OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-74) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (65-65)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing three in a row...are 6-5 over the last 11 games but are 6-12 over the last 18 contests...are 57-74 (.431) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and seventh worst in the majors...it is fifth worst in Oakland history after 131 games and is the worst since 1997 (52-79)...the 74 losses match the A's season total from last year...have not lost more than 74 games since going 74-88 in 2011...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 39 consecutive days and 107 of the last 111 (dating back to May 8)...the 107 days alone in last are fifth most in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 23-33 (.411) since then.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 12-15 (.444) in the month of August and will finish with a losing record in the month for the second consecutive season (12-17 in 2014) and sixth time in the last eight years...rank second in the American League with 59 doubles...the Oakland record for doubles in August is 63 in 2007...the pitching staff has allowed 37 home runs, which is tied with Detroit for the most in the AL...the home runs match the most allowed in any month by an A's team over the last 17 years (May, 2002; July, 2004)...have not allowed more than 37 home runs in a month since August of 1998 (40)...rank eighth in the AL in ERA with a 4.28 ERA (116 er in 244.0 ip) and ninth with a .258 (242-for-937) batting average.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.09 ERA (86 er in 152.0 ip) and .271 (162-for-597) opponents batting average over the last 17 games...have allowed 28 home runs over that stretch (1.66 per nine innings)...now have a 3.62 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.375) and fewest extra base hits (332), third in fewest home runs (121) and fourth in opponents batting average (.242) and opponents on-base percentage (.302).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-9 with a 4.24 ERA (49 er in 104.0 ip) over the last 19 games (dating back to Aug. 9)...the only win by an A's starter over that stretch was by Jesse Chavez on Aug. 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...starters have a 3.22 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (69) and rank fourth in innings pitched (788.1).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .291 (76-for-261) with 40 runs scored over the last seven games (5.71 runs per game)...however, are hitting .241 (456-for-1894) with 197 runs scored over the last 56 games (3.52 runs per game) dating back to June 26...hit .261 and averaged 4.55 runs per game over their first 75 contests...for the season, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (872), third in doubles (234) and fourth in triples (32) and stolen base percentage (69-for-91, 75.8%)...have the third lowest slugging percentage (.389) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (106)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which is the fewest in the majors...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007...have been hit by a pitch 28 times, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in infield hits (136)...rank third in the AL in grand slams (5), RBI (95) and plate appearances (129) with the bases loaded...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) and rank second in plate appearances (115).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 104 errors, which are the most in the majors...rank second in the majors with 57 unearned runs (San Diego, 62)...Marcus Semien has 32 errors and Brett Lawrie 21, which rank first and second in the American League...the 53 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1998 when Mike Caruso (35) and Ray Durham (18), as well as Russ Davis (34) and Joey Cora (19), also combined for 53 for the White Sox and Mariners, respectively...the last time two teammates had more than 53 errors was 1996 when Jose Valentin (37) and Jeff Cirillo (18) had 55 for the Brewers.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-30 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently the worst mark in Oakland history (.381 in 1980)...it is tied for third

worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...the 30 losses are the most in the majors and tied with the 1968 A's for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for one-run losses in a season is 32 by the 1976 A's...the 45 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...are 23-47 (.329) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 8) and the last at bat losses are tied for fourth...are 6-9 (.400) in extra inning games and the 15 extra inning games are tied with Chicago for second most in the AL (Seattle, 21)...have five walk-off wins in their last 21 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a nine-game homestand tonight against Los Angeles-AL (three games), Seattle (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) and have won 10 of the last 14 home games...however, are 30-36 (.455) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Seattle, 29-36)...the 36 home losses are the most by an A's team over the last four years...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1)...have lost 11 of the last 14 road games and 17 of the last 23...are 27-38 (.415) on the road for the season, which is tied for third worst in the AL...have a 2.95 ERA (199 er in 607.0 ip) at home compared to 4.35 (270 er in 558.0 ip) on the road...have not posted an ERA under 3.00 at home since 1990 (2.56).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 11-24 (.314) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-23)...are 16-24 (.400) since the All-Star Break, which is the second worst record in the American League (Detroit, 16-26)...are 22-28 (.440) in day games, which is the fourth worst record in the AL.

DIVISIONAL PLAY: Each of the A's next four series are against American League West competition and the A's will play 24 of their final 31 games against division foes...are 25-27 (.481) against the West, which is their best mark against an AL division...are 12-17 (.414) against the Central and went 10-23 (.303) against the East, which was the A's worst mark ever against the East...are 10-7 (.588) against the National League West.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Parker)...Davis and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL a total of 20 times, which is two more than the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series, 6-7...are 3-3 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have won three of the previous four season series and are 47-42 against the Angels over the last five years...including 38-8 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of their last 34 losses, including 12 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 412-338 against the Angels...that includes 214-159 in Oakland and 198-179 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 461-415 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (25) and multiple hit games (38)...leads American League rookies in hits (127) and total bases (166)...**Mark Canha** is batting .308 (28-for-91) with 10 doubles and 17 RBI in 24 games in August...the doubles are tied for second most in the AL in August...had just nine doubles in 71 games over the first four months...**Danny Valencia** has not committed an error in 27 games at third base this year and has a 54-game errorless streak as a third baseman...**Stephen Vogt** has homered in back-to-back games for the second time in his career (May 3-4, 2015) and has back-to-back three-hit games for the second time (June 24-25, 2015).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1996** Willie Adams tosses the A's third consecutive shutout, a 8-0 whitewashing of the Red Sox...it follows a combined shutout by Dave Telgheder and Buddy Groom against Boston and a Don Wengert blanking of the Orioles...in **1998** Rickey Henderson scores on a Jason Giambi fifth inning sacrifice fly in a game at Cleveland to become the sixth player in major league history to score 2000 runs in his career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Felix Doubront (1-1, 3.70 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and seventh start of the season...it will be his fifth appearance and third start with the A's...was released by Chicago (NL) March 28 and signed a minor league contract with Toronto April 2...began the season on the disabled list at Triple-A Buffalo with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13 and went 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA in nine starts with the Bisons before he was selected by the Blue Jays July 3...was 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29...was traded to Oakland July 31 for cash considerations and is 0-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) in four games, including two starts, with the A's.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-1 with a 3.49 ERA (11 er in 28.1 ip) and .301 (34-for-113) opponents batting average in his five starts compared to 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .255 (13-for-51) opponents average in three relief appearances...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 1-for-3 in his relief appearances...is now 28-24 with a 4.39 ERA (210 er in 431.0 ip) in 79 career starts, 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA (40 er in 48.2 ip) in 32 relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 13 of his 14 extra base hits to righties...lefties are slugging .289 (1 double) compared to .429 by righties...has allowed a .350 (14-for-40) average with runners in scoring position...opponents are batting .360 (27-for-75) with both of his home runs allowed the first time through the lineup, .225 (20-for-89) after that.

WITH TORONTO: Made his Blue Jays debut in relief on **July 3** at Detroit, allowing one run in 2.1 innings in relief of Drew Hutchison...picked up his first and only win of the season in his first start, a 2-1 Toronto win at Chicago (AL) **July 7**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a Sanchez RBI single...shutout the White Sox on three hits over his final 4.2 innings...had a no decision in an 11-10 loss at Kansas City **July 12**...yielded a career-high tying seven runs, including six runs in the first inning and another in the fifth...the Blue Jays then scored eight times in the sixth inning and he was relieved by Delabar to start the sixth with an 8-7 lead...Delabar allowed three runs for the blown save...had a no decision in a 4-3, 10-inning loss at Oakland **July 22**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Phegley RBI single in the fourth...then allowed a Vogt RBI single and a Smolinski sacrifice fly in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 3-1...was the losing pitcher in Toronto's 3-2 loss to Philadelphia on **July 28**...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Asche and a RBI double by Blanco.

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed 4.1 innings of relief **Aug. 3** against Baltimore in his Oakland debut, which was an A's season-high for a reliever at the time...enter the game in the fourth inning in relief of Jesse Chavez...allowed RBI doubles to Paredes and Joseph in the fifth inning and a RBI single to Machado in the eighth...then tossed 6.1 innings of relief at Toronto **Aug. 12**...it was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 on May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota) and the longest by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.1 innings July 7, 2007 vs. Seattle...did not strike out a batter and his 6.1 innings pitched were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL)...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) **Aug. 18** in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit but issued a career-high tying six walks...yielded his only hit in the second inning, a leadoff single by Gonzalez...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...walked Ellis and Pederson to start the inning...Ellis went to third on a passed ball and scored on a Hernandez ground out...left after six innings with the score tied 1-1.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-5 win over the Mariners a week ago today in Seattle...left the game after two innings with a right foot contusion and the score tied 0-0...the start was the shortest of his career...Scribner yielded five runs in the third but the A's scored seven runs in the fifth, one in the seventh and three in the ninth for the win.

1-1 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts...pitched in relief in 2010 and made two starts in 2013...picked up the win in his last start, a 6-2 Boston win at Anaheim on July 5, 2013...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a double play in the third...then allowed the game-tying lead-off home run to Kendrick in the fourth...the Red Sox scored four times over the final three innings to get him the win.

WITH BUFFALO: Was 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in nine games, all starts, with Triple-A Buffalo...signed a minor league deal with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the Triple-A DL with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13...surrendered just one home run in 48.0 innings...allowed a .197 (24-for-122) batting average and his lone home run against right-handed hitters compared to .222 (12-for-54) against left-handers...opponents hit .178 with runners in scoring position and .190 when leading off an inning...went 1-2 with a 1.69 ERA in six starts on the road, 0-1 with a 3.94 ERA in three starts at home...did not allow a run in the fourth (8.0 ip), fifth (6.0 ip) or seventh (3.0 ip) innings...the Bisons were 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed five innings or fewer in five of his nine starts.

BUFFALO HIGHLIGHTS: Did not allow an earned run over his first three starts (15.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 10 so) and went 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA in four starts in May...lost three consecutive starts from June 5 to 15 (6.00 ERA)...struck out a season-high eight batters in 5.0 innings June 5 at Louisville...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings June 10 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...then tossed a season-low 3.0 innings in his next start at Lehigh Valley on June 15...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts June 20 at Syracuse...picked up his lone win of the season in his final start July 28 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre when he tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...issued a season-high four walks.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-6, 2.82 ERA): Is 1-4 with a 2.76 ERA (14 er in 45.2 ip) and .226 (37-for-164) opponents batting average in seven starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 25 for his fourth stint with the A's...the ERA is seventh lowest in the American League over that span...has received one run of support or fewer in seven of his 10 starts...his season run support average as a starter is 2.15...has 25 runs of support in 15 career starting assignments (2.46 RSA)...is 1-4 with a 1.83 ERA in eight games at home compared to 0-2 with a 4.34 ERA in seven games on the road...has walked 14 batters in 62.2 innings as a starter after issuing nine walks in 10.2 innings of relief...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 A's loss at Seattle last Wednesday (4.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Los Angeles and it came in relief earlier this year on April 29 in Oakland (2.0 ip, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen has a 6.70 ERA (32 er in 43.0 ip) over its past 13 games and 5.86 ERA (61 er in 93.2 ip) over its past 29 contests...has a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is the third highest in the American League.
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and the fifth fewest wins (17)...has yielded the third most doubles (78), is tied for the third most home runs (52) and has tossed the fifth fewest innings (376.2).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (22), the lowest save percentage (51.2%) and is tied for the most blown saves (21).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (52) and the second most first batter home runs (15)...has the second highest opponents average against first batters faced in the AL (.259).
- The A's are 9-43 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 44-30 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has yielded four runs in his past six games (4.0 ip, 9.00 ERA)...did not allow an earned run in his previous 13 games and 12.2 innings.
- Has a 2.10 ERA (6 er in 25.2 ip) over his past 29 games (beginning May 22)...posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Has allowed a .193 (11-for-57) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .275 (21-for-78) with 12 of his 17 extra base hits (.613 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a 1.29 ERA (3 er in 21.0 ip) in 27 games at home compared to 6.89 (12 er in 15.2 ip) in 22 contests on the road.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs (5) in the majors and tied for second in first batter RBI (13).
