## 2014 SEASON

- + Appeared in 9 games for the Nationals over four stints, and spent the remainder of the season with Triple-A Syracuse...called up for good when rosters expanded Sep 1.
- + Posted minor league career bests with 13.0 SO/9 IP (39.1-IP, 57-SO), a .163 opp avg. and 0.86 WHIP...in the second half of the Triple-A season, posted a 1.59 ERA (17-IP, 3-ER) with 26 SO and just 3 BB in 15 games.
- + On Sep 3 at LAD, entered with one out and the bases loaded in the 10th inning and struck out Adrian Gonzalez, his only batter...the Nationals won 8-5 in 14 innings.

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Has faced 120 opposing left-handed batters in the big leagues and allowed only 5 extra-base hits (3-HR, 2-2B).
- + Began the **2013** season with the Astros, was claimed off waivers by the Nationals on April 23 and saw five stints with Washington...pitched in 16 games total...recorded an 11.37 ERA (6.1-IP, 8-ER) in 5 apps for Houston and a 1.50 ERA (6-IP, 1-ER) in 11 apps for the Nationals.
- + Capped the season with 8 straight scoreless outings from Sep 11 through season's end.
- + Compiled a 1.31 ERA (34.1-IP, 5-ER) in 39 apps for Syracuse.
- + Pitched for Santurce following the season, his sixth straight offseason pitching winter ball in Puerto Rico...earned 4 saves and recorded a 2.49 ERA with 36 SO in 21.2 IP.

- + **WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC:** Was a member of Team Puerto Rico...posted one save (March 8 vs. Spain) and yielded just 1 ER in 4.1 IP over 7 apps.
- + In **2012** ranked T-6th among NL rookies with 44 appearances for Houston, which remains a career high...began the season with Triple-A Oklahoma City and had two stints in the majors (May 27-June 27, July 25-season's end).
- + Limited opposing left-handed batters to a .213 avg. (13-for-61).
- + Registered his first career save June 18 vs. KC by retiring Mike Moustakas, his only batter faced, with the tying runs on base.
- + Saw his first major league action in **2011** for Houston, appearing in 3 games in September...made his major league debut Sep 16 at CHC and faced two batters, retiring Carlos Peña on a fly-ball and yielding a single to Tony Campana.
- + Began the season with Double-A Corpus Christi and spent most of the season there, making 19 starts and 4 relief apps...named a Texas League midseason All-Star and was named Texas League Pitcher of the Month for June (0-1, 2.89 ERA, 37.1-IP, 48-SO)...finished 7th in the league with 110 SO.
- + On June 22 vs. Frisco (Rangers), struck out his first 9 batters faced and had a perfect game through 5.2 innings before allowing a single...finished with a line of 6.2 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 BB and a Hooks-record 14 SO...left with a 2-0 lead before Frisco rallied for 6 runs off the bullpen.
- + Did not pitch in **2010** after being released by the Rockies at the end of spring training...pitched in 12 games (7 starts) for Carolina in

the Puerto Rican Winter League...in **2009**, made a combined 44 apps between Class-A Modesto and Double-A Tulsa...spent the entire **2008** season with Tulsa, making 19 starts, including a 2.03 ERA (53.1-IP, 12-ER) over his final 9 starts.

- + In **2007**, was promoted to Modesto and allowed just 6 HR in 116.2 IP...named Rockies Organizational Pitcher of the Month in July, after going 4-0 in 5 starts with a 2.90 ERA and 23 SO...in **2006** with Class-A Asheville, earned a career-high 8 wins and yielded 3 runs or fewer in 21 of his 27 starts...made his pro debut with Rookie-level Casper in **2005**.

## AMATEUR CAREER

- + Selected by Colorado as a draft-and-follow in the 31st round of the 2004 June Draft out of Escuela Asunción Rodríguez de Sala...the following year pitched collegiately at Miami-Dade (Fla.) Community College and signed with the Rockies on May 21, 2005.

## X-RAY REPORT

- + Nava is one of two players in major league history to hit a grand slam on the first pitch he saw in the majors, connecting off Joe Blanton on June 12, 2010 vs. PHL...he joined CLE Kevin Kouzmanoff (Sep 2, 2006 at TEX).
- + As a freshman in high school, Nava stood 4 feet, 8 inches and weighed 70 pounds...he grew to 5-foot-5, 150 pounds by his senior year and tried to walk on at Santa Clara (Calif.) University, but was encouraged instead to consider a career coaching and accepted a job as an equipment manager...after a growth spurt, he transferred to play ball at College of San Mateo, where he was named All-Conference and Junior College All-American in his two seasons, then transferred back to Santa Clara on scholarship for his senior season...that year (2006) he led the West Coast Conference with a .395 average and .494 OBP, but went undrafted.
- + The Red Sox spent \$1 to purchase Nava's contract from the Chico Outlaws of the independent Golden Baseball League on Jan 17, 2008, after winning the league MVP award in 2007.
- + As a minor leaguer, Daniel left a ticket on the pass list for Erin Andrews for every home game from 2008 to 2010, but his tickets went unclaimed...Nava married his wife, Rachel, in 2012, and they have one daughter, Faith.

## 2014 SEASON

- + Spent most of the season with Boston and appeared in 113 games, including 95 starts (57-

RF, 31-LF, 6-1B, 1-DH)...recorded a career-high 9 outfield assists, tied for 8th most in the AL.

- + Saw three stints in the majors, and two stints with Triple-A Pawtucket...batted .130 (10-for-77) in 22 games over the first two stints with Boston...recalled for his third stint June 2, and spent the remainder of the season in the majors, leading the Red Sox with a .308 (88-for-286) batting avg. over that span...during that time, ranked 5th among AL outfielders in batting and 4th with a .379 OBP.
- + Tied for 7th in the AL with 10 HBP.
- + Batted .293 (88-for-300) with all 4 HR and a .372 OBP vs. RHP.
- + Pinch-hit and scored the game-winning run in back-to-back walk-off wins, July 9 and July 10 vs. CWS (double, walk).
- + Hit a grand slam in the 6th inning on Sep 14 at KC, turning a 4-3 deficit into a 7-4 lead...was his second career slam, first since his major league debut.
- + Hit an inside-the-park homer for Pawtucket on May 16 at Indianapolis (Pirates).

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Entered 2015 a career .293/.385/.428 hitter against right-handed pitching.
- + From 2012-14, led the Red Sox in games (299) and starts (264) in the outfield...also ranked 2nd among AL players with 34 HBP during that span (Josh Willingham, 37).
- + In **2013**, his first full season in the majors, ranked 5th among AL qualifiers in OBP (.385)

- and 8th in batting avg. (.303)...set career highs in virtually every offensive category...led all major league switch-hitters in OBP, and ranked 2nd in OPS (.831).
- + Named Most Improved Red Sox Player by the Boston chapter of the BBWAA.
  - + Ranked 6th in the AL with a .322 avg. (109-for-339) vs. RHP.
  - + Ranked 2nd in the AL with 15 HBP and tied for 5th with 8 sac flies.
  - + Appeared in a career-high 134 games, 121 starts (56-LF, 51-RF, 8-1B, 5-DH, 1-CF)...made his only career ML appearance in CF on July 8 at SEA...it was his first experience at CF of his pro career.
  - + Reached base in a career-high 41 consecutive starts from June 22 to Sep 6, 2nd-longest such streak in the AL in 2013 to DET Miguel Cabrera (44)...it was the longest streak by a Red Sox hitter since Kevin Youkilis in 2008 (44) and longest ever by a Red Sox switch-hitter.
  - + From Aug 1 through season's end, led the majors (min. 150 PA) with a .356 avg. (47-for-132) and ranked 2nd in the AL with a .427 OBP... hit .396 (19-for-48) in August, 3rd best in the majors.
  - + On April 20 vs. KC, the first home game after the Boston Marathon bombing, hit the deciding 3-run homer with 2 outs in the 8th inning for a 4-3 victory.
  - + **POSTSEASON:** Played in 9 games for Boston en route to the World Championship...made 7 starts (5-LF, 2-RF)...started in LF at Tropicana Field in Game 3 and Game 4 of the ALDS, and went 1-for-2 with 2 BB in the clinching Game 4...drove in 2 of Boston's 4 runs in Game 3 of the World Series, a loss, including the tying run on a 6th-inning single.
  - + In **2012** was selected by Boston on May 10 and remained with the Red Sox for the duration of the season...played in 88 games, 71 starts (66-LF, 3-DH, 2-RF)...had two separate stints on the DL due to left wrist problems...led the team with 9 HBP.
  - + Won the 2012 Lou Gorman Award, given annually to a Red Sox minor leaguer who has demonstrated dedication and perseverance in overcoming obstacles while working his way to the major league team.
  - + Hit .269 (50-for-186) with a .383 OBP vs. RHP, compared to .185 (15-for-81) with a .280 OBP vs. LHP.
  - + Led off a career-high 25 times and reached base safely in 22 of those games.
  - + Started the year with Pawtucket and ranked among IL leaders in OBP (.421, 6th) and OPS (.926, 8th) at the time of his call-up.
  - + Spent the entire **2011** season with Pawtucket, leading the team with 69 runs and a .372 OBP... finished 3rd in the IL with 70 walks...designated for assignment by Boston on May 20 and re-joined the PawSox on May 26 after being out-righted from the 40-man roster.
  - + Posted a 34-game on-base streak from May 26 to July 5, longest in the IL in 2011.
  - + Seven of his 10 HR came over his last 30 games of the season, beginning Aug 5.
  - + Saw his first major league action in **2010** over three stints with Boston...appeared in 60 games and made 44 starts, all in LF...did not commit an error in 67 chances.
  - + Selected to Boston on June 12 and debuted that day vs. PHI...became the fourth player in major league history to hit a grand slam in his first big league plate appearance, joining FLA Jeremy Hermida (Aug 31, 2005 vs. STL), CLE Kevin Kouzmanoff (Sep 2, 2006 at TEX) and PHI Bill Duggeby (April 21, 1898 vs. NYG)... joined Kouzmanoff as the only two players to do so on the first pitch they saw in the majors.
  - + Joined Rip Repulski (May 10, 1960 vs. CWS) as the only Red Sox to hit a grand slam in their first PA with the club...his 4 RBI tied Merrill Combs (Sep 12, 1947 vs. CLE) for most ever by a Red Sox player in his first major league game.
  - + Reached base in each of his first 12 major league games from June 12-25, longest streak by a Red Sox player to begin his career since Mo Vaughn (12) in 1991.
  - + Optioned to Pawtucket on July 21...recalled for 2 games Aug 2, and returned for the remainder of the season on Aug 17.
  - + In **2009** batted a combined .352 avg. (80-for-227) with a .458 OBP in 61 games between Class-A Salem and Double-A Portland, marks that would have led Red Sox farmhands if he qualified...missed over 2 months to start the season...promoted to Salem on Aug 5 and reached base in 31 of 32 games in his first Double-A experience...drew 25 walks against 12 strikeouts for Salem...hit .382 (34-for-89) in August, 3rd in the EL...named Red Sox Minor League Offensive Player of the Month for August/September.
  - + On Jan 17, **2008**, Boston purchased his contract from the independent Chico Outlaws...in his first season of affiliated pro ball, won the California League batting title and led Red Sox minor leaguers with a .341 avg. (110-for-323) for Class-A Lancaster.

- + Recorded a .424 OBP (2nd in CL, 1st in Red Sox system) and a .948 OPS (1st in CL, 2nd in Red Sox system)...finished 5th in the CL with a .523 SLG.
- + In **2007** was selected as the Golden Baseball League MVP after leading the Chico Outlaws to the league championship...his .371 avg. was 2nd best in league history...named Golden League Player of the Month for June.
- + Was named the top independent league prospect by *Baseball America*.

**AMATEUR CAREER**

- + As a senior at Santa Clara (Calif.) University, led the West Coast Conference with a .395 avg. and .494 OBP...went undrafted (see X-Ray Report).
- + Hit over .400 in his two seasons at the College of San Mateo from 2004-05.
- + Graduated from St. Francis (Calif.) High School in 2001.
