THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: Sept. 8

2004 - A 5-2 win over Cincinnati gives Roger Clemens his 326th career victory, moving him into 11th place on the all-time list...the win is also a club-record 12th in a row for the surging Astros, who are on their way to clinching the Wild Card.

1993 - Darryl Kile hurls the 9th no-hitter in franchise history, a 7-1 triumph over the New York Mets...Kile fans the final 2 batters to finish the game...Ken Caminiti and Andujar Cedeno both slug home runs and each provide a defensive gem in the 7th to preserve the no-hitter.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros will continue this season-long, 11-day, 10-game road trip through Oakland (0-1), Anaheim and Texas with the middle game of this 3-game series with the A's tonight...LHP Scott Kazmir (7-9) will start for the Astros opposite A's starter RHP Sonny Gray (12-7).

DIVISIONAL GAMES: Tonight, the Astros will play game 2 of a 22-game stretch of playing AL Western division opponents (0-1 so far)...on the season, Houston is 29-26 against the AL West: Seattle (10-6), Oakland (7-7), Los Angeles (8-5) and Texas (4-8).

TRADE CHIP: LHP Scott Kazmir will be making his 1st appearance against Oakland since they traded him to Houston on July 23...the lefty spent the last year and a half with the A's, before being traded to the Astros in exchange for minor leaguers **RHP Daniel Mengden** and **C Jacob Nottingham**.

LEFTY LEADERS: The Astros boast 2 pitchers within the top 4 in ERA leaders in the AL in **LHP Dallas Keuchel** and **LHP Scott Kazmir...**since joining the Astros, Kazmir has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 7 of his 8 starts.

INTHE STANDINGS: At 75-63 (.543), the Astros are in 1st place in the AL West with a 2.0-game lead over the 2nd-place Rangers...the Astros have been in 1st place or have shared 1st place for 42 straight days, dating back to July 28, and have owned at least a share for the division lead for 132 out of 155 days so far this season.

IT'S BEEN AWHILE: The Astros 75-63 record is their best after 138 games since 2004, when they were also 75-63...the last time the Astros held at least a 2.0-game lead in their division this late in the season was on Sept. 14, 2003, when the Astros led the NL Central by 2.0 games over the Cubs.

75 WINS: With 75 wins this season, the Astros have already surpassed their win total from 2014 (70-92)...the last time Houston posted more than 75 wins in a single season was in 2010 (76-86).

ABOUT YESTERDAY: Trailing 8-2 after 6.0 innings, the Astros mounted a furious comeback attempt that fell just short, dropping the opener of this 3-game series 10-9 in Oakland...the Astros got 3 home runs in their final 3 turns at bat, provided by **PH Jonathan Villar** (solo), **SS Carlos Correa** (3R) and **LF Jake Marisnick** (2R).

ELIAS SAYS: SS Carlos Correa has hit 17 home runs to go along with his 50 RBI in his 1st 75 Major League games...the only other player to break into the Majors with Houston and produce both as many home runs and RBI through his 1st 75 games like Correa has is **OF George Springer**, who did it last year (19 homers and 50 RBI through his 1st 75 games).

RETURN OF THE JEDI: Over his last 7 games, **3B Jed Lowrie** has hit .478 (11x23) with 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 7 RBI and 2 walks...this hot streak comes on the heels of a season-long 0x28 run.

THE ASTROS REMEMBER: The Astros would like to send their condolences to the family and friends of former pitcher **Joaquin Andujar**, who passed away today at the age of 62...Andujar pitched 7 seasons for the Astros (1976-81, 1988) and had a 13-year Major League career, which began (1976) and ended (1988) in a Astros uniform.

2016 SCHEDULE RELEASED: Earlier today, the Astros released their 2016 regular season schedule, which features Opening Day on April 4 at New York (AL) and Interleague matchups with the NL Central division...the Astros 2016 Home Opener will be on April 11 vs. Kansas City.

ERA LEADERS: The Astros own the best team ERA (3.39) in the American League, with their starting staff (3.58) ranking 2nd in the AL in ERA and their bullpen ranking 3rd (2.99).

FIRE STARTERS: Since the Astros inserted LHP Scott Kazmir into the rotation on July 24, Houston owns the best starter's ERA (2.72) in the Majors... MLB rankings since July 24:

SPEED AND POWER: The Astros lead the American League in stolen bases (103) and rank 2nd in the Majors in home runs (188)...individually, **2B Jose Altuve** leads all American League players with 36 steals.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: The Astros have set a franchise record with 10 players recording double digit homers this season...the Major League record is 11 players with double-digit homers in a single season, set by the 2004 Tigers...Houston is close to tying and surpassing that record as IF Marwin Gonzalez and OF Jake Marisnick both have 9 home runs.

UP THE CHARTS: The Astros have posted 188 home runs this season, which ranks 4th among single-season totals in franchise history...with 3 home runs, the Astros can match the 3rd-highest total, which was posted by the 2003 Astros (191).

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYOFFS: The Astros have 7 affiliates that have clinched a postseason berth this season, besting their previous franchise record of 6, set in 2013...5 affiliates will start postseason play tomorrow, leaving only the Rookie Level Greeneville Astros in action last night, as they forced a deciding game 3 tonight by beating Princeton last night in game 2 of the Appalachian League Championship Series.

MINOR LEAGUE TITLES: With all minor league regular seasons ending yesterday, the Astros finished with several league leaders throughout their system, including Double A Corpus Christi's 1B A.J. Reed, who led all of minor league baseball in home runs (34) and RBI (127)...additionally, the organization had 2 players win batting titles in OF Jon Kemmer, who hit .327 in the Texas League (AA), and IF Bobby Wernes, who hit .352 in the NY-Penn League (R).

LAST START - 9/2 vs. SEA: went 4.1 innings, his shortest outing since July 8 at NYM (3IP)...allowed 3 runs (2 earned) on 7 hits, walking 2 with 5 strikeouts in the no decision (Houston lost 8-3).

ABOUT KAZMIR: Houston native will be making his 9th start as an Astro, and his 1st against his former club since being acquired via trade from Oakland on July 23...was acquired in exchange for 2 prospects: RHP Daniel Mengden and C Jacob Nottingham.

has been 1 of the top pitchers in the AL this season, ranking 4th in ERA (2.50) and 5th in opponent batting average (.221)...has allowed more than 3 earned runs just twice all season.

LEADING THE CHARGE: since joining the Astros rotation on July 24, Houston's starting staff has posted the best ERA in the AL (3.03, 124ER/368.2IP).

has made 8 starts for Houston, going 2-4 with a 2.77 ERA (16ER/48.2IP) and 41 strikeouts.

SUCCESS vs. THE WEST: has been stellar against the ALWest division this year...in 10 starts against LAA, SEA and TEX, has gone 5-1 with an 1.07 ERA (9R/67IP), 21 walks and 65 strikeouts, while allowing a .172 (40x233) opponent batting average.

HOME COOKIN': ranks 2nd in the AL in ERA at home with a 1.91 mark (22ER/89.1IP)...trails only teammate LHP Dallas Keuchel (1.49, 19ER/114.2IP), who is the Major League leader.

went 4-2 with a 1.36 ERA (10ER/66IP) in his 10 home starts at O.co Coliseum., and has gone 1-1 with a 3.32 ERA (7ER/19IP) in his 3 home starts at Minute Maid Park.

RUN PREVENTION: has allowed 1 run or less in 13 starts this season, which is tied for the 4th-most in the AL with LHP Dallas Keuchel and LHP Hector Santiago, behind only RHP Sonny Gray (14), LHP David Price (14) and RHP Chris Archer (15). STELLAR FROM THE STRETCH: has allowed just 5 hits with run-

ners in scoring position and 2 outs, as opponents have gone just 5x45 (.111)...is the 5th lowest mark among AL starting pitchers. overall with runners on base, has posted the lowest opponent

batting average (.185, 42x227) among AL starting pitchers. WEAK CONTACT: Per Fangraphs.com has posted the 8th-lowest

hard-hit ball % in the AL (24.8%)...teammate LHP Dallas Keuchel (20.7%) leads the Major Leagues.

HISTORIC MONTH: Was named AL Pitcher of the Month for July after posting the 3rd-lowest ERA in July in Major League history (min. 25 IP)...the only 2 to top Kazmir's month were **Spud Chandler** (0.24) in 1941 and **Frank Allen** (0.25) in 1916.

- combined to go 2-0 with a 0.26 ERA (1ER/34IP) and a .134 $\,$ (15x112) opponent batting average in 5 starts with the Astros (2g) and A's (3g) in the month.
- marked his 2nd career Pitcher of the Month Award, as he won it with TB in May of 2008...marked the 4th time an Astro won a monthly award this season, as **Dallas Keuchel** won the AL Pitcher of the Month Award in both April and May (Keuchel also won the award in August), while Carlos Correa won the AL Rookie of the Month Award in June.
- vs. OAK: tonight will mark Kazmir's 20th overall appearance, 1st this season, against his former club...last faced the A's on 8/18/13 while with the Indians...allowed 5 runs in only 5.0 innings, taking his 6th loss against OAK.
- set a career high in strikeouts on 8/25/07 while pitching for the Rays against the A's.
- pitched for the A's in 2014 and 2015...went 20-14 with a 3.12 ERA (104x300IP) in 50 starts in that span.
