RAY MATTER—After losing the first 3 games on this 10-day, 10-game road trip, the Rays have won 4 of the last 6 games including the last 3, all by one one run...the Rays are 4-5 on the road trip (0-3 at Texas, 2-1 at Houston and 2-0 here)...only once in club history have the Rays lost the first 3 games of a road trip and returned home with a .500 or better trip...that occured July 19-20, 2000, when Tampa Bay dropped the first 3 games of a 12-game trip and wound up 7-5 while going through Toronto, Kansas City, New York and Detroit...in last night's 5-4 win, the Rays scored 2 runs in the 9th inning to wipe out Oakland's 4-3 lead...entering last night's game, the Rays had been 0-49 when trailing after 8 and 4-14 in games and 11-7 since Aug 2...they have been between one game under .500 and one game over .500 for 62 days this season and for 37 of the last 45 days.

A.L. WILD CARD RACE—There are presently four teams within 1.5 games of the AL's second Wild Card spot and 6 teams within 5.0 games...in the four years of the "Second Wild Card" era, this is the most crowded race for the second Wild Card on this date.

<u>CLOSE CALLS</u>—The Rays have played 5 consecutive 1-run games for the first time since Sep 12-18, 2010, when they played 6 straight games...the Rays are 21-22 in one-run games and last night was the Rays 11th one-run game in their last 18 games... it was also their 71st game decided by 2

ROAD TRIP RECAP—The Rays have been led by relievers **Xavier Cedeno**, **Alex Colome**, **Brandon Gomes** and **Steve Geltz**, who have worked a combined 19.1 IP and allowed 3 hits and one run...the Rays have scored 31 runs in the 9 games—3.4 runs per game—but have been led by the bottom of the order...Rays 7-thru-9 hitters are a combined 32-for-95 (.337).

RAYS SEEK FIRST SWEEP HERE—The Rays have won the first 2 games of this series and are seeking their first-ever sweep here...the Rays have made 24 visits to Oakland (5-17-2)...in only two other current AL parks have the Rays never swept a series: Comerica Park and U.S. Cellular Field... Rays lead the season series 4 games to 2...last night's win clinched the Rays first winning season vs. the A's since 2010, and a win today would give the Rays their best record ever in one season vs. the A's...the Rays 61-95 (.391) all-time record vs. the A's is their worst vs. an AL opponent, as is their 24-52 (.316) mark at O.co Coliseum.

HOMESTAND PREVIEW—Following their fourth off-day of the month tomorrow (their most off days in one month excluding July), the Rays open a 6-game homestand with Minnesota and Kansas City, their final Central Division games of the year...Rays are 1-6 vs. the two teams in 2015...overall, the Rays have have won their last 4 home games, 6 of their last 8 and are 30-24 after starting the season at home 1-6...in their first meeting with the Twins, the Rays dropped 2 of 3 games at Target Field...the Rays have won the last 5 season series from the Twins and have not lost a season series to them since 2006...Rays are 30-13 (.698) vs. Minnesota since May 29, 2009 and lead all-time, 67-65.

WINNING THE HARD WAY—The Rays are 62-61 while scoring 458 runs, fewest in the AL and 29th in the majors...the last AL teams to be .500 or better after 123 games with so few runs scored were all from the 1976 season—when the Orioles, Twins, Yankees and Tigers all were over .500 with

fewer than 458 runs scored.

THIS WEEK IN RAYS BASEBALL—The Rays are 4-2 in their 6 games this week and have allowed only 13 runs in the 6 games...Rays starters have worked to a 1.83 ERA (39.1-IP, 34-H, 8-ER, 7-BB, 36-SO).

RAYS ROOKIES—Last night, RH **Alex Colome** earned the Rays 22nd win by a Rays rookie this season, most in the majors...Rays rookies are 22-16 with 6 saves and a 3.67 ERA (372.2-IP, 152-ER).

<u>GOMES ONE SHY OF PERFECT GAME</u>—RH Brandon Gomes has retired the last 26 batters he's faced since BOS Josh Rutledge singled on July 31 at Fenway Park...Gomes' streak matches the 2nd longest in club history...RH Steve Geltz retired 32 in a row earlier this year (June 6-24), and RH Kyle Farnsworth had a streak of 26 in 2011 (July 28–Aug 23).

MATT MOORE SETS DURHAM K RECORD—Last night, Rays LH Matt Moore, pitching for Triple-A Durham, struck out 16 batters in the Bulls' 5-2 win over Columbus (Indians), setting a franchise Triple-A record...Moore, 26, was optioned on Aug 3...last night, he went 6 innings, striking out 16 of the 22 batters he faced while allowing 2 runs on 4 hits...with the Bulls, he has has a 3.42 ERA with a 36/5 K/BB ratio in 23 2/3 innings in 4 starts.

WHAT'S LEFT — After today, the Rays have:

- + 22 games at home, 16 on the road
- + 25 games vs. teams over .500, 13 games vs. teams under .500
- + 26 games vs. AL East teams

<u>UBER-UTLITY</u>—INF Logan Forsythe doubled and homered last night and now is batting .281 with 14 HR and 52 RBI...no other major league second basemen can match each of those numbers...Logan has started games at 1B, 2B and 3B this season for the Rays and has compiled career highs in hits (118), HR and RBI...only four active players have started games at three different infield positions and surpassed his numbers in one season: TB **Ben Zobrist** (2009), **Juan Uribe** (2x: 2004 with CWS, 2009 with SF), MIN **Michael Cuddyer** (2010) and DET **Omar Infante** (2004).

<u>3-HOMER RARITY</u>—The Rays hit 3 HR last night off **Sonny Gray**, owner of the lowest opponents' avg. in the AL...it was the first time in 68 career starts that Gray has allowed 3 HR in a game...since July 28, the Rays have had four 3-homer games...they have come in games started by Gray (all off Gray), NYM **Jacob deGrom** (2 off deGrom on Aug 7), CWS **Chris Sale** (2 off Sale on Aug 4) and DET **David Price** (2 off Price on July 28).

COMING TO LIFE IN AUGUST—The Rays are hitting .286 in 19 games this month (11-8), 2nd best in the majors (Boston .311)...Rays are 5th in the majors in OPS (.787) and are averaging 4.53 runs per game...Rays entered August batting .239 (28th in the majors) and sporting a .684 OPS (24th) while averaging 3.58 runs per game (28th)...the Rays batted just .229 in July...SS Asdrubal Cabrera is 3rd in the majors this month with a .405 (30-for-74) batting average...OF **Brandon Guyer** is batting .371 (13-for-35).

FIRST-YEAR MANAGERS ARE TIGHT—The four teams who began the season with rookie managers are all presently separated by only 2.0 games:

A LITTLE HELP—Today's starter, Jake Odorizzi, has the lowest run support in the AL (min. 20 starts) with 3.16 runs scored per 9 IP...close behind are Chris Archer (7th at 3.65) and Nathan Karns (9th at 3.71)...the Rays are the only team with 3 pitchers in the bottom 10 in run support...Odorizzi has made 13 quality starts (6-plus IP, 3 ER or fewer) and has failed to win 9 of those (4 losses, 5 no decisions), the 3rd highest total in the AL behind CWS Jose Quintana (12) and BAL Wei-Yin Chen (11).

CABRERA CONTINUES TO LEAD AL SINCE RETURN—In 22 games since returning from the DL on July 28, SS Asdrubal Cabrera leads the AL with a .412 avg. (35-for-85)...on June 17, he was hitting .199...in 46 games since then, he has batted .357 (58-for-169).

- + LAST START—On Tue vs. HOU, tied a season-high with 9 SO (also April 18 vs. NYY)...yielded only one run, an RBI double by Marwin Gonzalez in the 3rd...received no decision, after the Rays bullpen blew a 2-1 lead.
- Was the 10th time since the start of 2014 he allowed one run or fewer and not earned a win, one shy of the AL lead (TB Chris Archer and LAA Hector Santiago) for most such starts over that span.
- + vs. AL WEST—This season is 1-1 with a 0.91 ERA (29.2-IP, 3-ER) in 5 starts against AL West opponents...in his career, is 5-4 with a 1.87 ERA (68.2-IP, 14-ER) in 12 starts...hasn't allowed a run in 5 of those 12 starts, and has allowed 1 ER or fewer in 9 of the 12 starts.
- + SINCE HIS RETURN—Is 2-1 with a 3.94 ERA (45.2-IP, 20-ER) in 8 starts since returning from the 15-day DL (left oblique strain)...ranked 5th in the AL with a 2.47 ERA at the time of his injury.
- + STREAKING—Has made 5 straight starts of at least 6 IP and no more than 1 BB...only twice has a Rays pitcher compiled a longer streak of this type: David Price (9) in July–Aug 2013 and Doug Waechter (6) in Aug– Sep 2005...has 34 SO compared to 5 BB in this stretch...prior to this, totaled 10 BB and 11 SO in his first 3 starts since returning from the DL.
- + WORKLOAD—Averaging 98 pitches per game...has thrown 100-plus pitches in 5 straight starts, the second-longest streak of his career (6, June–July 2014)...averaging 15.9 pitches per inning, down from 18.0 in 2014 which was highest in club history among gualifiers.
 - + Has finished 6 innings in 16 of his 20 starts this season, compared to 14 times in 31 starts in 2014...has pitched into the 7th inning 12 times, compared to 8 times in 2014.
- + UNSUPPORTED—Has received the lowest run support in the AL (min. 20 starts) at 3.16 R/9 IP (122.1-IP, 43-RS)...the lowest mark by a qualifying pitcher in club history is 3.63 R/9 IP by Alex Cobb in 2014...the Rays have scored 2 runs or fewer for him 14 times in 20 starts and have given him a total of 7 runs in his 6 losses.

- + STINGY vs. LEFTIES—Has held lefties to only 1 HR in 264 AB (Justin Smoak, July 17 at TOR)...has held lefties to a .326 SLG, 4th-lowest mark in the AL (min. 200 BF) behind Erasmo Ramirez (.278), OAK Sonny Gray (.278) and Chris Archer (.320).
- **H** ROAD IMPROVEMENT—Seeking his first road win since May 31 at BAL...is 3-4 with a 3.74 ERA (65-IP, 27-ER) on the road, and has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 6 of his 11 road starts...in 2014, recorded a 6.32 ERA (68.1-IP, 44-ER) in 14 road starts last season and had the largest homeroad differential in the majors (min. 100 IP)...it was the 2nd highest in club history among season qualifiers—only Mark Hendrickson (6.53 in 2005) was higher.
 - + This year, his 2.20 ERA at home ranks 4th among AL pitchers (min. 50 IP at home)...has allowed 1 run or fewer in 7 of 9 home starts.
- + COBBYCAT—32.4 pct. of his pitches have been changeups, most in the AL (min. 100 IP) and 2nd in the majors to COL Jorge de la Rosa (35.6), according to FanGraphs...borrowed his changeup grip from Alex Cobb in the 2013-14 offseason.
- + ABOUT THAT RECORD—Has a 3.71 career ERA, yet only a .447 (17-21) career winnning pct. ...among active pitchers with 50-plus starts, only three have a lower ERA and a lower win pct. for their career: SD Tyson Ross (.380, 3.61), SD Andrew Cashner (.397, 3.45) and HOU Mike Fiers (.440, 3.57).
- + **GROUNDED**—Has a 1.17 GB/FB ratio this season, well below the AL average (1.43), but up considerably from his 0.65 GB/FB ratio last season—2nd lowest in the majors to SEA **Chris Young** (0.42)...has gotten 6 GIDP behind him this season, compared to 1 in 2014.
- WANTED MAN—As a prospect, was twice included in trades for an All-Star pitcher...the Brewers traded him to Kansas City on Dec 19, 2010 in a six-player deal for Zack Greinke...two years later, the Royals traded him to the Rays in a seven-player deal for James Shields.

+ LAST START—On Wed at HOU, left in line for a 2-1 win over Dallas Keuchel, but the bullpen blew it and the Rays lost 3-2 in 13 innings... lone run was a homer by Carlos Correa in the 1st...his line: 6 IP, 6 H, 1 R/ER, 1 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 84 pit, 53 str...it was his second straight start in his home state, his first appearances in Texas since college (Texas Tech).

- SINCE THE BREAK—Is unbeaten (3-0) in 6 starts since the All-Star break, and exited with the Rays ahead or tied in his 3 starts with a nodecision…has maintained a 2.81 ERA (32-IP, 10-ER) in the second half.
- + 2 RUNS OR FEWER—<u>His 18 starts allowing 2 runs or fewer are most in the AL</u>, and the only NL pitchers with that many are LAD Zack Greinke (20) and NYM Jacob deGrom (18)...this ties the Rays rookie record set by Rolando Arrojo in 1998...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the
- most by any rookie since 2013 (MIA **Jose Fernandez**-22, LAD **Hyun-Jin Ryu**-19, STL **Shelby Miller**-18)...if he reaches 20 he will be only the third rookie to do so in the last 40 seasons (since 1976), joining Fernandez and NYM **Dwight Gooden** in 1984 (22).
- + 3 HITS OR FEWER—<u>Has made 10 starts of allowing 3 hits or fewer, most</u> in the majors...it's the most by an AL pitcher since 2013, when TB Matt Moore and TEX Yu Darvish each had 11.
- + vs. MINNESOTA—Has faced the Twins once, in the third start of his career for Washington, on June 9, 2013 in Game 2 of a doubleheader at Nationals Park...earned no decision in the 5-4 Nats victory...his line: 3.0 IP, 5 H, 4 R/ER, 3 BB, 2 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 74 pit, 43 str.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- Has been ejected twice as manager: April 16 at TOR, May 10 vs. TEX.
 37-year-old manager is the youngest skipper in the majors since ARI A.J. Hinch (34) in 2009 and youngest active manager/head coach in the four major sports, ahead of Boston Celtics head coach Brad Stevens (38).
- + Is the fifth manager in Rays history...is the sixth Tampa-born manager

in ML history and second to manage the Rays…joins Hall of Famers AI Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.

Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, including parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10)...spent two years (2005-06) in the Rays org., and appeared in 13 major league games in 2005 for Lou Piniella.
