OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-76) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (63-71)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and five of the last eight games and are 7-7 over the last 14 contests...are 58-76 (.433) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...it is tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 134 games and is the worst since 1997 (53-81)...the 76 losses are the A's most since going 74-88 in 2011...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 42 consecutive days and 110 of the last 114 (dating back to May 8)...the 110 days alone in last are fifth most in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 24-35 (.407) since then.

OFFENSE: Stephen Vogt had the A's 33rd triple of the season Wednesday, which matches the most by an A's team over the last 30 years (1987, 2014)...last had more than 33 triples in 1985 when they collected 34...the A's rank fourth in the American League in triples...have homered in a season-high nine consecutive games (12 home runs total)...however, have just 110 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL...are batting .280 (102-for-364) with 57 runs scored over the last 10 games (5.70 runs per game)...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (899), third in lowest slugging percentage (.391), tied for third in doubles (241) and fourth in stolen base percentage (69-for-91, 75.8%)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which is the fewest in the majors...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007...have been hit by a pitch 28 times, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in infield hits (137)...are tied for second in the AL in plate appearances with the bases loaded (132) and rank third in grand slams (5) and RBI (100)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in walks (15), are tied for the lead in triples (2) and rank third in plate appearances (117).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.48 ERA (106 er in 179.0 ip) and .276 (195-for-706) opponents batting average over the last 20 games...have allowed 30 home runs over that stretch (1.51 per nine innings)...now have a 3.69 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.375) and fewest extra base hits (337), third in fewest home runs (123) and fourth in opponents batting average (.244) and on-base percentage (.303).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-11 with a 4.88 ERA (64 er in 118.0 ip) over the last 22 games (dating back to Aug. 9)...have a 3.33 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.34 was in 1981 (3.16)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (70) and rank fourth in innings pitched (802.1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just five errors in the last 14 games but have 104 for the season, which are the most in the majors...rank second in the majors with 57 unearned runs (San Diego, 66)...Marcus Semien has 32 errors and Brett Lawrie 21, which rank first and second in the American League...the 53 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1998 when Mike Caruso (35) and Ray Durham (18), as well as Russ Davis (34) and Joey Cora (19), also combined for 53 for the White Sox and Mariners, respectively.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-30 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently the worst mark in Oakland history (.381 in 1980)...it is tied for third worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...the 30 losses are the most in the majors and tied with the 1968 A's for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for one-run losses in a season is 32 by the 1976 A's...the 45 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...are 23-47 (.329) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are second fewest in the AL (NYY, 8) and the losses are third most...are 6-9 (.400) in extra inning games and the 15 extra inning games are tied with Chicago for second most in the AL (Seattle, 21) and the losses rank third...have five walk-off wins in their last 24 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this nine-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-NL (2-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2) and have won 11 of the last 17 home games...however, are 31-38 (.449) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Seattle, 29-36)...the 38 home losses are the most by an A's team since the 2011 A's also lost 38...have not lost more than 38 home games since 2009 when they went 40-41...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1)...have lost 11 of the last 14 road games and 17 of the last 23...are 27-38 (.415) on the road for the season, which is tied for second worst in the AL...have a 3.11 ERA (219 er in 634.0 ip) at home compared to 4.35 (270 er in 558.0 ip) on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 12-25 (.324) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 6-24)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...are 4-17 (.190) on Friday, which is the worst mark in the majors...are 17-26 (.395) since the All-Star Break, which is the second worst record in the American League (Detroit, 17-28)...are 22-29 (.431) in day games, which is the worst record in the AL...are 26-29 (.472) against AL West, which is their best mark against an AL division...are 12-17 (.414) against the Central and went 10-23 (.303) against the East, which was the A's worst mark ever against the East...are 10-7 (.588) against the National League West.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's recalled Sean Nolin from Nashville today and he is scheduled to start on Sunday...he will become the 28th player to pitch for the A's this year, which breaks the franchise record for most pitchers used in a season (27 in 1915 and 1955)...the A's have used 21 relievers, which matches the Oakland record set in 1997...Nolin will become the 48th player overall, which is the A's most over the last three seasons...have used just two catchers, which currently matches the fewest in Oakland history (2008 and 2009)...have five players on the disabled list and have used the DL a total of 21 times, which matches the most by an A's team over the last five years (also 2012)...currently have 33 players on the active roster.

IN AUGUST: The A's went 13-15 (.464) in the month of August and finished with a losing record in the month for the second consecutive season (12-17 in 2014) and sixth time in the last eight years...tied for the American League lead and set an Oakland record for doubles in August with 64 (previous: 63 in 2007)...the pitching staff allowed 37 home runs, which tied Detroit for the most in the AL and matched the most allowed in any month by an A's team over the last 17 years (May, 2002; July, 2004)...ranked ninth in the AL in ERA (4.30) and batting average (.259).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series 4-9 but have outscored the Mariners 61-58...with one more loss, will lose the season series for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are 3-4 in Oakland and 1-5 in Seattle...six of the nine losses this year have been by one run and 14 of the A's 19 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer...are 42-47 against Seattle over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 325-254 (.561) against Seattle...that includes 179-110 in Oakland, 145-142 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (25) and multiple hit games (38)...leads American League rookies in hits (128) and total bases (167)...**Mark Canha** is batting .306 (26-for-85) with eight doubles, a triple, three home runs and 19 RBI over his last 21 games...**Brett Lawrie** has homered in back-to-back games for the second time in his last six games and is now batting .362 (17-for-47) with five home runs, nine RBI and 11 runs scored over his last 12 games...**Drew Pomeranz** has allowed two runs in his past 13 games (14.0 ip, 1.29 ERA)...**Marcus Semien** is batting .309 (29-for-94) with three home runs and 13 RBI over his last 27 games

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1973** the A's defeat the California Angels 4-3 as Ken Holtzman wins his 20th game en route to a 21-13 season...in **2000** Mike Stanley is a perfect 5-for-5 with five RBI in the A's 10-0 win over Toronto...in **2002** the A's blow an 11-0 lead against Kansas City but Scott Hatteberg hits a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 12-11 win, the A's American League record breaking 20th consecutive victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (1-1, 5.47 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with the A's and started that day against Arizona...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings and had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win...was 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA in four games, including three starts, during his first stint from Aug. 1 to 14...began the season in the Kansas City organization and went 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...was traded to the A's with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland Aug. 1...went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with the Sounds following his Aug. 15 option.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (12 er in 22.0 ip) and .274 (23-for-84) opponents batting average in his four starting assignments compared to 0-0 with an 8.31 ERA and .368 opponents average in three relief appearances...has issued all four of his walks as a starter.

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed eight runs in 1.2 innings Aug. 12 at Toronto for his lone loss as an Athletic (43.20 ERA, .600 opponents batting average)...is 1-0 with a 2.21 ERA (5 er in 20.1 ip) and a .240 (18-for-75) opponents average in his other four games with Oakland...tossed at least seven innings and allowed one run in each of his first two starts with the A's...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least seven innings while allowing one run or fewer in each of his first two games with the A's...joins Ron Darling (1991), Kevin Appier (1999) and Rich Harden (2003)...the A's are 2-2 in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings, allowed two runs or fewer and walked one or fewer in three of his four starts.

WITH KANSAS CITY: Was recalled for the first time April 26 as the 26th man but did not pitch...recalled for his second stint May 12 and made one appearance on May 15 against New York, retiring the side in order in the ninth inning of the Royals 12-1 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...was optioned following the game...recalled for a third time June 20 and pitched the next day against Boston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was optioned back to Omaha the next day...was recalled July 7 as the 26th man and stayed one more day without pitching before he was optioned to Omaha for the final time July 8.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first start with the A's, a 5-1 victory over Cleveland Aug. 1 in Oakland...retired 13 of the first 14 batters he faced, allowing just a two-out single to Brantley in the first inning...then allowed his only home run on a one-out solo home run by Chisenhall in the fifth...that was the only run he would allow in 7.1 innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss to Houston Aug. 6 in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Lowrie in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired 11 straight at one point and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 2-1...Rodriguez allowed a two-run home run to Correa for the blown save.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Toronto Aug. 12...allowed a career-high eight runs in 1.2 innings...yielded a three-run home run to Colabello in the first but the A's came back with two runs in the second inning...was charged with five of the Blue Jays seven runs in the bottom of the second...allowed a two-run single to Donaldson and a RBI single to Colabello and was relieved by Doubront with runners on first and third and one out...Doubront allowed both runners to score plus two of his own.

LAST START: He had a no decision in a 3-2 A's win at Arizona last Saturday...Oakland scored twice in the second inning and he blanked the Diamondbacks on four hits and a walk over the first four innings before allowing two runs in the fifth...Pollock had a RBI single and the tying run scored when Goldschmidt grounded into a double play...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh and the A's scored once in the eighth for the win.

MINORS: Went 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha and 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Nashville...combined to go 7-5 with a 3.56 ERA in 20 games, 19 starts, overall...issued just 21 walks in 118.2 innings, an average of 1.59 walks per nine innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .254 (54-for-213) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (73-for-248) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...seven were solo shots...yielded five home runs in his first four starts and 20.1 innings and five home runs over his final 16 games and 98.1 innings...at the time of the July 28 trade to the A's, he ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (92) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...his teams were 13-6 (.685) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer and tossed at least five innings in each of his 20 appearances.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Made his lone relief appearance in his second outing, April 15 at Memphis...entered the game to start the third inning with a 2-1 lead but ended up taking the loss in a 4-2 decision...was 0-2 with a 4.70 ERA over his first three games before his promotion to Kansas City April 26...returned the next day and went 4-1 with a 2.95 ERA over his first seven starts following his return...struck out a season-high nine batters May 8 against Oklahoma City...was sent to Kansas City for the second time May 12 and was optioned back to Omaha May 15...matched his season high with nine strikeouts May 31 at Albuquerque...was promoted to Kansas City a third time June 20...then went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA over his first five starts from June 27 to July 21 following his return...joined the Royals for his fourth stint July 7...tossed his lone complete game of the season in his first start following his return on July 11 against Iowa...fired a seven-hitter in a 3-2 seven-inning loss in the second game of a doubleheader...made two starts with Nashville on Aug. 18 against El Paso and Aug. 23 at Reno and did not walk a batter in either start.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (7-13, 3.93 ERA): Is 3-7 with a 5.23 ERA and .288 opponents batting average over his last 12 starts dating back to June 28...was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA and .246 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed at least one home run in seven consecutive starts, which is the longest streak by an Athletic over the last two years...has 13 losses, which are tied with Kluber (CLE) for the most in the American League...they are the most by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill lost 14 in 2011...is 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA in 13 games at home compared to 2-8 with a 4.95 ERA in 15 games on the road...over the last two seasons, he is 10-7 with a 2.76 ERA in Oakland, 5-14 with a 4.53 ERA on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-4 A's win at Arizona last Sunday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 0-5 with a 4.24 ERA (46.2 ip, 50 h, 24 r, 22 er, 15 bb, 40 so, 5 hr) in 15 career appearances, including six starts, against Seattle.

- The A's bullpen has a 5.95 ERA (37 er in 56.0 ip) over its past 16 games (dating back to Aug. 16) and a 4.43 ERA for the season, which is the third highest in the American League.
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and is tied for the third fewest wins (17)...has yielded the third most home runs (53) and extra base hits (139) and tossed the sixth fewest innings (389.2).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (22), the lowest save percentage (51.2%) and is tied for the most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is second worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979).
- Has allowed the second most first batter home runs in the majors (15) and the third most first batter RBI (53)...has the second highest opponents average against first batters faced in the AL (.260).
- The A's are 9-44 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 45-31 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has yielded five runs in his past eight games (5.2 ip, 7.94 ERA)...did not allow an earned run in his previous 13 games and 12.2 innings.
- Has a 2.30 ERA (7 er in 27.1 ip) over his past 31 games (dating back to May 22)...posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 appearances.
- Has allowed a .206 (13-for-63) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .272 (22-for-81) with 12 of his 17 extra base hits (.605 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a 1.19 ERA (3 er in 22.2 ip) in 29 games at home compared to 6.89 (12 er in 15.2 ip) in 22 contests on the road.
