### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-73) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (62-65)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 28, 2015 – CHASE FIELD – 6:40 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (12-5, 2.10) VS. RHP CHASE ANDERSON (6-5, 4.28) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 4-11 (.267) over the last 15 games, 11-21 (.344) over the last 32 and 55-73 (.430) for the season...that is the worst record in the American League and seventh worst in the majors...are a season-high tying 18 games under .500 for the third time this year (last: Aug. 22)...have not been more than 18 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 16 games for the second day in a row...have spent 104 of the last 108 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...this is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in last...it is the second time in the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 21-32 (.397) since then.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 8-6 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-3 vs. San Francisco, 3-1 vs. Los Angeles)... are 4-5 over the last nine games after going 4-1 over their first five...are batting .277 (132-for-477), which is the fourth best interleague average... are averaging 5.00 runs per game (70 runs in 14 games), which is tied for fourth best...after this three-game series, the A's have one remaining interleague series against San Francisco in Oakland (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 188-150 (.556)...have won 22 of their last 28 interleague games at the Coliseum...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers are 2-for-11 (.182) with a run, RBI, seven strikeouts and two sacrifice hits...now have a .082 (28-for-341) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 158 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .090)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .238 (422-for-1776) with 183 runs scored over the last 53 games (3.45 runs per game) dating back to June 26... hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests... for the season, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (852), third in stolen base percentage (69-for-90, 76.7%) and fifth in doubles (228)...have the second fewest home runs (103) and second lowest slugging percentage (.388)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in infield hits (135).

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 14-30 (.318) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the 30 losses are tied with the 1968 club for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for one-run losses is 32 by the 1976 A's...the 44 one-run games are tied for third most in the American League...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...19 of the A's last 30 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 22-46 (.324) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 33-27 (.550) in games decided by three runs or more.

**OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have five walk-off wins in their last 20 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...are tied for the second most extra-inning games (Seattle, 20).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 6.84 ERA (19 er in 25.0 ip) and .308 (32-for-104) opponents batting average over the first three games of the road trip after compiling a 2.74 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five games on the last homestand...have a 3.65 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.375) and fewest extra base hits (325) and fourth in opponents batting average (.242), opponents on-base percentage (.302) and fewest home runs (119).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have a 3.23 ERA, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...in the designated

hitter era, the lowest ERAs by an American League starting pitching staff are 2.98 (Oakland, 1974), 3.08 (New York, 1978) and 3.16 (Oakland and New York, 1981)...are tied for the fewest home runs in the AL (68), rank fourth in innings pitched (771.0) and tied for fifth in complete games (5).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 102 errors, which are the most in the majors...the A's rank second in the majors with 53 unearned runs (San Diego, 62)...Marcus Semien has 32 errors and Brett Lawrie 20, which rank first and tied for second in the American League...the 52 errors are the most by two teammates since Troy Glaus (33) and Adam Kennedy (19) also combined for 52 for the 2000 Angels...the last time two teammates had more than 52 errors was when Mike Caruso (35) and Ray Durham (18) had 53 for the 1998 White Sox.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this six-game road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (three games)...have lost 13 of the last 15 on the road and 16 of the last 20...snapped an eight-game road losing streak Monday night, which matched the longest road losing streak by an A's team over the last 10 years (July 23-Aug. 7, 2008)...went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...are 25-37 (.403) on the road for the season, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...have a 2.95 ERA (199 er in 607.0 ip) at home compared to 4.45 (262 er in 530.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on their last homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...have won 10 of their last 14 home games but are 30-36 (.455) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the AL...the 36 home losses are the most by an A's team over the last four years.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 14-23 (.378) since the All-Star Break, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are batting .241 (303-for-1257) with 134 runs scored (3.62 runs per game)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors (Atlanta, 117), the third fewest home runs (29) and the fourth lowest batting average.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 21-28 (.429) in day games, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 11-24 (.314) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 44-49 (.473) when they start a right-hander...are tied for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies with the bases loaded (14), rank second in plate appearances (126), third in RBI (93) and tied for third in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (16-for-91, .176)... are third in pinch plate appearances (109).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Parker)...Davis and Parker are on the 60-day DL... have used the DL a total of 20 times, which is two more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's trail the all-time series, 13-14...are 7-8 in Oakland and 6-6 in Arizona...the two clubs last met in 2012 when the A's were swept in a three-game series in Arizona...the A's have not won a game at Chase Field since June 17, 2008...went 9-3 against the Diamondbacks from 1998-2001 but are 4-11 since then.

#### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (25) and multiple hit games (37)...leads American League rookies in hits (123) and total bases (162)...**Mark Canha** is batting .353 (24-for-68) with 10 runs, seven doubles, a triple, two home runs, 13 RBI and seven multiple hit games over his past 18 contests...**Brett Lawrie** has a seven-game hitting streak and is batting .481 (13-for-27) with three doubles, two home runs and five RBI over that span.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1974 the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in 2002 the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15 games, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach an American League record 20 before coming to an end.

### **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (12-5, 2.10 ERA)**

**EARNED RUN AVERAGE:** Leads the American League and ranks second in the majors with a 2.10 ERA (Greinke, LAD 1.61)...currently has the lowest ERA by an AL pitcher since Pedro Martinez posted a 1.74 ERA for Boston in 2000...now has a 2.65 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Athletics history among pitchers with 450 or more innings pitched (since 1913, when earned runs became an official stat).

AMONG THE LEADERS: In addition to leading the American League in ERA, he also leads the league in opponents batting average (.200), onbase percentage (.254) and slugging percentage (.287)...is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), tied for third in complete games (3), ranks fifth in innings pitched (175.1), sixth in winning percentage (.706), tied for eighth in wins (12) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (145)...also ranks second in fewest pitches per inning (14.4), tied for second in opponents reaching base on an error (8) and tied for fifth in wild pitches (10).

LAST EIGHT STARTS: Is 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA

(13 er in 60.2 ip) and .188 (40-for-213) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...has three complete games, including two shutouts, over that stretch...has tossed seven or more innings six times and allowed two runs or fewer five times.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 8-2 with a 1.64 ERA (16 er in 88.0 ip) in 13 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA (25 er in 87.1 ip) in 12 starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for second in the American League in road wins...has allowed three home runs in 88.0 innings on the road, 10 in 87.1 innings at home.

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed a career-high three home runs in his last start...has yielded five home runs in his last three starts (22.2 ip) after yielding eight over his first 22 (152.2 ip)...has surrendered 13 home runs in 175.1 innings for the season and his average of 0.67 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Has set an Oakland single-season record for putouts by a pitcher with 30...broke the previous mark of 28 set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...has the most putout by an A's pitcher since Eddie Plank had 33 in 1907...the record is 35 by Chick Fraser in 1901...leads Major League pitchers in putouts...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances (51) and tied for eighth in assists (21).

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 1.82 ERA (6 er in 29.2 ip) in four starts in August...is scheduled to make his final start in August tonight and is attempting to post an ERA under 2.00 in a month for the third time this year... went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May...also had a sub-2.00 ERA in July, 2014 (1.03)...finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Was the winning pitcher in his only interleague appearance this year, a three-hit shutout at Los Angeles July 28...is now 2-1 with a 3.31 ERA (13 er in 35.1 ip) in six career interleague appearances, including five starts.

**WITH THE BAT:** Is 1-for-3 (.333) with two strikeouts...singled off Pedro Baez July 28 at Los Angeles for his first Major League hit...is now 1-for-5 (.200) with three strikeouts and two sacrifice hits in seven career plate appearances...never batted as a minor leaguer.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-2 with a 1.81 ERA (23 er in 114.2 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest compared to 4-3 with a 2.67 ERA (18 er in 60.2 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more... his ERA on four days rest is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed 23 of his 28 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .214 (45-for-210) with two doubles and three home runs (.267 slugging percentage) with runners on base... the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the batting average is tied for sixth...also ranks third among AL qualifiers with a .184 (63-for-342) batting average against left-handed hitters and fourth with a .138 (44-for-319) average with two strikes...opponents are batting .185 (31-for-168) with a

.230 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are third lowest in the AL.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 5-1 with a 0.97 ERA (6 er in 55.2 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 7-4 with a 2.63 ERA (35 er in 119.2 ip) in 17 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League and is tied for fourth in day wins.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-2 with a 2.26 ERA (13 er in 51.2 ip) in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...his ERA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchscherer's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 11-12 with a 2.96 ERA (68 er in 207.0 ip) in 32 games after the break.

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in five of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22, Aug. 22)...has tossed at least seven innings in 15 of his 25 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 17 times, one earned run or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times...the A's are 15-10 (.600) in his starting assignments and are 39-29 (.574) when he starts in his career...is 27-1 in 39 career starts with three runs of support or more...tossed a two-hit shutout July 12 at Cleveland and a three-hit shutout three starts later July 28 at Los Angeles (NL)...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts in a month since Barry Zito had two in August, 2001...the four career shutouts are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 12 years... has allowed three hits or fewer in three of the shutouts.

**ALL-STAR:** Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Tampa Bay last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a career-high three home runs, all solo shots...yielded a second inning home run to Forsythe but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the second...Jaso homered in the third but the A's scored three times in the sixth to take a 4-2 lead...surrendered a home run to Cabrera in the seventh and left after eight innings with a 4-3 lead... Venditte put two runners on base in the ninth and Pomeranz allowed both to score for the blown save.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Felix Doubront (1-1, 3.70 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and seventh start of the season...it will be his fifth appearance and third start with the A's...is 1-1 with a 3.49 ERA (11 er in 28.1 ip) and .301 (34-for-113) opponents batting average in his six starts compared to 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .255 (13-for-51) opponents average in three relief appearances...he had a no decision in the A's 11-5 win over the Mariners on Monday in Seattle...left the game after two innings with a right foot contusion and the scored tied 0-0...is 0-1 with a 2.70 ERA in two interleague games, both starts, this year (10.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 3 er, 8 bb, 11 so)...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (7.0 ip, 5 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 5 so) in one career appearance against Arizona, a start and 4-0 Red Sox win in Boston on Aug. 4, 2013.

#### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

15-25, 4.52 ERA (184 er in 366.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 21-for-41 (51.2%)

- The A's bullpen has an 8.07 ERA (29 er in 32.1 ip) over its past 10 games, a 6.29 ERA (58 er in 83.0 ip) over its past 26 games and 4.52 ERA for the season...that is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Colorado, 4.91).
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and is tied for the third fewest wins (15)...has yielded the third most doubles (77), fourth most home runs (51) and tossed the fourth fewest innings (366.0).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (21), the lowest save percentage (51.2%) and the second most blown saves (20).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (52) and the second most first batter home runs (15)...has the second highest opponents average against first batters faced in the AL (.260).
- The A's are 9-42 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 42-30 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has vielded four runs in his past six games (4.0 ip. 9.00 ERA)...did not allow an earned run in his previous 13 games and 12.2 innings.
- Has a 2.10 ERA (6 er in 25.2 ip) over his past 29 games (beginning May 22)...posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Has allowed a .193 (11-for-57) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .275 (21-for-78) with 12 of his 17 extra base hits (.613 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a 1.29 ERA (3 er in 21.0 ip) in 27 games at home compared to 6.89 (12 er in 15.2 ip) in 22 contests on the road.
- Has allowed the most first batter home runs in the majors (5) and is tied for the most first batter RBI (13).
- Has faced the Diamondbacks five times in his career (4.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 4.50 ERA).
