OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-70) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (61-61)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost eight of their last 10 games, including a season-high seven-game losing streak that was snapped on Tuesday... are 9-18 (.333) over the last 27 games and 53-70 (.431) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in the majors...it is the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 123 games and is the worst since 1997 (50-73)...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 14 games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2011 season 22 games out... have spent 98 of the last 102 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...tomorrow will mark the A's 100th day alone in last, which will be the sixth time in Oakland history the A's spent at least 100 days in last...it will be the second time in the last 17 years (162 in 2009)... went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 19-29 (.396) since then.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's fell to 14-28 (.333) in one-run games with the loss last night, which is tied with Toronto for the worst record in the majors (12-24)...the 28 losses are the most in the majors and match the most by an A's team over the last 29 years (also last year)... have not lost more than 28 one-run games since 1986 when they went 22-29...the 42 one-run games are tied with the Rays for third most in the American League...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...17 of the A's last 25 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 22-44 (.333) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is also the worst record in the majors... are 31-26 (.544) in games decided by three runs or more.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's extended their losing streak against American League East competition to nine games with the loss last night...that is their second longest such losing streak over the last 17 years (10, May 30-July 22, 2011)...have lost 17 of their last 20 games against AL East competition and 9-22 (.290) for the season, which is the worst record by any team against the AL East...need to win each of the their two remaining games against the Rays to avoid posting the worst mark in Oakland history against the East...the current mark is 18-37 (.327) in 1998.

PITCHING: The A's have tied an Oakland record by allowing a home run in 15 consecutive games (23 home runs total)...also did it from Aug. 6-21, 1987...the only longer streak by an A's team since 1914 is a 17-game streak by the 1964 Kansas City A's from July 26-Aug. 14...have allowed 110 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...have a 2.25 ERA (7 er in 28.0 ip) and .165 (16-for-97) opponents batting average on the homestand after compiling a 6.93 ERA and .304 opponents average on the last road trip...have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL...lead the AL in shutouts (14) and opponents slugging percentage (.370), have allowed the second fewest extra base hits (304) and rank fourth in opponents batting average (.241) and on-base percentage (.301).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of the last 13 home games for a 1.85 ERA (18 er in 87.2 ip)... have a 3.18 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.83)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...lead the American League in fewest home runs (63), rank third in innings pitched (746.0) and tied for fourth in complete games (5).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .233 (372-for-1600) with 153 runs scored over the last 48 games (3.19 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank third in the American League in fewest strikeouts (818) and stolen base percentage (67-for-88, 76.1%)...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.383) and second fewest home runs (96)...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors in infield hits (129).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Billy Burns committed the A's 100th error of the season last night, which is the most in the majors...the A's rank second in the majors with 53 unearned runs (San Diego, 61)...Marcus Semien has 31 errors and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 51 errors are the most by two teammates since Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19) combined for 52 for the 2000 Anaheim Angels.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's had their season-high five-game home winning streak snapped last night...are 2-1 on this five-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (0-1)...have won eight of their last 12 home games but are 29-35 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...the 35 home losses are the most by an A's team over the last four years...leave following the game tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Seattle (three games) and Arizona (three games)...went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...it was the seventh winless road trip of seven or more games in Oakland history, the first since July 21-27, 1998 (0-7 vs. Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...now have an eight-game road losing streak, which matches the longest road losing streak by an A's team over the last 10 years (July 23-Aug. 7, 2008)...have not lost more than eight straight road games since losing 11 straight from May 21-June 9, 2005...have also lost 11 of the last 12 and 14 of the last 17 on the road...are 24-35 (.407) on the road for the season, which is tied for the third worst road record in the AL...have a 2.93 ERA (192 er in 589.0 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (243 er in 505.0 ip) on the road.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 12-20 (.375) since the All-Star Break, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 12-21)...are batting .235 (254-for-1081) with 104 runs scored (3.25 runs per game)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors (Atlanta, 98), the third lowest batting average and the third fewest home runs (22).

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have five walk-off wins in their last 19 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have the second most extra-inning games to Seattle (19)...are 8-16 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the majors and the losses are third most in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (124) and sacrifice flies (14), rank third in RBI (88) and tied for third in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (.16-for-87, .184)...are third in pinch plate appearances (105).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have three players on the disabled list (Davis, Hahn, Parker), which is a season low...Davis and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL a total of 19 times, which is one more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's trail in the season series, 2-3...lost the first game in Oakland last night after splitting a four-game series in Tampa Bay in May...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 19-14 against the Rays dating back to the start of the 2011 season...are batting .208 (184-for-882) with 76 runs scored in 26 games over the last four years (2.92 runs per game)...all-time, the A's are 95-60 against Tampa Bay...are 52-23 in Oakland and 43-37 at Tropicana Field.

Fernando Abad has a 1.57 ERA over his last 26 games after posting a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances...**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (24) and multiple hit games (34) and tops American League rookies in hits (114) and total bases (147).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1971** the A's and the Red Sox are tied at 1-1 entering the bottom of the ninth of the first game of a doubleheader when Reggie Jackson hits an inside the park home run with two outs to give the A's the win...in **1990** Rickey Henderson scores his 744th run in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record...Rickey finished his A's career with 1270 runs scored.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (12-5, 2.04 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.04 ERA...currently has the lowest ERA by an AL pitcher since Pedro Martinez posted a 1.74 ERA for Boston in 2000...now has a 2.64 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Athletics history among pitchers with 450 or more innings pitched (since 1913, when earned runs became an official stat).

AMONG THE LEADERS: In addition to leading the American League in ERA, he also leads the league in opponents batting average (.201), on-base percentage (.254) and slugging percentage (.275)...is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), tied for third in complete games (3), ranks sixth in winning percentage (.706) and innings pitched (167.1), tied for seventh in wins (12) and ninth in strikeouts (141)...has allowed 10 home runs in 167.1 innings and his average of 0.54 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...ranks second in fewest pitches per inning (14.5), tied for second in opponents reaching base on an error (8) and fourth in wild pitches (10).

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 3-2 with a 1.71 ERA (10 er in 52.2 ip) and .188 (35-for-186) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...has three complete games, including two shutouts, over that stretch...has tossed seven or more innings five times and allowed two runs or fewer five times.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 8-2 with a 1.69 ERA (20 er in 106.2 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest compared to 4-3 with a 2.67 ERA (18 er in 60.2 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more...his ERA on four days rest is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 19 of his 24 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .218 (45-for-206) with two doubles and three home runs (.272 slugging percentage) with runners on base...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the batting average ranks sixth...also ranks third among AL qualifiers with a .184 (60-for-326) batting average against left-handed hitters and fifth with a .137 (42-for-306) average with two strikes...opponents are batting .194 (31-for-160) with a .241 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are fourth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-2 with a 1.64 ERA (16 er in 88.0 ip) in 13 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.50 ERA (22 er in 79.1 ip) in 11 starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the American League lead in road wins...has allowed three home runs in 88.0 innings on the road, seven in 79.1 innings at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.97 ERA (6 er in 55.2 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 7-4 with a 2.58 ERA (32 er in 111.2 ip) in 16 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League and is tied for second in day wins.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has 28 putouts, which ties the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...leads Major League pitchers in putouts...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances (48) and tied for eighth in assists (20).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-2 with a 2.06 ERA (10 er in 43.2 ip) in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...his ERA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchscherer's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 11-12 with a 2.94 ERA (65 er in 199.0 ip) in 31 games after the break.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in three starts in August...went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 (also 1.03 in July, 2014)...finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts.

30 CAREER WINS: Picked up the 30th victory of his career July 28 at Los Angeles (NL), which was the 66th appearance of his career...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to win 30 games in 66 or fewer games...the

others are Tim Hudson (52nd game), Barry Zito (61st), Mark Mulder (61st) and Trevor Cahill (66th).

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in four of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22)...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 24 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 17 times, one earned run or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 18 times...the A's are 15-9 (.625) in his starting assignments and are 39-28 (.582) when he starts in his career...is 27-1 in 38 career starts with three runs of support or more...tossed a two-hit shutout July 12 at Cleveland and a three-hit shutout three starts later July 28 at Los Angeles (NL)...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts in a month since Barry Zito had two in August, 2001.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Baltimore last Monday...it was his first start since Aug. 7 as he missed his scheduled start on Aug. 13 in Toronto due to back spasms...the A's scored a run in the second, but he allowed three unearned runs in the fourth inning...Sogard committed an error with two outs and Clevenger hit a three-run home run two batters later...also allowed a RBI double to Joseph in the sixth inning...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it snapped a streak of 29 consecutive games without a loss by Gray when given a lead of at least one run...it was just the second such loss of his career.

GRAY vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.63 ERA (24.0 ip, 24 h, 8 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career starts...is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (6 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts at Tampa Bay...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-2 A's win at Tampa Bay May 24...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings but left the game early with a right ankle contusion...allowed three hits to the first five batters he faced...then retired 12 of the final 13 batters he faced...was relieved by Otero to start the bottom of the sixth with the A's leading 5-0.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Kendall Graveman (6-9, 4.27 ERA): Is 0-5 with a 6.89 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the losing streak is a career high, an A's season high and is tied for the third longest active streak in the American League...it matches the longest losing streak by an Athletic over the last three years...is 0-4 with a 7.00 ERA in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 6-5 with a 3.38 ERA in 14 starts before the break...the four post-break losses are tied for third most in the AL...has allowed seven home runs in 27.0 inning since the break after allowing eight in 82.2 innings before the break...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 18-2 A's loss at Baltimore last Sunday (3.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against the Rays, a start in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay earlier this year on May 23 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 6 so).

- The A's bullpen has a 6.23 ERA (45 er in 65.0 ip) over its past 21 games (beginning July 29)...is 3-6 with two saves and four blown saves over that span...has a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League.
- Is tied for the second fewest wins (13) in the AL and has the third most losses (24)...has tossed the third fewest innings (348.0) and yielded the fourth most doubles (71) and home runs (47).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (21), the lowest save percentage (53.8%) and is tied for the most blown saves (18).
