Made his Major League debut Sept. 4, 2003 as a defensive replacement at **Texas**...Tripled for his first MLB hit off **Bartolo Colon** at **Chicago** (A.L.)

2014

Spent his first full season with the **Rays**, but was limited to 83 games...Spent 64 games on the DL with a left hand fracture (6/19-8/31).

Prior to his DL stint, hit .269 (49/1820) with five home runs in 62 games...In 21 games after his return, hit .179 (10/56) with one homer.

2013

Traded twice in a span of four days, from the **Cubs** to the **Nationals** on Aug. 19, then to the **Rays** on Aug. 23.

Made his first career trip to the postseason as a member of the **Rays**...At the time, ranked fifth among active players in career games played (1,277) without playing in a postseason game.

Signed a two-year deal with Tampa Bay following the season (Nov. 6, 2013).

2012

Led the **Cubs** with a .350 OBP, including a .358 OBP while hitting leadoff (114 games)...Ranked third in OBP among NL leadoff hitters (min. 200 PA)...Drew 61 walks, his most since 2007 (67).

Hit a pinch-hit grand slam off **Kameron Loe** on May 11 at **Milwaukee**, his first career pinch-hit home run and second career grand slam.

2011

Spent the 2011 season with **Oakland** after he was acquired by trade the previous November from the **Royals**...Hit .270(48/178) after the All-Star break, 50 points higher than his .220 mark (58/264) in the first half.

After no multi-homer games in his first eight seasons, had three in 2011: May 3 vs. CLE, May 24 at LAA and Aug 6 at TB.

Collected his 1,000th career hit May 14 vs. **White Sox**, a two-run triple.

2010

Hit a career-high .319 (112/352) in his last season with the **Royals**...Season was cut short due to right thumb surgery.

Reached the All-star break with a .326 average and 107 hits, sixth-most in the A.L.

2009

Slugged a career-high 13 home runs and tallied nine triples, tied for third in the A.L.

Hit .316 in July, .324 in August and .320 in September...His 17-game hitting streak from Aug. 30-Sept. 18 was his longest ever within a season and two shy of his career high (2004-05).

2008

Led the Majors with a .419 (44/105) average with RISP, second-highest mark in Royals history (George Brett, .469 in 1980)...

Hit .359 with runners on base, second in the A.L. and fourth in MLB.

Made his Major League debut as a defensive replacement Sept. 2 at **Texas**.
Recorded his first Major League hit Sept. 27 vs. CWS, a triple off **Bartolo Colon**.

Made his Major League debut Sept. 2, 2006 vs. **Toronto** and singled in his first at-bat off **A.J. Burnett**.

2014

Spent his first season with the **Indians**, hitting .262 (109/416) with 25 doubles, eight home runs and 58 RBI in 129 games...Hit .326 (56/172) with RISP, good for 10th in the A.L.

2013

Finished third on the **Rangers** in doubles (26), tied for fourth in game-winning RBI (7), and placed fifth in games (142).

2012

Established career highs in nearly every offensive category...Was one of only eight players in the Majors with minimums of a .300 average, .380 OBP and .475 SLG, and one of just four in the A.L. (**Mike Trout**, **Miguel Cabrera**, **Prince Fielder**).

2011

Did not see steady playing time until August 22...Batted .358 (43/120) over that span, good for seventh-highest in the A.L. in that period.

Hit his first career grand slam August 26 vs. **Angels**.

Posted his third-straight season of 20+ doubles, 10+ homers and 55+ RBI, joining **Michael Young** as the only **Rangers** to do it each year from 2008-10.

Career-high 13-game hit streak Aug. 31 - Sept. 15.

2009

Rebounded from an 0-for-23 start to bat .269, 3rd-best on the **Rangers** (min. 200 AB).

2008

Season ended in early August due to knee injury...Placed 3rd among A.L. rookie leaders in RBI, doubles and extra-base hits...His 28 doubles tied **Bump Willis** (1977) for second-most ever by a **Texas** rookie behind **Mark Teixeira** (29 in 2003) while his 74 RBI are behind only **Pete Incaviglia** (88 in 1986) and **Teixeira** (84 in 2003) among first-year **Rangers**.

Combined to hit .343 (36/105) with two home runs and 14 RBI in 46 games for **Boston** and **Texas**.

Traded from **Boston** to **Texas** on July 31

Made his Major League debut as a September call-up in **Boston**...Singled off **Toronto's A.J. Burnett** in first big league at-bat...

Hit first homer on Sept. 17 at Yankee Stadium off **Jaret Wright**.

In three seasons at Baylor from 2001-03, he hit .346 (230/665) with 147 runs, 44 doubles, 22 homers and 142 RBI in 172 games...Was named first-team All-American by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and first-team All-Big 12 as a junior after batting .413 with 11 homers and 67 RBI, and set a Big 12 record with 121 hits.

Originally selected by the Angels in the 50th round of the 2000 First-Year Player Draft, but chose to go to Baylor.

Signed with the Boston Red Sox after being drafted in the first round (17th pick) of the 2003 First-Year Player Draft.
