RAY MATTER—The Rays opened this 3-game series last night with a 2-1 win over the A's, their 4th straight one-run game and 2nd consecutive onerun win...it was the Rays 12th win of the season in which they have scored 2 runs or less, most in the majors...after dropping the first three games, the Rays are now 3-5 on this 10-game, 10-day road trip through the AL West (0-3 at Texas, 2-2 at Houston and 1-0 here)...the Rays bullpen has failed to hold late leads in 3 of the losses: in the 7th inning (Aug 14 at TEX), 8th (Tue at HOU) and 9th (Wed at HOU)...the Rays have lost 2 walkoffs on this trip (both at Houston) and have a major league 10 this season...the Rays brought a 4-game win streak on this trip and are now 7-5 in their last 12 games and 10-7 since Aug 2...the Rays have been between one game under .500 and one game over .500 for 61 days this season and for 36 of the last 44 days...the Rays are at .500 (61-61) for the 18th day, most ever in one season...Rays were also 61-61 last season after 122 games.

ently 4 teams within 2.0 games of the AL's second Wild Card spot and 6 teams within 5.0 games...in the 4 years of the "Second Wild Card" era this is the most crowded race for the second wild card on this date.

straight games by 1-0 and 2-1 scores...it is only the 3rd time in club history the Rays have won 2 straight games by scoring a combined total of 3 or fewer runs...it is the 2nd time this season (also June 4-5 vs. SEA, 2-1 and 1-0)...last night was the Rays 10th one-run game in their last 17 games...it was also their 70th game decided by 2 runs or fewer, tied for the major league

lead...it was their 14th game out of the last 19 decided by one or two runs...8 of the Rays

last 10 losses have been by 1 or 2 runs.

DESMOND BECOMES FIRST RAY-The Rays have won their last 2 games (1-0 at Houston and 2-1 here) and Desmond Jennings has driven in all of three runs in the 2 wins...it's the first time ever that a Rays player has driven in all of the Rays runs in back-to-back wins...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last MLB player to do it was SF Cody Ross on May 8-10, 2011...the Giants beat Colorado 3-0 and Arizona 1-0...Desmond returned from the 60-day disabled list (left knee bursitis) on Aug 14 and has hit safely in 6 of his 7 games since (.357, 10-for-28) with 1 HR and 4 RBI... he had no homers and 2 RBI in 19 games before going on the DL.

last AL teams to be .500 or better after 122 games with so few runs scored were all from the 1976 season-when the Orioles, Twins, Yankees and Tigers all were over .500 with fewer than 453 runs scored.

THIS WEEK IN RAYS BASEBALL - The Rays are 3-2 in their last 5 games and have allowed only 9 runs in the 5 games...Rays starters have worked to a 1.13 ERA (32.1-IP, 26-H, 4-ER, 5-BB, 32-SO)...in the last 3 games, Rays pitchers have struck out 36 batters and walked 3.

THE RAYS WAY-Rays starting pitchers have not allowed a run in their last 19.2 innings and only one in their last in the last 23.2 IP...last night was the 24th game a Rays starter has not allowed a run, tops in the majors... the Rays had 32 such games last year, most by an AL club since the 1964 Angels (34)...last night, Drew Smyly became the 8th different Rays pitcher with a scoreless start this season, tops in the AL...it was the 53rd time a Rays starter allowed one run or less, 2nd in the majors behind St. Louis (56).

GOMES ONE SHY OF PERFECT GAME-Brandon Gomes has retired the last 26 batters he's faced since BOS Josh Rutledge singled on July 31 at Fenway...Gomes' streak matches the 2nd longest in club history...RH Steve Geltz retired 32 in a row earlier this year (June 6-24), and RH Kyle Farnsworth had a streak of 26 in 2011 (July 28-August 23).

SABR HAS KIERMAIER No. 1-SABR (Society for American Baseball Research) yesterday released its Defensive Index rankings and Rays CF Kevin Kiermaier has extended his commanding lead in the AL in the SABR Defensive Index™ rankings through games of Aug 16…the SABR Defensive Index accounts for approximately 25 pct. of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award selection process...major league managers and coaches, voting only within their league and unable to vote for players on their own teams, account for 75 pct, of the selection process...Kiermaier's SDI of 21.8 is the best in the majors among all qualified defenders, followed by Giants SS Brandon Crawford (14.0), Rockies 3B Nolan Arenado (11.9), Orioles 3B Manny Machado (10.3), Giants C Buster Posey (10.0) and DET/NYM LF Yoenis Cespedes (9.9).

.500 HOME AND ROAD — The Rays enter play today with a .500 mark at home (31-31) and on the road (30-30)...no other major league team is exactly .500 at home or on the road.

ERASMO! — The Rays are 13-6 (.684) when tonight's starter Erasmo Ramirez is on the mound...only six other major league starters (min. 18 starts) have seen their teams win a higher pct. of their starts: STL Carlos Martinez (.818), STL Michael Wacha (.782), DET/TOR David Price (.720), TOR Drew Hutchison (.708), LAD Zack Greinke (.708) and NYM Jacob deGrom (.696)...overall, has the 7th-best winning pct. in the majors (10-4, .714).

nated for assignment on Sunday to accommodate Drew Smyly's transfer from the 60-day disabled list to the 40-man roster, has cleared waivers and been outrighted to Triple-A Durham.

A LITTLE HELP — Tomorrow's starter Jake Odorizzi has the lowest run support among AL starters with a runs-per-game mark of 3.16...close behind are Chris Archer (7th at 3.65) and Nathan Karns (9th at 3.71)...the Rays are the only team with 3 pitchers in the bottom 10 in run support...Odorizzi has made 13 quality starts (6-plus IP, 3 ER or fewer) and has failed to win 9 of those (4 losses, 5 no decisions), the 3rd highest total in the AL behind CWS Jose Quintana (12) and BAL Wei-Yin Chen (11).

GELTZ CLOSING IN ON 60-RH Steve Geltz made his AL-high 59th appearance last night...only 3 Rays rookies have reached 60 appearances in a season: RH Ruddy Lugo (64 in 2006), RH Esteban Yan (64 in 1998) and RH Lance Carter (62 in 2003)...the last rookie to lead the AL in apps was CWS Kelly Wunsch in 2000 (83).

only 4 errors this season and 3B Evan Longoria has only 7...their 11 combined are the fewest by a left side of the infield in the majors this season... in the 2000s, only one SS-3B combination had fewer errors in one season: the 2000 Indians with SS Omar Vizquel (3) and 3B Travis Fryman (8) combined for 11.

- + LAST START—On Mon vs. HOU, was given a 4-0 lead before even throwing a pitch, winning his second straight start...both runs allowed were driven in by Evan Gattis, via a 2nd-inning single and 4th-inning solo homer...threw 102 pitches, his most since June 15 vs. WAS (103)...his line: W, 5.2 IP, 6 H, 2 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 1 HR, 102 pit, 64 str.
 - + Became the fourth Nicaraguan to win 10 games in a season, joining **Dennis Martinez**, **AI Williams** and **Vicente Padilla**.
 - Became the third Ray to reach 10 wins in the season after he was acquired via trade, joining Mark Hendrickson (10-15, 2004) and Matt Garza (11-9, 2008).
- + ERASMO LATELY—Since moving into the starting rotation for good on May 14, has made 17 starts and gone 10-3—T-2nd in the AL in wins over that span, with HOU Dallas Keuchel and NYY Nathan Eovaldi, one shy of TEX Colby Lewis (11)...opponents are batting .205/.270/.313 (72-for-352), lowest opp avg. in the AL...has a 2.61 ERA (96.2-IP, 28-ER) over this stretch, 4th in the AL, lowering his season ERA from 8.38 to 3.57.
- + TYPICALLY STRONG—Has yielded 1 <u>earned</u> run or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts this season...is one of only seven AL pitchers with at least 12 starts of 1 ER or fewer, a list that includes teammate and AL co-leaders Chris Archer (14) and OAK Sonny Gray, tonight's opposing starter... the six other pitchers have all made at least 23 starts to Erasmo's 19.
 - Has yielded 2 hits or fewer in 5 starts this year, one shy of the AL lead held by teammates Chris Archer and Nathan Karns, OAK Sonny Gray and OAK/HOU Scott Kazmir.
- H MR. EFFICIENCY—Averaging 14.9 pitches per inning, which would rank T-6th in the AL if he qualified...the only qualifiers in club history to ever finish a season that low are RH James Shields (2011, 2008, 2007) and LH David Price (2013).
- + DOESN'T TAKE MUCH—Has yet to lose when he receives 2 runs or more of run support...in those 13 starts, he is 10-0 with a 1.88 ERA (76.2-IP, 16-ER)...has gotten 1 or fewer runs of support in 6 starts, and is 0-4 with a 6.10 ERA (31-IP, 21-ER) in those starts.

- + THE TURNAROUND—<u>Since April 19</u>, is 10-3 with a 2.52 ERA in 24 apps (18 starts), ranking among AL leaders in numerous categories (see chart)...yielded 16 runs (15 earned) in his first 2 apps (1 start) spanning 5.1 IP this year, a 25.31 ERA, and only 34 runs (31 earned) in 110.2 IP since then.
- THE CHANGE—His changeup has accounted for 24.4 percent of his pitches, according to FanGraphs, and 41.4 percent of his strikeouts (36 of 87) have come with the changeup, per PITCHf/x.
 - Has thrown 678 changeups since last yielding a home run with the pitch (April 17, 2014 at TEX, Shin-Soo Choo), per PITCHf/x.

 Was the 10th time since the start of 2014 he allowed one run or fewer and not earned a win, one shy of the AL lead (TB Chris Archer and LAA Hector Santiago) for most such starts over that span.
- + SINCE HIS RETURN—Is 2-1 with a 3.94 ERA (45.2-IP, 20-ER) in 8 starts since returning from the 15-day DL (left oblique strain)...ranked 5th in the AL with a 2.47 ERA at the time of his injury.
- + vs. OAKLAND—Has faced the A's once, on May 20, 2014 at Tropicana Field...his line: L, 4.2 IP, 4 H, 3 R/ER, 5 BB, 8 SO, 113 pit, 71 str...his 5 BB and 113 pitches remain tied for his career high...40 of his 113 pitches came in the 4th inning, but didn't allow a run in the frame...his 3 runs allowed came in the 2nd, on a Coco Crisp 2-run double and John Jaso RBI single, the only runs of the entire game in the Rays 3-0 loss.
