OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-75) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (66-66)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (12-6, 2.13) VS. LHP ANDREW HEANEY (5-2, 3.11) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night...are 7-6 over the last 13 games after losing a season high seven straight...are 58-75 (.436) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and seventh worst in the majors...it is tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 133 games and is the worst since 1997 (53-80)... the 75 losses are the A's most since going 74-88 in 2011...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 41 consecutive days and 109 of the last 113 (dating back to May 8)...the 109 days alone in last are fifth most in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 24-34 (.414) since then.

ROSTER NOTES: Last night, Cody Martin and Ryan Dull became the 26th and 27th players to pitch for the A's this year, which sets the Oakland record (previous: 26 in 1997, 2009 and 2011) and ties the Athletics record (also 1915 and 1955) for most pitchers used in a season...Dull is the A's 21st reliever, which matches the Oakland record set in 1997...Jason Pridie also made his A's debut last night and the A's have now used 47 players overall, which is their most over the last three seasons...the A's have used just two catchers, which currently matches the fewest in Oakland history (2008 and 2009)...have five players on the disabled list and have used the DL a total of 21 times, which matches the most by an A's team over the last five years (also 2012)...currently have 32 players on the active roster following Martin's option to Nashville today.

OFFENSE: The A's have homered in a season-high eight consecutive games (10 home runs total)...are batting .281 (92-for-327) with 53 runs scored over the last nine games (5.89 runs per game)...for the season, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (891), third in doubles (239) and fourth in triples (32) and stolen base percentage (69-for-91, 75.8%)...have the third lowest slugging percentage (.390) and third fewest home runs (108)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which is the fewest in the majors...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007...have been hit by a pitch 28 times, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in infield hits (137)... rank second in the AL in plate appearances with the bases loaded (132) and third in grand slams (5) and RBI (100)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15) and rank third in plate appearances (115).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.14 ERA (97 er in 170.0 ip) and .274 (182-for-665) opponents batting average over the last 19 games... have allowed 29 home runs over that stretch (1.54 per nine innings)... now have a 3.65 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.375) and fewest extra base hits (334), third in fewest home runs (122) and fourth in opponents batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.303).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-10 with a 4.62 ERA (58 er in 113.0 ip) over the last 21 games (dating back to Aug. 9)...have a 3.28 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (69) and rank fourth in innings pitched (797.1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 104 errors, which are the most in the majors...rank second in the majors with 57 unearned runs (San Diego, 65)...Marcus Semien has 32 errors and Brett Lawrie 21, which rank first and second in the American League...the 53 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1998 when Mike Caruso (35) and Ray Durham (18), as well as Russ Davis (34) and Joey Cora (19), also combined for 53 for the White Sox and Mariners. respectively.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-30 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently the worst mark in Oakland history (.381 in 1980)...it is tied for third worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...the 30 losses are the most in the majors and tied with the 1968 A's

for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for one-run losses in a season is 32 by the 1976 A's...the 45 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...are 23-47 (.329) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 8) and the last at bat losses are tied for fifth...are 6-9 (.400) in extra inning games and the 15 extra inning games are tied with Chicago for second most in the AL (Seattle, 21)...have five walk-off wins in their last 23 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this nine-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-1), Seattle (three games) and Houston (three games)... went 3-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) and have won 11 of the last 16 home games...however, are 31-37 (.456) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Seattle, 29-36)...the 37 home losses are the most by an A's team over the last four years...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1)...have lost 11 of the last 14 road games and 17 of the last 23...are 27-38 (.415) on the road for the season, which is tied for third worst in the AL...have a 3.02 ERA (210 er in 625.0 ip) at home compared to 4.35 (270 er in 558.0 ip) on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 12-24 (.314) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 6-24)...are 17-25 (.405) since the All-Star Break, which is the second worst record in the American League (Detroit, 17-26)...are 22-28 (.440) in day games, which is the fourth worst record in the AL.

DIVISIONAL PLAY: The A's will play 22 of their final 29 games against division foes...are 26-28 (.481) against the West, which is their best mark against an American League division...are 12-17 (.414) against the Central and went 10-23 (.303) against the East, which was the A's worst mark ever against the East...are 10-7 (.588) against the National League West.

IN AUGUST: The A's went 13-15 (.464) in the month of August and finished with a losing record in the month for the second consecutive season (12-17 in 2014) and sixth time in the last eight years...tied for the American League lead and set an Oakland record for doubles in August with 64 (previous: 63 in 2007)...the pitching staff allowed 37 home runs, which tied Detroit for the most in the AL and matched the most allowed in any month by an A's team over the last 17 years (May, 2002; July, 2004)...ranked ninth in the AL in ERA (4.30) and batting average (.259).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series, 7-8...are 4-4 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have won three of the previous four season series and are 48-43 against the Angels over the last five years...including 39-8 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of their last 35 losses, including 12 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 413-339 against the Angels...that includes 215-160 in Oakland and 198-179 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 462-416 against the Angels.

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (25) and multiple hit games (38)...leads American League rookies in hits (128) and total bases (167) and is tied for the lead in runs scored (61)...**Mark Canha** Is batting .321 (26-for-81) with eight doubles, a triple, three home runs and 19 RBI over his last 20 games...**Brett Lawrie** homered for the third time in his last five games last night and is now batting .349 (15-for-43) with four home runs, eight RBI and 10 runs scored over his last 11 games...**Drew Pomeranz** has allowed two runs in his past 13 games (14.0 ip, 1.29 ERA...**Marcus Semien** is batting .300 (27-for-90) with three home runs and 13 RBI over his last 26 games

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons has two home runs and seven RBI in the second game of a doubleheader against Boston, a 15-0 A's win...in **1989** Jose Canseco's two-run homer in the first inning of the A's 7-2 win at Milwaukee is the 8000th in the history of the Athletics franchise...in **2003** the A's score two times in the 12th inning to defeat Baltimore 2-0 and extend their winning streak to 10 games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (12-6, 2.13 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Leads the Ameri- ATHLETICS ERA LEADERS can League and ranks third in the majors with a 2.13 ERA...currently has the lowest ERA by an AL pitcher since Pedro Martinez posted a 1.74 ERA for Boston in 2000...now has a 2.65 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Athletics history among pitchers with 450 or more innings pitched (since 1913, when earned runs became an official stat).

AMONG THE LEADERS: In addition to leading the American League in ERA, he also leads the league in opponents batting average (.201), onbase percentage (.254) and slugging percentage (.289)... is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), tied for third in complete games (3), ranks fifth in innings pitched (181.2), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.667), tied for ninth in wins (12) and 10th in

strikeouts (150)...also ranks second in fewest pitches per inning (14.5), tied for second in opponents reaching base on an error (8), tied for fifth in wild pitches (10) and tied for eighth in unearned runs (8).

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-2 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) and .224 (17-for-76) opponents batting average over his last three starts... it marks his second two-game losing streak of the season (May 13-19).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.97 ERA (6 er in 55.2 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 7-5 with a 2.64 ERA (37 er in 126.0 ip) in 18 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors and is tied for fifth in the American League in day wins

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-3 with a 2.33 ERA (15 er in 58.0 ip) in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 FRA in 18 starts before the break his FRA at the break was fourth lowest in Oakland history and second lowest in the designated hitter era behind Justin Duchscherer's 1.82 in 2008...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 11-13 with a 2.95 ERA (70 er in 213.1 ip) in 33 games after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Leads Major League pitchers with an Oakland record 31 putouts...has the most putouts by an A's pitcher since Eddie Plank had 33 in 1907...the record is 35 by Chick Fraser in 1901...ranks second among AL pitchers in total chances (53) and eighth in assists (22).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs in his last four starts (29.0 ip), including a career-high three Aug. 22 against Tampa Bay...yielded just eight home runs over his first 22 starts (152.2 ip) and has surrendered 13 home runs in 181.2 innings for the season...his average of 0.64 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .190 (33-for-174) with 11 walks (.238 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average is second lowest in the American League and the on-base percentage ranks third...has allowed a .214 (47-for-220) batting average with four doubles and three home runs with runners on base (.273 slugging percentage)...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the AL and the batting average ranks fourth...also ranks third in the AL with a .189 (66for-349) batting average against left-handed hitters and fifth with a .139 (46-for-331) average with two strikes...all opponents average rankings are based on pitchers that qualify for the ERA title.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 8-2 with a 1.81 ERA (23 er in 114.2 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest compared to 4-4 with a 2.69 ERA (20 er in 67.0 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.. his ERA on four days rest is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 7-2 with a 2.07 ERA (19 er in 82.2 ip) in 11 starts against American League West competition compared to 5-4 with a 2.18 ERA (24 er in 99.0 ip) in 15 starts against everyone else...is now 19-7 with a 2.22 ERA (57 er in 231.0 ip) in 34 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 12-12 with a 3.08 ERA (80 er in 233.2 ip) in 37 games against everyone else.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Aaron Brooks (1-1, 5.47 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with the A's this year...started that day against Arizona and had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win (6.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...went 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA in four games, including three starts, during his first stint from Aug. 1 to 14...allowed two runs in 14.1 innings over his first two starts before allowing eight runs in 1.2 innings Aug. 12 at Toronto...began the season in the Kansas City organization and was 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha before he was traded to the A's with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with Nashville...has never faced the Mariners in his career

- The A's bullpen has a 1.50 ERA (3 er in 18.0 ip) over its past four games but a 5.88 ERA (34 er in 52.0 ip) over its past 15 contests (dating back to Aug. 16)...has a 4.41 ERA for the season, which is the third highest in the American League.
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and is tied for the fourth fewest wins (17)...has yielded the third most home runs (53) and extra base hits (137).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (22), the lowest save percentage (51.2%) and is tied for the most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is second worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979).


