LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the seventh contest of a nine-game (2-4) road trip to Detroit (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) & Oakland (Aug. 31-Sept. 2)...**With Sunday's loss, the Halos have been swept five times in last 10 series...**Angels are at .500 mark for first time since June 26th (37-37) – 19th time reaching the .500 mark in 2015...**LAA is 2-8 in last 10 affairs and 11-25 over last 36 games (17-3 in previous 20)**...Angels are 17-25 since ASB and 10-18 this month (marks first sub-.500 month since July of 2013; snaps streak of 12 consecutive .500+ months)...LAA's 18 losses are most in August since 1999 (8-21).

KNOW THIS: Mike Trout is a double shy of joining Frank Robinson as only MLB players with four 25 2B/25 HR seasons before their age-24 campaign...Would also join Tim Salmon (6 seasons), Vladimir Guerrero (5), Garret Anderson (4) and Jim Edmonds (4) as the only players in franchise history to accomplish the feat at least four times.

FROM STATS LLC: Trout tallied his 60th extra-base hit yesterday (& 61st) - fifth player in MLB history with at least 60 extra-base hits and 10 stolen bases in each of his first four full seasons in his career.

KNOW THIS: Mike Scioscia is four wins shy of becoming one of 27 managers all-time to reach 1,400 wins...Scioscia would be just the 10th manager to reach the mark with one team...**He and Terry Francona are two of only four current managers in MLB with 1000+ wins (Bochy, Showalter).**

CLOSE TO RETURN: Four Angels are currently on minor league rehab assignments: Freese (finger; Salt Lake), Collin Cowgill (rt. wrist; Salt Lake), Matt Joyce (concussion; Salt Lake) and Taylor Featherston (upper back; Arkansas).

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout leads MLB with a 7.1 Offensive WAR...He ranks 3rd in A.L. a .978 OPS and 4th with a .581 SLG pct...**Trout has led A.L. in runs each of last three seasons – no player has ever led either league in runs four consecutive seasons...**His 434 runs since 2012 lead MLB (**I. Kinsler** is 2nd with 374)...**Trout is on pace for a career-best 41 HRs** - have been just two 40+ HR campaigns in Club history (**Troy Glaus** in 2000, 47; & 2001; 41).

REVERSE ON THE ROAD: Angels are 3-16 in last 19 road affairs...**Halos have been swept four times in last six road series...**LAA scoring 2.6 runs per away game since the All-Star break (49 runs in 19 games).

MANAGER MINUTE: Since Scioscia took over as manager in 2000, the Halos rank third in MLB in wins (1,396) behind Yankees & Cardinals...Scioscia is the 11th individual to manage one franchise for 2500+ games...Scioscia's 1,396 wins rank 28th all-time...**Wilbert Robertson** is 27th (1,399).

Cron is batting .347 (26/75) with four doubles, four home runs and nine RBI over his last 22 games...**Erick Aybar** is batting .305 (67/220) since June 19 (60 games) after hitting .246 through his first 64 games...**David Murphy** has 18 hits in last 59 at-bats (.305) after going 4-for-23 (.174) to open his Angels career...**David DeJesus** sits on 99 career home runs...**Angels have won 52 of 72 games (72%) when receiving a quality start...**Calhoun has set a career-high of 20 home runs and 67 RBI...Angels are 58-18 in last 76 games when **Calhoun** scores a run...**Trout's** current 21-game homerless stretch is longest of career.

IN CLOSING: Last Tuesday, Huston Street recorded his 30th save in a season for the fifth time in his career (third straight campaign)...**31 saves this season rank 2nd in A.L...**The veteran earned his 300th save July 22nd, 27th player all-time to reach the mark, second youngest pitcher to accomplish the feat (**Francisco Rodriguez**; 31 years, 166 days)...**Since 2011, he leads MLB converting 92% of save chances (157/171) – min. 175 G.**

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP HECTOR SANTIAGO

7-8, 3.13 ERA

In seven career starts vs. Oakland, is 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (41.1 IP – 6 ER)

- Making 27th appearance (26th start) of the season...13th road game (12th start) in 2015...Is in fifth Major League season and second with the Angels.
- **ALL-STAR:** Was named to 2015 American League All-Star team...First All-Star selection of career...Finished the first half with a 6-4 record and his 2.33 ERA (108.1 IP – 28 ER) ranked third in the league at the Break...Did not pitch in All-Star Game.
- **STREAKING WEST:** Has gone unbeaten in each of last 11 starts against A.L. West opponents...Only **David Price** (15 starts) has a longer active streak against his own division.
- **SOLID SANTIAGO:** From July 10, 2014-July 20, 2015, went 13-6 with a 2.61 ERA (182.2 IP – 53 ER) in 35 games (31 starts) for the Angels, after going 0-7 with a 4.50 ERA (58 IP – 29 ER) in 14 games (11 starts) to start his Angels tenure.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with the loss in last start Wednesday at Detroit after tossing 4.1 innings and allowing five earned runs on seven hits with three walks and three strikeouts...Three home runs allowed set a career-high and five runs allowed matched his season-high.
- **LIMIT OF ONE:** Yielded one-or-fewer earned runs in 12 of last 24 starts...Ranks tied for fifth in American League with 12 starts of one-or-fewer earned runs allowed this season...**Streak of five consecutive starts (June 22-July 20) allowing one-or-fewer runs is tied for second longest streak in Angels history (Dean Chance – 7 games in 1964, has record).**
- **LEAGUE LEADER:** Ranks sixth in the American League with a 3.13 ERA (149.2 IP – 52 ER) this season...Is eighth in the league with a .227 (129/569) batting average against...**Is seventh in the A.L. with a 3.18 ERA (107.2 IP – 38 ER) in night games...**Ranks sixth with a 2.71 (79.2 IP – 24 ER) home ERA.
- **RISP SUCCESS:** **Has held opponents to a .176 (19/108) batting average against with runners in scoring position.**
- **NO-DECISIONS:** Since the start of 2014, leads the Majors with 13 no-decisions in starts when allowing one-or-fewer earned runs...His five no-decisions in starts with one-or-fewer earned runs this season are tied for second most in the American League.
- **SUPPORT ME:** Halos have scored four-or-fewer runs in each of his last six starts...Scored at least six runs in each of previous four starts...The club scored four-or-fewer runs in 10 of his 12 starts prior to that run...Angels scored a total of three-or-fewer runs in 16 of his 24 starts last season.
- **KEEPING LEFTIES IN THE PARK:** Since joining Angels in 2014, Santiago has allowed just three home runs to left-handed batters across 304 batters faced in that span...Average of one HR allowed to lefties per every 101.33 batters faced is fourth best rate in the Majors.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In nine career games (seven starts) against Oakland, is 3-2 with a 2.08 ERA (43.1 IP – 10 ER) and 41 strikeouts...In two starts against the A's this season is 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA (11.2 IP – 3 ER)...**Since joining Angels last season, is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (35 IP – 5 ER) and 33 strikeouts in six games (all starts) vs. A's...**As a starter, is 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (41.1 IP – 6 ER) for his career against Oakland.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** In four career games (two starts) in Oakland, is 1-2 with a 3.65 ERA (12.1 IP – 5 ER)...Earned the win in last start at the Coliseum on September 24, 2014 after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings...As a starter, has allowed one earned run in 10.1 innings pitched in Oakland.
- **RELIEF OUTING:** Made first relief appearance of the season on June 6 at Yankee Stadium...Tossed 3.2 scoreless innings allowing just two hits with no walks and three strikeouts...Marked longest relief appearance of the season by any Angels pitcher...Has now tossed 13.1 scoreless frames across seven career relief outings with the Angels.
- **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:** Throughout the season, Santiago has hosted numerous 'Santiago's Soldier's' events...He has twice made visits to children at the Children's Hospital of Orange County...On May 28, he visited students at Cambridge Elementary School in Orange as part of the Angels **Adopt-A-School** program...On May 9, he appeared at **Fiesta Angels** and signed autographs for fans at the event...On April 11, he attended the Angels fifth annual **5K and Fun Run**, posing for photos with fans, signing autographs and helping to distribute medals to the race finishers.
