- Went 6-5 with a 2.13 ERA in 14 games (10 starts) during a pair of stints with Milwaukee
- Was with the Brewers from 6/8-6/24 and 8/9-end
- Held opponents to a .181 batting average with 76 strikeouts in just 71.2 innings
- Pitched in relief during his first stint, going 0-1 with a 2.57 ERA in 4 appearances (7ip, 2er)
- Was a starter during his second stint, going 6-4 with a 2.09 ERA in 10 starts (64.2ip, 15er)

- Retired his last 18 batters in a row in a 6-1 win on 8/19 vs. Toronto (7ip, 2h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 6k)
- Went 8-5 with a 2.55 ERA in 17 starts at Triple-A Nashville, making 11 quality starts
- Was a Pacific Coast League All-Star.....was PCL Pitcher of the Week for 4/28-5/4

- Reached base safely in 35 consecutive games from 5/7-6/22, the fifth-longest streak in franchise history
- From 6/2-6/22 recorded a career-high 18-game hitting streak (25-77, .325, 1hr, 9rbi).....was the longest hitting streak by a Brewer in 2014
- Hit 5 leadoff homers: 4/1 vs. Atlanta, 4/12 vs. Pittsburgh, 5/5 vs. Arizona, 5/10 vs. New York-AL and 8/6 vs. San Francisco.....now has 7 career leadoff homers
- Had 4-hit games on 4/4 at Boston and 5/23 at Miami, tying his career high (14x)

2013

- Signed a 3-year contract extension on 3/13 which runs through the 2016 season
- Batted .284 with 24 HR, 73 RBI and 40 stolen bases in 147 games
- Made 143 starts, all in center field
- Finished ninth in National League Most Valuable Player voting
- Was named Brewers Most Valuable Player as voted on by members of the Milwaukee Chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America
- Led the team in doubles (27), home runs (24), extra-base hits (61), total bases (271) and slugging percentage (.506).....tied Norichika Aoki for the team lead in runs (80) and Jean Segura for the team lead in triples (10)
- Ranked among the National League leaders in triples (T2nd, 10), stolen bases (4th, 40), slugging percentage (7th, .506) and extra-base hits (T8th, 61)
- Became the first player in franchise history with 20+ home runs and 40+ stolen bases in a season.....was the only player in the majors with 20+ home runs and 35+ stolen bases in 2013
- Won his first Rawlings Gold Glove Award, snapping the team's streak of 30 consecutive seasons without a winner, the longest drought in the history of the award (since 1957).....was the first Brewers Gold Glove Award winner since Robin Yount won at shortstop in 1982

C. GOMEZ

- His 12 assists trailed only the Mets' Juan Lagares (14) for the Major League lead among center fielders
- Was selected to his first All-Star Game.....joined Davey May (1973) as the only center fielders in franchise history to make an All-Star team.....went 0-for-1 in the All-Star Game as he played three innings in right field.....grounded out off the Yankees' Mariano Rivera
- Was named National League Player of the Week for 4/15-4/21 after batting .500 (9-for-18) with 2 HR, 3 RBI and 5 runs in 6 games
- Recorded his 500th career hit on 4/21 vs. Chicago-NL with a single off Scott Feldman
- From 4/23-5/8 recorded a season-high 14-game hitting streak, the longest streak by a Brewer in 2013 (26-53, .491, 4hr, 9rbi)
- Notched his first career 2-homer game on 5/25 vs. Pittsburgh..... duplicated the feat two days later with a pair of homers vs. Minnesota
- On 9/26 was suspended for a game for his actions while rounding the bases on a home run on 9/25 at Atlanta.....served the suspension on 9/26 at New York-NL

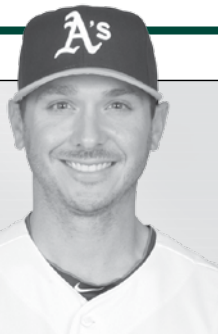

run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts...allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .226 against left-handed hitters compared to .275 against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 19 home runs and issued 41 of his 47 walks to righties...13 of the 19 home runs were solo shots...was 7-2 with a 3.86 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.21 ERA in 15 starts on the road...logged a 5-2 record and a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...was 6-5 with a 3.55 ERA in 15 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more...compiled a mark of 5-4 and a 4.60 ERA in 16 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-5 with a 3.38 ERA in 13 starts after the break...committed three errors, which tied for second most among AL pitchers...the Indians were 15-14 (.517) in his starting assignments...was a non-roster invitee with the Indians during the spring but was added to the roster and placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 with a sprained right rib cage...made one rehab start at Triple-A Columbus April 15 before he was reinstated from the DL April 20...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings May 4 against Minnesota for his first win of the season...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 19, 2010...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Oakland, his first of four 10-strikeout games...had a season-high four-game winning streak from June 21 to Aug. 4...compiled a 1.93 ERA and .173 opponents batting average over that nine-start stretch...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings July 24 at Seattle, allowing one unearned run on one hit for the win...it was his longest outing since June 6, 2008...went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in six starts in July...allowed just one home run in 36.0 innings...singled Aug. 4 at Miami, his second career hit...went 3-2 with a 2.57 ERA in five starts in September...struck out 43 batters in 28 innings and walked just four...ranked fourth in the AL in strikeouts in September...had three 10-strikeout games in the month, including Sept. 6 against New York (NL) when he fanned a season-high 12 in 6.0 shutout innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the second pitcher in Cleveland history to have that many strikeouts in a game in which he pitched no more than six innings (Sam McDowell vs. Detroit, Sept. 18, 1966)...did not walk a batter and became the first Major League pitcher with a scoreless outing of 6.0 innings or fewer with at least 12 strikeouts and no walks since Texas' Matt Perisho Oct. 3, 1999 at Anaheim...finished the season with back-to-back 10-strikeout games, fanning 10 Sept. 21 against Houston and 11 Sept. 28 at Minnesota...won both starts to become the first Indian to win consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts since Chuck Finley in April, 2000.

2011—Made one start for the Los Angeles Angels April 3 at Kansas City (1.2 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 0 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 4 with a lower back strain...began a rehab assignment May 24 at Triple-A Salt Lake...went 0-5 with a 17.02 ERA in five starts before he was released June 15.

2009—Was acquired by the Angels Aug. 28 in exchange for three minor leaguers...with Los Angeles, he posted a 2-2 record and a 1.73 ERA in six starts...for the season, finished 10-9 with a 4.89 ERA in 26 starts between the Rays and Angels...recorded 10-or-more wins for the fifth consecutive season...logged his 50th career victory April 24 at Oakland (6.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 2 so)...left Tampa Bay as the Rays all-time leader in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts, starts and quality starts...was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 21 due to a right quadriceps strain and was reinstated June 27...pitched six innings-or-more in 17 of 26 starts, including 13 of last 15...allowed three runs-or-less in each of last nine starts.

2008—Went 12-8 with a 3.49 ERA in 27 starts with the Rays...led the club with 166 strikeouts, which ranked 10th in the American League...missed all of April with a left elbow strain...earned AL Pitcher of the Month honors for May after going 5-1 with a 1.22 ERA...became first Ray ever to win a pitcher of the month award...won six straight starts from May 10 to June 6, becoming the first Rays pitcher to

2007—Posted a 13-9 record and a 3.48 ERA in 34 starts with the Rays...led the American League and established a career-best with 239 strikeouts... at the age 23, he became the youngest AL strikeout champion since 22-year-old Frank Tanana with the Angels in 1975...was the eighth youngest in AL history... was edged out by Jake Peavy (240) for the Major League strikeout lead in the Padres' one game playoff with Colorado, their 163rd game...established a club record with a 3.48 ERA, placing ninth in AL...was 8-3 with a 2.39 ERA in 15 second-half starts.

2006—Compiled a 10-8 record with a 3.24 ERA in 24 starts with the Rays...made first career All-Star Game before being sidelined with shoulder inflammation in the second half...named the Rays Opening Day starter and at 22 years and 69 days became the youngest Opening Day hurler since Dwight Gooden (21 years, 143 days) in 1986...was named American League Player of the Week for May 15-21, becoming the youngest pitcher in 25 years to win the honor...tossed his first career shutout July 3 at Tropicana Field, giving up two hits while walking two and striking out 10...pitched a scoreless inning at the 77th All-Star Game in Pittsburgh...was placed on the disabled list July 24 and was reinstated Aug. 11...made three starts after his return but was shelved for the final six weeks of the season as precaution.

2005—Completed his first full season in the Majors posting a 10-9 record and a 3.77 ERA in 32 starts... led the club in starts, innings and strikeouts (4th in AL)...was one of only three pitchers in the AL with more strikeouts than hits allowed, joining Randy Johnson and Johan Santana...only four rookies since 1980 bettered Kazmir's numbers in innings, strikeouts and ERA (Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, Dwight Gooden and Mark Langston in 1984 and Hideo Nomo in 1991)...was named to *Baseball America's* All-Rookie Team...posted a 7-2 record and a 2.79 ERA in 14 second-half starts...started season ranked as the seventh best prospect in all of the Minor Leagues according to *Baseball America*.

2004—Acquired by the Rays July 30 from the Mets along with right-handed pitcher Jose Diaz in exchange for right-handed pitchers Victor Zambrano and Bartolome Fortunato...was assigned to Double-A Montgomery but was there just three weeks before his promotion to the Rays...made his Major League debut, Aug. 23 at Seattle, recording the victory in the Rays' 9-0 win (5.0 ip, 4 h, 3 bb, 4 so)... at the age of 20 years and 7 months, he became youngest pitcher in Majors that season and in Rays history...was youngest pitcher to win his ML debut since Mike Norris with Oakland, April 10, 1975...was the fourth youngest player in the American League.

2003—Split time between Capital City and St. Lucie, posting a combined 5-6 record with a 2.63 ERA... led all minor league starting pitchers in strikeouts per nine innings (11.94)...had 145 strikeouts in 109.1 innings pitched...was named the Mets' best prospect and the 11th-best prospect in all of minor league baseball by *Baseball America*...helped lead Port St. Lucie to the Florida State League championship and was winning pitcher in title-clinching game, Sept. 9 at Dunedin.

2002—Was named *Baseball America's* top left-handed minor league pitcher after posting an 0-1 record with an 0.50 ERA in five starts at Single-A Brooklyn...opponents batted just .089 against him.
