#### SERIES VS. ATHLETICS

The Mariners and Athletics meet for the 14th of 19 games this season...the Mariners won 2-fo-3 game vs. the A's at Safeco Field, Aug. 24-26...Seattle went 10-9 vs. the A's last season, including a 4-5 mark at Safeco Field...dating back to 2013, the Mariners are 30-21 over last 51 games vs. the A's.

**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 10-game, 11-day road trip tonight with the first of three games vs. the Oakland Athletics...the trip began in Chicago-AL (2-2) and continued in Houston (2-1)...open a 10-game homestand Monday vs. Texas (4 games), Colorado (3 games) and Los Angeles (3 games)...tonight's game will be televised in the Mariners TV market on **ROOT SPORTS** and broadcast on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...won 2 straight and 4 of 7 on current road trip...have won 7 of last 11 games...are 11-10 over last 21, 17-14 in last 31 and 21-20 in last 41...won 5 of last 9 series to improve to 15-20-8 in series played...are 7-10 in 17 rubber games (3-game series).

- **AL Leader - Nelson Cruz** is amongst AL leaders: 1st in HR (39), 2nd in SLG (.587), 3rd in OPS (.967), T3rd in XBH (62), T4th in hits (158), T5th in multi-H G (45), 6th in OBP (.380), T7th in RBI (82), 9th in AVG (.310).
- **Heating Up - Robinson Canó** is batting .339 (75x221) with a .936 OPS since July 1 (T5th in AL in avg, 12th in OPS)...has raised his batting avg from .238 to .282 in last 54 G.
- **Edgar Effect** - Seattle is hitting .260 with 224 extra-base hits and averaging 4.5 runs per game since **Edgar Martinez** took over as hitting coach on June 20...hit .233 w/3.38 RPG in first 68 G of season.
- **Close Games** - T1st in the AL with 76 of 134 G decided by 2 or fewer runs (26-22 in 1-run games).
- **Last At-Bat** - 23 defeats in final at-bat, most in MLB...T1st in AL with 10 walk-off losses (TB - 10).
- **Extra Innings** - Mariners lead the Majors with 21 extra-inning games (10-11: 4-6 home, 6-5 road).
- **HR Report** - 5th in the AL with 162 home runs, already 26 more HR than last season (136, 10th in AL).
- **Lefty Masher** - since July 31, **Franklin Gutierrez** is batting .400 (20x50) with 5 doubles, 5 home runs, 15 RBI vs. left-handed pitchers.
- **11 Straight** - The Mariners have hit a home run in 11 consecutive games (18 HR), the longest HR streak since recording a franchise-high 23 straight games with a home run, June 20-July 19, 2013.

**CONTINUING SUCCESS VS. THE A'S**...with one more win vs. the Athletics (6 games remaining), the Mariners will clinch the season series for the third consecutive season (currently 9-4 this season)...went 11-8 in 2013 and 10-9 last season vs. the A's...would be the first time to win three consecutive season series vs. Oakland since 2001-2003.

**NO START, NO WORRIES**...**Logan Morrison** has homered in each of the last two games, coming off the bench in each game...became the second Mariners player to hit a HR in consecutive team games in which he did not start, joining Leroy Stanton in 1977.

**NICE MARINERS DEBUT**...**Shawn O'Malley** went 3-for-4 with 2 RBI in his Mariners debut Wednesday at Houston...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he became the 4th player with 3+ hits and 2+ RBI in the first game in a Mariners uniform, joining Henry Cotto (4/6/88 at OAK), Eliezer Alfonzo (5/30/10 at LAA) and **Seth Smith** (4/6/15 vs. LAA).

**BACKSTOP SACRIFICE**...Mariners catchers **Mike Zunino** (8, T3rd in AL) and **Jesus Sucre** (7, T5th in AL) have combined for 15 of the Mariners 32 sac bunts this season...the 15 sac hits from the catcher position are the most in the Majors this season (TEX is 2nd with 10) and most since the Angels also had 15 in 2012...last team with more than 15 sac bunts out of the catcher position was the Angels with 20 in 2011...Mariners club record for sac hits by catchers is 16 set in 2000.

**SO CLOSE**...the Mariners are 38-38 in a Major League leading 76 games that are decided by two runs or less this season, including going 21-19 on the road and 17-19 at Safeco Field...over the last two seasons, Seattle has had over one-third of the games (93 of 296) decided by one run or less (34-49 record) and 162 of 296 games (54.7%) decided by 1 or 2 runs (81-81)...7 of the last 11 games have been decided by 2 runs or less (5-2).

**HEATING UP ON THE ROAD**...since July 21, the Mariners are batting .281 (244x867) with 121 runs, 53 doubles, 3 triples, 38 home runs and 117 RBI over 23 road games...during this stretch lead the Majors in hits and total bases (398), 2nd in home runs, 3rd in RBI (117) and slugging percentage (.481), 4th in runs and average on the road...several Mariners have enjoyed success hitting on the road since July 21: **Robinson Canó** (.364/32x88, 12 R, 7 2B, HR, 12 RBI, 9 BB), **Franklin Gutierrez** (.356/21x59, 12 R, 4 2B, 7 HR, 18 RBI, 5 BB), **Kyle Seager** (.330/33x100, 21 R, 7 2B, 6 HR, 12 RBI, 10 BB), **Nelson Cruz** (.307/31x101, 16 R, 5 2B, 10 HR, 15 RBI, 10 BB) and **Mark Trumbo** (.301/22x73, 11 R, 2B, 4 HR, 9 RBI, 5 BB)...overall the Mariners are batting .243 (588x2418) in 69 road games in 2015.

**ROAD HOMERS**...the Mariners have hit 12 home runs in the first 7 games of the current road trip...Seattle leads the Majors with 92 road home runs, 5 in front of 2nd-place New York Yankees (87)...have homered in 9 straight road contests, and 23 of last 24 dating back to July 20...**Nelson Cruz** leads the Majors with 26 road home runs, while **Kyle Seager** is tied for T5th with 17 longballs.

**NIGHT OWL**...**Nelson Cruz** is batting .325 (110x340) with 51 runs scored, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 27 home runs, 50 RBI in 89 night games this season...among American League leaders at night, Cruz ranks T1st in home runs (27), T2nd in hits (110), 3rd in slugging percentage (.612) and OPS (.997), 4th in average (.324) and extra-base hits (43), 6th in on-base percentage (.385) and T8th in runs scored (51)...**Robinson Canó** (.301/106x352, 44 R, 25 2B, 1 3B, 8 HR, 37 RBI) also ranks among AL leaders at night in hits (T4th/105), doubles (5th/25) and average (12th/.301).

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Franklin Gutierrez** is batting .315 (41x130) with 21 runs, 10 doubles, 11 home runs, 30 RBI and a 1.012 OPS in 44 games with Seattle this season, including batting .362 (25x69) with 16 runs scored, 5 doubles, 8 home runs and 22 RBI in 20 games since August 4...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...his .646 slugging percentage in 44 games this season currently leads the Majors (min. 125 PA)?...Gutierrez ranks ahead of Bryce Harper, WAS (.627), Miguel Sano, MIN (.617), Giancarlo Stanton, MIA (.606), Josh Donaldson, TOR (.589) and Nelson Cruz, SEA (.587).
