OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-71) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (57-68)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 25, 2015 – SAFECO FIELD – 7:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won two straight but are just 4-9 over their last 13 games, including a season-high seven-game losing streak that was snapped last Tuesday...are 11-19 (.367) over the last 30 games and 55-71 (.437) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and seventh worst in the majors...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 14 games...have spent 101 of the last 105 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...it is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in last...it is the second time in the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25, and are 21-30 (.412) since then.

THE LONG BALL: The A's did not allow a home run Sunday afternoon to snap an Oakland record streak of allowing at least one home run in 16 consecutive games (26 home runs total)...broke the previous mark of 15 from Aug. 6-21, 1987...have allowed 115 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...the offense has hit 100 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored eight or more runs in two straight games after going 30 straight games without scoring eight runs in a single game...scored seven runs in an inning for the second straight game, the first time they've done so since July 22, 1975 (both ends of a doubleheader)...are hitting .238 (406-for-1708) with 176 runs scored over the last 51 games (3.45 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (837), third in stolen base percentage (68-for-89, 76.4%) and tied for third in doubles (225)...have the second lowest slugging percentage (.388)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in infield hits (133).

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 14-29 (.326) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the 29 losses are the most by an A's team since the 1986 A's went 22-29...have lost more than 29 games by one run twice in Oakland history: 1976 (32) and 1968 (30)...the 43 one-run games are tied with the Rays for third most in the American League...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...18 of the A's last 28 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 22-45 (.328) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 33-26 (.559) in games decided by three runs or more.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for fewest in the AL and the losses are tied for second most...have seven losses when leading after seven innings, which is second most in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have five walk-off wins in their last 20 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...are tied for the second most extra-inning games (Seattle, 20).

PITCHING: The A's had a 2.74 ERA (14 er in 46.0 ip) and .188 (30-for-160) opponents batting average in five games on the last homestand after compiling a 6.93 ERA and .304 opponents average in seven contests on the last road trip...have a 3.59 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.371) and fewest extra base hits (314), and fourth in opponents batting average (.241) and opponents on-base percentage (.301).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have a 3.15 ERA, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.83)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...lead the American League in fewest home runs (66), rank fourth in innings pitched (762.0) and tied for fourth in complete games (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 100 errors, which are the most in the majors...the A's rank second in the majors with 53 unearned runs (San Diego, 62)...Marcus Semien has 31 errors and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and tied for second in the American League...the 51 errors are the most by two teammates since Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19) combined for 52 for the 2000 Angels.

HOME AND AWAY: Last night was the first game of a six-game road trip to Seattle (1-0) and Arizona (three games)...went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...it was the seventh winless road trip of seven or more games in Oakland history, the first since July 21-27, 1998 (0-7 vs. Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...snapped an eight-game road losing streak last night, which matched the longest road losing streak by an A's team over the last 10 years (July 23-Aug. 7, 2008)...have not lost more than eight straight road games since losing 11 straight from May 21-June 9, 2005...have lost 11 of the last 13 and 14 of the last 18 on the road...are 25-35 (.417) on the road for the season...have a 2.95 ERA (199 er in 607.0 ip) at home compared to 4.34 (248 er in 514.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on their last homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...had their season-high five-game home winning streak snapped Friday night...have won 10 of their last 14 home games but are 30-36 (.455) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the AL...the 36 home losses are the most by an A's team over the last four years.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 14-21 (.400) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...are batting .241 (287-for-1189) with 127 runs scored (3.63 runs per game)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors (Atlanta, 113), the third fewest home runs (26) and the fifth lowest batting average.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 20-27 (.426) in day games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 11-23 (.324) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (126) and sacrifice flies (14), rank third in RBI (93) and are second in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (16-for-87, .184)...are third in pinch plate appearances (105).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Parker)...Davis and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL a total of 20 times, which is two more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 4-7 against the Mariners but have out-scored Seattle 54-44...five of the seven losses have been by one run...13 of the A's 17 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer...are 3-4 in Oakland this year and are 1-3 in Seattle...have lost each of the previous two season series and three of the previous four...are 42-45 against the Mariners dating back to 2011...all-time, the A's are 325-252 (.563) against Seattle, which is the third best mark by any team against the Mariners...are 179-110 in Oakland, 145-140 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) over his past 27 games (beginning May 22)...posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances...**Billy Burns** has 33 infield hits, which is second most in the majors (Gordon, MIA 39)...they are the most by an Athletic since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (24) and multiple hit games (36)...leads American League rookies in hits (119) and total bases (155)...**Mark Canha** is 15-for-29 (.517) with six multiple hit games over his last seven games and 22-for-51 (.431) with six doubles, one triple, two home runs and 13 RBI over his last 13 games...leads AL rookies in RBI (48)...has a career-high tying seven-game hitting streak (also earlier this month) and has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games...**Evan Scribner** has allowed 14 home runs this season, which is the third most by a reliever in A's franchise history...the **A's offense** has scored eight or more runs in back-to-back games after going 30-straight games without scoring at least eight runs.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** Mark McGwire hits his first major league home run, a two-run shot in the fifth inning off Walt Terrell, in the A's 8-4 win at Detroit...in **2006** Barry Zito takes a no-hitter into the eighth inning and wins the 100th game of his career in the A's 9-3 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (7-12, 3.75 ERA)

RECENTLY: Is 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (7 er in 21.0 ip) and .187 (14-for-75) opponents batting average over his last three starts...however, is 3-6 with a 5.01 ERA (31 er in 55.2 ip), .276 (61-for-221) opponents batting average and nine home runs in 55.2 innings (1.46 hr per nine innings) over his last 10 starts dating back to June 28...was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA, .246 opponents average and five home runs in 77.0 innings (0.58 hr per nine innings) over his first 12 starts.

CAREER HIGHS: Has career highs in games started (22), losses (12) and earned runs (58)...picked up his seventh win of the season in his last start, which is one short of his high of eight from last year...needs 6.2 innings pitched to match his career high of 146.0 from 2014.

LOSSES: Has 12 losses, which are second most in the American League (Kluber, CLE 13)...they are the most by an A's pitcher since 2011 (Cahill 14, Gonzalez 12)...nine came before the break, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-3 with a 4.66 ERA (20 er in 38.2 ip) in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 4-9 with a 3.40 ERA in 19 games before the break...last year, he was 7-6 with a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the break, 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games after the break...has a 3.72 career ERA before the break, 5.81 (117 er in 181.1 ip) after the break.

RUN SUPPORT: Received five runs of support in his last start after receiving five runs of support in his previous five starts (1.82 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 22 starts overall and his season RSA of 3.68 (57 rs in 139.1 ip) is seventh lowest in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 11 home runs in his last 13 starts and 74.2 innings after surrendering three over his first 13 games and 64.2 innings...has yielded 11 of his 14 home runs to left-handed hitters...10 have come with runners on base...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .085 (5-for-59), which is the lowest mark in the majors...the lowest mark by an Athletic since 1914 is .146 by Barry Zito in 2005 (min. 1.0 ip per team game)...has allowed a .174 (8-for-46) average with runners in scoring position and two outs...has walked two batters or fewer in 18 of his 22 starts

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (23 er in 72.2 ip) in 13 games at home compared to 2-7 with a 4.73 ERA (35 er in 66.2 ip) in 13 games on the road...over the last two seasons, he is 10-6 with a 2.76 ERA (43 er in 140.0 ip) in 28 games at home compared to 5-13 with a 4.40 ERA (71 er in 145.1 ip) in 30 contests on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-5 with a 3.97 ERA (31 er in 70.1 ip) in 14 games at night compared to 4-7 with a 3.52 ERA (27 er in 69.0 ip) in 12 games during the day...is tied for the Major League lead in day losses (Lohse, MIL)...the day losses are the most by an A's pitcher since Tom Candiotti had eight in 1998.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 7-12 with a 3.93 ERA (58 er in 132.2 ip) in his 22 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 15-20 with a 94 ERA (117 er in 267.0 ip) in 45 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-9 with a 3.57 ERA (34 er in 85.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 4.60 ERA (24 er in 47.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 17-24 with a 3.65 ERA (139 er in 342.2 ip) in 93 games, including 43 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed six innings and allowed just one hit in his first start, a two-run home run by Calhoun, in a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) **April 23**...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota **May 5**...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits in a 1-0 loss to Detroit **May 26** in Oakland...combined with Clipper on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on **May 31**...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning **June 6** at Boston to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...left his start at Los Angeles (AL) **June 12** with a 4-3 lead but Scribner allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for

the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego **June 17** in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia)...snapped a three-game losing streak in a 14-1 win over Minnesota **July 19** in Oakland...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .306 opponents average during the streak, which spanned three starts from June 28 to July 9.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win over Los Angeles (NL) last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 116 pitches and matched his best with 8.0 innings pitched...yielded just two hits and two walks...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Rollins...the A's scored twice in the sixth for the win.

CHAVEZ vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-4 with a 3.43 ERA (42.0 ip, 42 h, 18 r, 16 er, 13 bb, 37 so, 3 hr) in 14 career appearances, including five starts...is 0-2 with a 2.91 ERA (7 er in 21.2 ip) in nine games, two starts, at Safeco Field and 0-2 with a 3.98 ERA (9 er in 20.1 ip) in five games, three starts, in Oakland...is 0-2 with a 5.27 ERA (13.2 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 8 er, 2 bb, 11 so) in three games, including two starts, this year...pitched in relief April 11 in Oakland (0.2 ip)...entered the game in the top of the 11th inning with the A's trailing 5-4 and retired the only two batters he faced...then took the loss in a 4-3 decision at Seattle May 10...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth...had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth...also lost in a 9-5 decision in Oakland July 3...the A's scored three times in the second inning but he allowed a two-run home run to Morrison in the third...also allowed a two-run home run to Smith in the sixth inning and was relieved by O'Flaherty with one out in the seventh inning and the A's trailing 4-3.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-5, 2.48 ERA): Is 1-3 with a 2.18 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's...the ERA is fifth lowest in the American League over that span...has tossed at least six innings and allowed six hits or fewer in each of his six starts...has walked just eight batters (1.74 per nine innings) and struck out 36 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.50...has received one run of support or fewer in six of his nine starts...his season run support average as a starter is 2.16...has allowed a .188 batting average with runners in scoring position...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss to Tampa Bay last Friday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...it was the fourth time this year he started a game that the A's lost 2-1...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in two career appearances against Seattle, including one start, both this year.

- The A's bullpen has a 6.39 ERA (54 er in 76.0 ip) over its past 24 games (beginning July 29)...is 5-7 with two saves and six blown saves over that span...has a 4.51 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Colorado, 5.00).
