitches in his last start, Aug 11 at Norfolk (Orioles).
- + STINGY ON LEFTIES—In 2014, ranked 3rd among major league starters with a .171 opp avg. (27-for-158) against left-handed hitters...only KC Danny Duffy (.137) and CWS Chris Sale (.165) were better...he has held lefties to a .192 (80-for-416) avg. in his career.

- + STARTING OVER—Saw some club record and historic streaks come to an end in his last start...snapped a club-record streak of allowing 3 runs or fewer at 10 straight starts to start a Rays career...snapped a 9-start streak of yielding 4 hits or fewer, failing to become the fifth since data is available (1914) to do so in at least 10 straight starts.
 - + Snapped a 10-start streak yielding 3 runs or fewer, 4th-longest in franchise history (at any point of a career)...snapped a 9-start streak yielding 2 runs or fewer, T-2nd in club history.
- + THE DIRT—Smyly was featured in this season's first edition of *Inside Pitch*, the official publication of the Rays…he talked about buying a Beef O'Brady's with his father in Maumelle, Ark. this offseason and the "Wooooo, Pig! Sooie!" cheer at the University of Arkansas, where he was roommates with Astros left-hander Dallas Keuchel and teammates for one year with Logan Forsythe.
- + vs. AL WEST—Is 4-9 (.308) with a 4.71 ERA (93.2-IP, 49-ER) in 29 apps (14 starts) in his career against the AL West...to compare, is 7-2 (.778) with a 2.16 ERA in 29 apps (15 starts) vs. the AL East and 8-3 (.727), 3.29 in 51 apps (16 starts) vs. the AL Central.
- + ARRIVING IN STYLE—The lefty was acquired hours before the July 31 trading deadline in a three-team, five-player trade with Seattle and Detroit involving **David Price...**none of the 15 other starting pitchers traded prior to the deadline put up better numbers with their new teams than Smyly's winning pct. (.750) and ERA (1.70).
- + THE RAYS WAY—Went 3-1 with a 1.70 ERA (47.2-IP, 9-ER) in 7 starts with the Rays last season and held opponents to a .155 (25-for-161) batting avg. ...during that time—i.e., since the start of August through season's end—he ranked among AL leaders (min. 40 IP) in ERA (2nd, behind LAA Matt Shoemaker's 1.66 ERA), opp avg. (1st) and baserunners per 9 IP (1st).

CAREER—Is 0-2 with a 9.95 ERA (12.2-IP, 14-ER) in 5 career apps (2 starts) against the A's...his teams have been shut out in both of his starts (L, 10-0 on May 26 at OAK, with DET, and L, 3-0 on Aug 5 at DET, his Rays debut)...the A's have hit .364/.419/.727 (20-for-55) againsf him...is 0-2 with a 7.11 ERA (12.2-IP, 10-ER) in 3 apps (2 starts) at O.co Coliseum.

TOMORROW'S STARTER—RH ERASMO RAMIREZ (10-4, 3.57)

- + LAST START—On Mon vs. HOU, was given a 4-0 lead before even throwing a pitch, winning his second straight start...both runs allowed were driven in by Evan Gattis, via a 2nd-inning single and 4th-inning solo homer...threw 102 pitches, his most since June 15 vs. WAS (103)...his line: W, 5.2 IP, 6 H, 2 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 1 HR, 102 pit, 64 str.
 - Became became the fourth Nicaraguan to win 10 games in a season, joining Dennis Martinez, Al Williams and Vicente Padilla.
 - Became the third Ray to reach 10 wins in the season after he was acquired via trade, joining Mark Hendrickson (10-15, 2004) and Matt Garza (11-9, 2008).
- + ERASMO LATELY—Since moving into the starting rotation for good on May 14, has made 17 starts and gone 10-3—tied for the AL lead in wins over that span, with HOU Dallas Keuchel, TEX Colby Lewis and
- NYY **Nathan Eovaldi...**opponents are batting .205/.270/.313 (72-for-352), lowest opp avg. in the AL...has a 2.61 ERA (96.2-IP, 28-ER) over this stretch, 4th in the AL, lowering his season ERA from 8.38 to 3.57.
- + MR. EFFICIENCY—Averaging 14.9 pitches per inning, which would rank T-6th in the AL if he qualified...the only qualifiers in club history to ever finish a season that low are RH James Shields (2011, 2008, 2007) and LH David Price (2013).
- + vs. OAKLAND—Has lost his last 5 starts against the A's (since Sep 29, 2013) and is 0-6 with a 5.26 ERA (37.2-IP, 22-ER) in 8 career apps (7 starts)...has made more starts vs. Oakland than any other team...is the first pitcher to start his career at 0-6 (or worse) against the A's since KC Luke Hochevar (0-8, 2008–Current).

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Has been ejected twice as manager: April 16 at TOR, May 10 vs. TEX.
- 37-year-old manager is the youngest skipper in the majors since ARI A.J.
 Hinch (34) in 2009 and youngest active manager/head coach in the four major sports, ahead of Boston Celtics head coach Brad Stevens (38).
- + Is the fifth manager in Rays history...is the sixth Tampa-born manager
- in ML history and second to manage the Rays...joins Hall of Famers Al Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, including parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10)...spent two years (2005-06) in the Rays org., and appeared in 13 major league games in 2005 for Lou Piniella.

- + 47.1 percent of his hits have gone for extra bases (18-1B, 6-2B, 4-3B, 6-HR)...had an RBI triple on Wed at HOU and a 3-run homer on Mon at HOU, his first since May 22 vs. OAK...was the first of his career with 2 runners on, and the Rays first 3-run HR since June 20 at CLE (Evan Longoria).
- ► Batting .269/.333/.500 (14-for-52) in 20 games (14 starts) since his July 12 recall, his third stint with the Rays this season.
- + Seventeen of his 26 RBI have come in innings 7-thru-9, the highest rate (65.4 percent) in the majors (min. 20 RBI).
- + Four of his 6 HR and 16 of his 26 RBI have come in 2-strike counts, the 3rd-highest rate (61.5 percent) in the majors (min. 20 RBI).
- + Has played 57 games with 37 starts (17-2B, 16-SS, 4-DH)...batting .263 (20-for-76) vs. LHP, including .282 (11-for-39) vs. LHP since May 17.

- + Hitless in his last 12 at-bats...had 4 SO yesterday at HOU, tying his career high (3rd time, last July 16, 2012 at TB) and the club record (71st time)... has struck out in his last 7 at-bats...marks the second time in his career he's had at least 3 SO in consecutive games, along with July 2-3, 2011 at CIN.
- + Batting .410/.440/.628 (32-for-78) since his return from 15-day DL on July 28...ranks 2nd in the majors in batting avg. over that span, behind CLE Michael Brantley (.417)...this stretch has raised his avg. from .223 to .261, and he's raised it by 62 points since June 18 (from .199).
- + Has 10 multi-hit efforts in his last 16 games (last Mon at HOU)...his 3 RBI on Mon at HOU were his most since Sep 27, 2014 vs. MIA (with WAS).
- + Leads AL shortstops with 36 XBH...ranks 2nd among AL shortstops with a .988 fielding pct., behind BAL J.J. Hardy (.992).
