OAKLAND ATHLETICS (59-79) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (75-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their five-game losing streak yesterday but have still lost eight of the last 12 games and 17 of the last 25...are 59-79 (.428), which is the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...it is tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 138 games and is the worst since 1997 (53-85)...the 79 losses are the most since going 74-88 in 2011...are in last place in the AL West for the 46th consecutive day...have spent 114 of the last 118 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fifth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 25-38 (.397) since then

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12-for-16 (.750) over the last 10 games, which includes an Oakland recording tying streak of six consecutive hits from Sept. 4-6 (also July 18-26, 1996)...are batting .262 (28-for-107) with 15 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits and plate appearances (125) and fourth in batting average...are one of four AL teams without a home run.

BASES LOADED: Danny Valencia hit the A's sixth grand slam of the season last Friday night, which is tied for second in the American League and is the most by an A's team since the 2004 club also had six...the A's are batting .347 (41-for-118) with the bases loaded, which is the best mark in the AL and second best in Oakland history (.375 in 2000)...rank second in the AL in plate appearances (136) and third in RBI (109).

OFFENSE: The A's have four triples in the last eight games and now have 35 for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League and is tied for the fourth best single season total in Oakland history...they are the most since the 1980 club also had 35 and the Oakland record is 40 set in 1968... have homered in a season-high 13 consecutive games (17 home runs total)...however, have just 115 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL...are batting .284 (143-for-504) with 80 runs scored over the last 14 games (5.7 runs per game)...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.393)...have the fewest sacrifice hits (12) and hit by pitches (28) in the majors...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (141).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.61 ERA (134 er in 215.0 ip), .284 (240-for-844) opponents batting average and 37 home runs allowed (1.55 per nine innings) over the last 24 games...that has raised the season ERA .39 points to 3.79, which ranks fifth in the American League...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...lead the AL in shutouts (14), rank second in fewest extra base hits (357), third in opponents slugging percentage (.381) and fewest home runs (130) and fourth in opponents batting average (.246).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-14 with a 5.71 ERA (81 er in 127.2 ip) over the last 25 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...Felix Doubront has two of those wins and Jesse Chavez has the other...have tossed five innings or fewer in 12 of those 25 contests...now have a 3.46 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have allowed 72 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 106 errors, which are the most in the majors...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...rank second in the majors with 60 unearned runs (San Diego, 71)...Marcus Semien has 33 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 55 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1996 when Jose Valentin (37) and Jeff Cirillo (18) also combined for 55 with Milwaukee.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their season-high tying five-game home losing streak yesterday (also April 11-26)...are 32-41 (.438) in Oakland and have clinched a losing record at home for the first time since 2009 (40-41) and third time in the last 17 years (40-41 in 2007)...have not lost more than 41 home games since going 39-42 in 1998...have the

worst home record in the American League and second worst in the majors (Colorado 31-40)...are 2-5 on this nine-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (1-0) and have lost seven of the last 10 home games...begin a 10-game road trip to Texas (three games), Chicago-AL (four games) and Houston (three games) on Friday...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1) and have lost 11 of the last 14 road games and 17 of the last 23...are 27-38 (.415) on the road for the season, which is tied for third worst in the AL...have a 3.32 ERA (247 er in 670.0 ip) at home compared to 4.35 (270 er in 558.0 ip) on the road.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their 31st one-run game of the season Sunday, which is one short of the Oakland record of 32 set in 1976...are 16-31 (.340) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently fourth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank fifth in games (47)...are 24-48 (.333) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...the Oakland record for losses by two runs or fewer is 49 in 1968...are 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the AL (NYY, 8) and the losses are third most...are 6-9 (.400) in extra inning games...the 15 extra inning games are tied with Chicago for second most in the AL (Seattle, 21) and the losses rank third...have five walk-off wins in their last 28 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 12-26 (.316) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 6-25)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...are 18-29 (.383) since the All-Star Break, which is the worst record in the AL and fourth worst in the majors...are 23-30 (.434) in day games, which is the second worst record in the AL.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 28 pitchers this year, which set an Athletics record for most pitchers used in a season...broke the previous mark of 27 set in 1915 in Philadelphia and matched in 1955 with Kansas City...have used 21 relievers, which matches the Oakland record set in 1997...have employed 49 players overall, which is their most over the last three years...have five players on the disabled list and have used the DL a total of 21 times, which matches the most by an A's team over the last five years (also 2012)...currently have 35 players on the active roster.

A's vs. ASTROS: The season series is even at seven games each...the A's are 3-3 in Houston and 4-4 in Oakland...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 38-20...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 20 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 20-10 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (41)...leads AL rookies in hits (134) and total bases (173)...**Danny Valencia** has hit safely in each of the 12 career games against Houston in which he has an at bat...is 18-for-42 (.429) with four home runs and 10 RBI in 13 career games against the Astros.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1916** switch hitter Wally Schang becomes the first American Leaguer to homer from both sides of the plate in the same game...in **1965** Bert Campaneris plays all nine positions in a game against the Angels...the A's lose in 13 innings, 5-3...in **1978** Mike Edwards sets an Oakland record by scoring five runs in the A's 11-4 win at Texas...in **1984** Carney Lansford collects four hits in the A's 9-5 win at Cleveland, including the 1000th hit of his career off Steve Farr...in **1992** Carney Lansford is 5 for 6 with five RBI in the A's 14-2 win at California...in **2002** Barry Zito wins his 20th game as he combines with Jim Mecir and Ricardo Rincon on a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Minnesota...Zito would go on to win 23 games and the AL Cy Young.

- The A's bullpen has 5.59 ERA (47 er in 75.2 ip) over its past 20 games (dating back to Aug. 16) and a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.68).
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and is tied for the third fewest wins (17)...has allowed the second most extra base hits (151), is tied for the second most home runs (58) and has allowed the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners to score (70-of-212, 33.0%).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (23), the lowest save percentage (52.3%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980).
- First batters faced are 97-for-367 (.264) with 15 home runs and 55 RBI...the RBI are tied for the most in the majors, the home runs are tied for third most and the opponents batting average is fourth highest.
- The A's are 10-46 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 45-32 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Has allowed a .212 (14-for-66) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .271 (23-for-85) with 12 of his 18 extra base hits (.588 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
