OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-74) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (63-65)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost three straight and 12 of the last 16 games to fall to a season-high 19 games under .500 at 55-74 (.426), which is the worst record in the American League and seventh worst in the majors...have not been more than 19 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 16 games for the third day in a row...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2011 season 22 games out...have spent 105 of the last 109 days in sole possession of last in the West (dating back to May 8)...this is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in last...it is the second time in the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 21-33 (.389) in 54 games since then.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 8-7 in interleague play (3-1 vs. San Diego, 2-1 vs. Colorado, 0-3 vs. San Francisco, 3-1 vs. Los Angeles, 0-1 vs. Arizona)...are 4-6 over the last 10 games after going 4-1 over their first five...are averaging 4.93 runs per game (74 runs in 15 games), which is fifth best in interleague play...are batting .274 (140-for-511), which is sixth best...have the ninth best ERA (47 er in 131.0 ip, 3.23 ERA)...after this three-game series, the A's have one remaining interleague series against San Francisco in Oakland (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 188-151 (.555)...have won 22 of their last 28 interleague games at the Coliseum...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2-for-14 (.143) with a run, RBI, nine strikeouts and two sacrifice hits...now have a .081 (28-for-344) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 160 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .089)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .238 (430-for-1810) with 187 runs scored over the last 54 games (3.46 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (857) and third in most doubles (231) and stolen base percentage (69-for-90, 76.7%)...are tied for the second fewest home runs (104) and have the third lowest slugging percentage (.388)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in infield hits (135).

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 14-30 (.318) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the 30 losses are tied with the 1968 club for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for one-run losses is 32 by the 1976 A's...the 44 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 in 1980...20 of the A's last 31 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 22-47 (.319) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 33-27 (.550) in games decided by three runs or more.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have five walk-off wins in their last 20 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...are tied for the second most extra-inning games (Seattle, 20).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.27 ERA (23 er in 33.0 ip) and .296 (40-for-135) opponents batting average over the first four games of the road trip after compiling a 2.74 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five games on the last homestand...have a 3.66 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.376) and fewest extra base hits (330) and fourth in opponents batting average (.242), opponents on-base percentage (.302) and fewest home runs (120).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have a 3.23 ERA, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time

A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (68), rank fourth in innings pitched (777.1) and tied for fifth in complete games (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 103 errors, which are the most in the majors...rank second in the majors with 55 unearned runs (San Diego, 62)...Marcus Semien has 32 errors and Brett Lawrie 21, which rank first and second in the American League...the 53 errors are the most by two teammates since 1998 when Mike Caruso (35) and Ray Durham (18), as well as Russ Davis (34) and Joey Cora (19), also combined for 53 for the White Sox and Mariners, respectively...the last time two teammates had more than 53 errors was 1996 when Jose Valentin (37) and Jeff Cirillo (18) had 55 for the Brewers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (0-1)...have lost 14 of the last 16 on the road and 17 of the last 21...snapped an eight-game road losing streak Monday night, which matched the longest road losing streak by an A's team over the last 10 years (July 23-Aug. 7, 2008)...went 0-7 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3) and Baltimore (0-4)...are 25-38 (.397) on the road for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...have a 2.95 ERA (199 er in 607.0 ip) at home compared to 4.45 (266 er in 538.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on their last homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...have won 10 of their last 14 home games but are 30-36 (.455) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the AL...the 36 home losses are the most by an A's team over the last four years.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 14-24 (.368) since the All-Star Break, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are batting .241 (311-for-1291) with 138 runs scored (3.63 runs per game)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors (Atlanta, 121), the third fewest home runs (30) and the fourth lowest batting average.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 21-28 (.429) in day games, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 11-24 (.314) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 44-50 (.468) when they start a right-hander...rank second in the majors in sacrifice flies with the bases loaded (14), third in RBI (93) and plate appearances (127) and tied for third in grand slams (5)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) but have the fourth lowest batting average (17-for-92, .185)...are third in pinch plate appearances (110).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Parker)...Davis and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL a total of 20 times, which is two more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's trail the all-time series, 13-15...are 7-8 in Oakland and 6-7 in Arizona...the two clubs last met in 2012 when the A's were swept in a three-game series in Arizona...the A's have not won a game at Chase Field since June 17, 2008...went 9-3 against the Diamondbacks from 1998-2001 but are 4-12 since then.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (25) and multiple hit games (37)...leads American League rookies in hits (124) and total bases (163)...**Mark Canha** is batting .347 (25-for-72) with 10 runs, eight doubles, one triple, two home runs (.569 slugging percentage), 14 RBI and seven multiple hit games over his past 18 contests (beginning Aug. 5)...leads AL rookies in RBI (49)...**Brett Lawrie** has homered in back-to-back games for the seventh time in his career (last: May 28-29, 2015)...extended his hitting streak to eight games last night and is batting .452 (14-for-31) with three doubles, three home runs and seven RBI over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1989** the A's score 10 times in the fifth inning of a 19-5 win at New York...Jose Canseco has two hits in the inning, including a three run homer, and is 4 for 5 with four runs, a pair of homers and five RBI in the game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (1-1, 6.20 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last night for his second stint with the A's this year...was 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA (11 er in 16.0 ip) and .258 (16-for-62) opponents batting average in four games, three starts, during his first stint with the A's...was optioned to Nashville Aug. 15 and was 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .209 opponents batting average in two starts with the Sounds...was acquired from the Kansas City Royals with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland Aug. 1...was 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha.

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a walk-off home run in relief to Machado in the 13th inning of his last game Aug. 14 at Baltimore...allowed eight runs in 1.2 innings in his last start Aug. 12 at Toronto (43.20 ERA, .600 opponents batting average) after allowing two runs in 14.0 innings over his first two starts (1.26 ERA, .176 opponents batting average)...is now 0-2 with a 57.86 ERA (15 er in 2.1 ip) in two career starts against Toronto compared to 1-0 with a 5.23 ERA (12 er in 20.2 ip) in six games against everyone else...tossed at least seven innings and allowed one run in each of his first two starts with the A's...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least seven innings while allowing one run or fewer in each of his first two games with the A's...joins Ron Darling (1991), Kevin Appier (1999) and Rich Harden (2003).

WITH KANSAS CITY: Was recalled for the first time April 26 as the 26th man but did not pitch...recalled for his second stint May 12 and made one appearance on May 15 against New York, retiring the side in order in the ninth inning of the Royals 12-1 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...was optioned following the game...recalled for a third time June 20 and pitched the next day against Boston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was optioned back to Omaha the next day...was recalled July 7 as the 26th man and stayed one more day without pitching before he was optioned to Omaha for the final time July 8.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first start with the A's, a 5-1 victory over Cleveland Aug. 1 in Oakland...retired 13 of the first 14 batters he faced, allowing just a two-out single to Brantley in the first inning...then allowed his only home run on a one-out solo home run by Chisenhall in the fifth...that was the only run he would allow in 7.1 innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss to Houston Aug. 6 in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Lowrie in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired 11 straight at one point and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 2-1...Rodriguez allowed a two-run home run to Correa for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Toronto Aug. 12...allowed a career-high eight runs in 1.2 innings...yielded a three-run home run to Colabello in the first but the A's came back with two runs in the second inning...was charged with five of the Blue Jays seven runs in the bottom of the second...allowed a two-run single to Donaldson and a RBI single to Colabello and was relieved by Doubront with runners on first and third and one out...Doubront allowed both runners to score plus two of his own.

LAST GAME: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss at Baltimore Aug. 14...entered the game in the bottom of the 13th with one out and Joseph on second...allowed a walk-off home run to the first batter he faced (Machado).

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Nashville following his Aug. 15 option...held opponents to a .209 batting average, including .188 against left-handers...did not walk a batter and recorded 11 strikeouts in 12.0 innings.

WITH OMAHA: Went 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...struck out 92 batters and ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts at the time of the trade on July 28...was also tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...walked just 21 batters for an average of 1.77 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .282 opponents batting average, including .259 (51-for-197) against left-handed hitters compared to .303 (67-for-221) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his nine home runs to righties...six were solo shots...yielded five home runs in his first four starts and 20.1 innings, four home runs over his final 14 games and 86.1 innings.

CAREER: Was drafted by Kansas City in the ninth round of the 2011 draft...is 42-32 with 4.21 ERA in 111 career minor league appearances, including 106 starts, over five professional seasons...made his Major League debut with two stints with the Royals in 2014...compiled a 43.88 ERA in two games, including one start...is now 1-2 with a 10.57 ERA (27 er in 23.0 ip) in eight career appearances, including four starts...was named Pitcher of the Year at Triple-A Omaha in 2014 and also earned Pacific Coast League Postseason MVP honors after tossing a two-hit shutout to clinch the PCL title...earned Northwest Arkansas Pitcher of the Year honors in 2013 and was a Pioneer League All-Star in 2011.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Chavez (7-13, 4.00 ERA): Is 3-7 with a 5.52 ERA (37 er in 60.1 ip) and 11 home runs in 60.1 innings (1.64 hr per nine innings) over his last 11 starts dating back to June 28...has career highs in games started (23), losses (13), hits (144), runs (67) and earned runs (64)...his seven wins are one short of his high of eight from last year...needs 2.0 innings pitched to match his career high of 146.0 from 2014...his 13 losses are tied for the most in the American League (Kluber, CLE)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss to the Mariners on Tuesday in Seattle (4.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 2-1 with a 3.91 ERA (10 er in 23.0 ip) in four interleague games this year, all starts...is 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (6 er in 6.0 ip) in four career appearances against Arizona, all in relief...has not faced the Diamondbacks since May 15, 2010.

- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and is tied for the third fewest wins (15)...has yielded the third most doubles (78), is tied for the third most home runs (52) and has tossed the fourth fewest innings (367.2).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (21), the lowest save percentage (51.2%) and the second most blown saves (20).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (52) and the second most first batter home runs (15)...has the second highest opponents average against first batters faced in the AL (.261).
- The A's are 9-43 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 42-30 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).
