OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-77) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (64-71)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and six of the last nine games and are now 7-15 dating back to Aug. 11...are a season-low tying 19 games under .500 (also 55-74 on Aug. 28) at 58-77 (.430)...that is the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...it is tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 135 games and is the worst since 1997 (53-82)...have not been more than 19 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...the 77 losses are the A's most since going 74-88 in 2011...trail Houston by a season-high tying 16 games (last on Aug. 29)...have not been more than 16 games back in the AL West since finishing the 2011 season 22 games out...have been in sole possession of last place in the West for 43 consecutive days and 111 of the last 115 (dating back to May 8)...the 111 days alone in last are fifth most in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 24-36 (.400) since then.

OFFENSE: The A's have tripled in back-to-back games and now have 34 triples for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League and is the most by an A's team since the 1985 club also had 34...the Oakland record is 40 in 1968...are batting .290 (117-for-403) with 65 runs scored over the last 11 games (5.9 runs per game)...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (905) and third in doubles (243) and lowest slugging percentage (.392)...have the fewest sacrifice hits (12) and hit by pitches (28) in the majors...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007...rank second in the majors with 140 infield hits (Miami, 148).

THE LONG BALL: The A"s have homered in a season-high 10 consecutive games (13 home runs total)...however, have just 111 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...Danny Valencia hit the A's sixth grand slam of the season last, which is tied for second in the AL and is the most by an A's team since the 2004 club also had six... the A's are tied for second in the AL in plate appearances with the bases loaded (133) and rank third in RBI (104) and batting average (.339).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 3-for-3 last night and are now 8-for-11 (.727) over the last seven games...are batting .235 (24-for-102) with 15 walks for the season...lead the AL in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in plate appearances (120), third in hits and fourth in batting average...are one of four AL teams without a home run.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.60 ERA (117 er in 188.0 ip) and .280 (208-for-743) opponents batting average over the last 21 games... have allowed 32 home runs over that stretch (1.53 per nine innings)... now have a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.377) and fewest extra base hits (343), tied for third in fewest home runs (125) and fourth in opponents batting average (.245) and on-base percentage (.304).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-12 with a 5.46 ERA (69 er in 113.2 ip) over the last 22 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 11 of those games...now have a 3.39 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL and third fewest in the majors (70).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 105 errors, which are the most in the majors...rank second in the majors with 57 unearned runs (San Diego, 66)...Marcus Semien has 33 errors and Brett Lawrie 21, which rank first and second in the American League...the 54 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1996 when Jose Valentin (37) and Jeff Cirillo (18) combined for 55 with Milwaukee.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-30 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently the worst mark in Oakland history (.381 in 1980)...it is tied for third worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...the 30 losses are the most in the majors and tied with the

1968 A's for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for onerun losses in a season is 32 by the 1976 A's...the 45 one-run games are
fourth most in the American League...are 23-47 (.329) in games decided
by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...the
Oakland record for losses by two runs or fewer is 49 in 1968...are 9-17 in
games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second
fewest in the AL (NYY, 8) and the losses are third most...are 6-9 (.400) in
extra inning games...the 15 extra inning games are tied with Chicago for
second most in the AL (Seattle, 21) and the losses rank third...have five
walk-off wins in their last 25 home games after tallying just one over their
first 45 home contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this nine-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-1) and Houston (three games) and have now lost five of the last seven home games...are 31-39 (.443) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors...the losses are the most by an A's team since the 2009 A's went 40-41...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1)...have lost 11 of the last 14 road games and 17 of the last 23...are 27-38 (.415) on the road for the season, which is tied for third worst in the American League...have a 3.22 ERA (230 er in 643.0 ip) at home compared to 4.35 (270 er in 558.0 ip) on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 12-26 (.316) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 6-24)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979... are 17-27 (.386) since the All-Star Break, which is the second worst record in the American League (Detroit, 17-29)...are 22-29 (.431) in day games, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's recalled Sean Nolin from Nashville yesterday and he is scheduled to start tomorrow...he will become the 28th player to pitch for the A's this year, which will break the franchise record for most pitchers used in a season (27 in 1915 and 1955)...the A's have used 21 relievers, which matches the Oakland record set in 1997...have five players on the disabled list and have used the DL a total of 21 times, which matches the most by an A's team over the last five years (also 2012)... currently have 33 players on the active roster.

IN AUGUST: The A's went 13-15 (.464) in the month of August and finished with a losing record in the month for the second consecutive season (12-17 in 2014) and sixth time in the last eight years...tied for the American League lead and set an Oakland record for doubles in August with 64 (previous: 63 in 2007)...the pitching staff allowed 37 home runs, which tied Detroit for the most in the AL and matched the most allowed in any month by an A's team over the last 17 years (May, 2002; July, 2004).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are 4-10, which includes 3-5 in Oakland and 1-5 in Seattle...each team has scored 69 runs in the 14 games as six of the A's 10 losses this year have been by one run...14 of the A's 20 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer...are 42-48 against Seattle over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 325-255 against Seattle...that includes 179-111 in Oakland, 145-142 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (25) and multiple hit games (39)...leads AL rookies in hits (130) and total bases (169)... Mark Canha Is batting .315 (28-for-89) with eight doubles, a triple, three home runs and 19 RBI over his last 22 games...Brett Lawrie is batting .385 (20-for-52) with five home runs, 10 RBI and 12 runs scored over his last 13 games...Danny Valencia has a nine-game hitting streak and is 14-for-36 (.389) with 12 RBI and nine runs scored during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw tosses a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win the first game of a doubleheader at Boston...in **1951** Ferris Fain goes 5 for 5 in the second game of a doubleheader against Washington...in **1973** Catfish Hunter improves his record to 18-3 as the A's defeat the California Angels 11-6...it is Hunter's club record 13th consecutive win... he finishes the season 21-5, an .808 winning percentage.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (7-13, 3.93 ERA)

RECENTLY: Is 3-7 with a 5.23 ERA (38 er in 65.1 ip) and .288 (77-for-267) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts dating back to June 28... was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA and .246 opponents average over his first 12 starts.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least one home run in seven consecutive starts, which is the longest streak by an Athletic over the last two years...has yielded nine home runs in 39.1 innings over that stretch (2.06 per nine innings) after surrendering eight in 109.2 innings over his first 17 games (0.66 per nine innings).

LOSSES: Has 13 losses, which are tied with Kluber (CLE) for the most in the American League...they are the most by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill lost 14 in 2011...has a .350 winning percentage, which is fourth lowest in the AL...nine of his losses came before the break, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008).

CAREER HIGHS: Has career highs in games started (24), innings pitched (149.0), losses (13), hits (152), runs (70) and earned runs (65) and has matched his high in home runs (17)...his seven wins are one short of his high of eight from last year.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (23 er in 72.2 ip) in 13 games at home compared to 2-8 with a 4.95 ERA (42 er in 76.1 ip) in 15 games on the road...ranks seventh in the American League in home ERA...is tied for the AL lead in road losses...over the last two seasons, he is 10-6 with a 2.76 ERA (43 er in 140.0 ip) in 28 games at home compared to 5-14 with a 4.53 ERA (78 er in 155.0 ip) in 31 contests on the road.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-4 with a 5.03 ERA (27 er in 48.1 ip) in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 4-9 with a 3.40 ERA in 19 games before the break...last year, he was 7-6 with a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the break, 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games after the break... has a 3.72 career ERA before the break, 5.84 (124 er in 191.0 ip) after the break.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 24 starts overall and his season RSA of 3.93 (65 rs in 149.0 ip) is ninth lowest in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded 13 of his 17 home runs to left-handed hitters and is tied for fourth in the American League in home runs allowed against lefties...11 have come with runners on base and 10 have come the second time through the lineup...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .109 (7-for-64), which is the lowest mark in the majors... the lowest mark by an Athletic since 1914 is .146 by Barry Zito in 2005 (min. 1.0 ip per team game)...has walked two batters or fewer in 20 of his 24 starts...has walked just six of the 153 batters he has faced leading off an inning.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-6 with a 4.44 ERA (37 er in 75.0 ip) in 15 games at night compared to 4-7 with a 3.41 ERA (28 er in 74.0 ip) in 13 games during the day...is tied for the Major League lead in day losses (Lohse, MIL)...the day losses are the most by an A's pitcher since Tom Candiotti had eight in 1998.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 7-13 with a 4.11 ERA (65 er in 142.1 ip) in his 24 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26... is now 15-21 with a 4.00 ERA (123 er in 276.2 ip) in 47 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-9 with a 3.47 ERA (35 er in 90.2 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest compared to 3-4 with a 5.23 ERA (30 er in 51.2 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more... ranks ninth in the American League in ERA when starting on four days rest.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed six innings and allowed just one hit in his first start, a two-run home run by Calhoun, in a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) *April* 23...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota *May* 5...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits in a 1-0 loss to Detroit *May* 26 in Oakland...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on *May* 31...finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning *June* 6 at Boston to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...left his start at Los Angeles (AL) *June* 12 with a 4-3 lead but Scribner allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2...struck out a career-high 11 batters in a
