### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (54-71) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (57-67)

MONDAY, AUGUST 24, 2015 – SAFECO FIELD – 7:10 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have lost nine of their last 12 games, including a season-high seven-game losing streak that was snapped last Tuesday... are 10-19 (.345) over the last 29 games and 54-71 (.432) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and seventh worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 15 games for the second consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2011 season 22 games out...have spent 100 of the last 104 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...it is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in last...it is the second time in the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 20-30 (.400) since then.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's did not allow a home run yesterday afternoon to snap an Oakland record streak of allowing at least one home run in 16 consecutive games (26 home runs total)...broke the previous mark of 15 from Aug. 6-21, 1987...have allowed 113 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...the offense has hit 98 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's scored eight runs yesterday afternoon, their most since July 19 against Minnesota when they scored 14...including seven runs and eight hits in the seventh inning, which matched the A's most in an inning this year...are hitting .235 (391-for-1667) with 165 runs scored over the last 50 games (3.30 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank third in the American League in fewest strikeouts (830), fourth in stolen base percentage (67-for-88, 76.1%) and tied for fourth in doubles (220)...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.385)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in infield hits (131).

**ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES:** The A's are 14-29 (.326) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the 29 losses are the most by an A's team since the 1986 A's went 22-29...have lost more than 29 games by one run twice in Oakland history: 1976 (32) and 1968 (30)...the 43 one-run games are tied with the Rays for third most in the American League...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...18 of the A's last 27 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 22-45 (.328) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 32-26 (.552) in games decided by three runs or more.

**OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the AL and the losses are tied for second most...have seven losses when leading after seven innings, which is second most in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have five walk-off wins in their last 20 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...are tied for the second most extra-inning games (Seattle, 20).

**PITCHING:** The A's had a 2.74 ERA (14 er in 46.0 ip) and .188 (30-for-160) opponents batting average in five games on the last homestand after compiling a 6.93 ERA and .304 opponents average in seven contests on the last road trip...have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.371) and fewest extra base hits (311), third in opponents batting average (.240) and fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.301).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have a 3.16 ERA, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.83)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...lead the American League in fewest home runs (66), rank third in innings pitched (760.0) and tied for fourth in complete games (5).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Billy Burns committed the A's 100th error of the season Friday night, which is the most in the majors...the A's rank second in the majors with 53 unearned runs (San Diego, 62)...Marcus Semien has 31 errors and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and second in the American League...the 51 errors are the most by two teammates since Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19) combined for 52 for the 2000 Angels.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a six-game road trip to Seattle (three games) and Arizona (three games) tonight...went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...it was the seventh winless road trip of seven or more games in Oakland history, the first since July 21-27, 1998 (0-7 vs. Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...now have an eight-game road losing streak, which matches the longest road losing streak by an A's team over the last 10 years (July 23-Aug. 7, 2008)...have not lost more than eight straight road games since losing 11 straight from May 21-June 9, 2005...have also lost 11 of the last 12 and 14 of the last 17 on the road...are 24-35 (.407) on the road for the season, which is tied for the third worst road record in the American League...have a 2.95 ERA (199 er in 607.0 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (243 er in 505.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on their last homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...had their season-high five-game home winning streak snapped Friday night...have won 10 of their last 14 home games but are 30-36 (.455) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the AL...the 36 home losses are the most by an A's team over the last four years.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 13-21 (.382) since the All-Star Break, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are batting .237 (272-for-1148) with 116 runs scored (3.41 runs per game)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors (Atlanta, 108), the third fewest home runs (24) and the fourth lowest batting average.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 20-27 (.426) in day games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 11-23 (.324) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (125) and sacrifice flies (14), rank third in RBI (91) and tied for third in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (16-for-87, .184)...are third in pinch plate appearances (105).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have four players on the disabled list (Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Parker)...Davis and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL a total of 20 times, which is two more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's are 3-7 against the Mariners but have out-scored Seattle 43-39...five of the seven losses have been by one run...13 of the A's 17 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer...are 3-4 in Oakland this year and were swept in a three-game series in Seattle in May...have lost each of the previous two season series and three of the previous four...are 41-45 against the Mariners dating back to 2011...all-time, the A's are 324-252 (.563) against Seattle, which is the third best mark by any team against the Mariners...are 179-110 in Oakland, 144-140 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Fernando Abad** a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) over his past 27 games (beginning May 22)...posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances...**Billy Burns** recorded his 33rd infield hit of the season yesterday afternoon, which is second most in the majors (Gordon, MIA 39)...they are the most by an Athletic since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (24) and multiple hit games (35)...leads American League rookies in hits (117) and total bases (152)...**Mark Canha** is 13-for-24 (.542) with five multiple hit games over his last six games and 20-for-46 (.435) with five doubles, one triple, two home runs and 11 RBI over his last 12 games...leads AL rookies in RBI (46)...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .367 (11-for-30) with four multiple hit games over his last seven games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** a doubleheader turns into a tripleheader as the A's need 18 innings to win the second game of the twinbill, 9-8...the doubleheader, which starts at 1:34, ends at 9:06 when Ted Kubiak's RBI single ends the 5 hour and 8 minute second game...in **1986** Mark McGwire collects his first Major League hit, a second inning single off Tommy John, in the A's 11-4 victory at New York...in **2003** the A's set a franchise record and tie a Major League record by hitting two grand slams in a 17-2 win at Toronto...Ramon Hernandez has a grand slam in the first and Miguel Tejada hits his sixth career slam in the sixth inning.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Felix Doubront (1-1, 3.89 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and sixth start of the season...it will be his fourth appearance and second start with the A's... was released by Chicago (NL) March 28 and signed a minor league contract with Toronto April 2...began the season on the disabled list at Triple-A Buffalo with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13 and went 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA in nine starts with the Bisons before he was selected by the Blue Jays July 3...was 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29...was traded to Oakland July 31 for cash considerations and is 0-0 with a 3.58 ERA (5 er in 16.2 ip) in three games, including one start, with the A's.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 1-1 with a 3.76 ERA (11 er in 26.1 ip) and .288 (30-for-104) opponents batting average in his five starts compared to 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .255 (13-for-51) opponents average in three relief appearances...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 1-for-3 in his relief appearances...is now 28-24 with a 4.41 ERA (210 er in 429.0 ip) in 78 career starts, 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA (40 er in 48.2 ip) in 32 relief appearances.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed and 13 of his 14 extra base hits to righties...lefties are slugging .278 (1 double) compared to .429 by righties...has allowed a .368 (14-for-38) average with runners in scoring position...opponents are batting .348 (23-for-66) with both of his home runs allowed the first time through the lineup, .225 (20-for-89) after that.

**WITH TORONTO:** Made his Blue Jays debut in relief on **July 3** at Detroit, allowing one run in 2.1 innings in relief of Drew Hutchison...picked up his first and only win of the season in his first start, a 2-1 Toronto win at Chicago (AL) **July 7**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a Sanchez RBI single...shutout the White Sox on three hits over his final 4.2 innings...had a no decision in an 11-10 loss at Kansas City **July 12**...yielded a career-high tying seven runs, including six runs in the first inning and another in the fifth...the Blue Jays then scored eight times in the sixth inning and he was relieved by Delabar to start the sixth with an 8-7 lead...Delabar allowed three runs for the blown save...had a no decision in a 4-3, 10-inning loss at Oakland **July 22**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Phegley RBI single in the fourth...then allowed a Vogt RBI single and a Smolinski sacrifice fly in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 3-1... was the losing pitcher in Toronto's 3-2 loss to Philadelphia on **July 28**...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Asche and a RBI double by Blanco.

**WITH OAKLAND:** Tossed 4.1 innings of relief **Aug. 3** against Baltimore in his Oakland debut, which was an A's season-high for a reliever at the time...enter the game in the fourth inning in relief of Jesse Chavez...allowed RBI doubles to Paredes and Joseph in the fifth inning and a RBI single to Machado in the eighth...then tossed 6.1 innings of relief at Toronto **Aug. 12**...it was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 on May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota) and the longest by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.1 innings July 7, 2007 vs. Seattle...did not strike out a batter and his 6.1 innings pitched were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL).

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit but issued a career-high tying six walks...yielded his only hit in the second inning, a leadoff single by Gonzalez...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...walked Ellis and Pederson to start the inning...Ellis went to third on a passed ball and scored on a Hernandez ground out...left after six innings with the score tied 1-1.

**WITH BUFFALO:** Was 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in nine games, all starts, with Triple-A Buffalo...signed a minor league deal with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the Triple-A DL with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13...surrendered just one home run in 48.0 innings...allowed a .197 (24-for-122) batting average and his lone home run against right-handed hitters compared to .222 (12-for-54) against left-handers...opponents hit .178 with runners in scoring position and .190 when leading off an inning...went 1-2 with a 1.69 ERA in six starts on the road, 0-1 with a 3.94 ERA in three starts at home...did not allow a run in the fourth (8.0 ip), fifth (6.0 ip) or seventh (3.0 ip) innings... the Bisons were 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed five innings or fewer in five of his nine starts.

**BUFFALO HIGHLIGHTS:** Did not allow an earned run over his first three starts (15.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 10 so) and went 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA in four starts in May...lost three consecutive starts from June 5 to 15 (6.00 ERA)...struck out a season-high eight batters in 5.0 innings June 5 at Louisville...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings June 10 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...then tossed a season-low 3.0 innings in his next start at Lehigh Valley on June 15...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts June 20 at Syracuse...picked up his lone win of the season in his final start June 28 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre when he tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...issued a season-high four walks.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Jesse Chavez (7-12, 3.75 ERA):** Is 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .187 opponents batting average over his last three starts...however, is 3-6 with a 5.01 ERA and nine home runs in 55.2 innings (1.46 hr per nine innings) over his last 10 starts dating back to June 28...has career highs in games started (22), losses (12) and earned runs (58)...picked up his seventh win of the season in his last start, which is one short of his high of eight from last year...needs 6.2 innings pitched to match his career high of 146.0 from 2014...has 12 losses, which are second most in the American League (Kluber, CLE 13)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's win over Los Angeles (NL) last Wednesday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 0-4 with a 3.43 ERA in 14 career appearances, including five starts, against Seattle...is 0-2 with a 5.27 ERA in three games, including two starts, this year.

- The A's bullpen has a 6.39 ERA (49 er in 69.0 ip) over its past 23 games (beginning July 29)...is 4-7 with two saves and six blown saves over that span...has a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.02).
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and is tied for the third fewest wins (14)...has tossed the third fewest innings (352.0), yielded the third most doubles (74) and fourth most home runs (47).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (21), the lowest save percentage (51.2%) and the second most blown saves (20).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (51) and is tied for second in first batter home runs (14)...has the second highest opponents average against first batters faced in the AL (.259).
- The A's are 8-41 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 42-29 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has allowed a .167 (9-for-54) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .280 (21-for-75) with 11 of his 14 extra base hits (.600 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a 1.29 ERA (3 er in 21.0 ip) in 27 games at home compared to 6.43 (10 er in 14.0 ip) in 20 contests on the road.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (4) and tied for second in first batter RBI (12).
