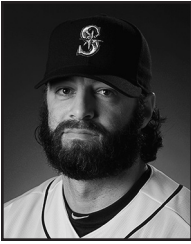

- **The Totals** – Was 3-1, 2.20 in 56 games (45.0 IP, 39 H, 11 ER).
- **The Streak** - Did not allow a run in 19.0 consecutive innings May 2 - July 10 (21 games).
- **Clean Sheet** – Had 49 shutout appearances (in 56 games total) and never allowed more than 2 runs in a game (1 R – 2x; 2 R – 5x).
- **Tough on Lefty's** – limited left-handed batters to a slash line of .188 batting average against/.217 on-base percentage/.288 slugging percentage.
- **Not Many HR** - Allowed only 1 HR in first 45 appearances...allowed 3 HR over 2 appearances Aug. 27 vs. Texas and Aug. 29 vs. Washington.
- **Welcome Back** - Made his Seattle debut April 1 at Los Angeles (AL), his first big league game since Aug. 22, 2011 (951 days between appearances).

**PERSONAL:** Joseph Ronald Beimel...resides in Manhattan Beach, Calif., with wife Carley... has 3 children, Andrew (1/14/97), Claire (11/16/01) and Greyson (10/28/14)...wears uniform #97 in honor of his first son's year of birth...pitched one season at Allegany College in Cumberland, MD and 2 years at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA...elected to the Dukes Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004...played baseball, football and basketball and wrestled at St. Marys (PA) High School (graduated '95)...selected by Texas in the 26th round of the 1996 June Draft but did not sign...was the first player ever drafted by the Pirates out of Duquesne University 2 years later...signed for the Pirates by Jon Mercurio.

**CAREER:** Has played for 7 Major League teams: Pittsburgh, Los Angeles (NL), Colorado, Minnesota, Tampa Bay, Washington and Seattle.

**1998:** Made pro debut at Short-Season A Erie.

**1999:** Pitched in South Atlantic League All-Star Game with Single-A Hickory.

**2000:** Had a 3.36 ERA, 7th-best in the Carolina League in 18 starts at Lynchburg and was selected for league All-Star Game...finished the year with 10 starts at Altoona.

**2001:** Set career high for wins (7) and innings (115.1) in first Major League season...held opponents to team-low .269 opponent batting average...allowed 2 runs in 5.0 innings in start to win Major League debut April 8 vs. Houston.

**2002:** Set career high with 53 appearances including eight starts between June 7-July 24.

**2003:** Led the Pirates staff in appearances (69)...posted a 3.57 ERA in 43 1st half appearances with 7.77 ERA in 26 outings after the All-Star break.

**2004:** Signed with Minnesota organization on April 11 after being released by Pittsburgh on March 31...tied for 2nd-most appearances (49) among Twins minor leaguers at AAA Rochester...contract was purchased by Minnesota on Sept. 7 and worked in 3 games.

**2005:** Spent most of season at AAA Durham in Tampa Bay organization, making 48 relief appearances...saw action in 7 games in 2 stints with the Devil Rays (July 3-13; August 31-end of season).

**2006:** Opened at AAA Las Vegas before being promoted to Los Angeles on May 1 for rest of year...had a 2.68 ERA after the All-Star break with a 1.32 (2 ER, 13.2 IP) mark in 12 September appearances.

**2007:** Established a Dodgers franchise record for appearances by a left-hander (83), tied for 3rd-most in the NL...held left-handed batters to a .188 batting average and permitted just 10 of 57 inherited runners to score (17.5%), the 4th-best in the NL.

**2008:** Had the National League's 4th-lowest relief ERA (2.02) in final season with the Dodgers...ERA was 1.61 in 42 games before the All-Star break...posted a 1.16 ERA (3 ER, 23.1 IP) in 35 appearances at Dodger Stadium...had a string of 17 consecutive scoreless outings (11.1 IP), April 13-May 19.

**2009:** Split season with Washington and Colorado...signed with the Nationals on March 20...was on DL from April 21-May 6 with a left hip flexor strain, including a rehab appearance at High-A Potomac...was traded to Colorado on July 31...made 3 scoreless appearances for the Rockies in the NLDS vs. Philadelphia.

**2010:** Signed a minor league contract with Colorado on March 23 and began year at Colorado Springs (AAA)...joined the Rockies on April 16 and finished 3rd on the staff in appearances (71)...had a 2.28 ERA in 39 games before the All-Star Game and a 5.19 mark in 32 second half contests.

**2011:** Was a non-roster invitee at Pittsburgh's Major League camp...assigned to AAA Indianapolis on April 11 before having his contract purchased on April 15...on the disabled list on May 28-July 15 with left elbow inflammation...designated for assignment on Aug. 23 and released on Aug. 30.

**2012:** Went to spring training with the Texas Rangers, was released in March and missed the entire season after undergoing Tommy John surgery in May.

**2013:** Spent the entire season with AAA Gwinnett in the Atlanta Braves system after signing in May...had a reverse left-right split, allowing left-handers to hit .290 (18x62) and limiting right-handers to a .239 (16x67) average...was the second consecutive season that he didn't appear in the Majors after having Tommy John surgery in 2012.

**PERSONAL:** Franklin Rafael Gutierrez...resides in Boca Raton, FL with wife (Vivian) and son...father-in-law is former Major Leaguer Luis Salazar...his favorite player growing up was Andres Galarraga...signed by Dodgers scout Camilo Pascual on Nov. 18, 2000.

**CAREER:** Played in 681 career Major League games with Cleveland (2005-08) and Seattle (2009-current)...won the 2010 AL Gold Glove Award...originally acquired by Seattle in a trade with Cleveland along with Endy Chavez (of), Mike Carp (inf), Aaron Heilman (rhp), Jason Vargas (lhp), Ezequiel Carrera (of), and Maikel Cleto (rhp) from the Mets, in exchange for J.J. Putz (rhp), Sean Green (rhp), Jeremy Reed (of) & Luis Valbuena (inf) on Dec. 10, 2008.

**2002:** Spent most of year at South Georgia of the South Atlantic League before ending season with 2 games with AAA Las Vegas.

**2003:** In a combined 128 games for A Vero Beach and AA Jacksonville, batted .287 (141x492) with 24 home runs and 80 RBI...named the Dodgers Minor League Player of the Year...rated as the 4th-best prospect in the Florida State League by *Baseball America*...ranked 2nd in the FSL in slugging pct (.513), home runs (20) and total bases (218), and 3rd in extra-base hits (53)...represented the World Team in the Futures Game in Chicago...selected to the FSL Postseason All-Star Team and the Topps Class A All-Star Team...named to the FSL *Baseball America* High Class A All-Star Team...named FSL Player of the Week, April 3-13...named the April FSL Player of the Month by Topps.

**2004:** Acquired by the Indians prior to the season for Milton Bradley...spent most of the season at Akron, but was limited to 77 combined games at Akron and Buffalo due to a strained ligament in his right elbow suffered on a HBP...promoted to Buffalo on June 22 to get regular at-bats as the DH after experiencing elbow pain...on the DL July 2-Sept. 1.

**2005:** Split the season between Akron and Buffalo and was added to the big league roster on Aug. 31...started the year in Akron, batting .261 (100x383) with 25 doubles, 2 triples, 11 home runs and 42 RBI...promoted to Buffalo on Aug. 10...made his Major League debut Aug. 31 vs. Detroit as a pinch runner...named the 4th-best prospect in the Indians organization by *Baseball America* and hit .341 (63x185) in the Venezuelan Winter League for Caracas (4 HR, 31 RBI).

**2006:** Split the season between Buffalo and Cleveland...was with the Indians from June 16-July 13, Aug. 9-25 and Sept. 5-remainder of the season...collected his first Major League hit June 17 at Milwaukee...hit first HR Aug. 13 vs. Kansas City (off Andy Sisco).

**2007:** Made 59 starts in right field, 7 starts in left field and 2 starts in center field for the Indians...hit .260 (53x204) with 12 doubles, 9 home runs and 27 RBI in 66 games following the All-Star break...began the year on the 15-day Major League disabled list after injuring his left hamstring running on the bases on March 22.

**2008:** Over the last two months of the season hit a combined .313 (46x147) with 12 doubles, 4 home runs and 20 RBI in 47 games...recorded 10-game hitting streak from Sept. 7-16...hit his first career grand slam and drove in a career-high 4 RBI May 27 vs. Chicago (Mark Buehrle)...hit his first career leadoff home run Aug. 6 at Tampa Bay.

**2009:** Set career highs in games (153), at-bats (565), runs (85), hits (160), home runs (18) and RBI (70)...earned Fielding

Bible Award as best defensive center fielder in baseball...hit .335 (55x164) against left-handers, ranking 10th in the AL...became just the 9th player in club history to record a season of at least 15 HR and 15 stolen bases...led Major League outfielders with 445 putouts, 3rd with .921 zone rating and had 6 outfield assists...hit .301 (108x359) with 57 runs, 18 doubles, 12 HR, 46 RBI and .802 OPS June 23-end of season...career-high 13-game hitting streak June 26-July 10 (.462/24x52)...recorded first career multi-homer game June 18 at San Diego...hit 2-run home run in Mariners debut on Opening Day, April 6 at Minnesota...ranked 2nd in the AL with 13 sacrifice bunts...left game June 10 at Baltimore with a left knee contusion, missing 2 games due to injury.

**2010:** Earned first AL Gold Glove...set ML record finishing the season with 415 errorless chances in the outfield, besting the previous record (Curt Flood, STL, 396 in 1966)...first Mariners outfielder to finish the season with a 1.000 fielding percentage (min. 108 games)...led Mariners with 64 RBI, T1st in triples (3), 2nd in home runs (12), walks (50), 3rd in steals (25), runs (61), doubles (25)...stole a career-high 25 bases.

**2011:** Appeared in 92 games, making 85 starts in center field...missed remainder of season after being placed on 60-day disabled list Sept. 6 with a strained left oblique...did not commit an error in 92 games (244 total chances), his 2nd consecutive season without committing an error, and extended his errorless games streak to 279 games (723 TC)...hit .282 (35x124) with 12 runs, 8 doubles and 10 RBI over his final 33 games, July 31-Sept. 4...began season hitting .187 (37x198) in his first 59 games...tied for team lead with 7 outfield assists (with Ichiro)...on DL March 30-May 18 with stomach gastritis; missed first 41 games.

**2012:** Appeared in 40 games, making 38 starts (all in CF)...hit .260 (39x150) with 18 runs, 10 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs and 17 RBI...hit .400 (26x65) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 4 HR, 13 RBI, .723 SLG vs. LHP (.153/13x85 vs. RHP)...committed an error on Sept. 11 at Toronto (dropped fly ball), his first since Aug. 20, 2009...went 301 consecutive games in the outfield (293 GS) without an error, a streak that included an American League record 846 consecutive chances...the previous AL record was 723 consecutive errorless chances by Darin Erstad, and fell short of the MLB record of 938 by Darren Lewis...on 7-day (concussion) disabled list on June 29-Aug. 27 after being hit in the face by an errant pick-off throw at first base June 28 vs. Boston...hit pinch-hit 3-run home run in 8th inning June 20 at Arizona for the first pinch-hit home run of his career.

**2013:** Missed 106 games in two DL stints with a strained right hamstring, April 23-June 21 & June 25-Aug. 25...reached double-digits in home runs (10) for the first time since 2010, despite appearing in only 41 games...averaged 14.50 at-bats per home run, the 6th-best ratio in the Majors by players with 10 or more home runs...hit a team-high 3 leadoff home runs, all coming in the month of April (4/3 at OAK, 4/5 at CWS, 4/11 vs. TEX)...tied Rickey Henderson (May 2000) for most leadoff HR in a month in club history...homered in his first game back from the DL on June 22 vs. Oakland...was active for only 2 games before returning to the DL...returned from the DL on Aug. 26 and hit .235 (20x85) with 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 13 RBI and 2 stolen bases in his final 23 games...17 of his 36 total hits went for extra bases (7 2B, 10 HR)...appeared in 47 games on rehab assignment with AAA Tacoma, batting .211 (41x194) with 16 doubles, 3 home runs and 25 RBI.

**POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE:** Batted .207 (6x29) in 10 postseason games (HR, 4 RBI) in 2007...homered in Game 2 of the ALDS vs. New York in the 11th inning.

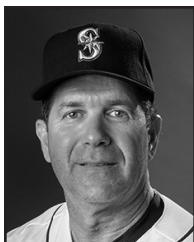

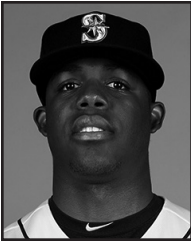

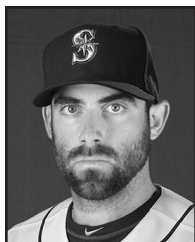
