OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-79) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (75-64)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP AARON BROOKS (1-2, 6.91) VS. RHP COLLIN MCHUGH (15-7, 3.75) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing five in a row...are 9-17 (.346) over the last 26 games and 60-79 (.432) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors... it is sixth worst in Oakland history after 139 games and is the worst since 1997 (54-85)...the 79 losses are the most since going 74-88 in 2011...are in last place in the AL West for the 47th consecutive day...have spent 115 of the last 119 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fifth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 26-38 (.406) since then.

GOING FOR THE SWEEP: The A's have won the first two games of this series and have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas...have played 18 series of three or more games since then... the A's only other three-game sweep was June 2-4 at Detroit...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...have a streak of 32 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history (35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984).

OFFENSE: The A's have homered in a season-high 14 consecutive games (19 home runs total), which is the second longest streak in the majors this year (15, Colorado, May 21-June 3)...however, have just 117 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...have four triples in the last nine games and 35 for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL and tied for the fourth best single season total in Oakland history... they are the most since the 1980 club also had 35...the Oakland record is 40 set in 1968...are batting .282 (151-for-535) with 84 runs scored over the last 15 games (5.6 runs per game)...have the second fewest strikeouts in the AL (932) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.393)...have the fewest sacrifice hits (12) and hit by pitches (28) in the majors...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (141).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12-for-16 (.750) over the last 11 games, which includes an Oakland recording tying streak of six consecutive hits from Sept. 4-6 (also July 18-26, 1996)...are batting .262 (28-for-107) with 15 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits, tied for second in plate appearances (125) and third in batting average...are one of four AL teams without a home run.

BASES LOADED: The A's are 8-for-12 (.667) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 15 games...are batting .347 (41-for-118) with the bases loaded, which is the best mark in the American League, third best in the majors and second best in Oakland history (.375 in 2000)...rank second in the AL in plate appearances (136), tied for second in grand slams (6) and third in RBI (109).

PITCHING: The A's tossed their 15th shutout of the season last night, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors... it was their first shutout since Aug. 4...had a 5.01 ERA, .270 opponents batting average and 43 home runs allowed in the 30 games between shutouts...have allowed the second fewest extra base hits in the AL (358), rank third in fewest home runs (130) and opponents slugging percentage (.380) and fourth in ERA (3.76) and opponents batting average (.246)... opponents have been successful in just 68-of-107 (63.6%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-14 with a 5.41 ERA (81 er in 134.2 ip) over the last 26 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 12 of those 26 contests...now have a 3.43 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and tied for third lowest in the majors...have allowed 72 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 106 errors, which are the most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 102)...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...rank second in the majors with 60 unearned runs (San Diego, 71)...Marcus Semien has 33 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 55 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for

56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1996 when Jose Valentin (37) and Jeff Cirillo (18) also combined for 55 with Milwaukee.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 33-41 (.446) in Oakland, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have clinched a losing record at home for the first time since 2009 (40-41) and third time in the last 17 years (40-41 in 2007)...have not lost more than 41 home games since going 39-42 in 1998...are 3-5 on this nine-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-0)...snapped a season-high tying five-game home losing streak Monday (also April 11-26)...begin a 10-game road trip to Texas (three games), Chicago-AL (four games) and Houston (three games) on Friday...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1) and have lost 11 of the last 14 road games and 17 of the last 23...are 27-38 (.415) on the road for the season, which is tied for fourth worst in the AL...have a 3.27 ERA (247 er in 679.0 ip) at home compared to 4.35 (270 er in 558.0 ip) on the road.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their 31st one-run game of the season Sunday, which is one short of the Oakland record of 32 set in 1976...are 16-31 (.340) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently fourth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank fifth in games (47)...are 24-48 (.333) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors... the Oakland record for losses by two runs or fewer is 49 in 1968...are 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the AL (NYY, 8) and the losses are third most...are 6-9 (.400) in extra inning games...the 15 extra inning games are tied for second in the AL and the losses rank third...have five walk-off wins in their last 29 home games after tallying just one over their first 45 home contests.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have set an Athletics record for most pitchers used in a season (28) and have tied the Oakland record most relievers used in a season (21)...currently have 35 players on the active roster... are 13-26 (.333) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 6-25)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...Stephen Vogt leads the A's with 18 home runs...there have been three seasons in Oakland history where the A's did not have a player with 20 home runs (1978, 1983, 2010)... Evan Scribner leads the A's with 54 games pitched...the last time the A's did not have a pitcher appear in 60 or more games in a non-strike season was in 1987 when Dennis Eckersley and Gene Nelson led the club with 54 games.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lead the season series, 8-7...are 5-4 in Oakland and 3-3 in Houston...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 39-20...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 20 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 21-10 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

In **1945** Dick Fowler no-hits the St. Louis Browns, 1-0...in **1958** Preston Ward hits three consecutive home runs in Kansas City's 8-6 win against Baltimore...in **1985** Jose Canseco hits his first ML home run off the Rangers Jeff Russell in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas...in **1988** Luis Polonia becomes the third player in Oakland history to score five runs in a game in the A's 14-6 win at Kansas City...he is a perfect 5 for 5 on the day and also drives in three runs...in **1990** the A's defeat the New York Yankees 7-3 to complete a sweep of the season series, 12-0...in **1995** Stan Javier ties an Oakland record with a pair of triples in the A's 8-2 win at Chicago.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (1-2, 6.91 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 29 and is 0-1 with a 8.64 ERA (8 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts since his return...was 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA in four games, including three starts, during his first stint from Aug. 1 to 14...began the season in the Kansas City organization and went 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals ... was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...was traded to the A's with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland Aug. 1...went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with the Sounds following his Aug. 15 option.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-2 with a 6.66 ERA (18 er in 24.1 ip) and .302 (29-for-96) opponents batting average in his five starting assignments compared to 0-0 with an 8.31 ERA and .368 opponents average in three relief appearances...has issued all six of his walks as a starter.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .268 (15-for-56) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .356 (21-for-59) against righthanders...opponents are batting .419 (13-for-31) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .513 (20-for-39) batting average to the first three hitters in the order, .211 (16-for-76) against the four through nine hitters

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed at least seven innings and allowed one run in each of his first two starts with the A's...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least seven innings while allowing one run or fewer in each of his first two games with the A's...joins Ron Darling (1991), Kevin Appier (1999) and Rich Harden (2003)...the A's are 2-3 (.400) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his five starts.

WITH KANSAS CITY: Was recalled for the first time April 26 as the 26th man but did not pitch...recalled for his second stint May 12 and made one appearance on May 15 against New York, retiring the side in order in the ninth inning of the Royals 12-1 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...was optioned following the game...recalled for a third time June 20 and pitched the next day against Boston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was optioned back to Omaha the next day...was recalled July 7 as the 26th man and stayed one more day without pitching before he was optioned to Omaha for the final time July 8.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first start with the A's, a 5-1 victory over Cleveland Aug. 1 in Oakland...retired 13 of the first 14 batters he faced, allowing just a two-out single to Brantley in the first inning...then allowed his only home run on a one-out solo home run by Chisenhall in the fifth...that was the only run he would allow in 7.1 innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss to Houston Aug. 6 in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Lowrie in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work... retired 11 straight at one point and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 2-1...Rodriguez allowed a two-run home run to Correa for the blown save.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Toronto Aug. 12...allowed a career-high eight runs in 1.2 innings...yielded a threerun home run to Colabello in the first but the A's came back with two runs in the second inning...was charged with five of the Blue Jays seven runs in the bottom of the second ... allowed a two-run single to Donaldson and a RBI single to Colabello and was relieved by Doubront with runners on first and third and one out...Doubront allowed both runners to score plus two of his own

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in a 3-2 A's win at Arizona Sept. 4...Oakland scored twice in the second inning and he blanked the Diamondbacks on four hits and a walk over the first four innings before allowing two runs in the fifth...Pollock had a RBI single and the tying run scored when Goldschmidt grounded into a double play...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh and the A's scored once in the eighth for the win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-8 loss to Seattle last Friday in Oakland...the A's scored four times in the first but he allowed a Miller sacrifice fly in the second...the A's got that run back in the bottom of the second but he allowed five of the Mariners six runs in the third inning for the loss...allowed a RBI double to Seager and a RBI single to Romero and was relieved by Venditte with the bases loaded and one out...Venditte allowed all three runs to score plus one of his own.

MINORS: Went 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha and 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Nashville...combined to go 7-5 with a 3.56 ERA in 20 games, 19 starts, overall... issued just 21 walks in 118.2 innings, an average of 1.59 walks per nine innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .254 (54for-213) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (73-for-248) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...seven were solo shots...yielded five home runs in his first four starts and 20.1 innings and five home runs over his final 16 games and 98.1 innings...at the time of the July 28 trade to the A's, he ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (92) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...his teams were 13-6 (.685) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer and tossed at least five innings in each of his 20 appearances.

RHP Jesse Chavez (7-14, 4.17 ERA): Is 3-8 with a 5.75 ERA and .300 opponents batting average over his last 13 starts dating back to June 28. was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA and .246 opponents average over his first 12 starts....leads the American League and is tied for second in the majors with 14 losses...the losses are tied with Dallas Braden (2010) and Trevor Cahill (2011) for second most by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...is 3-5 with a 5.72 ERA in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 4-9 with a 3.40 ERA in 19 games before the break...his post-break ERA is fifth highest in the AL...has allowed at least one home run in eight consecutive starts, which matches the longest streak by an Athletic over the last six years...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-3 A's loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland (2.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 2 so)...is 2-1 with a 5.70 ERA in 13 career appearances, including two starts, against Texas

- The A's bullpen has 5.45 ERA (47 er in 77.2 ip) over its past 21 games (dating back to Aug. 16) and a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.67).
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and the third fewest wins (17).. has allowed the second most extra base hits (151), third most home runs (58) and fourth highest percentage of inherited runners to score (70-of-212. 33.0%).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (23), the lowest save percentage (52.3%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, . 52.0% in 1980).
- First batters faced are 97-for-368 (.264) with 15 home runs and 55 RBI.. the RBI are tied for second most in the majors, the home runs are tied for third most and the opponents batting average is sixth highest.
- The A's are 10-46 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 46-32 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).


